

OAKLAND ATHLETICS (36-48) VS. MINNESOTA TWINS (28-55)

WEDNESDAY, JULY 6, 2016 — TARGET FIELD — 12:10 P.M. CDT RHP SONNY GRAY (3-7, 5.42) VS. RHP ERVIN SANTANA (2-7, 4.50) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost five of their last six games but are 8-7 over the first 15 days of this 20-day stretch without a day off that takes the A's into the All-Star Break...are 23-36 (.390) since the start of May, which is the worst record in the majors since May 1...went 13-12 (.520) in April...are 36-48 (.429) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West for the 11th consecutive day and trail first place Texas by 16½ games...since divisional play began in 1969, the A's largest deficits in the AL West at the All-Star Break are 30½ (1979), 19 (2001), 15½ (1986), 15 (1977) and 13 (1997)...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 27 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone 11 consecutive games without an error, which is tied for the second longest errorless streak in Oakland history...however, have committed 53 errors for the season, which are the fourth most in the American League...rank second in the AL in double plays (89)...A's outfielders have nine assists, which is tied with San Francisco and St. Louis for the fewest in the majors.



PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 6.63 ERA (53 er in 72.0 ip) over the last eight games after posting a 3.65 ERA over the previous 11 contests... have a 4.79 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League to Minnesota (5.06)...also have the the second highest on-base percentage (.338), and the third highest opponents batting average (.272) and slugging percentage (.441).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-4 with a 7.88 ERA (28 er in 32.0 ip) over the last five games after going 4-3 with a 2.89 ERA over the previous 13 contests...are 22-38 with a 5.15 ERA (257 er in 449.1 ip) for the season...the ERA is second worst and have the second fewest innings pitched in the American League...are tied for the most losses (Minnesota) and have the fourth fewest wins...are one of five AL teams without a complete game and the A's streak of 135 consecutive games without a complete game is second longest in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009) and the second longest active streak in the AL (Baltimore, 269)...have used 11 different starting pitchers, which is the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 12).

OFFENSE: The A's homered in 11 of their last 14 games, including a season-high 10 consecutive games from June 22 to Aug. 1...10 of the A's last 14 home runs and 17 of the last 27 have come with runners on base... are batting .229 (40-for-175) with 15 runs scored (3.0 per game) and three home runs over the first five games of July...however, have a .267 (213-for-797) average with 117 runs scored over the last 23 games (5.1 runs per game)...for the season, have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.306), rank second in fewest walks (208) and fewest strikeouts (561), have hit the fourth fewest home runs (87), and tied for fourth in fewest doubles (136).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on this seven-game road trip to Minnesota (1-1) and Houston (four games)...have won seven of the last nine road games...started the year 7-0 on the road and went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11...are 19-22 (.463) on the road for the season...went 5-1 on the last road trip to Los Angeles-AL (3-1) and San Francisco (2-0)...it was their first winning road trip of six or more games since June 3-11, 2014 (5-4) and their best record on a road trip of four or more games since Sept. 10-15, 2013 (5-1)...went 1-4 on the last homestand against San Francisco (1-1) and Pittsburgh (0-3) and have lost 10 of the last 13 home games... are 17-26 (.395) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the American League...have a 5.48 ERA (216 er in 354.2 ip) on the road compared to 4.15 (179 er in 388.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 6.05)...are batting .265 (385-for-1455) on the road compared to .241 (341-for-1417) at home...have the fifth highest road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home batting average.

THIS AND THAT: A's pinch hitters are tied for the American League lead in RBI (11), rank second in hits (15) and plate appearances (67) and tied for third in extra base hits (4)...are the only team without a pinch walk...

the A's are 9-12 (.429) in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher compared to 27-36 (.429) against righties...the 21 games against left-handed starters are the fifth fewest in the AL...are batting .262 against left-handed pitchers, .250 against right-handers...have lost 10 of their last 14 one-run games after winning five of the first eight...are 9-13 (.409) in one-run games for the season, which is the third worst record in the AL... have played three of their four longest nine-inning games of the season in the last eight days (3:53 a week ago yesterday, 3:43 last Thursday, 3:35 on Sunday) and are averaging 3:15 over the last 12 games (2334 minutes)... however, are averaging 2 hours and 59 minutes per game for the season, which is tied for third fastest in the majors.

IN JUNE: The A's finished June with an 11-15 (.423) record...it marked the first time they had a losing record in June since going 9-17 in 2011... the offense struck out 158 times, which was the fewest in the majors...had the third fewest stolen bases in the AL in June (7), tied for the third fewest home runs (28) and had the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.423)... trailed first place Texas by $15\frac{1}{2}$ games at the end of the month, which is the A's third largest deficit in the West at the end of June since divisional play began in 1969 (23 in 1979, 20 in 2001).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 20 times this year and currently have 11 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard)... this marks the sixth time in the last 10 years the A's have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 20 players have combined to miss 782 games (39.1 games per stint)...today is the 43rd day the A's have had at least 11 players on the DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. TWINS: The A's have won the season series for the fifth time in the last six years as they lead 4-1 with one game remaining...won the first game in Minnesota Monday before losing last night...swept a threegame series in Oakland...last night's loss snapped a six-game winning streak against the Twins, which was second longest by an A's team over the last 18 years (12, Sept. 11, 2013-Aug. 9, 2014)...are 24-11 (.686) over the last five years, which is the best record by an American League team against the Twins...have won 16 of the last 19 games in the Coliseum... since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 297-296 against Minnesota... that includes 166-128 in Oakland and 131-168 in Minnesota...are 14-13 at Target Field...are 354-365 all-time against the Twins and have a 1001-1001 record against the Twins/Senators...the Twins/Senators are the only team the A's have defeated 1,000 times.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp has an 12-game hitting streak, which is a new A's teamseason-high, the longest active hitting streak in the American League, and the third longest in the majors...*Khris Davis* has seven multiple hit games over his last 10 games and is 16-for-42 (.381) with two home runs and seven RBI over that span...*Ryan Dull* has stranded all 36 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-47 (.021) with runners in scoring position...his streak of consecutive inherited runners stranded is the longest in the expansion era (credit: Elias)...*Marcus Semien* has 18 home runs, which is a career high and the most among AL shortstops and tied for second most among Major League shortstops.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1990** the A's hit seven home runs in the second game of a doubleheader to defeat the Cleveland Indians 12-1...Mark McGwire and Rickey Henderson hit two each and Carney Lansford, Jose Canseco and Jamie Quirk chip in one each...in **2001** Mark Mulder takes a perfect game into the eighth inning and finishes with a complete game one-hitter in the A's 3-0 win at Arizona...in **2009** Brett Anderson tosses a two-hit shutout at Fenway Park in a 6-0 A's win and Nomar Garciaparra drives in the goahead run in his return to Boston.

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 5 and is 0-2 with a 4.42 ERA (18 er in 36.2 ip) in six starts since his return...has walked one batter in each of those six starts...was placed on the DL May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA in nine starts before going on the DL.

SIX-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-6 with a 6.63 ERA (43 er in 58.1 ip) and .297 (71-for-239) opponents batting average over his last 11 starts...the six-game losing streak is a career high (previous: 4, Aug. 1-16, 2014) and is

tied for the longest active streak in the American League...it matches the longest losing streak by an A's pitcher over the last four years...the last A's pitcher to lose more than six straight is Tyson Ross (8, May 19-Sept. 24, 2012)...his last win came on April 22 at Toronto and his streak of 11 consecutive starts without a win is third longest by an A's starter this century (13, Braden, April 29-Sept. 29, 2007; 12, Bassitt, Aug. 9, 2015-April 28, 2016)...went 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA and .232 opponents batting average over his first four starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has a 5.42 ERA, which is third highest in the American League...has the seventh highest opponents on-base percentage (.337) and is tied for the 10th in lowest winning percentage (.300).

WILD PITCHES: Had two wild pitches in his last start and now has 13 for the season, which is five more than any other pitcher...they are most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break...had three wild pitches May 20 against New York and is the first A's pitcher with three wild pitches in a game since Doug Johns on Sept. 6, 1995 at Boston...has 43 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-0 with a 2.78 ERA (7 er in 22.2 ip) in four starts during the day compared to 2-7 with a 6.39 ERA (44 er in 62.0 ip) in 11 starts at night...over the last two years, he is 6-2 with a 2.05 ERA (19 er in 83.1 ip) in 13 starts during the day, 11-12 with a 4.08 ERA (95 er in 209.1 ip) in 33 starts at night.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is 2-1 with a 3.60 ERA (6 er in 15.0 ip) in three starts against American League Central teams compared to 1-6 with a 5.81 ERA (45 er in 69.2 ip) in 12 starts against everyone else.

BEFORE THE BREAK: Is 3-7 with a 5.42 ERA going into his final start before the All-Star Break...the seven losses are one more than his combined pre-All-Star Break total from the previous two seasons (20-6, 2.42 ERA in 37 starts)...is now 23-13 with a 3.16 ERA (118 er in 336.0 ip) in 53 career appearances before the All-Star Break compared to 13-14 with a 3.38 ERA (90 er in 239.2 ip) in 38 games after the break.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has yielded a .351 (26-for-74) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is third highest in the American League...opponents are batting .228 (28-for-123) the first time through the lineup, .274 (32-for-117) the second time and .351 (33-for-94) after that... has surrendered nine of his 12 home runs to right-handed hitters and has a .538 opponents slugging percentage against righties compared to .391 against lefties...has allowed a .431 (28-for-65) combined batting average to the opponents eight and nine hitters but the four and five hitters are a combined 13-for-71 (.183)...opponents are 22-for-49 (.449) with four doubles and four home runs (.776 slugging percentage) when putting the first pitch in play.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.86 ERA (14 er in 44.0 ip) and .208 (33-for-159) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a starting assignment compared to a 8.19 ERA (37 er in 40.2 ip) and .343 (60-for-175) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

MONTH BY MONTH: Allowed seven runs in his first start in July and took the loss...had allowed just 16 runs in 77.0 career July innings entering this year (1.64 ERA)...is now 7-2 with a 2.28 ERA (21 er in 83.0 ip) in 13 career appearances in the month of July...the ERA is his lowest for any month of the season...went 0-1 with a 3.23 ERA in five starts in June after going 0-3 with a 9.61 ERA in four starts in May...allowed 25 runs in May, which were his most ever in a month (21, Aug. 2014)...surrendered five home runs in May, which match his most in a month (Aug. 2015)...went 3-2 with a 3.81 ERA in five starts in April...is now 10-3 with a 2.53 ERA in 15 career starts in April...the 10 wins are his most in any month.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Was scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start on April 4 against Chicago (AL) due to food poisoning...started two days

later against the White Sox and picked up the win in a 2-1 decision... tossed 6.1 innings to go over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career in a 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 11...was 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA over his first four starts...then matched the shortest outing of his career on April 27 at Detroit he tossed just 2.0 innings and allowed four runs in a 9-4 loss...it was his shortest outing as a starter (pitched 2.0 innings in his first two career outings, both in relief)...matched his career highs by allowing seven runs on 11 hits in an 8-2 loss to Seattle on May 3...allowed a career-high tying seven runs for the second consecutive start in a 14-7 loss at Boston May 9...allowed a career-high tying three home runs in a no decision at Tampa Bay May 15 (also Aug. 22, 2015 vs. Tampa Bay)...had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss at Houston June 5...left with a 2-1 lead but Coulombe allowed a run in the sixth for the blown save...it was the first of two times he left with the lead only to have the bullpen blown the save (Axford, June 26 at Los Angeles-AL).

LAST START: He extended his losing streak to six games in the A's 7-3 loss to Pittsburgh last Friday in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying seven runs for the third time this year...had a 3-0 lead and had retired the first seven batters before Mercer homered with one out in the third...allowed a run to score on a wild pitch in the fourth and two more in the fifth on a Mercer RBI single and a fielders choice...was charged with three more runs in the sixth inning on a Joyce RBI single and a Harrison two-run double.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Rich Hill (8-3, 2.31 ERA): Was reinstated from the disabled list last Saturday and had a no decision in the A's 4-2, 10-inning loss to Pittsburgh that day in Oakland (6.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...was placed on the 15-day DL June 9 retroactive to May 30 with a strained left groin and made one rehab start with Single-A Stockton...was 8-3 with a 2.25 ERA in 11 starts before the injury...is 5-0 with a 2.13 ERA and .190 opponents batting average over his last six starts and has not allowed a home run...the winning streak is one short of his career high...is 6-0 with a 1.40 ERA and .190 opponents batting average in six starts on the road...is the fourth pitcher in Athletics history to win each of his first six starts on the road in a season... is 2-1 with a 2.88 ERA in nine career appearances, including five starts, against Houston...had a loss in his only start this year, a 2-1 decision in Oakland on May 1 (6.0 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 bb, 4 so).

- The A's bullpen has a 5.63 ERA (49 er in 78.1 ip) and .312 (98-for-314) opponents batting average over its last 22 games...has a 4.23 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League.
- Has tossed 293.1 innings, which is the most in the AL and third most in the maiors
- Has allowed 31-of-144 (21.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 15.2%).
- Ranks second in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (31), fourth in walks per nine innings (2.88) and tied for fourth in fewest losses (10)...is tied for second in wild pitches (18) and ranks fourth in most home runs allowed (36).
