OAKLAND ATHLETICS (31-42) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (31-43)

SATURDAY, JUNE 25, 2016 — ANGEL STADIUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT LHP DILLON OVERTON (ML DEBUT) VS. RHP JHOULYS CHACIN (2-3, 5.56) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight and three of the last four games but are 6-13 over the last 19 contests...are 18-30 (.375) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 31-42 (.425) for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...it is tied for the fifth worst record after 73 games in Oakland history and is the worst since the 2009 club also started the year 31-42 (lost game 74)...are in fourth place in the AL West, the second time in the last 22 days the A's have not been in fifth...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 16 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: Dillon Overton will become the A's 10th different starting pitcher in the last 27 games...he will be the 11th pitcher to start a game for the A's this year, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 12)...Eric Surkamp tossed 3.2 innings yesterday, which is the 24th time this year an A's starter has tossed fewer than five innings...that is the most in the majors...have the second fewest innings pitched in the majors (387.1), are tied for second in losses (34) and have the third highest ERA (5.07)...on Thursday night, Kendall Graveman became the first A's starting pitcher to record a win since Sean Manaea on June 1...it snapped a 17-game streak without a win from the starting pitcher, which was the second longest such streak in Oakland history (18, July 24-Aug. 12, 1997)...starters are now 1-9 with a 5.10 ERA (54 er in 95.1 ip) over the last 19 games...Rich Hill is 8-3 with a 2.25 ERA (16 er in 64.0 ip) in 11 starts...the other nine starters are a combined 10-31 with a 5.62 ERA (202 er in 323.1 ip) in 62 games...starters have gone 124 consecutive games without a complete game, which is the second longest streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.07 ERA (100 er in 221.1 ip) over the last 25 games...logged a 3.33 ERA over the first 21 games and a 6.12 ERA over the next 27 contests from April 27 to May 25...have a 4.60 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.269) and third highest opponents slugging percentage (.436) and on-base percentage (.332)...have allowed 19 home runs over the last 11 games and 90 for the season...45 of those have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 55).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .271 (111-for-410) with 55 runs scored over the last 12 games (4.6 runs per game)...however, have just 26 walks over that stretch for a .318 on-base percentage (4 hbp, 4 sf)...have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.301) and the third lowest slugging percentage (.394)...rank second in fewest runs scored (288) and walks (169), tied for second in fewest strikeouts (492), third in fewest doubles (110) and fourth in fewest home runs (74)

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying three errors last night (fourth time)...have 13 errors in the last 11 games and 53 for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...rank fourth in the AL in double plays (78)...A's outfielders had their eighth assist of the season last night, their first since May 19... have the third fewest outfield assists in the majors (St. Louis and Washington, 7).

IN JUNE: The A's are 7-13 (.350) in the month of June, which is the third worst record in the American League...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record in June for the first time since going 9-17 in 2011... the offense has struck out 124 times, which is the fewest in the majors... rank last in the AL in runs (75), home runs (18) and slugging percentage (.393) and second to last in walks (48).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-0 on this six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (2-0) and San Francisco (two games)...have a three-game road winning streak, which is their second longest of the season...began the year 7-0 on the road and went 5-20 in between...went 1-7 on the last road trip to Houston (0-3), Milwaukee (0-2) and Cincinnati (1-2) and are 15-20 (.429) on the road for the season, which is the third worst road record in the American League...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Texas (1-3), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Milwaukee (1-1) and are 16-22 (.421) at home,

which is the third worst home record in the AL...have a 5.36 ERA (180 er in 302.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.92 ERA (149 er in 342.0 ip) at home... have the second highest road ERA in the AL (Minnesota, 5.37)...are batting .261 (324-for-1241) on the road compared to .243 (295-for-1212) at home.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's won 5-4 Thursday night and have now won each of their last two one-run decisions...however, have dropped nine of their last 13 one-run games after winning five of the first eight...are 9-12 (.429) in one-run games for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are 2-1 in extra innings and the three extra inning games are tied for second fewest in the American League...all three extra inning games have come on the road...are 8-4 (.667) in games decided in the last at bat, which is the third best record in the AL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 9-7 (.563) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 22-35 (.386) against righties... the 16 games against left-handed starters is tied for third fewest in the American League...have lost each of their last two replay challenges but have been successful in 8-of-13 (61.5%) challenges for the season, which is the third best percentage in the AL...the 13 challenges are fourth fewest in the AL...are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per games, which is tied for second fastest in the majors (Toronto, 2:56)...A's pinch hitters rank second in the AL in hits (12) and plate appearances (60) and tied for third in RBI (6) and extra base hits (3)...A's designated hitters have the second lowest batting average in the AL (.190), the third fewest RBI (28) and the fourth fewest home runs (8)...are in day five of a stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off leading into the All-Star Break...are in game 12 of a 20-game stretch in which the A's play all of their games in California.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and currently have 10 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hill, Manaea, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...Manaea and Reddick are currently on rehab assignments...Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 16 players have combined to miss 673 games (42.1 games per stint)...have had at least 10 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 3-5 against the Angels...have won the first two games in Anaheim after losing five of six in Oakland...by winning the first two games of this four-game series, the A's have snapped a four-series losing streak against the Angels, which was their longest since dropping six in a row from Aug. 16, 1985-April 12, 1987...have scored 22 runs in eight games this year (2.8 per game), including one or fewer four times... have lost the season series in each of the previous two years after winning three straight prior to that...are 52-51 against the Angels since the start of the 2011 season...including 42-11 when scoring four or more runs...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 417-347 against the Angels...that includes 216-166 in Oakland and 201-181 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 466-424 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has homered in back-to-back games for the third time this year and now has 44 home runs and 110 RBI over his last 162 games... Ryan Dull has stranded all 30 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-43 (.023) with runners in scoring position...first batters faced are 2-for-31 (.065) with two walks...Marcus Semien leads American League shortstops and is tied for third in the majors with 13 home runs... Danny Valencia is batting .325, which ranks fourth in the AL among players with 200 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1950** Eddie Joost homers in both games of a doubleheader at Chicago and combines to drive in seven runs...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits his 300th career home run in the second inning of the A's 10-8 loss to Detroit...he would later add #301 for his 33rd career multi-homer game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Dillon Overton (Major League Debut)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville today and will be making his Major League debut after just 53 minor league appearances, including 50 starts, in three professional seasons...had not pitched above Double-A prior to this year...will become the 47th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the third this year (Manaea and Mengden)... will become the fifth pitcher to make his first ML start for the A's this year (Neal and Triggs)...the last A's pitcher to start and win his debut was Bobby Cramer on September 13, 2010 at Kansas City...the last complete game was by Mike Morgan June 11, 1978 against Baltimore and the only shutout is by Mike Norris April 10, 1975 against Chicago...the previous 46 have combined for a 13-15 record and a 3.72 ERA.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 8-4 with a 3.01 ERA in 14 games, including 13 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...is tied for second in the Pacific Coast League in wins, ranks fourth in ERA and fifth in strikeouts (72)...won each of his final seven starts for the Sounds beginning May 17...logged a 1.40 ERA (7 er in 45.0 ip) and .215 (35-for-163) opponents batting average during the winning streak and did not surrender a home run...went 1-4 with a 4.89 ERA and .305 opponents batting average over his first seven games.

THE LONG BALL: Surrendered just two home runs in 83.2 innings, an average of 0.22 per nine innings...both of the home runs came in one start on May 6 against Memphis...finished with an eight-game, 52.0-inning, 216-batters faced homereless streak...has allowed 13 home runs in 246.2 career innings (0.47 per nine innings).

THIS AND THAT: Tossed at least six innings in 10 of his 14 appearances, allowed five hits or fewer nine times, two runs or fewer eight times and one walk or fewer 10 times...allowed 14 of his 32 runs in the second inning for a 9.00 ERA (13 er in 13.0 ip)...had a 1.91 ERA (15 er in 70.2 ip) in all other innings

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a season-high eight batters in a seasonlow 4.0 innings in his first start April 9 against Oklahoma City and took the loss...tossed his lone complete game of the season in the second game of an April 20 doubleheader at Colorado Springs, an 8-1 win (7.0 ip, $5\,h$, 1 r, 1 er, 5 so)...made his only relief appearance April 25 against New Orleans in a game started by Henderson Alvarez on a rehab assignment (4.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season high 11 hits in a 7-6 loss to Memphis May 6...began his seven-game winning streak May 17 against Fresno when he matched his season-high with eight strikeouts...allowed just one run in 6.2 innings then allowed one run in 6.0 innings in his next start May 23 at Las Vegas...walked a season-high four batters in 5.0 innings May 28 at Salt Lake...matched his season-high with four walks June 10 at Oklahoma City...tossed 6.0 shutouts innings that day, allowed two unearned runs in his next start and then logged 7.1 scoreless innings in his final start...did not allow an earned run over his final 25.1 innings and went 4-0 with a 0.99 ERA in four starts in June

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He combined with Tucker Healy on a sixhit shutout in the Sounds 4-0 win over Round Rock last Monday...tossed a season-high 7.1 innings and allowed five of the hits...had runners on second and third with two outs in the first inning but then retired each of the next 14 batters...allowed just one more base runner as far as second base.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was a non-roster invite with the A's this spring and did not allow a run in three relief appearances (6.0 ip, 5 h, 1 bb, 7 so)...opponents went 5-for-22 (.227)...was reassigned to minor league camp March 13.

2015 RECAP: Started the year at Single-A Stockton and was 2-4 with a 3.82 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, when he was promoted to Double-A Midland July 2...went 5-2 with a 3.06 ERA in 13 starts with the RockHounds and combined for a 7-6 record and a 3.43 ERA in 27 games, including 25 starts...led the A's farm system in ERA and tied for third in strikeouts (106)...walked just 27 batters in 126.0 innings, an average of 1.93 per nine innings...allowed a .265 opponents batting average, including .249 (43-for-173) against left-handed hitters compared to .274 (84-for-307) against right-handers...was rated as the A's eighth best prospect by Baseball America following the season.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's second round selection in the 2013 First-Year Player Draft but did not pitch until 2014 after undergoing "Tommy John" surgery...is the first A's pick from that draft to reach the majors... is 15-13 with a 3.06 ERA (84 er in 246.2 ip) in 53 games, including 50 starts, as a minor leaguer...has walked just 53 batters in 246.2 innings, an average of 1.93 per nine innings...led the A's farm system in ERA (3.43) in 2015...was rated as the A's eighth best prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2014 and 2015 seasons.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (3-6, 5.20 ERA): Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 5 and is 0-1 with a 3.28 ERA in four starts since his return... was placed on the DL May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA in nine starts before going on the DL...is 0-5 with a 6.60 ERA over his last nine starts...the five-game losing streak is a career high, matches the A's season high and is tied for the third longest active losing streak in the American League...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-3 A's win over Milwaukee last Tuesday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...is 5-3 with a 3.27 ERA (77.0 ip, 60 h, 31 r, 28 er, 23 bb, 68 so, 6 hr) in 12 career appearances, including 11 starts, against Los Angeles...including 2-0 with a 1.52 ERA in four games at Anaheim... was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 4-1 loss on April 11 in Oakland (6.1 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 6 so).

12-8, 3.89 ERA (111 er in 256.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 20-for-27 (74.1%)

- The A's bullpen compiled a 2.42 ERA over its first 27 games, a 6.69 ERA over its next 21 games from May 3-25 and has a 3.16 ERA (32 er in 91.0 ip) in 25 contests since then.
- Has tossed 256.2 innings, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed just 23-of-117 (19.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 15.7%).
- Has converted 20-of-27 (74.1%) save opportunities, which is third best
- Ranks third in the AL in strikeouts per walk (3.38), tied for third in fewest losses (8) and fourth in fewest walks (72) and most home runs (32).
- Rank second in the AL in first batter strikeouts (63) and have the third lowest first batter slugging percentage (.332).
