# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (36-49) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (46-39)

THURSDAY, JULY 7, 2016 — MINUTE MAID PARK — 7:10 P.M. CDT LHP RICH HILL (8-3, 2.31) VS. RHP DOUG FISTER (8-5, 3.66) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have lost two straight and six of the last seven games to fall a season-high tying 13 games under .500 for the third time this year (last: 29-42 on June 22)...are 8-8 over the first 16 days of this 20-day stretch without a day off that takes the A's into the All-Star Break...are 23-37 (.383) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 36-49 (.424) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West for the 13th consecutive day and trail first place Texas by 16½ games, which is one-half game short of the season high of 17 (last on June 22)...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 28 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have gone 12 consecutive games without an error, which ties the Athletics franchise record for longest errorless streak (June 3-15, 2002)...however, have committed 53 errors for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...rank third in the AL in double plays (89)...A's outfielders have nine assists, which is tied with San Francisco and St. Louis for the fewest in the majors.



**BEFORE THE ALL-STAR BREAK:** The A's are 36-49 (.424), which is currently the fourth worst record in Oakland history prior to the All-Star Break and the worst since 1997 (37-52, .416)...are 16½ games out of first place in the American League West...since divisional play began in 1969, the A's largest deficits in the West at the All-Star Break are 30½ (1979), 19 (2001), 15½ (1986), 15 (1977) and 13 (1997)...have a 4.78 ERA and have not had an ERA above 4.24 since 2000 (4.80)...have allowed 103 home runs, which is fourth most in Oakland history (114 in 1997, 111 in 1996, 105 in 1994)...the offense has 208 walks and the fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season is 248 in 1980.

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 6.41 ERA (57 er in 80.0 ip) over the last nine games after posting a 3.65 ERA over the previous 11 contests... have a 4.78 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the highest opponents on-base percentage (.338) and third highest opponents batting average (.273) and slugging percentage (.441).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 1-5 with a 6.87 ERA (29 er in 38.0 ip) over the last seven games and 5-14 with a 5.18 ERA (94 er in 163.1 ip) in 31 games dating back to June 3...are 22-39 with a 5.10 ERA (258 er in 455.1 ip) for the season...the losses are tied with San Diego for the most in the majors...have the second fewest innings pitched in the American League, the third highest ERA and are tied for the third fewest wins...are one of five AL teams without a complete game and the A's streak of 136 consecutive games without a complete game is second longest in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009) and the second longest active streak in the AL (Baltimore, 270)...have used 11 different starting pitchers, which is the most in the AL and tied for third most in the majors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's were shutout for the fourth time yesterday and were held to a season-low two hits for the third time...are now batting .207 (42-for-203) with 15 runs scored (2.5 per game) over the first six games of July...the runs scored are second fewest in the majors (Colorado, 11) and the batting average is third lowest...for the season, have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.304), rank second in fewest walks (208), fewest strikeouts (569) and lowest slugging percentage (.398) and fourth in fewest runs (350) and home runs (87)...have hit two home runs in the last five games after homering in a season-high 10 straight from June 22-July 1...10 of the A's last 14 home runs and 17 of the last 27 have come with runners on base.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-2 on this seven-game road trip to Minnesota (1-2) and Houston (four games)...have won seven of the last 10 road games...started the year 7-0 on the road and went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11...are 19-23 (.452) on the road for the season...went 1-4 on the last homestand against San Francisco (1-1) and Pittsburgh (0-3) and have lost 10 of the last 13 home games...are 17-26 (.395) at home for the season, which is the second worst home record in the American League... begin post All-Star Break play with a 10-game homestand against Toronto

(three games), Houston (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games)...will play 20 of their first 29 games after the break at home as the A's will sandwich two 10-game homestands around a nine-game road trip from July 15-Aug. 14...have a 5.46 ERA (220 er in 362.2 ip) on the road compared to 4.15 (179 er in 388.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.98)...are batting .261 (387-for-1483) on the road compared to .241 (341-for-1417) at home...have the fifth highest road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home batting average.

THIS AND THAT: A's pinch hitters are tied for the American League lead in RBI (11), rank second in hits (15) and plate appearances (68) and tied for third in extra base hits (4)...are the only team without a pinch walk... the A's have lost 10 of their last 14 one-run games after winning five of the first eight...are 9-13 (.409) in one-run games for the season, which is the third worst record in the AL...have played three of their four longest nine-inning games of the season in the last nine days and are averaging 3:12 over the last 16 games (3066 minutes)...however, are averaging 2 hours and 59 minutes per game for the season, which is tied for fourth fastest in the majors.

**IN JUNE:** The A's finished June with an 11-15 (.423) record...it marked the first time they had a losing record in June since going 9-17 in 2011... the offense struck out 158 times, which was the fewest in the majors...had the third fewest stolen bases in the AL in June (7), tied for the third fewest home runs (28) and had the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.423).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 20 times this year and currently have 11 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard)... this marks the sixth time in the last 10 years the A's have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 20 players have combined to miss 793 games (39.7 games per stint)...today is the 44th day the A's have had at least 11 players on the DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. ASTROS:** The A's trail in the season series, 2-4...are 2-1 in Oakland but were swept in a three-game series in Houston June 3-5...now have a five-game losing streak at Minute Maid Park, which is the A's longest ever here...have a four-game losing streak overall, which matches the A's longest against the Astros (April 15-26, 2015)...lost the season series to the Astros for the first time last year...lead the all-time series 42-27 (.609), which is the sixth best record by a Ma-

jor League club against another club among teams that have played each other 60 or more times...14 of the A's 27 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 23-12 in Oakland and 19-15 in Houston.

### TODAY'S TIDBITS

*Coco Crisp* has a 12-game hitting streak, which is an A's season high, the second longest active streak in the majors (19, Seager, LAD) and two short of his career high...*Khris Davis* is 16-for-45 (.356) with two home runs, seven RBI and seven multiple hit games over his last 11 games...*Ryan Dull* has stranded all 36 of his inherited runners and opponents are 1-for-47 (.021) with runners in scoring position...his streak of consecutive inherited runners stranded is the longest in the expansion era (credit: Elias)...*Marcus Semien* has 18 home runs, which is a career high and tied for second among Major League shortstops.

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1986** the A's defeat Boston 6-4 in Tony La Russa's first game as A's manager...Dave Stewart picks up his first of 116 wins as an Oakland Athletic and Jose Canseco hits his 20th homer...in **1994** the A's use a club record eight pitchers in a 6-4, nine inning win at Baltimore...four of them face one hitter each and Bob Welch, Dave Leiper, Bill Taylor and Ed Vosberg all pitch in the seventh inning...in **2002** the A's defeat Kansas City 3-2, their Oakland record setting seventh consecutive one-run game.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Rich Hill (8-3, 2.31 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the disabled list last Saturday and allowed two runs in 6.0 innings in a no decision...was placed on the 15-day DL June 9 retroactive to May 30 with a strained left groin and made one rehab start with Single-A Stockton on June 27 at Modesto (3.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 so)...was 8-3 with a 2.25 ERA in 11 starts before the injury...at the time, he ranked second in the American League in wins and ERA and third in strikeouts (74).

FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 5-0 with a 2.13 ERA (9 er in 38.0 ip) and .190 (26-for-137) opponents batting average over his last six starts and has not allowed a home run...the winning streak is the second longest of his career (6, Sept. 12, 2007 to June 1, 2009) and is the longest by an Athletic over the last two years.

QUALIFICATIONS: Missed 29 games while he was on the disabled list from May 30 to July 1 and has just 70.0 innings pitched...based on a minimum of 70 innings pitched, he has the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.269) and fewest home runs per nine innings (0.26) in the American League...also ranks second in ERA (2.31), third in opponents batting average (.206) and fourth in strikeouts per nine innings (10.29)...has hit eight batters, which is tied for second among all AL pitchers.

WINS: Has eight wins, which is the second best win total of his career... won a career-high 11 games with Chicago (NL) in 2007 but had just nine wins from 2008-15...all eight wins came in the first two months of the season and he became the 10th pitcher in Oakland history with eight wins before the end of May...joins Mark Mulder (2003) as the only Oakland pitchers to do it over the last 26 years.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 6-0 with a 1.40 ERA (6 er in 38.2 ip) and .190 (26for-137) opponents batting average in six starts on the road compared to 2-3 with a 3.45 ERA (12 er in 31.1 ip) and .224 (26-for-116) opponents average in six starts at home...is the fourth pitcher in Athletics history to win each of his first six starts on the road in a season, joining Sam Gray (1925), Kevin Appier (2000) and Gil Heredia (2000)...is tied for third in the American League in road wins... is now 7-1 with a 1.69 ERA (11 er in 58.2 ip) and .184 (38-for-207) opponents batting average in nine starts on the road over the last two years...has four 10-strikeout games in those nine starts and has fanned 72 in 58.2 road innings (11.05 per nine innings)... struck out 10 batters in each of his first two road starts this year and is the first pitcher in Oakland history with back-to-back 10-strikeout games on the road...the last A's pitcher to do it was Jim Nash in 1967 (July 8-13).

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-1 with a 1.38 ERA (4 er in 26.0 ip) in four starts against American League West competition compared to 5-2 with a 2.86 ERA (14 er in 44.0 ip) in eight starts against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 4-1 with a 1.09 ERA (4 er in 33.0 ip) in five starts on four days rest compared to 4-2 with a 3.41 ERA (14 er in 37.0 ip) in seven starts on five days rest or more.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed 15 of his 21 runs over the first three innings of a game...has a 3.28 ERA (13 er in 35.2 ip), .246 (33-for-134) opponents batting average and both of his home runs in innings one through three compared to a 1.31 ERA (5 er in 34.1 ip) and .160 (19-for-119) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on...over the last two years, he has a 3.40 ERA (18 er in 47.2 ip) in innings 1-3 and 0.88 (5 er in 51.1 ip) from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has surrendered both of his home runs and issued 25 of his 26 walks to right-handed hitters...over the last two years, he has allowed all four home runs and issued 29 of his 31 walks to righties. both of the home runs this year are solo shots...has allowed a .130 (21-for-162) batting average with two strikes.

STRIKEOUTS: Has 74 strikeouts before going on the DL, which tied for second most in Oakland history at the end of May...struck out 37 in April, which was fifth best in Oakland history and the second best over the last 15 years (Chavez, 41 in 2014)...had 10-strikeout games on April 9 at Seattle and April 21 at New York (AL) and is the first A's pitcher with two 10-strikeout games in one month since Mark Mulder in July, 2003...now has 10 career games with 10 or more strikeouts...has 176 strikeouts in 143.0 innings over the last four years (11.08 per nine innings).

IN MAY: Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for May after going 5-1 with a 2.13 ERA and .178 opponents batting average in six starts...it was his first career Pitcher of the Month award...had never won more than three games in a month and is the first A's pitcher to win five games in a month since Sonny Gray in July of 2014...joins Mark Mulder (2001) and Gil Heredia (2000) as the only A's pitchers to win five games in May over the last 28 years...was one of three five-game winners in the AL

in May...led the AL in ERA, had the third lowest batting average and tied for seventh in strikeouts (37).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Is scheduled to make his 13th start of the season...it will be his 17th appearance over the last two years, all starts. is 10-4 with a 2.09 ERA (23 er in 99.0 ip) and .188 (66-for-352) opponents batting average over that span...made 119 appearances from 2010-14, all in relief...appeared in 78 games, including 70 starts, over his first five seasons from 2005-09.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Made his first career Opening Day start April 4 against Chicago (AL) after Sonny Gray was scratched due to food poisoning...at the age of 36 years, 24 days, he was the fourth oldest pitcher to start an opener in Oakland history and the fifth oldest in Athletics history...tossed just 2.2 innings and was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss...picked up his first win as an Athletic in a 6-1 victory at Seattle April 9...struck out 10 batters and his final strikeout of lannetta in the sixth inning was the 500th of his career...struck out 10 batters in 6.0 innings in a 7-3 win at New York (AL) April 21, his second 10-strikeout game of the season...allowed four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in six consecutive starts from April 21 to May 18...that was the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since at least 1913...opponents went 18-for-126 (.143) over that stretch.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-2, 10-inning loss to Pittsburgh last Saturday in Oakland ... shutout the Pirates on a hit and a walk over the first three innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the fourth inning...Marte had a RBI single and Harrison a RBI double but he retired each of the final batters he faced...left after six innings with the scored tied 2-2.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daniel Mengden (1-4, 3.48 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 11 and is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season and his career has 31 strikeouts since 1913 those are tied with Willie Adams for second most by an A's pitcher over the first five games of his career to Tim Hudson (33 in 1999)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 A's loss to Pittsburgh last Sunday in Oakland (5.1 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 5 so)...has never faced the Astros in his career...began the season at Double-A Midland and went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts before he was promoted to Triple-A Nashville May 1...went 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds and combined for a 5-1 record and a 1.19 ERA in 11 minor league starts overall...the ERA was sixth lowest in all of the minor leagues at the time of his promotion...allowed just three home runs in 68.1 innings, an average of 0.40 per nine innings.

- 4.30 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League. Has tossed 295.1 innings, which is the most in the AL and tied for third most in the majors
- Has allowed 33-of-148 (22.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 15.0%).
- Is tied for second in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (31), tied for fourth in fewest losses (10) and ranks fifth in walks per nine innings (2.93)...is tied for second in wild pitches (18) and ranks fourth in most home runs allowed (37).
- Ranks second in the AL in first batter strikeouts (71), has the third lowest first batter slugging percentage (.332) and the fourth lowest first batter on-base percentage (.289).

- Is tied for third among AL relievers in blown saves (4).
- Has allowed nine of his 20 runs in sixth inning...has a 3.13 ERA (11 er in 31.2 ip) from the seventh inning on.
- Has a 3.86 ERA (7 er in 16.1 ip) in 17 games during the day, a 6.88 ERA (13 er in 17.0 ip) in 20 games at night.
