OAKLAND ATHLETICS (35-43) VS. SAN FRANCISCO GIANTS (49-31)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight and six of the last seven games after going 4-13 over a 17-game stretch from June 3-22...are 7-2 over the last nine games, which is the A's best nine-game stretch since June 16-25, 2015 (7-2)...are 22-31 (.415) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 35-43 (.449) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West for the sixth consecutive day...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 21 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 5-5 (.444) in interleague play (1-3 vs. Milwaukee, 1-2 vs. Cincinnati, 3-0 vs. San Francisco)...have won five of the last six games after losing each of the first four...after tonight, the A's will host Pittsburgh (Friday through Sunday) and Chicago (Aug. 5-7) and travel to St. Louis (Aug. 26-28)...went 11-9 (.550) against the National League last year...it marked the fourth consecutive sea-

son and 12th time in 19 years the A's finished with a winning record in interleague play...are now 196-158 (.554) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best in Major League history.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored six or more runs in each of the last six games (48 runs, 8.0 per game), which is the longest such streak by an A's team over the last three years...have homered in a season-high eight consecutive games (12 home runs total)...seven of the A's last nine home runs and 14 of the last 22 have come with runners on base...are batting .279 (163-for-585) with 96 runs scored over the last 17 games (5.6 runs per game)...for the season, have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.307), rank second in fewest walks (194) and fewest strikeouts (516) and third in fewest doubles (122).

STARTING PITCHING: Sean Manaea tossed 5.2 scoreless innings last night, marking just the fourth time this year an A's starting pitcher had a scoreless outing...that is tied for third fewest in the majors...A's starting pitchers are 4-3 with a 2.89 ERA (24 er in 74.2 ip) over the last 13 games and have issued just 16 walks (1.93 per nine innings)...are 21-34 with a 4.94 ERA (229 er in 417.1 ip) for the season...are tied for second in most losses and fewest innings pitched in the American League, have the third highest ERA and the fourth fewest wins...are one of five AL teams without a complete game and the A's streak of 129 consecutive games without a complete game is second longest in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009) and the second longest active streak in the AL (Baltimore, 263)...have used 11 different starting pitchers, which is the most in the AL and second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 12).

PITCHING: The A's ERA peaked at 4.97 on May 11, but Oakland has a 4.35 ERA (184 er in 380.2 ip) in 43 games since then...have a 4.63 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.272), third highest on-base percentage (.335) and fourth highest opponents slugging percentage (.439)...have allowed 25 home runs over the last 16 games and 96 for the season...46 of those have come with runners on base, which is tied for second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 58).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone five straight games without an error after committing a season-high tying three errors last Friday night (fourth time)...have 53 errors, which is second most in the American League (Minnesota, 54)...are tied for second in double plays (83)...A's outfielders have eight assists, which is second fewest in the majors (St. Louis, 7).

IN JUNE: The A's are 11-14 (.440) in the month of June and have clinched a losing record in the month for the first time since going 9-17 in 2011... the offense has struck out 148 times, which is the fewest in the majors... have the second fewest home runs in the American League (26), the second lowest slugging percentage (.418) and the third fewest extra base hits (76)...rank fourth in the American League in ERA (4.48).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 9-8 (.529) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 26-35 (.426) against righties...the

17 games against left-handed starters are fourth fewest in the American League...are batting .264 against left-handed pitchers, .251 against right-handers.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this five-game homestand against San Francisco (1-0) and Pittsburgh (three games)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Texas (1-3), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Milwaukee (1-1) and are 17-22 (.421) at home, which is the third worst home record in the American League...went 5-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (3-1) and San Francisco (2-0)...it was their first winning road trip of six or more games since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4) and their best record on a road trip of four or more games since Sept. 10-15, 2013 (5-1)...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 6-1 over the last seven games...are 18-21 (.462) on the road overall...have a 3.85 ERA (150 er in 351.0 ip) at home compared to 5.44 (204 er in 337.2 ip) on the road... have the fourth lowest home ERA in the AL and the highest road ERA...are batting .240 (306-for-1274) at home compared to .267 (370-for-1386) on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the AL and the fifth highest road batting average.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost 10 of their last 14 one-run games after winning five of the first eight...are 9-13 (.409) in one-run games for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...are tied for the third most losses...are 2-1 in extra innings and the three extra inning games are tied for second fewest in the American League...all three extra inning games have come on the road and the A's now have a streak of 58 consecutive home games without an extra inning game...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history to a 74-game streak from May 29, 1970 to May 2, 1971)...last played an extra inning game in the Coliseum on Aug. 18, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL, a 5-4 win in 10 innings.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-2 during this 20-game stretch without a day off that takes them into the All-Star Break...are batting .293 (93-for-317) with 60 runs scored (6.7 per game) over that stretch...are in game 17 of a 20-game stretch in which the A's play all of their games in California... the A's average time of game is 2 hours and 58 minutes, which is tied with Texas for second quickest in the majors (Toronto, 2:57)...A's pinch hitters are tied for the American League lead in RBI (11), rank second in hits (14) and plate appearances (63) and third in extra base hits (4).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Sean Doolittle on the 15-day disabled list today and now have nine players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Hill, Parker, Sogard)...have used the disabled list 17 times this year and players on the DL have combined to miss 724 games (42.6 games per stint)...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. GIANTS: The A's lead the season series 3-0...won the first game in Oakland last night after sweeping a two-game series in San Francisco on Monday and Tuesday...have won the season series for the seventh time in 20 years of interleague play (split nine, lost four)...neither team has ever swept a season series...the A's have won 13 of the last 17 games in Oakland but have lost 16 of the last 21 in San Francisco...are 57-52 all-time against the Giants during interleague play...that breaks down to 33-21 in Oakland and 24-31 in San Francisco...are 20-28 at AT&T Park.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp has hit safely and scored a run in each of his last seven games...is 12-for-28 (.429) with 11 runs over that span...Khris Davis is batting .323 (20-for-62) with five home runs, 17 RBI and 13 runs scored over his last 16 games...Ryan Dull has stranded all 34 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-46 (.022) with runners in scoring position...Marcus Semien has a career-high tying 15 home runs...Danny Valencia is batting .326, which ranks fifth in the American League among players with 200 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1995** Mark McGwire hits a two-out grand slam in the bottom of the ninth inning off California's Lee Smith to lift the A's to an 8-5 victory over the Angels...in **2001** Miguel Tejada has three home runs and eight RBI in the A's 15-4 win at Texas.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Dillon Overton (1-0, 4.76 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville last Saturday and made his Major League debut that day after just 53 minor league appearances, including 50 starts, in three professional seasons...had not pitched above Double-A prior to this year...became the 47th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the third this year (Manaea and Mengden)...is the fifth pitcher to make his first ML start for the A's this year (Neal and Triggs)...became the 15th pitcher in Oakland history to pick up the win in his debut, the first since Bobby Cramer on Sept. 13, 2010 at Kansas City...the last complete game was by Mike Morgan June 11, 1978 against Baltimore and the only shutout is by Mike Norris April 10, 1975 against Chicago...the 47 pitchers to start in their debut have combined for a 14-15 record and a 3.75 ERA.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in his Major League debut, a 7-3 A's win at Los Angeles (AL) last Saturday...tossed 108 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in his ML debut since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988 (previous: Mazzaro, 105 on June 2, 2009)...became the third pitcher in Oakland history to allow three home runs in his debut (Jeff Kaiser, April 11, 1985; Rick Rodriguez, Sept. 17, 1986)...all three home runs were solo shots, including back-to-back home runs by Calhoun and Trout in the first and a two-out shot by Pujols in the fifth.

WITH NASHVILLE: Went 8-4 with a 3.01 ERA in 14 games, including 13 starts, with Triple-A Nashville...was tied for second in the Pacific Coast League in wins, ranked fourth in ERA and fifth in strikeouts (72) at the time of his promotion...won each of his final seven starts for the Sounds beginning May 17...logged a 1.40 ERA (7 er in 45.0 ip) and .215 (35-for-163) opponents batting average during the winning streak and did not surrender a home run...went 1-4 with a 4.89 ERA and .305 opponents batting average over his first seven games.

THE LONG BALL: Surrendered just two home runs in 83.2 innings, an average of 0.22 per nine innings...both of the home runs came in one start on May 6 against Memphis...finished with an eight-game, 52.0-inning, 216-batter faced homerless streak...has allowed 13 home runs in 246.2 career innings (0.47 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .260 opponents batting average, including .251 (58-for-231) against right-handed hitters compared to .281 (27-for-96) against left-handers...surrendered both of his home runs to righties...walked just three batters to lead off an inning...opponents hit .215 with the bases empty compared to .319 with runners on base...they were 3-for-8 (.375) with a grand slam with the bases loaded

THIS AND THAT: Tossed at least six innings in 10 of his 14 appearances, allowed five hits or fewer nine times, two runs or fewer eight times and one walk or fewer 10 times...allowed 14 of his 32 runs in the second inning for a 9.00 ERA (13 er in 13.0 ip)...had a 1.91 ERA (15 er in 70.2 ip) in all other innings

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a season-high eight batters in a seasonlow 4.0 innings in his first start April 9 against Oklahoma City and took the loss...tossed his lone complete game of the season in the second game of an April 20 doubleheader at Colorado Springs, an 8-1 win (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 5 so)...made his only relief appearance April 25 against New Orleans in a game started by Henderson Alvarez on a rehab assignment (4.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season high 11 hits in a 7-6 loss to Memphis May 6...began his seven-game winning streak May 17 against Fresno when he matched his season-high with eight strikeouts...allowed just one run in 6.2 innings then allowed one run in 6.0 innings in his next start May 23 at Las Vegas...walked a season-high four batters in 5.0 innings May 28 at Salt Lake...matched his season-high with four walks June 10 at Oklahoma City...tossed 6.0 shutouts innings that day, allowed two unearned runs in his next start and then logged 7.1 scoreless innings in his final start...did not allow an earned run over his final 25.1 innings and went 4-0 with a 0.99 ERA in four starts in June.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was a non-roster invitee with the A's this spring and did not allow a run in three relief appearances (6.0 ip, 5 h, 1 bb, 7 so)...opponents went 5-for-22 (.227)...was reassigned to minor league camp March 13.

2015 RECAP: Started the year at Single-A Stockton and was 2-4 with a 3.82 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, when he was promoted to Double-A Midland July 2...went 5-2 with a 3.06 ERA in 13 starts with the RockHounds and combined for a 7-6 record and a 3.43 ERA in 27 games, including 25 starts...led the A's farm system in ERA and tied for third in strikeouts (106)...walked just 27 batters in 126.0 innings, an average of 1.93 per nine innings...allowed a .265 opponents batting average, including .249 (43-for-173) against left-handed hitters compared to .274 (84-for-307) against right-handers...was rated as the A's eighth best prospect by Baseball America following the season.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (3-6, 5.03 ERA): Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 5 and is 0-1 with a 3.23 ERA in five starts since his return... has walked one batter in each of those five starts...was placed on the DL May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA in nine starts before going on the DL...is 0-5 with a 6.19 ERA over his last 10 starts...the five-game losing streak is a career high matches the A's season high and is tied for the third longest active losing streak in the American League...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-6 A's loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)... has faced the Pirates once in his career and it came in relief in his Major League debut on July 10, 2013 at Pittsburgh (2.0 ip, 1 h, 3 so)...is 0-1 with a 1.98 ERA in two interleague starts this year and 3-3 with a 2.93 ERA in 10 career interleague appearances, including nine starts

- Has tossed 271.1 innings, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed 26-of-130 (20.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Houston, 15.1%).
