OAKLAND ATHLETICS (32-42) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (31-44)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won the first three games of this series and have not swept a four-game series since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto, a span of 19 four-game series...have not had a four-game sweep on the road since Aug. 27-30, 2012 at Cleveland...have also won four of the last five games but are 7-13 over the last 20 contests...are 19-30 (.388) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 32-42 (.432) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West for the second consecutive day...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 17 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: Last night, Dillon Overton became the A's 10th different starting pitcher in the last 27 games...he is the 11th pitcher to start a game for the A's this year, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 12)...A's starters are now 2-3 with a 2.86 ERA (16 er in 50.1 ip) over the last nine games...have issued 10 walks over that stretch (1.79 per nine innings), but have surrendered nine home runs...starters have the second fewest innings pitched in the majors (393.0), are tied for second in losses (34) and have the fourth highest ERA (5.06)...have tossed fewer than five innings 24 times this year, which is the most in the majors...have gone 125 consecutive games without a complete game, which is the second longest streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009)...Rich Hill is 8-3 with a 2.25 ERA (16 er in 64.0 ip) in 11 starts...the other 10 starters are a combined 11-31 with a 5.61 ERA (205 er in 329.0 ip) in 63 games.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.02 ERA (103 er in 230.1 ip) over the last 26 games...logged a 3.33 ERA over the first 21 games and a 6.12 ERA over the next 27 contests from April 27 to May 25...have a 4.58 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.269) and third highest opponents slugging percentage (.438) and on-base percentage (.332)...have allowed 22 home runs over the last 12 games and 93 for the season...45 of those have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 55).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .277 (123-for-444) with 62 runs scored over the last 13 games (4.8 runs per game)...however, have just 32 walks over that stretch for a .328 on-base percentage (4 hbp, 5 sf)...have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.303) and the third lowest slugging percentage (.396)...rank second in fewest walks (175) and fewest strikeouts (495), tied for second in fewest runs (295), third in fewest doubles (112) and tied for third in fewest home runs (75).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying three errors Friday night (fourth time)...have 13 errors in the last 12 games and 53 for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...rank fourth in the AL in double plays (78)...A's outfielders have eight assists, which is third fewest in the majors (St. Louis and Washington, 7).

IN JUNE: The A's are 8-13 (.381) in the month of June, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...with one more loss, the A's will clinch a losing record in June for the first time since going 9-17 in 2011...the offense has struck out 127 times, which is the fewest in the majors...rank last in the AL in runs (82), home runs (19) and slugging percentage (.398) and tied for second to last in walks (54).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 9-7 (.563) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 23-35 (.397) against righties...the 16 games against left-handed starters are tied for third fewest in the American League...are batting .264 (151-for-573) against left-handed pitching compared to .249 (485-for-1946) against right-handers.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-0 on this six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (3-0) and San Francisco (two games)...have a four-game road winning streak, which is their second longest of the season...began the year 7-0 on the road and went 5-20 in between...went 1-7 on the last road trip to Houston (0-3), Milwaukee (0-2) and Cincinnati (1-2) and are 16-20 (.444) on the road for the season...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Texas (1-3), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Milwaukee (1-1) and are 16-22 (.421) at home, which is the third worst home record in the American League...have

a 5.30 ERA (183 er in 311.0 ip) on the road compared to 3.92 ERA (149 er in 342.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.91)...are batting .264 (336-for-1275) on the road compared to .243 (295-for-1212) at home.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's won 5-4 Thursday night and have now won each of their last two one-run decisions...however, have dropped nine of their last 13 one-run games after winning five of the first eight...are 9-12 (.429) in one-run games for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...are 2-1 in extra innings and the three extra inning games are tied for second fewest in the American League...all three extra inning games have come on the road...are 8-4 (.667) in games decided in the last at bat, which is the third best record in the AL.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have lost each of their last two replay challenges but have been successful in 8-of-13 (61.5%) challenges for the season, which is tied for the third best percentage in the AL...the 13 challenges are tied for third fewest in the AL...are averaging 2 hours and 57 minutes per game, which is tied with Philadelphia for second fastest in the majors (Toronto, 2:56)...A's pinch hitters rank second in the AL in hits (12) and plate appearances (60) and tied for third in RBI (6) and extra base hits (3)...A's designated hitters have the second lowest batting average in the AL (.195) and are tied for the third fewest home runs (8) and RBI (29)...are in day six of a stretch of 20 consecutive days without a day off leading into the All-Star Break...are in game 13 of a 20-game stretch in which the A's play all of their games in California.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 16 times this year and currently have 10 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hill, Manaea, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...Manaea and Reddick are currently on rehab assignments...Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 16 players have combined to miss 683 games (42.7 games per stint)...have had at least 10 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 4-5 against the Angels...have won the first three games in Anaheim after losing five of six in Oakland...have swept just one four-game series from the Angels over the last 35 years and it came at Anaheim in the final series of the 2001 season (Oct. 4-7)...by winning this series, the A's have snapped a four-series losing streak against the Angels, which was their longest since dropping six in a row from Aug. 16, 1985-April 12, 1987...have been held to one run or fewer in four of the nine games this year...have lost the season series in each of the previous two years after winning three straight prior to that...are 53-51 against the Angels since the start of the 2011 season...including 43-11 when scoring four or more runs...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 418-347 against the Angels...that includes 216-166 in Oakland and 202-181 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 467-424 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has 44 home runs and 11 RBI over his last 162 games...
Ryan Dull has stranded all 32 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-45 (.022) with runners in scoring position...first batters faced are 2-for-32 (.063) with two walks...**Marcus Semien** leads American League shutouts and is tied for third in the majors with 13 home runs...
Danny Valencia is batting .333, which ranks fourth in the AL among players with 200 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1958** Hector Lopez hits three home runs in the A's 8-6, 12 inning win over Washington...in **1974** Campy Campaneris has two hits in the A's 5-0 win over California, giving him 1000 in his Oakland career...in **1997** Mark McGwire hits his ninth career grand slam in a 6-3 win over Texas, tying the franchise record held by Jimmie Foxx, Sam Chapman and Gus Zernial...in **2005** the A's set an Oakland record for margin of victory in a shutout with a 16-0 win over San Francisco...switch-hitter Nick Swisher becomes just the second player in Oakland history to homer from both side of the plate in the same game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (3-6, 5.20 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 5 and is 0-1 with a 3.28 ERA (9 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts since his return...was placed on the DL May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA in nine starts before going on the DL.

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-5 with a 6.60 ERA (34 er in 46.1 ip) and .302 (58-for-192) opponents batting average over his last nine starts...the five-game losing streak is a career high (previous: 4, Aug. 1-16, 2014), matches the A's season high and is tied for the third longest active losing streak in the American League...allowed at least four runs in each of his first five starts during the streak marking the first time in his career he has allowed four or more runs in more than two consecutive starts...went 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA and .232 opponents batting average over his first four starts.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-0 with a 2.70 ERA (5 er in 16.2 ip) in three starts during the day compared to 2-6 with a 5.95 ERA (37 er in 56.0 ip) in 10 starts at night...last year, he went 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA in nine starts during the day...it was the sixth lowest day ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 50 or more day innings...over the last two years, he is 6-2 with a 1.98 ERA (17 er in 77.1 ip) in 12 starts during the day, 11-11 with a 3.90 ERA (88 er in 203.1 ip) in 32 starts at night.

WILD PITCHES: Leads the majors with 11 wild pitches, which matches the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (Cahill, 2011; Darling, 1992)...had three wild pitches May 20 against New York and is the first A's pitcher with three wild pitches in a game since Doug John on Sept. 6, 1995 at Boston...has 41 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .226 (24-for-106) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .260 (26-for-100) the second time and .370 (30-for-81) after that...has yielded a .344 (22-for-64) batting average with runners in scoring position...has surrendered eight of his 11 home runs to right-handed hitters and has a .546 opponents slugging percentage against righties compared to .411 against lefties...has allowed a .456 (26-for-57) combined batting average to the opponents eight and nine hitters but the four and five hitters are a combined 11-for-62 (.177)...opponents are 19-for-45 (.422) with four doubles and four home runs (.778 slugging percentage) when putting the first pitch in play.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in four of his last five starts and eight of 13 for the season...is 2-1 in five starts with three runs of support or more compared to 1-5 in eight starts with two runs or fewer...last year, he was 12-1 in 20 starts with three runs of support or more and is now 31-3 in 47 such starts in his career.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.61 ERA (11 er in 38.0 ip) and .199 (27-for-136) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a starting assignment compared to an 8.05 ERA (31 er in 34.2 ip) and .351 (53-for-151) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

BEFORE THE BREAK: Has six losses this year, which match his combined pre-All-Star Break total from the previous two seasons...is 3-6 with a 5.20 ERA in 13 starts this year after going 20-6 with a 2.42 ERA in 37 starts before the All-Star Break over the previous two seasons.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 0-1 with a 3.28 ERA (9 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts in June...went 0-3 with a 9.61 ERA in four starts in May...allowed 25 runs, which were his most ever in a month (21, Aug. 2014)...surrendered five home runs, which match his most in a month (Aug. 2015)...went 3-2 with a 3.81 ERA in five starts in April...is now 10-3 with a 2.53 ERA in 15 career starts in April...the 10 wins are his most in any month.

START-BY-START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 victory over Chicago (AL) **April 6** in Oakland, the A's third game of the season...was scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start April 4 due to food poisoning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on **April 11** in Oakland...tossed 6.1 innings to go over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win over Kansas City **April 16** in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Cain in the top of the first and a RBI single to Fuentes in the fourth inning...won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-5 win at Toronto **April 22**...allowed a solo home run to Barney in the third inning, a Bautista sacrifice fly in the sixth and a Barney RBI single in the seventh...was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Detroit **April 27**...tossed 65 pitches in 2.0 innings...matched the shortest outing of his career and it was his shortest outing as a starter

(pitched 2.0 innings in his first two career outings, both in relief)...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 8-2 loss to Seattle in Oakland on **May 3**...matched his career highs by allowing seven runs on 11 hits...lost his third straight start in the A's 14-7 loss at Boston **May 9**...allowed a career-high tying seven runs for the second consecutive start...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win at Tampa Bay **May 15**...allowed a career-high tying three home runs (also Aug. 22, 2015 vs. Tampa Bay)...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to New York (AL) on **May 20**...allowed five runs on six hits and four walks in 3.1 innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss at Houston **June 5**...left with a 2-1 lead but Coulombe allowed a run in the sixth for the blown save and Dull allowed a run in the seventh for the loss...he was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at Cincinnati **June 10**...it was his sixth loss of the season, which is one short of his season total of seven from last year...the A's scored a run in the third and he retired each of the first 10 batters before walking Votto with one out in the fourth...did not allow a hit until Barnhart singled with one out in the sixth...allowed two runs in the seventh inning when Duvall had a RBI double and later scored on a wild pitch...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 loss to Texas on **June 15** in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on three hits and a walk over the first five innings and took a 5-0 lead into the sixth...allowed a leadoff home run to Chirinos followed by back-to-back doubles from Choo and Desmond...Fielder had a sacrifice fly to make the score 5-3 and Odor tied the game with a two-run home run...was relieved by Axford to start the seventh with the score tied at 5-5 and he allowed a home run to Chirinos for the loss.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-3 win over Milwaukee last Tuesday in Oakland...shutout the Brewers on two hits and a walk over the first three innings before allowing a RBI double to Nieuwenheis in the fourth inning...the A's tied the game in the fifth but he allowed an unearned run in the sixth as his own error on a pickoff attempt allowed Braun to advance to third before scoring on a Carter RBI single...the A's tied the game in the bottom of the sixth and he was relieved by Doolittle to start the seventh.

GRAY vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 5-3 with a 3.27 ERA (77.0 ip, 60 h, 31 r, 28 er, 23 bb, 68 so, 6 hr) in 12 career appearances, including 11 starts...is 3-3 with a 4.05 ERA (24 er in 53.1 ip) in eight starts in Oakland and 2-0 with a 1.52 ERA (4 er in 23.2 ip) in four games at Anaheim...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 4-1 loss on April 11 in Oakland...shut out the Angels on two hits and two walks over the first five innings but Tropeano blanked the A's on six hits and two walks in five innings...allowed three runs in the sixth inning on a Nava RBI single and a Trout two-run home run...went 3-1 with a 3.74 ERA (33.2 ip, 26 h, 16 r, 14 er, 7 bb, 26 so) in five starts last year.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Daniel Mengden (0-3, 3.00 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 11 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and his career...it will be his third start in an interleague game and his first start at night...has taken the loss in each of his first three starts, including his last start Wednesday against Milwaukee, a 4-2 loss (6.0 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 9 so)...joins Brad Rigby (1997) and Mike Morgan (1978) as the only three pitchers in Oakland history to lose each of the first three games of his career...has allowed three runs or fewer in each start and is just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1913 to lose each of his first three career games while allowing three runs or fewer in each game...has received two runs of support in his first three starts...went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts with Double-A Midland and 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA in seven starts with Nashville...combined for a 5-1 record and a 1.19 ERA in 11 starts overall.

- The A's bullpen compiled a 2.42 ERA over its first 27 games, a 6.69 ERA over its next 21 games from May 3-25 and has a 3.05 ERA (32 er in 94.1 ip) in 26 contests since then.
- Has tossed 260.0 innings, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed just 23-of-120 (19.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 15.3%).
