OAKLAND ATHLETICS (35-47) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (27-54)

MONDAY, JULY 4, 2016 — TARGET FIELD — 1:10 P.M. CDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (3-6, 4.84) VS. RHP RICKY NOLASCO (3-6, 5.31) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have a four-game losing streak after winning six of the previous seven contests...are now 7-6 over the first 13 days of this 20-day stretch without a day off that takes the A's into the All-Star Break...are 22-35 (.386) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 35-47 (.427) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West for the ninth consecutive day and trail first place Texas by 16½ games, which is one-half game short of the season high...since divisional play began in 1969, this is just the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have trailed by 16½ or more games before the All-Star Break (1979, 1986 and 2001)...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 25 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth.

OFFENSE: The A's had their season-best streak of 10 consecutive games with a home run end Saturday, and have now gone homerless in two consecutive games...now have 15 home runs in the last 12 games...nine of the A's last 12 home runs and 16 of the last 25 have come with runners on base...are batting .272 (198-for-728) with 110 runs scored over the last 21 games (5.2 runs per game)...for the season, have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.306), rank second in fewest walks (202) and fewest strikeouts (549) and tied for fifth in fewest doubles (133).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed 21 runs in 20.1 innings over the last four games (9.30 ERA) after yielding 28 runs in 74.2 innings over the previous 13 contests (2.89 ERA)...are 21-37 with a 5.14 ERA (250 er in 437.2 ip) for the season...have the second fewest innings pitched in the American League, are tied for the most losses, have the third highest ERA, and tied for third in fewest wins...are one of five AL teams without a complete game and the A's streak of 133 consecutive games without a complete game is second longest in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009) and the second longest active streak in the AL (Baltimore, 267)...have used 11 different starting pitchers, which is the most in the AL and second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 12).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.13 ERA (103 er in 180.2 ip) over the last 20 games and have a 4.75 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents batting average (.273), third highest and on-base percentage (.338) and fourth highest slugging percentage (.440).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone nine consecutive games without an error, which is their longest errorless streak since a 10-game streak from Aug. 28-Sept. 8, 2007...however, have committed 53 errors for the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...rank second in the AL in double plays (89)...A's outfielders have nine assists, which is tied with San Francisco for second fewest in the majors (St. Louis, 8).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's went 1-4 on their most recent five-game homestand against San Francisco (1-1) and Pittsburgh (0-3)...are 17-26 (.395) at home for the season, which is tied for the second worst home record in the American League...today marks the first game of a seven-game road trip to Minnesota (three games) and Houston (four games)...went 5-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (3-1) and San Francisco (2-0) and are 18-21 (.462) on the road ...it was their first winning road trip of six or more games since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4) and their best record on a road trip of four or more games since Sept. 10-15, 2013 (5-1)...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 6-1 over the last seven games...are batting .241 (341-for-1417) at home compared to .267 (370-for-1386) on the road...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL and the fifth highest road batting average...have a 4.15 ERA (179 er in 388.0 ip) at home compared to 5.44 (204 er in 337.2 ip) on the road...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 6.06).

EXTRA INNINGS AND ONE-RUN GAMES: The A's fell to 2-2 in extra inning games with the loss on Saturday...it was their first extra inning game at home since Aug. 18, 2015 vs. Los Angeles (NL), snapping a streak of 60 consecutive home games without an extra inning game...that was the second longest such streak in Oakland history (74, May 29, 1970-May 2, 1971)...have lost 10 of their last 14 one-run games after winning five of the first eight...are 9-13 (.409) in one-run games for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are 9-11 (.450) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 26-36 (.419) against righties...the 20 games against left-handed starters are tied for fourth fewest in the American League...are batting .262 against left-handed pitchers, .251 against right-handers.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 2 for their last 14 (.143) and are batting .219 (14-for-64) for the season...are tied for the American League lead in RBI (11) and rank second in hits (14) and plate appearances (65)...are the only team without a pinch walk.

TIME OF GAME: The A's have played three of their four longest nine-inning games of the season in the last six days (3:53 on Tuesday, 3:43 on Saturday, 3:35 yesterday) and are averaging 3:18 over the last 10 games (1976 minutes)...however, are averaging 2 hours and 59 minutes per game for the season, which is tied for the second fastest in the majors.

IN JUNE: The A's finished June with an 11-15 (.423) record...it marked the first time they had a losing record in June since going 9-17 in 2011... the offense struck out 158 times, which was the fewest in the majors...had the third fewest stolen bases in the AL in June (7), tied for the third fewest home runs (28) and had the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.423)... trailed first place Texas by 15½ games at the end of the month, which is the A's third largest deficit in the West at the end of June since divisional play began in 1969 (23 in 1979, 20 in 2001).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Fernando Rodriguez on the 15-day disabled list and Andrew Lambo on the 60-day DL today...now have 11 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard) ...Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...have used the disabled list 20 times this year and players on the DL have combined to miss 760 games (38.0 games per stint)...factoring in retroactive placements, the A's have had at least nine players on the DL every day since May 9...have had at least six players on the DL all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. TWINS: The A's lead the season series 3-0 after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland, May 30-June 1...the third victory was the 1,000th win for the Athletics franchise (Philadelphia, Kansas City, Oakland) against the Twins/Senators franchise...the Twins/Senators are the only team the A's have defeated 1,000 times...the A's won the season series in four of the previous five years and are 23-10 (.697) against the Twins since the start of the 2012 season...have won 16 of the last 19 games in the Coliseum... since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 296-295 against Minnesota... that includes 166-128 in Oakland and 130-167 in Minnesota...are 13-12 at Target Field...are 353-364 all-time against the Twins and have a 1000-1000 record against the Twins/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis is batting .33 (25-for-75) with five home runs, 17 RBI and 14 runs scored over his last 19 games... Ryan Dull has stranded all 34 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-46 (.022) with runners in scoring position...his streak of stranding inherited runners is the longest to start a season in the expansion era (credit: Elias)... Marcus Semien has five home runs in his last 11 games and 17 for the season, which is a career high, the most among American League shortstops and tied for third among Major League shortstops.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1905 Rube Waddell defeats Boston's Cy Young in a 20-inning marathon in the afternoon game of a doubleheader, 4-2...A's catcher Ossee Schreckengost works all 29 innings of the doubleheader to set a major league record...in 1974 California's Winston Llenas hits a pinch hit home run off Vida Blue in the sixth inning to end Oakland's club record streak of 136 2/3 innings without allowing a home run...in 1988 Mark McGwire homers in the 16th inning for the second consecutive day as the A's defeat the Cleveland Indians 4-2...McGwire has a solo shot in the 16th inning the day before at Toronto as the A's have a two-day span where they play 32 innings and 9 hours and 54 minutes of baseball in two cities.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (3-6, 4.84 ERA)

LAST EIGHT STARTS: Has allowed two runs or fewer in six of his last eight starts and is 2-1 with a 3.98 ERA (19 er in 43.0 ip) over that span... went 1-1 with a 2.04 ERA over his first three starts and was 0-4 with a 9.31ERA in four starts in between (April 25-May 14).

TWO GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 2-0 with a 4.09 ERA (15 er in 33.0 ip) and .308 (40-for-130) opponents batting average over his last six starts. it marks just the third time in his career he has put together back-to-back wins...the longest winning streak of his career is three from June 24 to July 4, 2015.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents have grounded into 11 double plays, which is tied for 10th most in the American League...has allowed two home runs over his last eight starts (43.0 ip) after surrendering 10 long balls over his first seven starts (37.0 ip)...has issued 20 of his 27 walks this year and 44 of 65 in his career to left-handed hitters...has a .309 (38-for-123) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .246 (29-for-118) the second time and .372 (29-for-78) after that...the opponents two and three hitters are batting a combined .377 (29-for-77) off him...has allowed a .148 (19-for-128) batting average with two strikes.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received two runs of support or fewer in seven of his 15 starts this year, including no runs three times and one run three times. his season run support average of 3.83 (34 rs in 80.0 ip) is 10th lowest in the American League among pitchers with at least 70 innings pitched...is 0-5 in seven starts with two runs of support or fewer, 3-1 in seven starts with three runs of support or more...is now 1-14 in 20 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 8-1 in 16 starts with three runs of support or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-3 with a 2.97 ERA (12 er in 36.1 ip) and .246 (34for-138) opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 2-3 with a 6.39 ERA (31 er in 43.2 ip) and .343 (62-for-181) opponents batting average in nine starts on the road...has surrendered just two home runs in 36.1 innings at home compared to 10 in 43.2 innings on the road

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 1-0 with a 4.33 ERA in five starts in June...was 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in six starts in May...his May loss total tied for second in the American League...it was the first time he has lost four games in a month in his career...went 1-2 with a 4.03 ERA in four starts in April.

THIS AND THAT: Has tossed fewer than six innings in 10 of his 15 starts, including fewer than five innings five times...has a streak of 27 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to June 18 of last year, which is the fifth longest such streak in Oakland history...is 3-11 with a 5.16 ERA (68 er in 118.2 ip) over his last 23 starts dating back to July 10, 2015... was 6-4 with a 3.20 ERA over the first 18 games of his career...allowed a career-high 10 hits in back-to-back starts on April 25 at Detroit and May 2 against Seattle and is the first A's pitcher with at least 10 hits in back-toback starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)...allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts

LOSING STREAKS SNAPPED: Defeated Minnesota May 30 to snap his losing streak at five games...had a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned five starts from April 25 to May 19...the losing streak fell one short of his career high of six, which he ended with his first win of the season this year on April 20...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during that losing streak, which spanned nine starts from July 10, 2015 to April 7, 2016...it was the longest losing streak by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross lost eight straight from May 19 to Sept. 24, 2012.

START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Chicago (AL) April 7 in Oakland...the scored was tied at 0-0 when allowed a two-run home run to Abreu in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 12 in Oakland...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings and it came in the second inning when Simmons grounded into a double play...left with a 3-1 lead...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 win at New York (AL) on *April 20*...it was his first win since July 4, 2015 against Seattle...struck out a career-high eight batters on a careerhigh tying 111 pitches...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Detroit April 25...allowed a career-high 10 hits and left after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss to Seattle May 2 in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits for the second consecutive start...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-3 loss at Baltimore on May 8...yielded a career-high four home runs, which are the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since May 6, 2013 at Cleveland when Jarrod Parker also allowed four home runs...lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 6-0 loss at Tampa Bay May 14...allowed a two-run home run to Miller in the third inning and two more

runs in the sixth...Andriese shut out the A's on two hits, no walks and a hit batter...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 to New York (AL) in Oakland on May 19...allowed a RBI double to Beltran in the third inning and a RBI double to Hicks in the sixth inning...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Seattle *May 24*...tossed just 4.2 innings and allowed two runs...yielded a RBI double to Cano in the first and a RBI single to Cruz in the third... picked up his second win of the season in the A's 3-2 win over Minnesota May 30 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Centeno in the second and a Dozier sacrifice fly in the fifth...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Houston in 12 innings on June 4...the A's scored three times in the second but he allowed three in the bottom of the second on a two-run home run by Gattis and a Marisnick sacrifice fly...also allowed a Rasmus RBI double in the third and a Correa RBI single in the fifth and left after 4.1 innings trailing 5-3...the A's scored single runs in the sixth and ninth innings to get him off the hook...he had a no decision in the A's 6-1 win at Cincinnati June 12...the A's scored four times in the second inning and he allowed his only run in the bottom of the second on a RBI double by Cabrera...had a 4-1 lead when he allowed a lead off single to Votto in the fifth inning...was relieved by Rodriguez who got the final two outs of that inning and pitched a scoreless sixth for the win...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win over Los Angeles June 17 in Oakland...allowed just one run in seven innings of work, a one-out solo home run by Calhoun in the third inning...retired each of the final 13 batters he faced...left after seven innings with a 2-1 lead but Madson allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save...it was the second time this year the A's bullpen blew a save in one of his start and both have come against the Angels (April 12)...Burns had a walk-off RBI single in the bottom of the ninth for the win...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) June 23...shutout the Angels on three hits over the first three innings and had a 4-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the fourth on a Giavotella RBI single and a Bandy sacrifice fly...those were the only runs he would allow in 6.2 innings of work.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 13-11 win at San Francisco last Tuesday...allowed a two-run double to Crawford in the third inning and a two-run single to Pagan in the fourth...was pinch hit for in the sixth inning when the A's scored four times to take a 5-4 lead...Axford came on to pitch the bottom of the sixth and allowed three runs for the blown save.

LHP Sean Manaea (3-4, 5.40 ERA): Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list last Wednesday and started and won that night against San Francisco in a 7-1 A's win (5.2 ip, 6 h, 1 bb, 4 so)...was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts at the time of the injury...is 3-3 with a 3.61 ERA and .248 opponents batting average over his last seven starts after going 0-1 with a 11.37 ERA and .382 opponents average over his first three starts...is scheduled to make just his third road start of the season, compared to eight starts at home. is 0-2 with a 12.10 ERA and .372 opponents average in two starts on the road, 3-2 with a 3.97 ERA and .260 opponents batting average in eight starts at home...was the winning pitcher in his only career appearance against Minnesota, a start earlier this year in a 5-1 win in Oakland (6.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 8 so).
