ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost seven of the last 10 games but are 10-9 over the first 19 days of this 20-day stretch without a day off that takes the A's into the All-Star Break...are 25-38 (.397) since the start of May after going 13-12 (.520) in April...are 38-50 (.432) for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West today for the 15th time in the last 16 days and 30th day this season...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 30 days in fourth, 10 days tied for fourth, and 20 days in fifth.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone 15 consecutive games without an error, which is an ongoing Athletics franchise record for longest errorless streak...previous mark was 12 from June 3-15, 2002...made 53 errors over the first 73 games...are tied for third in the American League in double plays (90)...A's outfielders have 10 assists, which is tied for third fewest in the majors.

BEFORE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's are 38-50 (.432), which is currently tied for the sixth worst record in Oakland history prior to the All-Star Break...it is the worst since 2011 (39-53, .424)...are 15½ games out of first place in the American League West...since divisional play began in 1969, the A's largest deficits in the West at the All-Star Break are 30½ (1979), 19 (2001), 15½ (1986), 15 (1977) and 13 (1997)...have a 4.77 ERA and have not had an ERA above 4.24 since 2000 (4.80)...have allowed 105 home runs, which is tied for third most in Oakland history (114 in 1997, 111 in 1996, 105 in 1994)...have 660 strikeouts, which is third most in Oakland history (728 in 2014, 680 in 2015)...the offense has 220 walks and the fewest in Oakland history in a non-strike season is 248 in 1980.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.92 ERA (70 er in 106.1 ip) over the last 12 games after posting a 3.65 ERA over the previous 11 contests...have a 4.77 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the third highest opponents on-base percentage (.336) and fourth highest opponents batting average (.271) and slugging percentage (.437).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-6 with a 6.04 ERA (38 er in 56.2 ip) over the last 10 games...are 24-39 with a 5.07 ERA (267 er in 474.0 ip) for the season...the losses are second most in the majors (San Diego, 41)...have the third fewest innings pitched in the American League, the third highest ERA and are tied for the third fewest wins...are tied for the second most walks (183) but are tied for the second fewest home runs allowed (67)...are one of five AL teams without a complete game and the A's streak of 139 consecutive games without a complete game is second longest in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009) and the second longest active streak in the AL (Baltimore, 272)...have used 11 different starting pitchers, which is the most in the AL and tied for fourth most in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's scored three runs or fewer last night for the seventh time in their last nine games and have averaged just 3.3 runs per game during that stretch...have scored 365 runs for the season, which is fourth fewest in the American League...are batting .228 (70-for-307) with 30 runs scored in July...the batting average is the third lowest in the American League and the runs are third fewest...have hit five home runs in the last eight games after homering in a season-high 10 straight from June 22-July 1...11 of the A's last 17 home runs and 18 of the last 30 have come with runners on base...for the season, have the lowest on-base percentage in the American League (.305), rank second in fewest walks (220), fewest strikeouts (588) and lowest slugging percentage (.400), and fourth in fewest home runs (90).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on this seven-game road trip to Minnesota (1-2) and Houston (2-1) and have won nine of the last 13 road games...started the year 7-0 on the road and went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11...are 21-24 (.467) on the road for the season...went 1-4 on the last homestand against San Francisco (1-1) and Pittsburgh (0-3) and have lost 10 of the last 13 home games...are 17-26 (.395) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...begin post All-Star Break play with a 10-game homestand against Toronto (three

games), Houston (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games)...will play 20 of their first 29 games after the break at home as the A's will sandwich two 10-game homestands around a nine-game road trip from July 25-Aug. 14...have a 5.39 ERA (233 er in 389.0 ip) on the road compared to 4.15 (179 er in 388.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.87)...are batting .261 (415-for-1587) on the road compared to .241 (341-for-1417) at home.

THIS AND THAT: A's pinch hitters are tied for the American League lead in RBI (11), rank second in hits (16) and plate appearances (69) and tied for third in extra base hits (4)...are the only team without a pinch walk...the A's have lost 11 of their last 16 one-run games after winning five of the first eight...are 10-14 (.417) in one-run games for the season, which is the fourth worst record in the AL...have played three of their four longest nine-inning games of the season in the last 12 days and are averaging 3:09 over the last 19 games (3599 minutes)...however, are averaging 2 hours and 59 minutes per game for the season, which is the fourth fastest in the majors...have been successful in 10-of-16 (62%) replay challenges, which is tied for the fifth best percentage in the majors...the 16 challenges are tied for third fewest in the majors.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 20 times this year and currently have 11 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard)...Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...this marks the sixth time in the last 10 years the A's have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 20 players have combined to miss 826 games (41.3 games per stint)...today is the 47th day the A's have had at least 11 players on the DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's trail in the season series, 4-5...are 2-4 in Houston and 2-1 in Oakland...the win Thursday snapped a five-game losing streak in Minute Maid Park, which was the A's longest ever here...it snapped a four-game losing streak overall, which matched the A's longest against the Astros (April 15-26, 2015)...lost the season series to the Astros for the first time last year...lead the all-time series 44-28 (.611), which is the sixth best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 60 or more times...14 of the A's 28 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 23-12 in Oakland and 20-17 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Dull allowed his first inherited runners of the season to score last night, snapping his Major League-record streak at 36 consecutive inherited runners stranded, which is the longest in the expansion era (credit: Elias)...since May 25, he's allowed just one run in 21.2 innings (0.42 ERA) and has allowed just seven hits over that stretch...has 22 strikeouts and three walks in that span...**Marcus Semien** has 19 home runs, a new career high, the most among AL shortstops and second among Major League shortstops...**Stephen Vogt** is 43-for-138 (.312) with 11 doubles, two triples, four home runs, and 20 RBI over his last 39 games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1901** Harry Davis becomes the first player in American League history to hit for the cycle...in **1932** Jimmie Foxx ties the American League record for most total bases in a game with 16...he hits three home runs and adds a double and two singles in the A's 18-17, 18 inning win at Cleveland...Eddie Rommel pitches 17 innings of relief and allows 29 hits...in **1990** five Oakland A's play in the All-Star Game at Wrigley Field...Bob Welch starts the game and pitches two innings and Dennis Eckersley pitches a scoreless ninth to save the American League's 2-0 victory...in **2004** Erubiel Durazo has a pinch hit grand slam and drives in five runs as the A's win at Cleveland, 16-7.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (3-5, 5.85 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 29 and is 1-1 with a 5.06 ERA (6 er in 10.2 ip) in two starts since his return... was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...has a 5.85 ERA overall, which is 10th highest in the American League among pitchers with 60 or more innings pitched...made one start on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton June 24 against San Jose and had a no decision (3.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 1 hr, 64 pitches)...was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is making his Major League debut.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Ranks fourth among American League rookies in games started (11) and innings pitched (60.0), fourth in strikeouts (49) and tied for seventh in wins (3).

HOME AND AWAY: Is scheduled to make his fourth road start of the season, compared to eight starts at home...is 0-3 with an 11.66 ERA (19 er in 14.2 ip) and .354 (23-for-65) opponents average in three starts on the road, 3-2 with a 3.97 ERA (20 er in 45.1 ip) and .260 (45-for-173) opponents batting average in eight starts at home...has surrendered six home runs in 14.2 innings on the road, four in 45.1 innings in Oakland.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .176 (9-for-51) batting average and four extra base hits (two doubles, two home runs)...right-handers are batting .316 (59-for-187) with eight of his 10 home runs and 16 of his 20 walks...has an .897 OPS against righties, .583 against lefties...has a .226 (21-for-93) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .279 (24-for-86) the second time and .390 (23-for-59) after that...opponents are batting .320 (31-for-97) with runners on base but just .224 (13-for-58) with runners in scoring position...has allowed a .455 (25-for-55) batting average, seven home runs and 16 RBI to the opponents four and five hitters compared to .235 (43-for-183) with three home runs and 21 RBI to all other spots in the order...opponents are 21-for-44 (.477) with six doubles, four home runs and 16 RBI when putting the first pitch in play.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 3.31 ERA (12 er in 32.2 ip) and .238 (29-for-122) opponents batting average over the first three innings of a game and an 8.89 ERA (27 er in 27.1 ip) and .336 (39-for-116) opponents batting average from the sixth inning on.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 7-4 A's win over Houston April 29 in Oakland...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...issued a career-high four walks...allowed a leadoff home run to Gattis in the second inning but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the second...allowed a RBI single to Gattis in the sixth to tie the game and was relieved by Doolittle with no outs and runners on first and second...Doolittle allowed both runs to score but the A's tied the game in the eighth and won it on a three-run home run by Alonso in the ninth.

SECOND START: He had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Seattle in Oakland on May 4...shutout the Mariners on two hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning...Marte had a RBI double, Cano a RBI single and Cruz a two-run home run...the A's then scored six times in the bottom of the fifth to give him an 8-4 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford).

THIRD START: He had the first decision of his career, a loss in the A's 13-5 loss at Boston May 10...yielded a career-high eight runs on a career-high 10 hits in a career-low 2.2 innings...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969)...allowed a lead-off home run to Betts in the first inning and Ramirez added a two-run homer...retired the side in order in the second but then allowed five runs in the third inning while recording just two outs...Pedroia had a RBI double, Bogaerts and Young had RBI singles and Shaw chased him from the game with a two-run double.

FOURTH START: He picked up his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas May 16 in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first six innings...had a 2-0 lead with runners on second and third and one out in the seventh inning...allowed a sacrifice fly to Stubbs and was relieved by Doolittle who got the final out of the inning.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to New York (AL) in Oakland on May 21...retired each of the first nine batters he faced before allowing the first four batters to reach base in the fourth inning...yielded four runs in the fourth on a Beltran RBI single, a Hicks sacrifice fly

and a Refsnyder two-run double...also allowed a RBI double to Castro in the seventh.

SIXTH START: He lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 loss to Detroit May 27 in Oakland...shutout the Tigers on three hits over the first three innings but then allowed two runs in the fourth on a RBI double by Maybin and a RBI single by McCann...also allowed a leadoff home run to Castellanos in the sixth...left after six innings trailing 3-0 as the A's were shutout on three hits over the first eight innings.

SEVENTH START: He picked up the second win of his career in the A's 5-1 win over Minnesota June 1 in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters...shut out the Twins on four hits and a walk over the first five innings...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the sixth inning...loaded the bases with no outs but got a sacrifice fly from Escobar before striking out Kepler and Centeno...was relieved by Dull to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 5-2.

EIGHTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-4 loss at Milwaukee June 7 at Milwaukee...allowed five runs in a career-high 7.0 innings...surrendered a two-run home run to Carter in the second inning and a three-run home run to Carter in the sixth...the A's were no-hit by Davies over the first six innings before Butler hit a two-run home run in the seventh inning...was relieved by Rodriguez to start the eighth with the A's trailing 5-2.

NINTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 14-5 win over Texas on June 13 in Oakland...had a 10-2 lead when he left the game after 4.1 innings with a left pronator muscle strain...went on the DL the next day...had a 5-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Andrus in the fourth...surrendered a solo home run to Choo, the final batter he faced.

TENTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-1 victory over San Francisco June 29 in Oakland...did not allow a run in 5.2 innings for the first scoreless outing of his career...put runners in scoring position in four of his six innings and retired the side in order in the third and fifth.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-4 loss at Minnesota on Tuesday...the A's scored a run in the second but he allowed a Suzuki RBI groundout in the bottom of the second...surrendered two more runs in the fourth inning on a Suzuki RBI single and a Buxton RBI single...then yielded a two-run home run to Vargas a solo home run to Kepler on consecutive pitches in the fifth inning.

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 7.12 ERA (34 er in 43.0 ip) and .316 (54-for-171) opponents batting average over its last 14 games...has a 4.31 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League.
- Has tossed 303.0 innings, which is the most in the AL and fourth most in the majors.
- Has allowed 36-of-151 (23.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 18.2%).
- Has converted 24-of-34 (70.6%) save opportunities...the save percentage ranks sixth in the AL and the saves are seventh.
- Is tied for second in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (31), ranks seventh in fewest losses (11) and ranks fifth in walks per nine innings (2.88)...is tied for the second most wild pitches (20) and is tied for fourth in most home runs allowed (38).

- Has not allowed a run in his past nine games and 8.1 innings...has a 0.42 ERA (1 er in 21.1 ip) and .096 (7-for-73) opponents batting average over his last 21 games dating back to May 25.
- Allowed two inherited runners to score yesterday...had stranded all 36 of his previous inherited runners...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, his streak of consecutive inherited runners stranded was the longest by any pitcher in the expansion era (since 1961)...the previous high of 35 was set in 2007 (Frank Francisco, TEX)...ranks second in the majors in inherited runners overall with 38 (Rzepczynski, 41).
- Opponents are 2-for-49 (.041) with runners in scoring position, including 1-for-27 (.037) with RISP and two outs.
- Leads American League relievers in opponents batting average (.150) and on-base percentage (.193) and ranks fifth in innings (44.2).
