## OAKLAND ATHLETICS (37-50) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (47-40)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost seven of the last nine games but are 9-9 over the first 18 days of this 20-day stretch without a day off that takes the A's into the All-Star Break...are 24-38 (.387) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 37-50 (.425) for the season, which is the tied for the third worst record in the American League...are in a tie for fourth place in the AL West today after being in sole possession of fourth place for 14 consecutive days...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 29 days in fourth, 10 days tied for fourth, and 20 days in fifth.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have gone 14 consecutive games without an error, which is an ongoing Athletics franchise record for longest errorless streak...broke the previous mark of 12 from June 3-15, 2002...made 53 errors over the first 73 games...are tied for third in the American League in double plays (89)...A's outfielders have 10 assists, which is tied fir third fewest in the ma-

- BEFORE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 37-50 (.425), which is currently the fifth worst record in Oakland history prior to the All-Star Break... it is the worst since 2011 (39-53, .424)...are  $16\frac{1}{2}$  games out of first place in the American League West...since divisional play began in 1969, the A's largest deficits in the West at the All-Star Break are 30½ (1979), 19 (2001), 15½ (1986), 15 (1977) and 13 (1997)...have a 4.80 ERA and have not had an ERA above 4.24 since 2000 (4.80)...have allowed 105 home runs, which is tied for third most in Oakland history (114 in 1997, 111 in 1996, 105 in 1994)...have 656 strikeouts, which is third most in Oakland history (728 in 2014, 680 in 2015)...the offense has 215 walks and the fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season is 248 in 1980.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 6.29 ERA (68 er in 97.1 ip) over the last 11 games after posting a 3.65 ERA over the previous 11 contests... have a 4.80 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the highest opponents on-base percentage (.337) and third highest opponents batting average (.272) and slugging percentage (.439)

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-6 with a 6.66 ERA (36 er in 48.2 ip) over the last nine games...are 23-40 with a 5.12 ERA (265 er in 466.0 ip) for the season...the losses are second most in the majors (San Diego, 40)...have the third fewest innings pitched in the American League, the third highest ERA and have the third fewest wins...have issued the second most walks (183) but are tied for the third fewest home runs allowed (67)...are one of five AL teams without a complete game and the A's streak of 138 consecutive games without a complete game is second longest in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009) and the second longest active streak in the AL (Baltimore, 271)...have used 11 different starting pitchers, which is the most in the AL and tied for fourth most in the

OFFENSE: The A's scored nine runs last night after scoring just 18 total runs over their previous seven games (2.6 runs/game)...fell to 15-3 when scoring seven or more runs in a game...have scored 362 runs for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League...are batting .221 (60for-272) with 27 runs scored in July...the batting average is the second lowest in the majors and the runs are fifth fewest...have hit four home runs in the last seven games after homering in a season-high 10 straight from June 22-July 1...11 of the A's last 16 home runs and 18 of the last 29 have come with runners on base...for the season, have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.304), rank second in fewest walks (215), fewest strikeouts (579) and lowest slugging percentage (.399) and fourth in fewest home runs (89).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on this seven-game road trip to Minnesota (1-2) and Houston (1-1) but have won eight of the last 12 road games...started the year 7-0 on the road and went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11...are 20-24 (.455) on the road for the season...went 1-4 on the last homestand against San Francisco (1-1) and Pittsburgh (0-3) and have lost 10 of the last 13 home games...are 17-26 (.395) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...begin post All-Star Break play with a 10-game homestand against Toronto (three games), Houston (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games)...will play

20 of their first 29 games after the break at home as the A's will sandwich two 10-game homestands around a nine-game road trip from July 25-Aug. 14...have a 5.47 ERA (231 er in 380.0 ip) on the road compared to 4.15 (179 er in 388.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.92)...are batting .261 (405-for-1552) on the road compared to .241 (341-for-1417) at home.

THIS AND THAT: A's pinch hitters are tied for the American League lead in RBI (11), rank second in hits (16) and plate appearances (69) and tied for third in extra base hits (4)...are the only team without a pinch walk... the A's have lost 11 of their last 15 one-run games after winning five of the first eight...are 9-14 (.391) in one-run games for the season, which is tied for the third worst record in the AL...have played three of their four longest nine-inning games of the season in the last 11 days and are averaging 3:10 over the last 18 games (3427 minutes)...however, are averaging 2 hours and 59 minutes per game for the season, which is tied for fourth fastest in the majors...have been successful in 10-of-16 (62%) replay challenges, which is tied for the fifth best percentage in the majors...the 16 challenges are tied for fourth fewest in the majors.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 20 times this year and currently have 11 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard)... Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...this marks the sixth time in the last 10 years the A's have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 20 players have combined to miss 815 games (40.8 games per stint)...today is the 46th day the A's have had at least 11 players on the DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's trail in the season series, 3-5...are 1-4 in Houston and 2-1 in Oakland...the win Thursday snapped a five-game losing streak in Minute Maid Park, which was the A's longest ever here... it snapped a four-game losing streak overall, which matched the A's longest against the Astros (April 15-26, 2015)...lost the season series to the Astros for the first time last year...lead the all-time series 43-28 (.606), which is the fifth best record by a Major

League club against another club among teams that have played each other 60 or more times...14 of the A's 28 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 23-12 in Oakland and 20-16 in Houston.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Butler is batting .311 (23-for-74) with 16 RBI over his last 29 games after hitting .200 with 16 RBI over his first 29 contests... Khris Davis has 39 home runs dating back to Aug. 6, 2015, which are tied for third most in the majors over that span... *Ryan Dull* has retired each of the last 19 batters he has faced...has stranded all 36 of his inherited runners and his streak of consecutive inherited runners stranded is the longest in the expansion era (credit: Elias)...opponents are 1-for-47 (.021) with runners in scoring position.....has a 0.44 ERA (1 er in 20.1 ip) and .087 (6-for-69) opponents batting average over his last 20 games dating back to May 25... Marcus Semien has 19 home runs, a new career high, the most among AL shortstops and second among Major League shortstops.

## THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1902 Danny Murphy goes 6 for 6 with a home run in his A's debut as Philadelphia defeats Boston 22-9...in 1935 Jimmie Foxx homers and drives in three runs in a 4-1 American League victory in the third All-Star game at Cleveland...in 1955 Joe DeMaestri is a perfect 6 for 6 in an 11-8, 11 inning loss to Detroit...in 1993 Troy Neel homers twice and drives in seven runs but the A's still lose 11-9 to Boston...in 2013 Grant Balfour records his 41st consecutive save in the A's 2-1 win at Pittsburgh to break Dennis Eckersley's club record for consecutive saves.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (4-6, 4.57 ERA)

THREE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 3-0 with a 3.63 ERA (16 er in 39.2 ip) over his last seven starts...the three-game winning streak matches his career high (June 24-July 4, 2015)...was 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...has allowed just two home runs during the winning streak (0.45 per nine innings) after allowing 10 over his first nine starts (1.91 per

SUPPORT: Has left with the lead in three of his starts only to have the bullepn blow the save (April 12 vs. Los Angeles-AL, June 17 vs. Los Angeles, June 28 vs. San Francisco)...has received two runs of support or fewer in seven of his 16 starts, including no runs three times and one run three times...is 0-5 with two runs of support or fewer, 4-1 with three runs of support or more...is now 1-14 in 20 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 9-1 in 17 starts with three runs of support or more

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has issued 23 of his 31 walks this year and 47 of 69 in his career to left-handed hitters...has a .266 (68-for-256) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup, .360 (31-for-86) after that...has allowed a .146 (20-for-137) batting average with two strikes... the opponents two hitter is batting .415 (17-for-41) off him.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 0-2 with a 5.11 ERA (21 er in 37.0 ip) in seven starts on four days rest, 3-2 with a 4.88 ERA (15 er in 27.2 ip) in five starts on five days rest and 1-2 with a 3.27 ERA (8 er in 22.0 ip) in four starts on six days rest or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-3 with a 2.97 ERA (12 er in 36.1 ip) and .246 (34for-138) opponents batting average in six starts at home compared to 3-3 with a 5.72 ERA (32 er in 50.1 ip) and .319 (65-for-204) opponents batting average in 10 starts on the road...has surrendered just two home runs in 36.1 innings at home compared to 10 in 50.1 innings on the road

MONTH BY MONTH: Picked up the win in his first start in July last Monday after going 1-0 with a 4.33 ERA in five starts in June...was 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in six starts in May...his May loss total tied for second in the American League...it was the first time he has lost four games in a month in his career...went 1-2 with a 4.03 ERA in four starts in April.

THIS AND THAT: Has tossed fewer than six innings in 10 of his 16 starts, including fewer than five innings five times...has a streak of 28 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to June 18 of last year, which is the fifth longest such streak in Oakland history...is 4-11 with a 4.95 ERA (69 er in 125.1 ip) over his last 24 starts dating back to July 10, 2015... was 6-4 with a 3.20 ERA over the first 18 games of his career...allowed a career-high 10 hits in back-to-back starts on April 25 at Detroit and May 2 against Seattle and is the first A's pitcher with at least 10 hits in back-toback starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)...allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts.

LOSING STREAKS SNAPPED: Defeated Minnesota May 30 to snap his losing streak at five games...had a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned five starts from April 25 to May 19...the losing streak fell one short of his career high of six, which he ended with his first win of the season this year on April 20...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during that losing streak, which spanned nine starts from July 10, 2015 to April 7, 2016...it was the longest losing streak by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross lost eight straight from May 19 to Sept. 24, 2012.

START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Chicago (AL) April 7 in Oakland...the scored was tied at 0-0 when allowed a two-run home run to Abreu in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 12 in Oakland...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings and it came in the second inning when Simmons grounded into a double play...left with a 3-1 lead but Doolittle allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 win at New York (AL) on April 20...it was his first win since July 4, 2015 against Seattle...struck out a career-high eight batters on a career-high tying 111 pitches...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Detroit April 25...allowed a careerhigh 10 hits and left after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss to Seattle May 2 in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits for the second consecutive start...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-3 loss at Baltimore on  $\it May 8...$  yielded a career-high four home runs, which are the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since May 6, 2013 at Cleveland when Jarrod Parker also allowed four home runs...lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 6-0 loss at Tampa Bay May 14...allowed a two-run home run to Miller in the third inning and two more runs in the sixth...Andriese shut out the A's on two hits, no walks and a hit batter...

was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 to New York (AL) in Oakland on May 19...allowed a RBI double to Beltran in the third inning and a RBI double to Hicks in the sixth inning...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Seattle *May 24*...tossed just 4.2 innings and allowed two runs...yielded a RBI double to Cano in the first and a RBI single to Cruz in the third...picked up his second win of the season in the A's 3-2 win over Minnesota *May 30* in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Centeno in the second and a Dozier sacrifice fly in the fifth...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Houston in 12 innings on June 4...left after 4.1 innings trailing 5-3 but the A's scored single runs in the sixth and ninth innings to get him off the hook...he had a no decision in the A's 6-1 win at Cincinnati June 12...the A's scored four times in the second inning and he allowed his only run in the bottom of the second on a RBI double by Cabrera...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win over Los Angeles June 17 in Oakland...allowed just one run in seven innings of work...left with a 2-1 lead but Madson allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save...it was the second time this year the A's bullpen blew a save in one of his starts...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) June 23...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the fourth on a Giavotella RBI single and a Bandy sacrifice fly...had a no decision in the A's 13-11 win at San Francisco June 28...left with a 5-4 lead but Axford allowed three runs in the sixth inning for the blown save.

LAST START: He picked up his fourth win of the season in the A's 3-1 victory at Minnesota on Monday...issued a career high tying four walks but allowed just one run in 6.2 innings of work...that came in the fourth inning when Kepler grounded into a fielders choice with the bases loaded to drive in Mauer...the A's were shutout on one hit and three waks over the first six innings but then scored three times in the seventh for the win.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (3-5, 5.85 ERA): Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 29 and is 1-1 with a 5.06 ERA in two starts since his return...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...has a 5.85 ERA overall. which is ninth highest in the American League among pitchers with 60 or more innings pitched...is 0-3 with an 11.66 ERA and .354 opponents average in three starts on the road, 3-2 with a 3.97 ERA and .260 opponents batting average in eight starts at home...has surrendered six home runs in 14.2 innings on the road, four in 45.1 innings in Oakland...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 11-4 A's loss at Minnesota on Tuesday (5.0 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 5 so, 2 hr)...had a no decision in his only career appearance against Houston and it came in a start in his Major League debut this year on April 29 in Oakland in a 7-4 A's win (5.0 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 3 so).

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 7.29 ERA (34 er in 42.0 ip) and .317 (53-for-167) opponents batting average over its last 13 games...has a 4.32 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League.
- Has tossed 302.0 innings, which is the most in the AL and tied for third most in the majors
- Has allowed 34-of-149 (22.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 18.8%).
- Has converted 23-of-33 (69.7%) save opportunities...the save percentage ranks seventh in the AL and the saves are tied for seventh
- Is tied for second in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (31), ranks seventh in fewest losses (11) and ranks fifth in walks per nine innings (2.89)...has the second most wild pitches (20) and ranks fourth in most home runs allowed (38).
