### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (30-42) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (31-42)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Are 3-3 over the last six games but are 5-13 over the last 18 contests...are 17-30 (.362) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 30-42 (.417) for the season, which is the second worst record in the American League and fourth worst in the majors...it is tied for the fourth worst record after 72 games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 1997 club also started the year 30-42 (lost game 73)...are 12 games under .500, which is one short of the season low...are 16½ games out of first place in the AL West, which is one-half game short of the season high...since divisional play began in 1969, this is just the third time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 16½ or more games before the end of June (1979 and 2001)...are in fifth place in the AL West for the 20th time in the last 21 days...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 15 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth.

**IN JUNE:** The A's are 6-13 (.316) in the month of June, which is the second worst record in the American League (Seattle, 6-16)...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record in June for the first time since going 9-17 in 2011...the offense has struck out 118 times, which is the fewest in the majors...rank last in the AL in runs (68), home runs (16) and slugging percentage (.382).

**STARTING PITCHING:** Last night, Kendall Graveman became the first A's starting pitcher to record a win since Sean Manaea on June 1...it snapped a 17-game streak without a win from the starting pitcher, which was the second longest such streak in Oakland history (18, July 24-Aug. 12, 1997)...starters are now 1-9 with a 5.11 ERA (52 er in 91.2 ip) over the last 18 games...have the fewest innings pitched in the majors (383.2), are tied for second in losses (34) and have the third highest ERA (5.07)...the A's have used nine different starters in the last 25 games and 10 for the season, which is tied with Los Angeles for the most in the American League...in the majors, only Cincinnati has used more (12)...have 23 games this year with fewer than five innings, which is the most in the majors...have gone 123 consecutive games without a complete game, which is the second longest streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009)...Rich Hill is 8-3 with a 2.25 ERA (16 er in 64.0 ip) in 11 starts...the other nine starters are a combined 10-31 with a 5.63 ERA (200 er in 319.2 ip) in 61 games.

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 4.15 ERA (98 er in 212.1 ip) over the last 24 games...logged a 3.33 ERA over the first 21 games and a 6.12 ERA over the next 27 contests from April 27 to May 25...have a 4.63 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.268) and slugging percentage (.437) and the third highest on-base percentage (.332)...have allowed 18 home runs over the last 10 games and 89 for the season...44 of those have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 53).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .208 (47-for-226) with 17 runs scored over the last seven games (2.4 runs per game)...have been held to one run or fewer six times over the last 14 games and have scored 281 runs for the season, which is tied with Tampa Bay for the fewest in the American League...have the lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.300) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.391)...rank second in fewest walks (168), tied for second in fewest strikeouts (486), third in fewest doubles (108) and fourth in fewest home runs (72).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed 10 errors in the last 10 games and 13 in the last 16...have 50 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors...rank fourth in the AL in double plays (77)...A's outfielders have seven assists, which is tied with St. Louis and Washington for the fewest in the majors.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-0 on this six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (1-0) and San Francisco (two games) tonight...have now won each of their last two road games after losing nine straight...have not won more than two straight road games since starting the year 7-0 on the road...are 7-20 on the road since then...went 1-7 on the last road trip to Houston (0-3), Milwaukee (0-2) and Cincinnati (1-2) and are 14-20 (.412) on the road for the season, which is the third worst road record in the American League...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Texas (1-3), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Milwaukee (1-1) and are 16-22 (.421) at home, which is the third worst home record in the AL...have a 5.47 ERA (178 er in 293.0

ip) on the road compared to 3.92 ERA (149 er in 342.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.91)...are batting .258 (310-for-1203) on the road compared to .243 (295-for-1212) at home.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's won 5-4 last night and have now won each of their last two one-run decisions...however, have dropped nine of their last 13 one-run games after winning five of the first eight...are 9-12 (.429) in one-run games for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are 2-1 in extra innings and the three extra inning games are tied for second fewest in the American League...all three extra inning games have come on the road...are 8-4 (.667) in games decided in the last at bat...have the third best record in the AL in last at bat games and are tied for fourth in wins.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 9-7 (.563) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 21-35 (.375) against righties...the 16 games against left-handed starters is tied for third fewest in the American League...have been successful in 8-of-12 (66.7%) replay challenges, which is the best percentage in the majors...the 12 challenges are tied for second fewest in the majors (New York-AL, 10)...are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is tied for second fastest in the majors (Toronto, 2:56)...A's pinch hitters rank second in the AL in hits (12) and plate appearances (59) and tied for third in RBI (6) and extra base hits (3)...A's designated hitters have the second lowest batting average in the AL (.193) and the fourth fewest home runs (8) and RBI (28)...are in day four of a stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off leading into the All-Star Break...are in game 11 of a 20-game stretch in which the A's play all of their games in California.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and currently have 10 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hill, Manaea, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...Reddick is currently on a rehab assignment...Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 16 players have combined to miss 663 games (41.4 games per stint)...have had at least 10 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. ANGELS:** The A's are 2-5 against the Angels...won the first game in Anaheim last night after losing five of six games in Oakland...have scored 15 runs in the seven games, including one or fewer four times...are batting .205 (47-for-229)...have lost each of their previous four series, which is their longest series losing streak to the Angels since they lost six in a row from Aug. 16, 1985-April 12, 1987...have lost nine of 13 games during the current streak...have lost the season series in each of the previous two years after winning three straight prior to that...are 51-51 against the Angels since the start of the 2011 season...including 41-11 when scoring four or more runs...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 416-347 against the Angels...that includes 216-166 in Oakland and 200-181 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 465-424 against the Angels.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Last night marked the third time in Oakland history each of the nine players in the starting lineup had exactly one hit (July 28, 1977 vs. California; Sept. 16, 1975 vs. Texas-G#2)...**Khris Davis** has 43 home runs and 107 RBI over his last 162 games...**Ryan Dull** has stranded all 30 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-42 (.024) with runners in scoring position...first batters faced are 1-for-30 with two walks...**Marcus Semien** hit his 13th home run of the season last night, which is two short of his career high of 15 from last year...leads American League short-stops in home runs and is tied for third in the majors...**Danny Valencia** is batting .328, which ranks fourth in the AL among players with 200 or more plate appearances.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1979 Rickey Henderson steals the first base of his career in his Major League debut in the first game of a doubleheader against Texas...he doubles in his first big league at bat and adds a single in three other at bats...in 2012 Derek Norris hits his first Major League home run, a walk-off three-run blast in the A's 4-2 win over San Francisco.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Eric Surkamp (0-5, 7.20 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season, his third against the Angels...is 0-2 with a 3.38 ERA against Los Angeles, 0-3 with a 8.88 ERA against everyone else...was recalled from Triple-A Nashville June 14 for his fourth stint with the A's this year and is 0-2 with a 9.72 ERA (9 er in 8.1 ip) in two starts since his return...was called up the first time April 8 and went 0-2 with a 5.59 ERA in four starts before he was optioned April 25...made just one start in each of his next two stints (May 11-16 and May 31-June 1).

**FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK:** Is 0-5 with a 7.20 ERA in eight starts this year...the ERA is third highest in the American League among pitchers with 25 or more innings pitched...the five-game losing streak is a career high (previous: 3, Sept. 24, 2011-July 23, 2013), matches the A's season high and is tied for the third longest active streak in the AL.

**FIRST THREE, LAST FIVE:** Went 0-1 with a 3.68 ERA, .267 opponents batting average and one home run allowed in 14.2 innings over his first three starts...is 0-4 with a 9.74 ERA (22 er in 20.1 ip), .378 (34-for-90) opponents batting average and six home runs allowed in 20.1 innings in five starts since then.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .267 (16-for-60) average the first time through the lineup, .378 (34-for-90) after that...has yielded a .387 (29-for-75) batting average with the bases empty compared to .280 (21-for-75) with runners on base...the opponents clean-up hitter is 1-for-14 (.071) with six walks...opponents are batting .423 (22-for-52) with two outs, including .429 (9-for-21) with runners in scoring position and two outs...has allowed a .303 (20-for-66) batting average with two strikes.

**THIS AND THAT:** Has walked 19 batters while striking out just 20 in 35.0 innings (4.89 walks per nine innings)...now has 50 career walks against 57 strikeouts in 92.0 innings (4.89 walks per nine innings)...has hit five batters, which is tied for sixth in the American League...has made eight starts, which are a new career high (previous: 6 with San Francisco in 2011)...has tossed fewer than five innings in six of his eight starts this year and 10 of 15 starts in his career...today will be his 16th career start...his only career win as a starter came on Sept. 12, 2011 against San Diego while pitching for San Francisco.

**FIRST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Seattle April 8...it was his first start since July 23, 2013 against Cincinnati...blanked the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a lead-off home run to Lee in the fifth...hit the next batter (Martin) and was relieved by Rodriguez, who allowed him to score, tying the game at 2-2.

**SECOND START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) in Oakland April 13...allowed at least two base runners in every inning except the fourth when he retired the side in order...yielded two runs on RBI singles by Calhoun in the third and fifth innings...left trailing 2-0.

**THIRD START:** He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 11-inning win at New York (AL) on April 19...allowed a RBI single to Rodriguez in the bottom of the first but the A's tied the game with a run in the second...then yielded a Beltran sacrifice fly in the fifth inning but the A's came back to tie the game in the sixth...was relieved by Rzepczynski with two outs in the sixth inning and the score tied 2-2.

**FOURTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss at Toronto April 24...allowed a career-high tying nine hits...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the third inning on a Carrera home run and three straight RBI singles by Smoak, Pillar and Barney...also surrendered a two-run home run to Bautista in the fourth and left after 4.2 innings with the A's trailing 6-1.

**FIFTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-3 loss at Boston on May 11...the A's scored a run in the second inning but he allowed a three-run home run to Bradley in the bottom of the second...Oakland tied the game with a two-run third inning but he allowed a RBI double to Young in the bottom of the third...was relieved by Dull with two outs in the third and runners on second and third, but Dull got the final out of the inning.

**SIXTH START:** He had a no decision in the A's 7-4 win over Minnesota on May 31 in Oakland...allowed a RBI double to Park in the second but the A's tied the game in the bottom of the second...allowed another run to score on a Sano fielders choice in the third but the A's scored twice in the bottom of the third...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed a two-out RBI double to Grossman in the fifth...left after 4.2 innings with the score tied 2-2.

**SEVENTH START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 10-6 loss to Texas on Tuesday in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying seven runs in just 2.1 innings...Rua had a sacrifice fly in the first inning, but the A's tied the game in the bottom of the first...he then allowed a three-run home run to Chirinos

in the second and was charged with three more runs in the third, including a solo home run by Rua.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-0 loss to Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday in Oakland...had a career-high five strikeouts in a career-high tying 6.0 innings...tossed a career-high 102 pitches...allowed a run in the first inning when Escobar scored on a Pujols ground out and another in the fifth inning on a leadoff home run by Perez...Weaver shutout the A's on three hits and a walk.

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP:** Went 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA in six games, including two starts...led the A's with 19 strikeouts...surrendered just one home run in 20.0 innings...opponents hit .239...had a 6.75 ERA in his two starts but did not allow a run in three of his four relief appearances (5 er in 16.0 ip, 2.81 ERA)...including his last outing April 2 against San Francisco when he tossed 7.0 scoreless innings of relief...was optioned to Nashville following the game but returned to Oakland April 8 when Doubront went on the DL.

**2015 IN THE MAJORS:** Began the season at Triple-A Charlotte in the Chicago White Sox organization and finished it with Triple-A Oklahoma City in the Los Angeles Dodgers farm system...in between, he made one appearance for the Dodgers in July...was selected July 6, pitched that day against Philadelphia (3.1 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 4 so), and was designated for assignment the next day...pitched mostly in relief at Charlotte, going 3-0 with a save and 2.81 ERA in 10 relief appearances and one start...then made 15 starts and one relief appearance with Oklahoma City where he was 9-3 with a 3.57 ERA...combined at Triple-A to post a 12-3 record and a 3.39 ERA in 27 games, including 16 starts.

**TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER**  
**LHP Dillon Overton (0-0, — ERA):** Will be selected from Triple-A Nashville tomorrow and will be making his Major League debut...becomes the third Oakland pitcher to start in ML debut this year (Manaea and Mengden) and the fifth to make his first ML start (Neal and Triggs)...will be the 11th pitcher to start a game for Oakland, which will be second most in the majors to Cincinnati (12)...had not pitched above Double-A prior to this year...went 8-4 with a 3.01 ERA in 14 games, including 13 starts, with Nashville this year...including 7-0 with a 1.40 ERA over his final seven starts...surrendered just two home runs in 83.2 innings...was the A's second round selection in the 2013 First-Year Player Draft but did not pitch in his first professional season after undergoing "Tommy John" surgery...is the first A's pick from that draft to reach the majors...is 15-13 with a 3.06 ERA in 53 games, including 50 starts, as a professional.

- The A's bullpen compiled a 2.42 ERA over its first 27 games, a 6.69 ERA over its next 21 games from May 3-25 and has a 3.36 ERA (32 er in 85.2 ip) in 24 contests since then.
- Has tossed 251.1 innings, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed just 22-of-115 (19.1%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 16.2%).
- Has converted 19-of-26 (73.1%) save opportunities, which is tied for third best in the AL.
- Ranks third in the AL in strikeouts per walk (3.32), tied for third in fewest losses (8) and fourth in fewest walks (72) and most home runs (32).
- Are tied for second in the AL in first batter strikeouts (62) and have the third lowest first batter slugging percentage (.329).
