OAKLAND ATHLETICS (29-42) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (31-41)

THURSDAY, JUNE 23, 2016 — ANGEL STADIUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (2-6, 4.87) VS. RHP TIM LINCECUM (1-0, 1.50) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last four games, six of the last eight and 13 of the last 17...are a season-high tying 13 games under .500 at 29-42 (also 28-41 on June 19)...that is the second worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...it is the fourth worst record after 71 games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 1994 club started the year 26-45 (won game 72)...are 16-30 (.348) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April... are a season-high tying 17 games out of first place in the AL West for the second time in the last three days... since divisional play began in 1969, this is just the third time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 17 or more games before the All-Star Break (1979 and 2001)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 19th time in the last 20 days...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 15 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 19 days in fifth.

IN JUNE: The A's are 5-13 (.278) in the month of June, which is the worst record in the American League and third worst in the majors...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record in June for the first time since going 9-17 in 2011...the offense has struck out 114 times, which is the fewest in the majors...rank last in the AL in runs (63), home runs (14) and slugging percentage (.380)...are a perfect 6-for-6 in stolen base attempts and are the only team in the majors without a caught stealing this month... the only time in Oakland history the A's did not have a caught stealing in a month is April of 2015 (13-for-13)...have two saves, which is tied with the Angels and Phillies for fewest in the majors.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 0-9 with a 5.29 ERA (50 er in 85.0 ip) over the last 17 games...the 17-game streak without a win from a starting pitcher is second longest in Oakland history...the longest such streak is 18 games from July 24-Aug. 12, 1997...the last A's starter to win a game was Sean Manaea on June 1...starters have the fewest innings pitched in the majors (377.0), are tied for the lead in losses (34) and have the third highest ERA (5.11)...the A's have used nine different starters in the last 24 games and 10 for the season, which is tied with Los Angeles for the most in the American League...have 23 games this year with fewer than five innings, which is the most in the majors...have gone 122 consecutive games without a complete game, which is the second longest streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009)...Rich Hill is 8-3 with a 2.25 ERA (16 er in 64.0 ip) in 11 starts...the other nine starters are a combined 9-31 with a 5.69 ERA (198 er in 313.0 ip) in 60 games.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .200 (38-for-190) with 12 runs scored over the last six games (2.0 runs per game)...have been held to one run or fewer six times over the last 13 games and have scored 276 runs for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and fourth fewest in the majors...have the lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.300) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.391)...have the second fewest walks (165) and strikeouts (482), the third fewest doubles (108) and the fourth fewest home runs (70).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.16 ERA (94 er in 203.1 ip) over the last 23 games...logged a 3.33 ERA over the first 21 games and a 6.12 ERA over the next 27 contests from April 27 to May 25...have a 4.64 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents slugging percentage (.437) and on-base percentage (.332) and the third highest batting average (.268)...have allowed 17 home runs over the last nine games and 88 for the season...43 of those have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 52).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 10 errors in the last nine games and 13 in the last 15...have 50 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors...rank fourth in the AL in double plays (75)...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is tied with St. Louis and Washington for the fewest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (four games) and San Francisco (two games) tonight...went 1-7 on the last road trip to Houston (0-3), Milwaukee (0-2) and Cincinnati (1-2) and have lost nine of the last 10 road games...are 6-20 over the last 26 road games after starting the year 7-0 on the road...are 13-20 (.394) on the road for the season, which is the third worst road record in the American League. went 3-6 on the last homestand against Texas (1-3), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Milwaukee (1-1) and are 16-22 (.421) at home, which is the second worst home record in the AL...have a 5.51 ERA (174 er in 284.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.92 ERA (149 er in 342.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.91)...are batting .258 (301for-1167) on the road compared to .243 (295-for-1212) at home.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 2-1 in extra innings and the three extra inning games are tied for second fewest in the American League...all three extra inning games have come on the road...are 8-4 (.667) in games decided in the last at bat...have the third best record in the AL in last at bat games and are tied for fourth in wins...have dropped nine of their last 12 one-run decisions after winning five of the first eight...are 8-12 (.400) in one-run games for the season, which is tied for the second worst record in the AL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's lost a replay challenge yesterday but have been successful in 8-of-12 (66.7%) challenges for the season, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 12 challenges are tied for second fewest in the majors (New York-AL, 10)...are averaging 2 hours and 56 minutes per games, which is tied with Toronto for the fastest in the majors...are 9-7 (.563) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 20-35 (.364) against righties...the 16 games against left-handed starters is tied for third fewest in the American League...A's pinch hitters rank second in the AL in hits (12) and plate appearances (59) and tied for third in RBI (6) and extra base hits (3)...A's designated hitters have the second lowest batting average in the AL (.191) and the fourth fewest home runs (8) and RBI (28)...are in day three of a stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off leading into the All-Star Break...are in game 10 of a 20game stretch in which the A's play all of their games in California

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and currently have 10 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hill, Manaea, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...Reddick is currently on a rehab assignment...Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 16 players have combined to miss 653 games (40.8 games per stint)...have had at least 10 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 1-5 against Los Angeles this year, with all six games coming in Oakland...have scored 10 runs in the six games, including one or fewer four times...are batting .197 (38-for-193)...have lost each of their last four series, which is their longest series losing streak to the Angels since they lost six in a row from Aug. 16, 1985-April 12, 1987... have lost nine of 12 games during the current streak...have lost the season series in each of the previous two years after winning three straight prior to that...are 50-51 against the Angels since the start of the 2011 season... including 40-11 when scoring four or more runs...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 415-347 against the Angels...that includes 216-166 in Oakland and 199-181 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 464-424 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Dull has stranded all 30 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-42 (.024) with runners in scoring position...first batters faced are 1-for-30 with two walks... Danny Valencia is batting .341 (47-for-138) with 10 home runs and 25 RBI in 37 games since he was reinstated from the disabled list May 6...the batting average ranks fifth in the American League over that span.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1978 Tim Conroy becomes the youngest Oakland pitcher to start a game at the age of 18 years, 81 days...he had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at Kansas City (3.1 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 1 er, 5 bb, 1 so)...in 1979, four days after turning their second triple play of the season, the A's turn their third against Texas, tying a major league record...in 1992 the A's score 10 runs in the third inning of a 12-7 win against Seattle...Harold Baines has five RBI in the inning with a two-run double and a three-run homer and has seven RBI for the day...in 1997 Jason Giambi extends his hitting streak to an Oakland record 25 games in a 6-5 loss at Seattle, breaking the mark of 24 set by Carney Lansford in 1984.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (2-6, 4.87 ERA)

LAST SIX STARTS: Has allowed one run in each of his last two starts and two runs or fewer in five of his last six starts...is 1-1 with a 3.73 ERA (13 er in 31.1 ip) over his last six starts...went 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA over his first three starts and was 0-4 with a 9.31 ERA in four starts in between.

RUN SUPPORT: Received two runs of support in his last start and has two runs or support or fewer in seven of his 13 starts this year...that includes no run support three times and one run three times...his season run support average of 3.16 (24 rs in 68.1 ip) is fifth lowest in the American League among pitchers with at least 60 innings pitched...is 0-5 in seven starts with two runs of support or fewer, 2-1 in six starts with three runs of support or more...is now 1-14 in 20 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 7-1 in 14 starts with three runs of support or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has issued 19 of his 26 walks this year and 43 of 64 in his career to left-handed hitters...has a .314 (33-for-105) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .194 (20-for-103) the second time and .413 (26-for-63) after that...the opponents one through four hitters are batting a combined .344 (45-for-131) off him while the five through nine hitters are batting .243 (34-for-140)...has allowed a .155 batting average with two strikes.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-3 with a 2.97 ERA (12 er in 36.1 ip) and .246 (34-for-138) opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 1-3 with a 7.03 ERA (25 er in 32.0 ip) and .338 (45-for-133) opponents batting average in seven starts on the road...has surrendered just two home runs in 36.1 innings at home compared to 10 in 32.0 innings on the road...ranks fourth in the American League in home runs allowed on the road.

MONTH BY MONTH: Has no decisions and a 4.11 ERA (7 er in 15.1 ip) in three starts in June...went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in six starts in May...his May loss total tied for second in the American League...it was the first time he has lost four games in a month in his career...went 1-2 with a 4.03 ERA in four starts in April.

THIS AND THAT: Has tossed fewer than five innings in three of his last five starts and five of 13 for the season...is 2-11 with a 5.21 ERA (62 er in 107.0 ip) and .292 (126-for-431) opponents average over his last 21 starts dating back to July 10, 2015...was 6-4 with a 3.20 ERA and .264 opponents average over the first 18 games of his career...allowed a career-high 10 hits in back-to-back starts on April 25 at Detroit and May 2 against Seattle and is the first A's pitcher with at least 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)...allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts.

LOSING STREAKS SNAPPED: Defeated Minnesota May 30 to snap his losing streak at five games...had a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned five starts from April 25 to May 19...the losing streak fell one short of his career high of six, which he ended with his first win of the season this year on April 20...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during that losing streak, which spanned nine starts from July 10, 2015 to April 7, 2016...it was the longest losing streak by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross lost eight straight from May 19 to Sept. 24, 2012.

START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Chicago (AL) April 7 in Oakland...the scored was tied at 0-0 when allowed a two-run home run to Abreu in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 12 in Oakland...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings and it came in the second inning when Simmons grounded into a double play...left with a 3-1 lead...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 win at New York (AL) on *April 20*...it was his first win since July 4, 2015 against Seattle...struck out a career-high eight batters on a careerhigh tying 111 pitches...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Detroit April 25...allowed a career-high 10 hits and left after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss to Seattle May 2 in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits for the second consecutive start...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-3 loss at Baltimore on May 8...yielded a career-high four home runs, which are the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since May 6, 2013 at Cleveland when Jarrod Parker also allowed four home runs...lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 6-0 loss at Tampa Bay May 14...allowed a two-run home run to Miller in the third inning...also yielded two runs in the sixth inning on a Pearce sacrifice fly and a Kiermaier RBI single...Andriese shut out the A's on two hits, no walks and a hit batter. was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 to New York (AL) in Oakland on *May* 19...allowed a RBI double to Beltran in the third inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the fourth...then allowed a RBI double to Hicks in the sixth inning and was relieved by Rzepczynski after allowing two runs

in 4.2 innings...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Seattle May 24. tossed just 4.2 innings and allowed two runs...yielded a RBI double to Cano in the first and a RBI single to Cruz in the third...was relieved Coulombe with one out in the fifth inning and runners on first and second with the A's trailing 2-1...the A's scored four times in the fifth to get him off the hook but the Mariners scored twice in the eighth and ninth for the win... picked up his second win of the season in the A's 3-2 win over Minnesota May 30 in Oakland...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a RBI single to Centeno in the second...also allowed a Dozier sacrifice fly in the fifth inning, but the A's tied the game in the bottom of the fifth and took the lead for good in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Houston in 12 innings on June 4...the A's scored three times in the second but he allowed three in the bottom of the second on a two-run home run by Gattis and a Marisnick sacrifice fly...also allowed a Rasmus RBI double in the third and a Correa RBI single in the fifth and left after 4.1 innings trailing 5-3...the A's scored single runs in the sixth and ninth innings to get him off the hook...he had a no decision in the A's 6-1 win at Cincinnati June 12... the A's scored four times in the second inning and he allowed his only run in the bottom of the second on a RBI double by Cabrera...had a 4-1 lead when he allowed a lead off single to Votto in the fifth inning...was relieved by Rodriguez who got the final two outs of that inning and pitched a score-

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win over Los Angeles last Friday in Oakland...allowed just one run in seven innings of work, a one-out solo home run by Calhoun in the third inning...retired each of the final 13 batters he faced...left after seven innings with a 2-1 lead but Madson allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save...it was the second time this year the A's bullpen blew a save in one of his start and both have come against the Angels (April 12)...Burns had a walk-off RBI single in the bottom of the ninth for the win.

- Has tossed 249.0 innings, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors.
