PITTSBURGH PIRATES (38-41) vs. OAKLAND ATHLETICS (35-44)

JULY 1, 2016 at Oakland Coliseum, Oakland, CA --- GAME #80/ROAD #39

LHP JEFF LOCKE (7-5, 5.12 ERA) vs. RHP SONNY GRAY (3-6, 5.03 ERA)

THE PIRATES... had the day off yesterday after beating the Mariners in Seattle, 8-1, Wednesday night...Have gone 4-2 in their last six games after losing eight-of-nine...Were a season-high nine games over .500 following their win in Texas on 5/27 (28-19); have gone 10-22 since then...Won a season-high six straight games from 4/24-30...Were 45-34 after 79 games in 2015 (46-34 after 80).

AND ON THE 49th DAY, WE RESTED: Yesterday's off day was the first non-traveling day off for the Pirates since May 12 in Chicago...Beginning with their game in Chicago on May 13, the Pirates had games scheduled for 31 straight days thru June 12, and aside from their travel day on June 13, the Bucs came to a ballpark ready to play a game 47 times in 48 days.

NOT GETTING A's: The Pirates have gone 1-11 against the Athletics in interleague play, which includes an 0-6 record here in Oakland...The Bucs lost each of their first 10 meetings with the A's before winning the final game played between the two clubs on 7/3/13 at PNC Park...Tonight's game is the first one for Pittsburgh in Oakland since 6/27/10.

NEARING HALFWAY: Tomorrow marks the midway point of the season (in terms of games) for the Pirates...They were 47-34 after 81 games last year and 41-40 in 2014...Here is a monthly breakdown of the 2016 season thus far:

ALL RIGHT ON THE ROAD: Starling Marte's .351 road batting average ranks fifth among the National League leaders and his .355 average against right-handed pitchers ranks third...Overall this season, Marte is batting .354 (40-for-113) against RHP on the road with 10 doubles, two triples, four home runs and 17 RBI (.965 OPS).

HOT ROD: Sean Rodriguez tied his career high (fourth time) with four RBI Wednesday in Seattle...He reached base safely four times in five plates appearances Wednesday and has gone 4-for-7 with five RBI and four walks in his last three games.

A STARLING SHINING BRIGHT: Starling Marte hit .345 (29-for-84) in 25 games last month and currently ranks third in the league with a .331 average...Marte also ranks third in the league in multi-hit games (31), second in stolen bases (21) and is sixth in hits (92).

PEN PALS: The Bucco relievers tossed 3.0 perfect frames Wednesday in Seattle and have pitched 20.2 consecutive scoreless innings and have struck out 15 batters, dating back to the seventh inning last Friday night.

BUCCON ON THE ROAD: The Bucs are 1-1 on this nine-game, 10-day road trip following their two-game split in Seattle Tuesday and Wednesday...The trip concludes with four games in St. Louis, beginning with a 4th of July contest at 1:15 CDT.

PLEASED WITH FELIZ: Neftali Feliz has produced a 1.96 ERA (18.1ip/4er) in his last 22 appearances and has been scored upon in just five of his 35 games overall...In his last 15 games against Oakland, Feliz has posted a 0.64 ERA (14.0ip/1er).

HOW MAY I ASSIST YOU?: 2015 Gold Glove Award winner Starling Marte shares the National League lead in outfield assists (nine) after leading the circuit with 16 last season...As a team, the Pirates rank second in the league with 19 outfield assists, trailing only the Atlanta Braves (22).

JUNG HO AND THE A.L.: Jung Ho Kang is hitting .333 (8-for-24) with three home runs and seven RBI in six interleague games this season and .360 (32-for-89) with six homers and 15 RBI in 23 career games against American League teams...In his last 11 interleague games, Kang is hitting .422 (19-for-45) with five home runs.

MOVING UP THE CHARTS: Andrew McCutchen is tied with Frank Thomas (163) for seventh place on the club's all-time home run list...Brian Giles ranks sixth with 165 and Dave Parker is fifth with 166...In Pittsburgh's 130 seasons of play in the National League, only two right-handed batters have hit more home runs than McCutchen; Hall-of-Famers Ralph Kiner (301) and Roberto Clemente (240).

SAVING THE DAY: Bucco closer Mark Melancon has converted each of his last 18 save situations dating back to 4/27...He has gone 22-for-23 in save opportunities this season, suffering his only blown save on 4/24 at Arizona...His 73 saves since the beginning of last season are tops in all of Major League Baseball and his 106 since the start of the 2014 season rank second in the Majors behind Trevor Rosenthal (107)...Melancon's 93.8 save pct. since 2014 is the best mark in MLB.

LEADING THINGS OFF: John Jaso connected off Jeff Samardzija for his second leadoff home run of the season on 6/22 and the sixth of his career...Jaso is hitting .367 (18-for-49) with seven walks and 11 runs scored in the first inning this season...As a team, Pittsburgh's leadoff hitters rank first in the league in batting average (.307), third in OPS (.845), third in on-base percentage (.384) and fourth in slugging percentage (.461).

REJOYCE REJOYCE: Matt Joyce, who is hitting .320 (8-for-25) overall in his last 11 games, has gone 10-for-28 (.357) as a pinch hitter this season, leading MLB in home runs (4), RBI (13) and runs scored (9)...Joyce's four pinch hit home runs are tied with Mark Johnson (1996) for the second-most in club history behind Craig Wilson (7 in 2001), and his 13 RBI are three

CHAD KUHL: The 23-year-old righthander will be making his second Major League start tomorrow night... Made his big league debut and won a 4-3 decision over Clayton Kershaw and the Dodgers at PNC Park Sunday night (5.0ip/4h/3r/3er/4bb/5so)...Was selected Sunday from Triple-A Indianapolis, where he went 6-2 with a 2.58 ERA in 14 starts...Went 3-1 with a 0.99 ERA (45.2ip/5er) in his first eight minor league starts thru 5/21...Was Pittsburgh's ninth round selection in the 2013 First-Year Player Draft...Was ranked sixth among International League leaders in ERA at the time of his promotio and produced a 19.0-inning scoreless streak from 5/11-21...Has produced a 2.89 ERA since the start of the 2014 season, the fourth-lowest in all of minor league baseball among pitchers with at least 350.0ip.
