OAKLAND ATHLETICS (33-43) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (49-29)

TUESDAY, JUNE 28, 2016 — AT&T PARK — 7:15 P.M. PDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (3-6, 4.68) VS. RHP ALBERT SUAREZ (3-1, 3.68) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of their last five games but are 8-14 over the last 22 contests...are 20-31 (.392) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 33-43 (.434) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West for the fourth consecutive day and trail first place Texas by 16½ games, which is one-half game short of the season high...since divisional play began in 1969, this is just the third time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 16½ or more games before the end of June (1979 and 2001)... have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 19 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 3-5 (.375) in interleague play (1-3 vs. Milwaukee, 1-2 vs. Cincinnati, 1-0 vs. San Francisco)...have a 3.04 ERA (23 er in 68.0 ip), which is the third best interleague ERA in the majors...after tonight, the A's will host the Giants (Wednesday and Thursday), Pittsburgh (Friday through Sunday) and Chicago (Aug. 5-7) and travel to St. Louis (Aug. 26-28)...went 11-9 (.550) against the

National League last year...it marked the fourth consecutive season and 12th time in 19 years the A's finished with a winning record in interleague play...are now 194-158 (.551) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best in Major League history.

PITCHERS HITTING: A's pitchers are 0-for-13 with eight strikeouts and two sacrifice hits...now have a .080 (29-for-362) average with four doubles, 11 RBI, 10 walks and 170 strikeouts since interleague play began in 1997...the batting average is the lowest in the majors over that span (New York-AL, .087)...the last triple by an A's pitcher was by Blue Moon Odom on Aug. 22, 1971 against Boston...Odom also hit the last home run on Sept. 4, 1972 against California...the last extra base hit was by Joe Kennedy, a double on June 12, 2007 at Houston.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-1 on this six-game road trip to Los Angeles-AL (3-1) and San Francisco (1-0) and will finish with their first winning record on a road trip of six or more games since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4)... with a win tonight, will have their best record on a road trip of four or more games since Sept. 10-15, 2013 (5-1)...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 5-1 over the last six games... are 17-21 (.447) on the road overall...begin a five-game homestand tomorrow against San Francisco (two games) and Pittsburgh (three games)... went 3-6 on the last homestand against Texas (1-3), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Milwaukee (1-1) and are 16-22 (.421) at home, which is the third worst home record in the American League...have a 5.28 ERA (193 er in 328.2 ip) on the road compared to 3.92 ERA (149 er in 342.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.91)...are batting .265 (357-for-1346) on the road compared to .243 (295-for-1212) at home...have the fourth best road batting average in the AL.

IN JUNE: The A's are 9-14 (.391) in the month of June and have clinched a losing record in the month for the first time since going 9-17 in 2011...the offense has struck out 139 times, which is the fewest in the majors...rank last in the AL in runs (96), home runs (22) and slugging percentage (.407) and tied for last in extra base hits (66)...the pitching staff has a 4.34 ERA (98 er in 203.0 ip) in June, which is fourth lowest in the AL.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of the last 11 games...are 3-3 with a 2.81 ERA (20 er in 64.0 ip) over that span and have issued just 14 walks (1.97 per nine innings)...for the season, starters have the third fewest innings pitched (406.2) and third most losses (34) in the majors and have the fourth highest ERA (4.98)...the A's used 10 different starting pitchers over a 27-game stretch from May 25-June 25...have employed 11 for the season, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 12)...starters have tossed fewer than five innings 24 times, which is the most in the majors...have gone 127 consecutive games without a complete game, which is the second longest streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 4.10 ERA (113 er in 248.0 ip) over the last 28 games...logged a 3.33 ERA over the first 21 games and a

6.12 ERA over the next 27 contests from April 27 to May 25...have a 4.59 ERA for the season, which is third highest in the American League...have the second highest opponents batting average (.270), third highest onbase percentage (.332) and fourth highest opponents slugging percentage (.436)...have allowed 23 home runs over the last 14 games and 94 for the season...46 of those have come with runners on base, which is tied for second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 55).

OFFENSE: The A's have homered in a season-high six consecutive games (eight home runs total)...have 78 home runs for the season, which is tied for fourth fewest in the American League...have scored six or more runs in each of the last four games (28 runs total), which matches the longest streak by an A's team over the last three years...have 309 runs overall, which is fourth fewest in the AL...are batting .280 (144-for-515) with 76 runs scored over the last 15 games (5.1 runs per game)...have the lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.306) and the third lowest slugging percentage (.398)...rank second in fewest walks (184) and fewest strikeouts (507) and third in fewest doubles (117).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone three straight games without an error after committing a season-high tying three errors last Friday night (fourth time)...have 13 errors in the last 14 games and 53 for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for fifth most in the majors...rank fourth in the AL in double plays (80)...A's outfielders have eight assists, which is second fewest in the majors (St. Louis, 7).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 0 for their last 9 and are batting .203 (12-for-59) for the season...rank second in the American League in hits (12) and plate appearances (60) and tied for third in RBI (6) and extra base hits (3)...are the only team without a pinch walk.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost 10 of their last 14 one-run games after winning five of the first eight...are 9-13 (.409) in one-run games for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...are tied for the third most losses...are 2-1 in extra innings and the three extra inning games are tied for second fewest in the American League...all three extra inning games have come on the road.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Josh Reddick from the disabled list today, leaving them with nine players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Hill, Manaea, Parker, Sogard)...this marks the first time the A's have fewer than 10 players on the DL since May 9 when they also had nine...Hill and Manaea are currently on rehab assignments... Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...have used the disabled list 16 times this year and players on the DL have combined to miss 703 games (43.9 games per stint)...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's won the first game of 2016 last night...lost five of six games to the Giants last year, matching their worst record against San Francisco (2009)...it marked just the fourth time in 19 years of interleague play Oakland lost the season series to the Giants...have won six season series and split nine...lost two of three in Oakland and were swept in a three-game series at San Francisco...have lost 16 of the last 20 games in San Francisco but have won 12 of the last 16 contests in Oakland... the A's are 55-52 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 32-21 in Oakland and 23-31 in San Francisco...are 19-28 at AT&T Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Dull has stranded all 32 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-45 (.022) with runners in scoring position...**Marcus Semien** hit his 15th home run of the season last night, which matches his career high in 155 games last year...**Danny Valencia** is batting .335, which ranks third in the AL among players with 200 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1952** Bobby Shantz tosses a two-hit shutout and Gus Zernial homers twice and drives in five runs in the A's 12-0 win at New York...in **1994** Bobby Witt pitches a two-hit shutout to defeat the California Angels 3-0, setting a club record for fewest hits in consecutive complete games...in his previous start, he tossed a one-hitter against Kansas City.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (3-6, 4.68 ERA)

LAST SEVEN STARTS: Has allowed two runs or fewer in six of his last seven starts and is 2-1 with a 3.55 ERA (15 er in 38.0 ip) over that span. went 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA over his first three starts and was 0-4 with a 9.31 ERA in four starts in between (April 25-May 14).

INTERLEAGUE: Had a no decision in his only interleague start this year on June 12 at Cincinnati (4.0 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so, 2.25 ERA)...is 1-2 with a 3.26 ERA (19.1 ip, 24 h, 7 r, 7 er, 8 bb, 16 so, 3 hr) in four career interleague appearances, all starts

WITH THE BAT: Is 0-for-2 with two strikeouts and a sacrifice hit this year. his only career at bats as a professional...struck out in his first at bat at New York (AL) on April 20...batted in the fifth inning after the A's designated hitter (Lowrie) entered the game following an injury to Valencia... hit in the four spot in the order to become just the second A's pitcher with a plate appearance in the clean-up spot in the designated hitter era (Ron Flores, June 29, 2006 vs. San Diego).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in seven of his 14 starts this year, including no runs three times and one run three times. his season run support average of 3.48 (29 rs in 75.0 ip) is fourth lowest in the American League among pitchers with at least 70 innings pitched...is 0-5 in seven starts with two runs of support or fewer, 3-1 in six starts with three runs of support or more...is now 1-14 in 20 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 8-1 in 15 starts with three runs of support or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents have grounded into 11 double plays, which is tied for eighth most in the American League...has issued 19 of his 26 walks this year and 43 of 64 in his career to left-handed hitters. has a .307 (35-for-114) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .218 (24-for-110) the second time and .389 (28-for-72) after that...the opponents two through four hitters are batting a combined .349 (37-for-106) off him...has allowed a .154 (19-for-123) batting average with

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-3 with a 2.97 ERA (12 er in 36.1 ip) and .246 (34for-138) opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 2-3 with a 6.28 ERA (27 er in 38.2 ip) and .335 (53-for-158) opponents batting average in eight starts on the road...has surrendered just two home runs in 36.1 innings at home compared to 10 in 38.2 innings on the road

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 1-0 with a 3.68 ERA (9 er in 22.0 ip) in four starts in June...went 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in six starts in May...his May loss total tied for second in the American League...it was the first time he has lost four games in a month in his career...went 1-2 with a 4.03 ERA in four

THIS AND THAT: Has tossed fewer than five innings in three of his last six starts and five of 14 for the season...is 3-11 with a 5.07 ERA (64 er in 113.2 ip) and .294 (134-for-456) opponents average over his last 22 starts dating back to July 10, 2015...was 6-4 with a 3.20 ERA and .264 opponents average over the first 18 games of his career...allowed a career-high 10 hits in back-to-back starts on April 25 at Detroit and May 2 against Seattle and is the first A's pitcher with at least 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)...allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts.

LOSING STREAKS SNAPPED: Defeated Minnesota May 30 to snap his losing streak at five games...had a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned five starts from April 25 to May 19...the losing streak fell one short of his career high of six, which he ended with his first win of the season this year on April 20...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during that losing streak, which spanned nine starts from July 10, 2015 to April 7, 2016...it was the longest losing streak by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross lost eight straight from May 19 to Sept. 24, 2012.

START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Chicago (AL) April 7 in Oakland...the scored was tied at 0-0 when allowed a two-run home run to Abreu in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 12 in Oakland...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings and it came in the second inning when Simmons grounded into a double play...left with a 3-1 lead...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 win at New York (AL) on *April 20*...it was his first win since July 4, 2015 against Seattle...struck out a career-high eight batters on a careerhigh tying 111 pitches...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Detroit April 25...allowed a career-high 10 hits and left after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss to Seattle May 2 in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits for the second consecutive start...was the losing

pitcher in the A's 11-3 loss at Baltimore on May 8...yielded a career-high four home runs, which are the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since May 6, 2013 at Cleveland when Jarrod Parker also allowed four home runs...lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 6-0 loss at Tampa Bay May 14...allowed a two-run home run to Miller in the third inning and two more runs in the sixth...Andriese shut out the A's on two hits, no walks and a hit batter...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 to New York (AL) in Oakland on May 19...allowed a RBI double to Beltran in the third inning and a RBI double to Hicks in the sixth inning...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Seattle May 24...tossed just 4.2 innings and allowed two runs...yielded a RBI double to Cano in the first and a RBI single to Cruz in the third...picked up his second win of the season in the A's 3-2 win over Minnesota *May 30* in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Centeno in the second and a Dozier sacrifice fly in the fifth...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Houston in 12 innings on June 4...the A's scored three times in the second but he allowed three in the bottom of the second on a two-run home run by Gattis and a Marisnick sacrifice fly...also allowed a Rasmus RBI double in the third and a Correa RBI single in the fifth and left after 4.1 innings trailing 5-3...the A's scored single runs in the sixth and ninth innings to get him off the hook...he had a no decision in the A's 6-1 win at Cincinnati June 12... the A's scored four times in the second inning and he allowed his only run in the bottom of the second on a RBI double by Cabrera...had a 4-1 lead when he allowed a lead off single to Votto in the fifth inning...was relieved by Rodriguez who got the final two outs of that inning and pitched a scoreless sixth for the win...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win over Los Angeles June 17 in Oakland...allowed just one run in seven innings of work, a one-out solo home run by Calhoun in the third inning...retired each of the final 13 batters he faced...left after seven innings with a 2-1 lead but Madson allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save...it was the second time this year the A's bullpen blew a save in one of his start and both have come against the Angels (April 12)...Burns had a walk-off RBI single in the bottom of the ninth for the win.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) last Thursday...shutout the Angels on three hits over the first three innings and had a 4-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the fourth on a Giavotella RBI single and a Bandy sacrifice fly...those were the only runs he would allow in 6.2 innings of work.

RHP Sean Manaea (2-4, 6.02 ERA): Was reinstated from the disabled list today...made one start on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton last Friday against San Jose and had a no decision (3.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 1 hr, 64 pitches)...was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts at the time of the injury...his ERA is sixth highest in the American League among pitchers with 40 or more innings pitched...is 2-3 with a 4.17 ERA and .243 opponents batting average over his last six starts after going 0-1 with a 11.37 ERA and .382 opponents average over his first three starts...had a no decision in his last Major League start, a 14-5 A's win over Texas on June 13 (4.1 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...has never faced the Giants in his career...was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 after going 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA in three starts with the Sounds.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

13-9, 3.99 ERA (117 er in 264.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 20-for-28 (71.4%)

- The A's bullpen compiled a 2.42 ERA over its first 27 games, a 6.69 ERA over its next 21 games from May 3-25 and has a 3.48 ERA (38 er in 98.1 ip) in 27 contests since then.
- Has tossed 264.0 innings, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed just 24-of-125 (19.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 15.1%) and third best in the majors (San Francisco, 18.9%).
- Ranks third in the AL in strikeouts per walk (3.34) and walks per nine innings (2.52), fourth in fewest walks (74), tied for fourth in fewest losses (9) and tied for fifth in most home runs (33).
- Ranks second in the AL in first batter strikeouts (66) and has the third lowest first batter slugging percentage (.326).
