OAKLAND ATHLETICS (32-43) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (49-28)

MONDAY, JUNE 27, 2016 — AT&T PARK — 7:15 P.M. PDT RHP DANIEL MENGDEN (0-3, 3.00) VS. RHP JEFF SAMARDZIJA (8-4, 3.59) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their three-game winning streak snapped yesterday...are 4-2 over the last six games and 7-14 over the last 21...are 19-31 (.380) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 32-43 (.427) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West for the third consecutive day and trail first place Texas by 16½ games, which is one-half game short of the season high...since divisional play began in 1969, this is just the third time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 16½ or more games before the end of June (1979 and 2001)...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 18 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 2-5 (.286) in interleague play (1-2 vs. Cincinnati, 1-3 vs. Milwaukee), which is tied for the second worst record in the majors (Cincinnati, 4-11)...after these two games in San Francisco, the A's will host the Giants (June 29-30), Pittsburgh (July 1-3) and Chicago (Aug. 5-7) and travel to St. Louis (Aug. 26-28)...went 11-9 (.550) against the National League last year...it marked the fourth con-

secutive season and 12th time in 19 years the A's finished with a winning record in interleague play...are now 193-158 (.550) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 0-for-9 with six strikeouts and two sacrifice hits...now have a .081 (29-for-358) average with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 168 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997... the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .087)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

IN JUNE: The A's are 8-14 (.364) in the month of June, which is the third worst record in the American League...have clinched a losing record in June for the first time since going 9-17 in 2011...the offense has struck out 136 times, which is the fewest in the majors...rank last in the AL in runs (88), home runs (21) and slugging percentage (.401).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of the last 10 games and are 2-3 with a 2.88 ERA (18 er in 56.1 ip) over that span...have issued 11 walks (1.76 per nine innings), but have surrendered nine home runs...for the season, starters have the second fewest innings pitched in the majors (399.0), rank third in losses (34) and have the fourth highest ERA (5.03)...the A's used 10 different starting pitchers over a 27-game stretch from May 25-June 25...have employed 11 for the season, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 12)...starters have tossed fewer than five innings 24 times, which is the most in the majors...have gone 126 consecutive games without a complete game, which is the second longest streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009)...Rich Hill is 8-3 with a 2.25 ERA (16 er in 64.0 ip) in 11 starts...the other 10 starters are a combined 11-31 with a 5.56 ERA (207 er in 335.0 ip) in 64 games.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.14 ERA (110 er in 239.0 ip) over the last 27 games...logged a 3.33 ERA over the first 21 games and a 6.12 ERA over the next 27 contests from April 27 to May 25...have a 4.61 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.271) and on-base percentage (.333) and fourth highest opponents slugging percentage (.439)...have allowed 23 home runs over the last 13 games and 94 for the season...46 of those have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 55).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .276 (132-for-479) with 68 runs scored over the last 14 games (4.9 runs per game)...however, have just 36 walks over that stretch for a .330 on-base percentage (5 hbp, 5 sf)...have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.304) and the second lowest slugging percentage (.397)...rank second in fewest walks (179) and fewest strikeouts (504), tied for second in fewest runs (301), third in fewest doubles (113) and fourth in fewest home runs (77).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high tying three errors Friday night (fourth time)...have 13 errors in the last 13 games and 53 for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for fifth most in the majors...rank fourth in the AL in double plays (78)...A's outfielders have eight assists, which is second fewest in the majors (St. Louis, 7).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 0 for their last 9 and are batting .203 (12-for-59) for the season...rank second in the American League in hits (12) and plate appearances (60) and tied for third in RBI (6) and extra base hits (3)...are the only team without a pinch walk.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (3-1) and San Francisco (two games)...had their four-game road winning streak snapped yesterday and are now 4-1 over their last five road games...started the year 7-0 on the road and went 5-20 in between...went 1-7 on the last road trip and are 16-21 (.432) on the road for the season... went 3-6 on the last homestand against Texas (1-3), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Milwaukee (1-1) and are 16-22 (.421) at home, which is the third worst home record in the American League...return home following the game tomorrow for a five-game homestand against San Francisco (two games) and Pittsburgh (three games)...have a 5.35 ERA (190 er in 319.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.92 ERA (149 er in 342.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.91)...are batting .263 (345-for-1310) on the road compared to .243 (295-for-1212) at home.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost 10 of their last 14 one-run games after winning five of the first eight...are 9-13 (.409) in one-run games for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...are tied for the third most losses...are 2-1 in extra innings and the three extra inning games are tied for second fewest in the American League...all three extra inning games have come on the road.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 16 times and currently have 10 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hill, Manaea, Parker, Reddick, Sogard)...Manaea and Reddick are currently on rehab assignments...Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...the 16 players have combined to miss 693 games (43.3 games per stint)...have had at least 10 players on the DL every day since May 10 and at least six players on the DL all year... have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011... have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's lost five of six games to the Giants last year, matching their worst record against San Francisco (2009)...it marked just the fourth time in 19 years of interleague play Oakland lost the season series to the Giants...have won six season series and split nine...lost two of three in Oakland and were swept in a three-game series at San Francisco...have lost three straight and 16 of the last 19 games in San Francisco but have won 12 of the last 16 contests in Oakland...the A's are 54-52 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 32-21 in Oakland and 22-31 in San Francisco.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is 7-for-16 (.438) with seven runs scored and seven RBI over his last four games...seven of his last nine hits are for extra bases (four doubles, one triple, two home runs)...**Ryan Dull** has stranded all 32 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-45 (.022) with runners in scoring position...first batters faced are 2-for-32 (.063) with two walks...**Marcus Semien** leads American League shortstops and ranks third in the majors with 14 home runs...his career high is 15...**Danny Valencia** is batting .327, which ranks fourth in the AL among players with 200 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1987** Mark McGwire ties a pair of Oakland records by hitting three home runs and scoring five runs in the A's 13-3 win at Cleveland...in **1996** the A's hit a franchise record eight home runs in a 18-2 win at California...the A's also collect an Oakland record 44 total bases and 11 extra base hits and score in eight different innings, tying an American League record...in **2002** Miguel Tejada plays in his 348th consecutive game, breaking Alfredo Griffin's Oakland record for consecutive games played...Tejada's streak reached 594 before signing with Baltimore.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (0-3, 3.00 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 11 and is scheduled to make his fourth start of the season and his career...this will be his third start in an interleague game and his first start at night...made his Major League debut June 11 at Cincinnati after just 43 minor league appearances, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...had not pitched above Single-A prior to this year...became the 46th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the second this year (Sean Manaea, April 29)...the last of those 46 to take the loss was Brett Anderson on April 10, 2009 against Seattle.

FIRST THREE STARTS: Has taken the loss in each of his first three starts...joins Brad Rigby (1997) and Mike Morgan (1978) as the only three pitchers in Oakland history to lose each of the first three games of his career...Rigby had a no decision in his fourth game while Morgan went on to lose each of his first nine games before picking up the win in his 10th game.

THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Has allowed three runs or fewer in each of his first three starts...is just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1913 to lose each of his first three career games while allowing three runs or fewer in each game...the others are Duane Pillette (1949 Yankees), Jim McAndrew (1968 Mets) and Kyle Drabek (2010 Blue Jays)...only McAndrew extended the streak to four games.

STRIKEOUTS: Has finished with more strikeouts than innings pitched in two of his first three starts and has 21 strikeouts in 18.0 innings... since 1913, his 21 strikeouts are second most by an A's pitcher over the first three games of his career to Tim Hudson (24 in 1999)...Hudson has the most after four games with 28.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support in his first three starts (18.0 ip, 1.00 RSA)... had one run of support in his first start, none in his second start and one in his third.

WITH THE BAT: Went 0-for-2 with a strikeout in his Major League debut on June 11 at Cincinnati...those were his first at bats as a professional.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, a 2-1 A's loss at Cincinnati June 11...at the age of 23 years, 113 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to start a game since Trevor Cahill on June 19, 2011 (23 years, 110 days)...tossed 104 pitches, which tied for second most by an A's pitcher in his ML debut since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988 (Mazzaro, 105 on June 2, 2009)...the A's scored a run in the first and he blanked the Reds on three hits and a walk over the first two innings...struck out the first batter he faced (Cozart)...allowed his only runs in the third inning on a two-run home run by Bruce...was relieved by Dull after 5.2 innings with the A's trailing 2-1.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Texas June 16 in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on a hit and a walk over the first six innings and had retired 15 straight when he allowed a leadoff home run to Desmond in the seventh...an Alonso error contributed to an unearned run later in the inning and he was relieved by Dull with the bases loaded and one out in the seventh and the A's trailing 2-1...Dull struck out the final two batters in the inning...Colby Lewis retired the first 23 Athletics before Alonso walked in the eighth and had a no-hitter until Muncy doubled to lead off the ninth.

LAST START: He lost his third consecutive start in the A's 4-2 loss to Milwaukee last Wednesday in Oakland...shutout the Brewers on three hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the fifth inning...Flores scored on a Rivera sacrifice and Gennett added a two-run home run...was relieved by Rodriguez to start the seventh with the A's trailing 3-1..

MINORS: Began the season at Double-A Midland and went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts before he was promoted to Triple-A Nashville May 1... went 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds and combined for a 5-1 record and a 1.19 ERA in 11 minor league starts overall...the ERA was sixth lowest in all of the minor leagues at the time of his promotion... allowed just three home runs in 68.1 innings, an average of 0.40 per nine innings...yielded no home runs in 23.0 innings with Midland...went 4-0 with a 0.79 ERA over his first nine starts and was 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA over his final two starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .179 opponents batting average, including .177 (23-for-130) against right-handed hitters compared to .182 (20-for-110) against left-handers...surrendered all three of his home runs to righties...yielded a .068 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .077 with RISP and two outs...opponents were 8-for-64 (.125) with four walks and a hit by pitch (.188 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: The RockHounds were 4-0 in his starting assignments and the Sounds were 5-2...his teams combined for a 9-2 (.818) record in his 11 starts...had five starts where he did not allow a run but had just two wins and three no decisions in those games...tossed at least five innings in each of his 11 starts, including seven or more four times...allowed six hits or fewer in all 11 starts and allowed more than two runs just once...did not allow a run in the first or second inning...had a 0.41 ERA over the first four innings of a game and a 2.59 ERA from the fifth inning on.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a season-high eight batters and walked a season-high three but allowed just two hits in 6.0 scoreless innings in his first start April 9 at Arkansas...ended up with a no decision in a 4-1 win. posted an identical line in his next start April 15 against Arkansas but had another no decision in a 1-0 win...matched his season high in strikeouts and walks in his final Double-A start, a 2-0 win at Corpus Christi April 26... did not allow a run in either of his first two starts at Nashville after not allowing a run in three of his four starts with Midland...was 3-0 over that seasonopening six-start stretch and allowed just two earned runs in 36.0 ip for a 0.50 ERA...capped that streak by fanning a season-high tying eight in a season-high 7.0 innings May 8 against Memphis, but had a no decision in a 3-2 win ... extended his scoreless streak to 24.0 innings before allowing a run in the seventh inning May 13 at Iowa...that was the only run he allowed in seven innings but he had a no decision in a 3-2 loss...tossed 6.0 innings in four consecutive starts from May 8 to 25...allowed a season-high three runs on a season-high tying six hits but picked up the win May 30 at Salt Lake...was charged with his only loss in his final start on June 5 at Omaha, a 6-4 Sounds loss.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was originally drafted by Houston in the fourth round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft...was traded to Oakland with catcher Jacob Nottingham for left-handed pitcher Scott Kazmir on July 23, 2015...has compiled a 15-5 record and a 2.87 ERA (67 er in 210.0 ip) in 43 games, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...has 209 strikeouts in 210.0 innings...has allowed just 14 home runs, an average of 0.60 per nine innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (3-6, 4.68 ERA): Has allowed two runs or fewer in six of his last seven starts and is 2-1 with a 3.55 ERA over that span... went 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA over his first three starts and was 0-4 with a 9.31 ERA in four starts in between...has received two runs of support or fewer in seven of his 14 starts this year, including no runs three times and one run three times...his season run support average of 3.48 is fourth lowest in the American League...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 5-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) last Thursday (6.2 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against the Giants, a start in the A's 4-3 loss at San Francisco on July 26, 2015 (1.1 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...is 1-2 with a 3.26 ERA in four career interleague appearances, all starts...is 0-for-2 with two strikeouts and a sacrifice hit this year, his only career at bats as a professional.
