ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost six of the last eight games...are 9-8 over the first 17 days of this 20-day stretch without a day off that takes the A's into the All-Star Break...are 24-37 (.393) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 37-49 (.430) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West for the 14th consecutive day...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 29 days in fourth, nine days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone 13 consecutive games without an error, to set the Athletics franchise record for longest errorless streak...broke the previous mark of 12 from June 3-15, 2002...made 53 errors over the first 73 games...are tied for third in the American League in double plays (89)...A's outfielders have nine assists, which is tied with San Francisco and St. Louis for the fewest in the majors.

BEFORE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 37-49 (.430), which is currently tied for the fifth worst record in Oakland history prior to the All-Star Break...it is the worst since 2009 (37-49, .430)...are 15½ games out of first place in the American League West...since divisional play began in 1969, the A's largest deficits in the West at the All-Star Break are 30½ (1979), 19 (2001), 15½ (1986), 15 (1977) and 13 (1997)...have a 4.74 ERA and have not had an ERA above 4.24 since 2000 (4.80)...have allowed 103 home runs, which is fourth most in Oakland history (114 in 1997, 111 in 1996, 105 in 1994)...have 645 strikeouts, which is fourth most in Oakland history (728 in 2014, 680 in 2015, 650 in 2013)...the offense has 213 walks and the fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season is 248 in 1980.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.87 ERA (58 er in 89.0 ip) over the last 10 games after posting a 3.65 ERA over the previous 11 contests...have a 4.74 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.337) and fourth highest opponents batting average (.271) and slugging percentage (.438).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed one run in three of the last four games (9 er in 23.2 ip, 3.42 ERA), but are 2-5 with a 6.14 ERA (30 er in 44.0 ip) over the last eight games...are 23-39 with a 5.05 ERA (259 er in 461.1 ip) for the season...the losses are tied with San Diego for the most in the majors...have the third fewest innings pitched in the American League, the third highest ERA and are tied for the third fewest wins...have issued the second most walks (181) but have surrendered the third fewest home runs (66)...are one of five AL teams without a complete game and the A's streak of 137 consecutive games without a complete game is second longest in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009) and the second longest active streak in the AL (Baltimore, 270)...have used 11 different starting pitchers, which is the most in the AL and tied for fourth most in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored four runs or fewer in each of the last seven games (18 runs, 2.6 per game) after scoring six runs or more in each of the previous seven contests (54 runs, 7.7 per game)...have scored 353 runs for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League...are batting .197 (46-for-234) with 18 runs scored in July...the batting average is the lowest in the majors and the runs are second fewest (Tampa Bay, 17)...have hit two home runs in the last six games after homering in a season-high 10 straight from June 22-July 1...10 of the A's last 14 home runs and 17 of the last 27 have come with runners on base...for the season, have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.303), rank second in fewest walks (213), fewest strikeouts (571) and lowest slugging percentage (.396) and fourth in fewest home runs (87) and lowest batting average (.250).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on this seven-game road trip to Minnesota (1-2) and Houston (1-0) and have won eight of the last 11 road games...started the year 7-0 on the road and went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11...are 20-23 (.465) on the road for the season...went 1-4 on the last homestand against San Francisco (1-1) and Pittsburgh (0-3) and have lost 10 of the last 13 home games...are 17-26 (.395) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...begin

post All-Star Break play with a 10-game homestand against Toronto (three games), Houston (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games)...will play 20 of their first 29 games after the break at home as the A's will sandwich two 10-game homestands around a nine-game road trip from July 15-Aug. 14...have a 5.35 ERA (221 er in 371.2 ip) on the road compared to 4.15 (179 er in 388.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.98)...are batting .258 (391-for-1514) on the road compared to .241 (341-for-1417) at home.

THIS AND THAT: A's pinch hitters are tied for the American League lead in RBI (11), rank second in hits (15) and plate appearances (68) and tied for third in extra base hits (4)...are the only team without a pinch walk...the A's have lost 10 of their last 14 one-run games after winning five of the first eight...are 9-13 (.409) in one-run games for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the AL...have played three of their four longest nine-inning games of the season in the last 10 days and are averaging 3:09 over the last 17 games (3218 minutes)...however, are averaging 2 hours and 59 minutes per game for the season, which is tied for fourth fastest in the majors...have been successful in 10-of-16 (62%) replay challenges, which is tied for the fourth best percentage in the majors...the 16 challenges are tied for fourth fewest in the majors.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 20 times this year and currently have 11 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard)...Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...this marks the sixth time in the last 10 years the A's have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 20 players have combined to miss 804 games (40.2 games per stint)...today is the 45th day the A's have had at least 11 players on the DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's trail in the season series, 3-4...are 1-3 in Houston and 2-1 in Oakland...the win last night snapped a five-game losing streak in Minute Maid Park, which is the A's longest ever here...it snapped a four-game losing streak overall, which matched the A's longest against the Astros (April 15-26, 2015)...lost the season series to the Astros for the first time last year...lead the all-time series 43-27 (.614), which is the fifth best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 60 or more times...14 of the A's 27 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 23-12 in Oakland and 20-15 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS
Khrist Davis is batting .347 (17-for-49) with two home runs, seven RBI and seven multiple hit games over his last 12 games...is tied for ninth in the American League in home runs (19) and has 39 home runs dating back to Aug. 6, 2015, which are tied for third most in the majors over that span...**Ryan Dull** has retired each of the last 19 batters he has faced...has stranded all 36 of his inherited runners and his streak of consecutive inherited runners stranded is the longest in the expansion era (credit: Elias)...opponents are 1-for-47 (.021) with runners in scoring position...has a 0.44 ERA (1 er in 20.1 ip) and .087 (6-for-69) opponents batting average over his last 20 games dating back to May 25...**Marcus Semien** has 18 home runs, which is a career high, the most among AL shortstops and tied for second among Major League shortstops.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY
In 1902 Danny Murphy goes 6 for 6 with a home run in his A's debut as Philadelphia defeats Boston 22-9...in 1935 Jimmie Foxx homers and drives in three runs in a 4-1 American League victory in the third All-Star game at Cleveland...in 1955 Joe DeMaestri is a perfect 6 for 6 in an 11-8, 11 inning loss to Detroit...in 1993 Troy Neel homers twice and drives in seven runs but the A's still lose 11-9 to Boston...in 2013 Grant Balfour records his 41st consecutive save in the A's 2-1 win at Pittsburgh to break Dennis Eckersley's club record for consecutive saves.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (1-4, 3.48 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 11 and is scheduled to make his sixth start of the season and his career...it will be just his second start at night and his second against an American League team...made his Major League debut June 11 at Cincinnati after just 43 minor league appearances, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...had not pitched above Single-A prior to this year...became the 46th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut (Overton became the 47th)...is the first of those to take the loss since Brett Anderson on April 10, 2009 against Seattle.

LOSSES: Was charged with his fourth loss in his last start and is the second pitcher in Oakland history to lose four or more games in the first five games of his career...the other is Mike Morgan, who lost each of his first nine career starts...picked up the win in his other start and is the sixth pitcher in Oakland history with a decision in each of his first five career games.

FOUR RUNS OR FEWER AND FOUR LOSSES: Has allowed four runs or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of his first five career starts...since 1913, the only other Major League pitcher to do that and lose at least four of those games is Tony Armas, who went 0-4 with a 2.97 ERA over his first five career starts with Montreal from Aug. 16, 1999-May 30, 2000.

STRIKEOUTS: Has 31 strikeouts in 31.0 innings over the first five starts of his career...since 1913, his 31 strikeouts are tied for second most by an A's pitcher over the first five games of his career to Tim Hudson (33 in 1999)...Hudson has the most after six games with 40.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .197 (12-for-61) batting average against right-handed hitters compared to .286 (16-for-56) against left-handers...has yielded just one extra base hit (home run) and issued four walks against righties for a .503 OPS...has an .876 OPS against lefties...has a .183 (15-for-82) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup, .371 (13-for-35) after that...the opponents number three hitter is 1-for-15 (.067) and the five hitter is 1-for-13 (.077)

THIS AND THAT: Received eight runs of support in his lone win on June 27 at San Francisco...has a total of five runs of support in his four losses (23.1 ip, 1.93 RSA)...has not allowed a run in the first, second or fourth innings...is the eighth starting pitcher in Oakland history to allow to allow three runs or fewer in each of his first four starts, the first since A.J. Griffin in 2012...was charged with the loss in each of his first three starts to join Brad Rigby (1997) and Mike Morgan (1978) as the only three pitchers in Oakland history to lose each of the first three games of their career...is just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1913 to lose each of his first three career games while allowing three runs or fewer in each game...the others are Duane Pillette (1949 Yankees), Jim McAndrew (1968 Mets) and Kyle Drabek (2010 Blue Jays).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, a 2-1 A's loss at Cincinnati June 11...at the age of 23 years, 113 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to start a game since Trevor Cahill on June 19, 2011 (23 years, 110 days)...tossed 104 pitches, which at the time tied for second most by an A's pitcher in his ML debut since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988 (Mazzaro, 105 on June 2, 2009)...the A's scored a run in the first and he blanked the Reds on three hits and a walk over the first two innings...struck out the first batter he faced (Cozart)...allowed his only runs in the third inning on a two-run home run by Bruce...was relieved by Dull after 5.2 innings with the A's trailing 2-1.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Texas June 16 in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on a hit and a walk over the first six innings and had retired 15 straight when he allowed a leadoff home run to Desmond in the seventh...an Alonso error contributed to an unearned run later in the inning and he was relieved by Dull with the bases loaded and one out in the seventh and the A's trailing 2-1...Dull struck out the final two batters in the inning...Colby Lewis retired the first 23 Athletics before Alonso walked in the eighth and had a no-hitter until Muncy doubled to lead off the ninth.

THIRD START: He lost his third consecutive start in the A's 4-2 loss to Milwaukee June 22 in Oakland...shutout the Brewers on three hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the fifth inning...Flores scored on a Rivera sacrifice and Gennett added a two-run home run...was relieved by Rodriguez to start the seventh with the A's trailing 3-1.

FOURTH START: He picked up his first Major League win in the A's 8-3 victory at San Francisco June 27...retired each of the first 13 batters before allowing a one-out single to Pagan in the fifth inning...shutout the Giants on two hits and a walk over the first seven innings and had an 8-0 lead when he allowed his only two runs in the eighth inning...loaded the bases with no outs before Stratton grounded into a double play to score a run...was relieved by Rodriguez who allowed a run to score on a wild pitch.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to Pittsburgh last Sunday in Oakland...the A's scored twice in the second and he blanked the Pirates on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...loaded the bases with one out in the fifth and then allowed a two-run single to Polanco before striking out the final two batters...the A's scored a run in the bottom of the fifth to take a 3-2 lead but he allowed a RBI triple to Frazier and a RBI single to Kratz in the sixth for the loss.

MINORS: Began the season at Double-A Midland and went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts before he was promoted to Triple-A Nashville May 1...went 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds and combined for a 5-1 record and a 1.19 ERA in 11 minor league starts overall...the ERA was sixth lowest in all of the minor leagues at the time of his promotion...allowed just three home runs in 68.1 innings, an average of 0.40 per nine innings...yielded no home runs in 23.0 innings with Midland...went 4-0 with a 0.79 ERA over his first nine starts and was 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA over his final two starts...allowed a .179 opponents batting average, including .177 against right-handed hitters compared to .182 against left-handers...surrendered all three of his home runs to righties...yielded a .068 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .077 with RISP and two outs...opponents were 8-for-64 (.125) with four walks and a hit by pitch (.188 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the RockHounds were 4-0 in his starting assignments and the Sounds were 5-2...his teams combined for a 9-2 (.818) record in his 11 starts...had five starts where he did not allow a run but had just two wins and three no decisions in those games...allowed six hits or fewer in all 11 starts and allowed more than two runs just once...had a 24.0 inning scoreless streak from April 26 to May 13.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was originally drafted by Houston in the fourth round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft...was traded to Oakland with catcher Jacob Nottingham for left-handed pitcher Scott Kazmir on July 23, 2015...has compiled a 15-5 record and a 2.87 ERA (67 er in 210.0 ip) in 43 games, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...has 209 strikeouts in 210.0 innings...has allowed just 14 home runs, an average of 0.60 per nine innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (4-6, 4.57 ERA): Is 3-0 with a 3.63 ERA over his last seven starts...the three-game winning streak matches his career high (June 24-July 4, 2015)...was 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...has allowed just two home runs during the winning streak (0.45 per nine innings) after allowing 10 over his first nine starts (1.91 per nine innings)...has a run support average of 3.84, which is ninth lowest in the American League...is 1-3 with a 2.97 ERA in six starts at home compared to 3-3 with a 5.72 ERA in 10 starts on the road...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's win at Minnesota on Monday (6.2 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 3 so)...is 1-1 with a 6.91 ERA (14.1 ip, 20 h, 11 r, 11 er, 6 bb, 5 so, 2 hr) in three career appearances, all starts, against the Astros...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 6-5 A's loss on June 4 at Houston (4.1 ip, 7 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 1 so).

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 7.04 ERA (30 er in 38.1 ip) and .313 (47-for-150) opponents batting average over its last 12 games...has a 4.25 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League.
- Has tossed 298.1 innings, which is the most in the AL and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed 33-of-148 (22.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 16.0%).
- Has converted 23-of-32 (71.9%) save opportunities...the save percentage ranks seventh in the AL and the saves are tied for seventh.
- Is tied for second in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (31), tied for third in fewest losses (10) and ranks fifth in walks per nine innings (2.90)...is tied for second in wild pitches (18) and ranks fourth in most home runs allowed (37).

- Has not allowed a run in his past eight games and 7.1 innings...has a 0.44 ERA (1 er in 20.1 ip) and .087 (6-for-69) opponents batting average over his last 20 games dating back to May 25.
- Has stranded all 36 of his inherited runners...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, his streak of consecutive inherited runners stranded is the longest by any pitcher in the expansion era (since 1961)...the previous high of 35 was set in 2007 (Frank Francisco, TEX)...ranks second in the majors in inherited runners overall (Rzepczynski, 40).
