OAKLAND ATHLETICS (36-47) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (27-55)

ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their four-game losing streak yesterday...are now 8-6 over the first 14 days of this 20-day stretch without a day off that takes the A's into the All-Star Break...are 23-35 (.383) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 36-47 (.434) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West for the 10th consecutive day and trail first place Texas by 15½ games...since divisional play began in 1969, the A's largest deficits in the AL West at the All-Star Break are 30½ (1979), 19 (2001), 15½ (1986), 15 (1977) and 13 (1997)...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 26 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone 10 consecutive games without an error, which is tied for the third longest errorless streak in Oakland history...however, have committed 53 errors for the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...rank second in the AL in double plays (89)...A's outfielders have nine assists, which is tied with San Francisco and St. Louis for the fewest in the majors.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.91 ERA

(42 er in 64.0 ip) over the last seven games after posting a 3.65 ERA over the previous 11 contests...have a 4.70 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League to Minnesota (5.07)...also have the third highest opponents batting average (.272) and on-base percentage (.337) and fourth highest slugging percentage (.437).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-3 with a 7.33 ERA (22 er in 27.0 ip) over the last four games after going 4-3 with a 2.89 ERA over the previous 13 contests...are 22-37 with a 5.08 ERA (251 er in 444.1 ip) for the season...have the second fewest innings pitched and second most losses in the American League, the third highest ERA and the fourth fewest wins...are one of five AL teams without a complete game and the A's streak of 134 consecutive games without a complete game is second longest in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009) and the second longest active streak in the AL (Baltimore, 268)...have used 11 different starting pitchers, which is the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (Cincinnati. 12).

OFFENSE: The A's have gone three consecutive games without a home run after homering in a season-high 10 consecutive games...nine of the A's last 12 home runs and 16 of the last 25 have come with runners on base...are batting .229 (32-for-140) with 11 runs scored (2.75 per game) and one home run over the first four games of July...however, have a .269 (205-for-762) average with 113 runs scored over the last 22 games (5.1 runs per game)...for the season, have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.306), rank second in fewest walks (205) and fewest strikeouts (558), tied for third in fewest home runs (85) and tied for fourth in fewest doubles (134).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this seven-game road trip to Minnesota (1-0) and Houston (four games)...have won three straight and seven of the last eight road games...started the year 7-0 on the road and went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11...are 19-21 (.475) on the road for the season...went 5-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (3-1) and San Francisco (2-0)...it was their first winning road trip of six or more games since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4) and their best record on a road trip of four or more games since Sept. 10-15, 2013 (5-1)...went 1-4 on the last homestand against San Francisco (1-1) and Pittsburgh (0-3) and have lost 10 of the last 13 home games...are 17-26 (.395) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...have a 5.32 ERA (205 er in 346.2 ip) on the road compared to 4.15 (179 er in 388.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 6.08)...are batting .265 (377-for-1420) on the road compared to .241 (341-for-1417) at home...have the fifth highest road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home batting average.

THIS AND THAT: A's pinch hitters are tied for the American League lead in RBI (11), rank second in hits (15) and plate appearances (67) and tied

for third in extra base hits (4)...are the only team without a pinch walk... the A's are 9-11 (.450) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 27-36 (.429) against righties...the 20 games against left-handed starters are tied for fourth fewest in the AL...are batting .263 against left-handed pitchers, .250 against right-handers...have lost 10 of their last 14 one-run games after winning five of the first eight...are 9-13 (.409) in one-run games for the season, which is the third worst record in the AL...have played three of their four longest nine-inning games of the season in the last seven days (3:53 a week ago today, 3:43 last Thursday, 3:35 on Sunday) and are averaging 3:15 over the last 11 games (2146 minutes)...however, are averaging 2 hours and 59 minutes per game for the season, which is tied for third fastest in the majors.

IN JUNE: The A's finished June with an 11-15 (.423) record...it marked the first time they had a losing record in June since going 9-17 in 2011... the offense struck out 158 times, which was the fewest in the majors...had the third fewest stolen bases in the AL in June (7), tied for the third fewest home runs (28) and had the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.423)... trailed first place Texas by 15½ games at the end of the month, which is the A's third largest deficit in the West at the end of June since divisional play began in 1969 (23 in 1979, 20 in 2001).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 20 times this year and currently have 11 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard)... this marks the sixth time in the last 10 years the A's have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 20 players have combined to miss 771 games (38.6 games per stint)...today is the 42nd day the A's have had at least 11 players on the DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. TWINS: The A's have won the season series for the fifth time in the last six years as they lead 4-0 with two games remaining...won the first game in Minnesota yesterday after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland...now have a six-game winning streak against the Twins, which is second longest by an A's team over the last 18 years (12, Sept. 11, 2013-Aug. 9, 2014)...are 24-10 (.706) over the last five years, which is the best record by an American League team against the Twins...have won 16 of the last 19 games in the Coliseum...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 297-295 against Minnesota...that includes 166-128 in Oakland and 131-167 in Minnesota...are 14-12 at Target Field...are 354-364 all-time against the Twins and have a 1001-1000 record against the Twins/Senators...the Twins/Senators are the only team the A's have defeated 1,000 times.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp has an 11-game hitting streak, which matches the A's season high, is the longest active hitting streak in the American League and third longest in the majors...Khris Davis has seven multiple hit games over his last nine games and is 16-for-39 (.410) with two home runs and seven RBI over that span...Ryan Dull has stranded all 36 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-47 (.021) with runners in scoring position...his streak of consecutive inherited runners stranded is the longest in the expansion era (credit: Elias)...Marcus Semien has 17 home runs, which is a career high and the most among AL shortstops.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1989 Mark McGwire connects off Charlie Leibrandt for his 100th career homer, a three-run shot in the third inning of the A's 12-9, 11-inning loss to Kansas City...in 1993 Rickey Henderson becomes just the second player in Major League history to lead off both games of a double-header with a homer...Boston's Harry Hopper was the first on May 30, 1913 vs. Washington...prior to the game, Rollie Fingers has his number 34 retired...in 1994 Rickey Henderson becomes Oakland's all-time leader in games played when he plays in his 1411th game as an Athletic...in 1996 the A's set an Oakland record and tie a franchise record by scoring 13 runs in the first inning of a 16-8 win over California...Matt Stairs tied a ML record by driving in six runs in the inning.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (3-4, 5.40 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list last Wednesday and tossed 5.2 shutout innings that night against San Francisco for the win...made one start on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton June 24 against San Jose and had a no decision (3.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 1 hr, 64 pitches)...was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts at the time of the injury...was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is making his Major League debut.

FIRST THREE, LAST SEVEN: Is 3-3 with a 3.61 ERA (17 er in 42.1 ip) and .248 (40-for-161) opponents batting average over his last seven starts after going 0-1 with a 11.37 ERA and .382 opponents average over his first three starts.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Ranks fourth among American League rookies in games started (10), tied for fourth in innings pitched (55.0), seventh in strikeouts (44) and tied for seventh in wins (3).

HOME AND AWAY: Is scheduled to make just his third road start of the season, compared to eight starts at home...is 0-2 with a 12.10 ERA (13 er in 9.2 ip) and .372 (16-for-43) opponents average in two starts on the road, 3-2 with a 3.97 ERA (20 er in 45.1 ip) and .260 (45-for-173) opponents batting average in eight starts at home...has surrendered four home runs in 9.2 innings on the road, four in 45.2 innings in Oakland.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .163 (8-for-49) batting average and three extra base hits (two doubles, one home run)...right-handers are batting .317 (53-for-167) with seven of his eight home runs and 14 of his 17 walks...has an .889 OPS against righties, .492 against lefties...has a .212 (18-for-85) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .282 (22-for-78) the second time and .396 (21-for-53) after that...opponents are batting .325 (27-for-83) with runners on base but just .229 (11-for-48) with runners in scoring position...has allowed a .469 (23-for-49) batting average, six home runs and 14 RBI to the opponents four and five hitters compared to .228 (38-for-167) with two home run and 17 RBI to all other spots in the order...opponents are 18-for-39 (.462) with five doubles, three home runs and 14 RBI when putting the first pitch in play.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.70 ERA (6 er in 20.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game, a 5.67 ERA (17 er in 27.0 ip) over innings three through five and a 11.25 ERA (10 er in 8.0 ip) from the sixth inning on.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 7-4 A's win over Houston April 29 in Oakland...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...issued a career-high four walks...allowed a leadoff home run to Gattis in the second inning but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the second...allowed a RBI single to Gattis in the sixth to tie the game and was relieved by Doolittle with no outs and runners on first and second...Doolittle allowed both runs to score but the A's tied the game in the eighth and won it on a three-run home run by Alonso in the ninth

SECOND START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Seattle in Oakland on May 4...shutout the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning...Marte had a RBI double, Cano a RBI sngle and Cruz a two-run home run...the A's then scored six times in the bottom of the fifth to give him an 8-4 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford).

THIRD START: He had the first decision of his career, a loss in the A's 13-5 loss at Boston May 10...yielded a career-high eight runs on a career-high 10 hits in a career-low 2.2 innings...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969)...allowed a lead-off home run to Betts in the first inning and Ramirez added a two-run homer...retired the side in order in the second but then allowed five runs in the third inning while recording just two outs...Pedroia had a RBI double, Bogaerts and Young had RBI singles and Shaw chased him from the game with a two-run double.

FOURTH START: He picked up his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas May 16 in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first six innings...had a 2-0 lead with runners on second and third and one out in the seventh inning...allowed a sacrifice fly to Stubbs and was relieved by Doolittle who got the final outing of the inning.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to New York (AL) in Oakland on May 21...retired each of the first nine batters he faced

before allowing the first four batters to reach base in the fourth inning... yielded four runs in the fourth on a Beltran RBI single, a Hicks sacrifice fly and a Refsnyder two-run double...also allowed a RBI double to Castro in the seventh.

SIXTH START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 loss to Detroit May 27 in Oakland...shutout the Tigers on three hits over the first three innings but then allowed two runs in the fourth on a RBI double by Maybin and a RBI single by McCann...also allowed a leadoff home run to Castellanos in the sixth...left after six innings trailing 3-0 as the A's were shutout on three hits over the first eight innings.

SEVENTH START: He picked up the second win of his career in the A's 5-1 win over Minnesota June 1 in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters...shut out the Twins on four hits and a walk over the first five innings... had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the sixth inning...loaded the bases with no outs but got a sacrifice fly from Escobar before striking out Kepler and Centeno...was relieved by Dull to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 5-2.

EIGHTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-4 loss at Milwaukee June 7 at Milwaukee...allowed five runs in a career-high 7.0 innings...surrendered a two-run home run to Carter in the second inning and a three-run home run to Carter in the sixth...the A's were no-hit by Davies over the first six innings before Butler hit a two-run home run in the seventh inning... was relieved by Rodriguez to start the eighth with the A's trailing 5-2.

NINTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 14-5 win over Texas on June 13 in Oakland...had a 10-2 lead when he left the game after 4.1 innings with a left pronator muscle strain...went on the DL the next day... had a 5-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Andrus in the fourth...surrendered a solo home run to Choo, the final batter he faced.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-1 victory over San Francisco last Wednesday in Oakland...did not allow a run in 5.2 innings for the first scoreless outing of his career...put runners in scoring position in four of his six innings and retired the side in order in the third and fifth.
