OAKLAND ATHLETICS (35-44) VS. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (38-41)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their three-game winning streak snapped last night...are now 7-3 over the first 10 days of this 20-day stretch without a day off that takes the A's into the All-Star Break...are 22-32 (.407) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 35-44 (.443) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West for the seventh consecutive day and trail first place Texas by 15½ games...that is the A's third largest deficit in the AL West at the end of June since divisional play began in 1969 (23 in 1979, 20 in 2001)...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 22 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 5-6 (.455) in interleague play (1-3 vs. Milwaukee, 1-2 vs. Cincinnati, 3-1 vs. San Francisco)...have won five of the last seven games after losing each of the first four...after this three game series with the Pirates the A's will host Chicago (Aug. 5-7) and travel to St. Louis (Aug. 26-28)...went 11-9 (.550) against the National League last year...it marked the fourth consecutive season and 12th time in 19 years the A's finished with a winning record in interleague play...are now 196-159 (.552) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best in Major League history.

IN JUNE: The A's finished June with an 11-15 (.423) record...it marked the first time they had a losing record in June since going 9-17 in 2011...the offense struck out 158 times, which was the fewest in the majors...had the third fewest stolen bases in the AL in June (7), tied for the third fewest home runs (28) and had the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.423).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored six or more runs in each of the last seven games (54 runs, 7.7 per game), which is the second longest such streak by an A's team over the last 12 years (8, April 3-11, 2013)...have homered in a season-high nine consecutive games (14 home runs total)...eight of the A's last 11 home runs and 15 of the last 24 have come with runners on base...are batting .278 (173-for-622) with 102 runs scored over the last 18 games (5.7 runs per game)...for the season, have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.307), rank second in fewest walks (195) and fewest strikeouts (526) and fourth in fewest doubles (126).

STARTING PITCHING: Dillon Overton tossed 3.0 innings last night, which marks the 25th time this year an A's starting pitcher has logged fewer than five innings...that is the most in the majors...A's starting pitchers are 4-4 with a 3.71 ERA (32 er in 77.2 ip) over the last 14 games and have issued just 19 walks (2.20 per nine innings)...are 21-35 with a 5.07 ERA (237 er in 420.1 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in most losses, fewest innings pitched and highest ERA and fourth in fewest wins...are one of five AL teams without a complete game and the A's streak of 130 consecutive games without a complete game is second longest in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009) and the second longest active streak in the AL (Baltimore, 264)...have used 11 different starting pitchers, which is the most in the AL and second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 12).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 24 runs in the last three games, including one on Wednesday, and now have a 5.07 ERA (86 er in 152.2 ip) over the last 17 contests...have a 4.72 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.273) and on-base percentage (.337) and fourth highest opponents slugging percentage (.442)...have allowed 27 home runs over the last 17 games and 98 for the season...47 of those have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 61).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have a season-high tying six-game errorless streak (May 29-June 4)...however, have committed 53 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League (Minnesota, 55)...rank second in double plays (86)...A's outfielders have eight assists, which is second fewest in the majors (St. Louis, 7).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 9-9 (.500) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 26-35 (.426) against righties...the 18 games against left-handed starters are fourth fewest in the AL...are batting .265 against left-handed pitchers, .251 against right-handers.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this five-game homestand against San Francisco (1-1) and Pittsburgh (three games)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Texas (1-3), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Milwaukee (1-1) and are 17-23 (.425) at home, which is the third worst home record in the American League...went 5-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (3-1) and San Francisco (2-0)...it was their first winning road trip of six or more games since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4) and their best record on a road trip of four or more games since Sept. 10-15, 2013 (5-1)...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 6-1 over the last seven games...are 18-21 (.462) on the road overall...have a 4.05 ERA (162 er in 360.0 ip) at home compared to 5.44 (204 er in 337.2 ip) on the road...are batting .241 (316-for-1311) at home compared to .267 (370-for-1386) on the road...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL and the fifth highest road batting average.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost 10 of their last 14 one-run games after winning five of the first eight...are 9-13 (.409) in one-run games for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...are 2-1 in extra innings and the three extra inning games are tied for second fewest in the American League...all three extra inning games have come on the road and the A's now have a streak of 59 consecutive home games without an extra inning game...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history to a 74-game streak from May 29, 1970 to May 2, 1971)...last played an extra inning game in the Coliseum on Aug. 18, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL, a 5-4 win in 10 innings.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have played two of their three longest nine-inning games of the season in the last three days (3:53 on Tuesday, 3:43 last night) and are averaging 3:20 over the last six games...for the season, the average time of game is 2 hours and 59 minutes, which is tied for second quickest in the majors (Toronto, 2:57)...A's pinch hitters are tied for the American League lead in RBI (11) and rank second in hits (14) and plate appearances (63)...are in game 18 of a 20-game stretch in which the A's play all of their games in California.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Sean Doolittle on the 15-day disabled list yesterday and now have nine players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Hill, Parker, Sogard)...have used the disabled list 17 times this year and players on the DL have combined to miss 733 games (43.1 games per stint)...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. PIRATES: The A's lead the all-time series, 11-1...that is the best record by one team against any other team...have won all six games in Oakland and are 5-1 in Pittsburgh...won each of the first 11 games before losing their last meeting on July 10, 2013 at Pittsburgh...the two clubs last squared off in Oakland in 2010...also met in Oakland and 2004 and Pittsburgh in 2002.

Khris Davis is batting .323 (20-for-62) with five home runs, 17 RBI and 13 runs scored over his last 16 games...**Ryan Dull** has stranded all 34 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-46 (.022) with runners in scoring position...**Marcus Semien** hit his 16th home run of the season last night, which is a new career high and the most among American League shortstops...**Danny Valencia** is batting .324, which ranks fifth in the AL among players with 200 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1902** Rube Waddell becomes the first major league pitcher to strikeout the side on nine pitches...he turns the trick in the third inning of the A's 2-0 win over Baltimore, his first victory as an Athletic...in **1979** the A's collect a club record 29 hits in a 13-12, 15 inning win at Texas...Jim Esian has five hits and Rickey Henderson, Mike Heath and Mike Edwards add four each...Texas starter Jon Matlack allows 12 hits in 5 1/3 and losing pitcher Doc Medich allows 12 hits in 8 1/3 innings of relief...in **2007** Dan Haren extends his winning streak to 10 games in the A's 11-5 win at New York.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (3-6, 5.03 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 5 and is 0-1 with a 3.23 ERA (11 er in 30.2 ip) in five starts since his return...has walked one batter in each of those five starts...was placed on the DL May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA in nine starts before going on the DL.

FIVE-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-5 with a 6.19 ERA (36 er in 52.1 ip) and .298 (64-for-215) opponents batting average over his last 10 starts...the five-game losing streak is a career high (previous: 4, Aug. 1-16, 2014), matches the A's season high and is tied for the third longest active losing streak in the American League...allowed at least four runs in each of his first five starts during the streak marking the first time in his career he has allowed four or more runs in more than two consecutive starts...went 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA and .232 opponents batting average over his first four starts.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 0-1 with a 1.98 ERA (13.2 ip, 12 h, 4 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 11 so, 0 hr) in two interleague starts this year...went 2-1 with a 1.69 ERA in three starts against the National League last year...is now 3-3 with a 2.93 ERA (20 er in 61.1 ip) in 10 career interleague appearances, including nine starts.

WILD PITCHES: Leads the majors with 11 wild pitches, which matches the most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break (Cahill, 2011; Darling, 1992)...had three wild pitches May 20 against New York and is the first A's pitcher with three wild pitches in a game since Doug John on Sept. 6, 1995 at Boston...has 41 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .248 (55-for-222) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup, .352 (31-for-88) after that...has yielded a .338 (23-for-68) batting average with runners in scoring position...has surrendered eight of his 11 home runs to right-handed hitters and has a .525 opponents slugging percentage against righties compared to .401 against lefties...has allowed a .433 (26-for-60) combined batting average to the opponents eight and nine hitters but the four and five hitters are a combined 13-for-67 (.194)...opponents are 20-for-46 (.435) with four doubles and four home runs (.783 slugging percentage) when putting the first pitch in play.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in four of his last six starts and eight of 14 for the season...is 2-1 in six starts with three runs of support or more compared to 1-5 in eight starts with two runs or fewer...last year, he was 12-1 in 20 starts with three runs of support or more and is now 31-3 in 48 such starts in his career.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.85 ERA (13 er in 41.0 ip) and .215 (32-for-149) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a starting assignment compared to a 7.41 ERA (31 er in 37.2 ip) and .335 (54-for-161) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

BEFORE THE BREAK: Has six losses this year, which match his combined pre-All-Star Break total from the previous two seasons...is 3-6 with a 5.03 ERA in 14 starts this year after going 20-6 with a 2.42 ERA in 37 starts before the All-Star Break over the previous two seasons.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-0 with a 2.78 ERA (7 er in 22.2 ip) in four starts during the day compared to 2-6 with a 5.95 ERA (37 er in 56.0 ip) in 10 starts at night...last year, he went 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA in nine starts during the day...it was the sixth lowest day ERA in Oakland history among pitchers with 50 or more day innings...over the last two years, he is 6-2 with a 2.05 ERA (19 er in 83.1 ip) in 13 starts during the day, 11-11 with a 3.90 ERA (88 er in 203.1 ip) in 32 starts at night.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 7-1 with a 1.64 ERA (14 er in 77.0 ip) in 12 career appearances in the month of July...the ERA is his lowest for any month of the season...went 0-1 with a 3.23 ERA in five starts in June after going 0-3 with a 9.61 ERA in four starts in May...allowed 25 runs in May, which were his most ever in a month (21, Aug. 2014)...surrendered five home runs in May, which match his most in a month (Aug. 2015)...went 3-2 with a 3.81 ERA in five starts in April...is now 10-3 with a 2.53 ERA in 15 career starts in April...the 10 wins are his most in any month.

START-BY-START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 2-1 victory over Chicago (AL) **April 6** in Oakland, the A's third game of the season...was scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start April 4 due to food poisoning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on **April**

11 in Oakland...tossed 6.1 innings to go over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-3 win over Kansas City **April 16** in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Cain in the top of the first and a RBI single to Fuentes in the fourth inning...won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-5 win at Toronto **April 22**...allowed a solo home run to Barney in the third inning, a Bautista sacrifice fly in the sixth and a Barney RBI single in the seventh...was the losing pitcher in the A's 9-4 loss at Detroit **April 27**...tossed 65 pitches in 2.0 innings...matched the shortest outing of his career and it was his shortest outing as a starter (pitched 2.0 innings in his first two career outings, both in relief)...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 8-2 loss to Seattle in Oakland on **May 3**...matched his career highs by allowing seven runs on 11 hits...lost his third straight start in the A's 14-7 loss at Boston **May 9**...allowed a career-high tying seven runs for the second consecutive start...had a no decision in the A's 7-6 win at Tampa Bay **May 15**...allowed a career-high tying three home runs (also Aug. 22, 2015 vs. Tampa Bay)...was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-3 loss to New York (AL) on **May 20**...allowed five runs on six hits and four walks in 3.1 innings...had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss at Houston **June 5**...left with a 2-1 lead but Coulombe allowed a run in the sixth for the blown save and Dull allowed a run in the seventh for the loss...he was the losing pitcher in the A's 2-1 loss at Cincinnati **June 10**...it was his sixth loss of the season, which is one short of his season total of seven from last year...did not allow a hit until Barnhart singled with one out in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 7-5 loss to Texas on **June 15** in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on three hits and a walk over the first five innings and took a 5-0 lead into the sixth...allowed a leadoff home run to Chirinos followed by back-to-back doubles from Choo and Desmond...Fielder had a sacrifice fly to make the score 5-3 and Odor tied the game with a two-run home run...was relieved by Axford to start the seventh with the score tied at 5-5 and he allowed a home run to Chirinos for the loss...had a no decision in the A's 5-3 win over Milwaukee **June 21** in Oakland...shutout the Brewers on two hits and a walk over the first three innings before allowing a RBI double to Nieuwenheis in the fourth inning...the A's tied the game in the fifth but he allowed an unearned run in the sixth as his own error on a pickoff attempt allowed Braun to advance to third before scoring on a Carter RBI single...the A's tied the game in the bottom of the sixth and he was relieved by Doolittle to start the seventh.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Sunday...allowed the first two batters of the game to reach base and score but those were the only two runs he allowed in six innings of work...Cron had a RBI single and Giavotella a sacrifice fly...left after six innings with a 6-2 lead but the bullpen allowed five runs over the final three innings with Axford getting the blown save and Hendriks the loss.

RHP Rich Hill (8-3, 2.25 ERA): Will be reinstated from the DL tomorrow after making one rehab start with Single-A Stockton on Monday at Modesto (3.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so)...was placed on the DL June 9 retroactive to May 30 with a strained left groin...thru May 30, he had the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.267), ranked second in wins (8) and ERA (2.25), third in strikeouts (74) and fifth in opponents batting average (.207)...is 5-0 with a 1.97 ERA and .190 opponents batting average over his last five starts and has not allowed a home run...the winning streak is one short of his career high...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 4-2 A's win over Detroit in Oakland on May 29 (6.1 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 9 so)...is 3-1 with a 3.79 ERA in seven career appearances against Pittsburgh, all starts...last faced the Pirates on April 18, 2008 at Chicago (NL)...was the winning pitcher in a 3-2 win (5.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 4 so).

- Has tossed 277.1 innings, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed 29-of-135 (21.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 15.1%).
