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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (35-45) VS. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (39-41)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost back-to-back games after winning six of the previous seven contests...are now 7-4 over the first 11 days of this 20-day stretch without a day off that takes the A's into the All-Star Break...are 22-33 (.400) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 35-45 (.438) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West for the seventh consecutive day and trail first place Texas by 16½ games, which is one-half game short of the season high...since divisional play began in 1969, this is just the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 16½ or more games before the All-Star Break (1979, 1986 and 2001)...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 23 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth.

THE HALFWAY POINT: The A's will play their 81st game of the season tonight, which is the halfway point the season...a loss tonight would match the sixth worst record at the halfway mark in Oakland history (last: 35-46 in 2009) and a win would match the eighth worst (last: 36-45 in 2015)...the offense has walked 198 times and are on pace for 401, which would be the fewest in Athletics history in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...have a .306 on-base percentage, which would be the lowest by an A's team since 1979 (.302)...have a 4.75 ERA, which would be the A's highest since 1998 (4.81)...have 39 wild pitches and are more than halfway to the Oakland record of 72 set in 1979...have allowed 99 home runs and are on pace for 200, which would be the second highest total in Oakland history (205 in 1996)...the pitching staff has 595 strikeouts and are on pace for 1205, which would be the second highest total in Athletics history (1244 in 2014)...the defense has turned 87 double plays and is on pace for 176, which would be the second highest total in Oakland history (195 in 1996).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 5-7 (.417) in interleague play (1-3 vs. Milwaukee, 1-2 vs. Cincinnati, 3-1 vs. San Francisco, 0-1 vs. Pittsburgh)...after this three game series with the Pirates the A's will host Chicago (Aug. 5-7) and travel to St. Louis (Aug. 26-28)...went 11-9 (.550) against the National League last year...it marked the fourth consecutive season and 12th time in 19 years the A's finished with a winning record in interleague play...are now 196-160 (.551) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best in Major League history.

OFFENSE: The A's have homered in a season-high 10 consecutive games (15 home runs total)...nine of the A's last 12 home runs and 16 of the last 25 have come with runners on base...are batting .271 (177-for-654) with 105 runs scored over the last 19 games (5.5 runs per game)...for the season, have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.306), rank second in fewest walks (198) and fewest strikeouts (534) and fourth in fewest doubles (127).

STARTING PITCHING: Sonny Gray allowed seven runs last night after Dillon Overton yielded eight the night before...this is the second time this year A's starters have yielded seven or more runs in back-to-back games (May 9-10 at Boston)...have allowed 15 runs in 9.0 innings over the last two games after yielding 28 runs in 74.2 innings (2.89 ERA) over the previous 13 contests...starters are 21-36 with a 5.15 ERA (244 er in 426.1 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in most losses, fewest innings pitched and highest ERA and fourth in fewest wins.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 31 runs in the last four games and now have a 5.18 ERA (93 er in 161.2 ip) over the last 18 contests...have a 4.75 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.273) and third highest on-base percentage (.337) and slugging percentage (.441).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone seven consecutive games without an error, which matches their longest errorless streak over the last eight years (Aug. 5-11, 2009 and May 17-24, 2013)...however, have committed 53 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League (Minnesota, 55)...rank second in double plays (87)...A's outfielders have eight assists, which is second fewest in the majors (St. Louis, 7).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this five-game homestand against San Francisco (1-1) and Pittsburgh (0-1)...went 3-6 on the last homestand against Texas (1-3), Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and Milwaukee (1-1) and are 17-24 (.415) at home, which is the third worst home record in the American League...went 5-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (3-1) and San Francisco (2-0)...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 6-1 over the last seven games...are 18-21 (.462) on the road overall...leave following the game tomorrow for a seven-game road trip to Minnesota (three games) and Houston (four games)...are batting .238 (320-for-1343) at home compared to .267 (370-for-1386) on the road...have the second lowest home batting average in the AL and the fourth highest road batting average...have a 4.12 ERA (169 er in 369.0 ip) at home compared to 5.44 (204 er in 337.2 ip) on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have lost 10 of their last 14 one-run games after winning five of the first eight...are 9-13 (.409) in one-run games for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...are 2-1 in extra innings and the three extra inning games are tied for second fewest in the AL...all three extra inning games have come on the road and the A's now have a streak of 60 consecutive home games without an extra inning game...that is the second longest such streak in Oakland history to a 74-game streak from May 29, 1970 to May 2, 1971...last played an extra inning game in the Coliseum on Aug. 18, 2015 vs. Los Angeles-NL, a 5-4 win in 10 innings.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have played two of their three longest nine-inning games of the season in the last four days (3:53 on Tuesday, 3:43 last night) and are averaging 3:15 over the last eight games...however, are average 2 hours and 58 minutes per game for the season, which is the shortest in the majors...A's pinch hitters are tied for the American League lead in RBI (11) and rank second in hits (14) and plate appearances (63)...are in game 19 of a 20-game stretch in which the A's play all of their games in California...are 9-10 (.474) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 26-35 (.426) against righties...the 19 games against left-handed starters are fourth fewest in the AL.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Rich Hill from the 15-day disabled list today and now have eight players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Parker, Sogard)...have used the disabled list 17 times this year and players on the DL have combined to miss 742 games (43.6 games per stint)...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. PIRATES: The A's lost the first game of 2016 last night...have now lost each of their last two games against the Pirates after winning each of the first 11...are 11-2 all-time against Pittsburgh, including 6-1 in Oakland and 5-1 in Pittsburgh...this is the first meeting between the two clubs since 2013 in Pittsburgh and the first meeting in Oakland since 2010.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is batting .303 (20-for-66) with five home runs, 17 RBI and 13 runs scored over his last 17 games...**Ryan Dull** has stranded all 34 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-46 (.022) with runners in scoring position...**Marcus Semien** has five home runs in his last nine games and 17 for the season, which is a career high and the most among American League shortstops...**Danny Valencia** is batting .320, which ranks eighth in the AL among players with 200 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1969** Reggie Jackson hits three home runs in the A's 5-0 win against Seattle...the three-homer game is the first in Oakland history and it gives Reggie 33 round trippers in the A's first 72 games...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits his 303rd career home run to break Jimmie Foxx's all-time Athletics record of 302...also, Jason Giambi is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 11-6 victory at Seattle...he has three singles and a pair of doubles.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Rich Hill (8-3, 2.25 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the disabled list today after making one rehab start with Single-A Stockton on Monday at Modesto (3.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so)...was placed on the 15-day DL June 9 retroactive to May 30 with a strained left groin... went 7-1 with a 1.76 ERA (10 er in 51.1 ip) and .173 (31-for-179) opponents batting average over his final eight starts before the injury and allowed just one home run in 51.0 innings...was 1-2 with a 4.15 ERA, .321 opponents average and one home run over his first three starts.

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 5-0 with a 1.97 ERA (7 er in 32.0 ip) and .190 (22-for-116) opponents batting average over his last five starts and has not allowed a home run...the winning streak is the second longest of his career (6, Sept. 12, 2007 to June 1, 2009) and is the longest by an Athletic over the last two years.

AT THE TIME OF THE INJURY: Was 8-3 with a 2.25 ERA in 11 starts when he placed on the disabled list retroactive to May 30...at the time, he had the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the American League (.267), ranked second in wins and ERA, third in strikeouts (74) and fifth in opponents batting average (.207)...had allowed just two home runs in 64.0 innings for an average of 0.28 per nine innings, which was second lowest...was tied for the Major League lead in hit batters (7).

WINS: Has eight wins, which is the second best win total of his career...won a career-high 11 games with Chicago (NL) in 2007 but had just nine wins from 2008-15...is tied for 10th in the American League in wins...became the 10th pitcher in Oakland history with eight wins before the end of May...joins Mark Mulder (2003) as the only Oakland pitchers to do it over the last 26 years.

STRIKEOUTS: Has 74 strikeouts before going on the DL, which tied for second most in Oakland history at the end of May...struck out 37 in April, which was fifth best in Oakland history and the second best over the last 15 years (Chavez, 41 in 2014)...had 10-strikeout games on April 9 at Seattle and April 21 at New York (AL) and is the first A's pitcher with two 10-strikeout games in one month since Mark Mulder in July, 2003...now has 10 career games with 10 or more strikeouts...has 170 strikeouts in 137.0 innings over the last four years (11.17 per nine innings).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is scheduled to make his first interleague appearance since Sept. 8, 2013 against New York-NL (0.0 ip, 1 bb) and his first start since June 25, 2009 at Florida, a loss (4.1 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 6 so)...is 1-2 with a 5.79 ERA (42.0 ip, 45 h, 27 r, 27 er, 25 bb, 36 so, 6 hr) in 18 career interleague appearances, including seven starts.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 15 of his 19 runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 3.58 ERA (13 er in 32.2 ip), .258 (32-for-124) opponents batting average and both of his home runs in innings one through three compared to a 0.87 ERA (3 er in 31.1 ip) and .148 (16-for-108) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on...over the last two years, he has a 3.62 ERA (18 er in 44.2 ip) in innings 1-3 and 0.56 (3 er in 48.1 ip) from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has surrendered both of his home runs and issued 23 of his 24 walks to right-handed hitters...over the last two years, he has allowed all four home runs and issued 27 of his 29 walks to righties...both of the home runs this year are solo shots...has allowed a .139 (21-for-151) batting average with two strikes.

DAYS REST: Is 4-1 with a 1.09 ERA (4 er in 33.0 ip) in five starts on four days rest compared to 4-2 with a 3.48 ERA (12 er in 31.0 ip) in six starts on five days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-0 with a 1.40 ERA (6 er in 38.2 ip) and .190 (26-for-137) opponents batting average in six starts on the road compared to 2-3 with a 3.55 ERA (10 er in 25.1 ip) and .232 (22-for-95) opponents average in five starts at home...is the fourth pitcher in Athletics history to win each of his first six starts on the road in a season, joining Sam Gray (1925), Kevin Appier (2000) and Gil Heredia (2000)...is tied for the American League lead in road wins...is now 7-1 with a 1.69 ERA (11 er in 58.2 ip) and .184 (38-for-207) opponents batting average in nine starts on the road over the last two years...has four 10-strikeout games in those nine starts and has fanned 72 in 58.2 road innings (11.05 per nine innings)...struck out 10 batters in each of his first two road starts this year and is the first pitcher in Oakland history with back-to-back 10-strikeout games on the road...the last A's pitcher to do it was Jim Nash in 1967 (July 8-13).

IN MAY: Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for May after going 5-1 with a 2.13 ERA and .178 opponents batting average in six starts...it was his first career Pitcher of the Month award...had never won more than three games in a month and is the first A's pitcher to win five games in a month since Sonny Gray in July of 2014...joins Mark Mulder

(2001) and Gil Heredia (2000) as the only A's pitchers to win five games in May over the last 28 years...was one of three five-game winners in the AL in May...led the AL in ERA, had the third lowest batting average and tied for seventh in strikeouts (37).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season...it will be his 16th appearance over the last two years, all starts...is 10-4 with a 2.03 ERA (21 er in 93.0 ip) and .187 (62-for-331) opponents batting average over that span...made 119 appearances from 2010-14, all in relief...appeared in 78 games, including 70 starts, over his first five seasons from 2005-09.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his first career Opening Day start April 4 against Chicago (AL) after Sonny Gray was scratched due to food poisoning...at the age of 36 years, 24 days, he was the fourth oldest pitcher to start an opener in Oakland history and the fifth oldest in Athletics history...tossed just 2.2 innings and was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss...picked up his first win as an Athletic in a 6-1 victory at Seattle April 9...struck out 10 batters and his final strikeout of Iannetta in the sixth inning was the 500th of his career...struck out 10 batters in 6.0 innings in a 7-3 win at New York (AL) April 21, his second 10-strikeout game of the season...allowed four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in six consecutive starts from April 21 to May 18...that was the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since at least 1913...opponents went 18-for-126 (.143) over that stretch.

LAST START: He extended his winning streak to five games in the A's 4-2 win over Detroit May 29 in Oakland...struck out the side in the first inning but then allowed RBI singles to McCann in the second and V.Martinez in the third...those were the only runs he would allow in 6.1 innings and the A's scored three unearned runs in the sixth for the win.

HILL vs. PITTSBURGH: Is 3-1 with a 3.79 ERA (40.1 ip, 35 h, 18 r, 17 er, 15 bb, 39 so, 2 hr) in seven career appearances, all starts...that includes 0-1 with a 6.19 ERA (11 er in 16.0 ip) in three starts at PNC Park compared to 3-0 with a 2.22 ERA (6 er in 24.1 ip) in four starts in his home ballparks...last faced the Pirates on April 18, 2008 at Chicago (NL)...was the winning pitcher in a 3-2 Cubs win...allowed a RBI single to Nady in the second but that was the only run he allowed in five innings of work...the Cubs scored three times in the fourth.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
RHP Daniel Mengden (1-3, 2.81 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 11 and is scheduled to make his fifth start of the season and his career...this will be his fourth start in an interleague game and his fourth start during the day...is the eighth starting pitcher in Oakland history to allow to allow three runs or fewer in each of his first four starts, the first since A.J. Griffin in 2012...had 26 strikeouts...since 1913, those are second most by an A's pitcher over the first four games of his career to Tim Hudson (28 in 1999)...picked up his first Major League win in his last start last Monday at San Francisco, an 8-3 A's win (7.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 5 so)...began the season at Double-A Midland and went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts before he was promoted to Triple-A Nashville May 1...went 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds and combined for a 5-1 record and a 1.19 ERA in 11 minor league starts overall.

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 5.51 ERA (40 er in 65.1 ip) and .316 (82-for-253) opponents batting average over its last 18 games dating back to June 13...now has a 5.00 ERA (104 er in 187.1 ip) over its last 53 games after posting a 2.42 ERA in its first 27 games.
- Has tossed 280.1 innings, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed 29-of-135 (21.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 15.1%).
- Ranks second in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (30), fourth in walks per nine innings (2.86) and tied for fourth in fewest losses (9)...has allowed the fourth most home runs (35).
- Ranks second in the AL in first batter strikeouts (68), has the third lowest first batter slugging percentage (.324) and the fifth lowest first batter on-base percentage (.285).
