OAKLAND ATHLETICS (38-51) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (51-40)

ABOUT THE A'S: Split a four-game series at Houston before the All-Star Break and went 10-10 over the final 20 games before the break...went 13-12 (.520) in April and 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19...are a season-high tying 13 games under .500 for the fifth time this year...are 38-51 (.427), which is the fourth worst record in the American League...it is tied for the fourth worst record in Oakland history after 89 games and is the worst since 2009 (38-51)...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by 15½ games...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 31 days in fourth, 10 days tied for fourth, and 20 days in fifth.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.16 ERA (293 er in 510.2 ip) over the last 58 games after posting a 3.91 ERA over the first 31 games through May 7...have a 4.73 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.270)...have a 5.51 ERA (71 er in 116.0 ip) over the last 13 games...have allowed 10 runs or more four times over that stretch and two runs or fewer five times.

STARTING PITCHING: Sean Manaea tossed 7.0 innings in the final game before the break after Kendall Graveman logged 8.0 innings the day before...that marks the first time A's starters have tossed at least seven innings in consecutive games since Aug. 6-8, 2015 when they had a three-game streak...A's starters have just 13 games with seven or more innings this year, which is tied with Kansas City and Milwaukee for the fewest in the majors...the fewest such games in Athletics history is 25 in 1997...starters are 7-5 with a 4.59 ERA (53 er in 104.0 ip) over the last 18 games after going 0-9 with a 5.29 ERA over a 17-game stretch from June 3 to 22...are 24-39 with a 5.00 ERA (267 er in 481.0 ip) for the season...have the most losses in the American League and second most in the majors (San Diego, 42)...have the third highest ERA in the AL, the third fewest innings pitched and are tied for the third fewest wins...have the third most walks (183) but have surrendered the second fewest home runs (67)...are one of five AL teams without a complete game and the A's streak of 140 consecutive games without a complete game is second longest in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009) and the second longest active streak in the AL (Baltimore, 273).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed a season-high four errors in the final game before the All-Star Break to snap their Athletics franchise record streak of 15 consecutive games without an error...broke the previous mark of 12 from June 3-15, 2002...now have 57 errors for the season, which is fourth most in the American League...also rank fourth in double plays (91)...A's outfielders have 10 assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .218 (74-for-339) in 10 games in July, which is the worst mark in the majors...have hit just six home runs, which is tied with Chicago (AL) for the fewest, and have scored 31 runs (3.1 per game), which is third fewest...11 of the A's last 17 home runs and 18 of the last 30 have come with runners on base...have a .304 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors...have a .397 slugging percentage, which is the lowest in the AL and sixth lowest in the majors...rank second in the AL in fewest walks (222) and strikeouts (596), third in fewest runs (366) and fourth in fewest home runs (90) and lowest batting average (.251).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin post All-Star Break play with a 10-game homestand against Toronto (three games), Houston (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games)...will play 20 of their first 29 games after the break at home as the A's will sandwich two 10-game homestands around a nine-game road trip from July 25-Aug. 14...went 1-4 on the last homestand against San Francisco (1-1) and Pittsburgh (0-3) and have lost four straight and 10 of the last 13 at home...are 17-26 (.395) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (1-2) and Houston (2-2) and are 21-25 (.457) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 9-5 since then...are batting .241 (341-for-1417) at home compared to .259 (419-for-1619) on the road...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL...have a 4.15 ERA (179 er in 388.0 ip) at home compared to 5.28 (234 er in 398.2 ip) on the road.

BEFORE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's had a 38-51 (.427) record at the All-Star Break, which was fifth worst in Oakland history and the worst since 2011 (39-53, .424)...were 15½ games out of first place in the American League West, which matched the third largest deficit at the break in Oakland history and was the worst since 2001 (19)...allowed 105 home runs, which tied for third most and was the most since 1997 (114)...had 670 strikeouts, which was third most behind 2014 (728) and 2015 (680)...had a 4.73 ERA, which was the first time the A's had an ERA above 4.24 since 2000 (4.80)...the offense drew just 222 walks, which was the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season 1958 (214).

CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's last two losses are walk-off losses and the A's are now 3-5 in walk-off games...the five walk-off losses are tied for second most in the majors (Texas, 9)...each of the A's last three games have been decided by one run and the A's are 10-15 (.400) in one-run games...the losses are tied for third most in the American League and the record is fourth worst...have lost 12 of their last 17 one-run games after winning five of the first eight...have lost each of their last three extra inning games and are 2-3 for the season.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 4 for their last 9 (.444) and are batting .235 (16-for-68) for the season...are tied for the American League lead in RBI (11), rank second in hits (16) and plate appearances (69) and tied for third in extra base hits (4)...are the only team without a pinch walk.

DESIGNATED HITTER: The A's designated hitter is batting .211 (64-for-303) with eight home runs and 30 RBI...the RBI are the fewest in the American League, the home runs are tied with Chicago for the fewest and the batting average is second lowest (Houston, .178)...the A's DH has entered the game defensively seven times this year, which is the most times that has happened since 1995 when they also did it seven times.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 20 times this year and currently have 11 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard)...Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...this marks the sixth time in the last 10 years the A's have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 20 players have combined to miss 837 games (41.9 games per stint)...today is the 48th day the A's have had at least 11 players on the DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The A's lost two of three at Toronto in April to open the season series and have now lost six of their last seven games to the Blue Jays...went 1-5 against Toronto last year, marking the first time they lost the season series to the Blue Jays since 2010...are 30-38 against the Blue Jays dating back to 2008 but are 213-189 all-time...that includes 105-95 in Oakland, 108-92 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Ryan Dull has an 8.1-inning scoreless streak and has a 0.42 ERA (1 er in 21.1 ip) and .096 (7-for-73) opponents batting average over his last 21 games...has allowed 2-of-38 (5.3%) inherited runners to score, which is tied for second best in the American League...opponents are 2-for-49 (.041) with runners in scoring position...**Marcus Semien** is tied for 10th in the American League with a career-high 19 home runs...leads AL shortstops and ranks second in the majors in home runs...**Stephen Vogt** has back-to-back multiple hit games (5-for-8, .625) and is now batting .327 (18-for-55) over his last 16 games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1932** Al Simmons has three home runs and six RBI but the A's lose to Detroit 11-10 in 11 innings...in **1969** Blue Moon Odom homers, drives in four runs and tosses a complete game to improve his record to 13-3 in the A's 6-2 win at Seattle...in **2002** Ted Lilly combines with the A's bullpen on a four-hit shutout in his Oakland debut at Tampa Bay, the A's third shutout in their last four games...in **2014** six A's players appear in the All-Star Game at Minnesota, matching the Athletics record for most players to play in an All-Star Game...the A's also had six players in 1973 and 1975.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (1-4, 4.54 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 11 and is scheduled to make his seventh start of the season and his career...the seven starts are fifth most among American League rookies...made his Major League debut June 11 at Cincinnati after just 43 minor league appearances, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...had not pitched above Single-A prior to this year...became the 46th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut (Overton became the 47th)...is the first of those to take the loss since Brett Anderson on April 10, 2009 against Seattle.

LAST TWO, FIRST FOUR: Is 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (10 er in 10.0 ip) and .317 (13-for-41) opponents batting average over his last two starts after going 1-3 with a 2.81 ERA and .221 opponents batting average over his first four starts.

STRIKEOUTS: Has 37 strikeouts in 35.2 innings over the first six starts of his career (9.34 per nine innings)...since 1913, his 37 strikeouts are fourth most by an A's pitcher over the first six games of his career.

AL AND NL: Has made four of his first six career starts against National League teams...is 1-3 with a 4.01 ERA (11 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts in interleague play compared to 0-1 with a 5.73 ERA (7 er in 11.0 ip) in two starts against American League teams.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .163 (8-for-49) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .224 (11-for-49) the second time and .395 (15-for-38) after that...the opponents number five hitter is 1-for-15 (.067) and the three hitter is 2-for-18 (.111)...has issued 10 of his 15 walks to left-handed hitters...three of the four home runs he has allowed have come with runners on base.

THIS AND THAT: Received eight runs of support in his lone win on June 27 at San Francisco...has a total of eight runs of support in his other four starts (28.0 ip, 2.57 RSA)...has not allowed a run in the first or second innings (12.0 ip)...has a 3.00 ERA (4 er in 12.0 ip) in innings three and four and a 10.80 ERA (14 er in 11.2 ip) from the fifth inning on...is the eighth starting pitcher in Oakland history to allow to allow three runs or fewer in each of his first four starts, the first since A.J. Griffin in 2012...was charged with the loss in each of his first three starts to join Brad Rigby (1997) and Mike Morgan (1978) as the only three pitchers in Oakland history to lose each of the first three games of their career...is just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1913 to lose each of his first three career games while allowing three runs or fewer in each game...the others are Duane Pillette (1949 Yankees), Jim McAndrew (1968 Mets) and Kyle Drabek (2010 Blue Jays)...allowed four runs or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of his first five career starts...since 1913, the only other Major League pitcher to do that and lose at least four of those games is Tony Armas, who went 0-4 with a 2.97 ERA over his first five career starts with Montreal from Aug. 16, 1999-May 30, 2000.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, a 2-1 A's loss at Cincinnati June 11...at the age of 23 years, 113 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to start a game since Trevor Cahill on June 19, 2011 (23 years, 110 days)...tossed 104 pitches, which at the time tied for second most by an A's pitcher in his ML debut since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988 (Mazzaro, 105 on June 2, 2009)...the A's scored a run in the first and he blanked the Reds on three hits and a walk over the first two innings...struck out the first batter he faced (Cozart)...allowed his only runs in the third inning on a two-run home run by Bruce...was relieved by Dull after 5.2 innings with the A's trailing 2-1.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Texas June 16 in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on a hit and a walk over the first six innings and had retired 15 straight when he allowed a leadoff home run to Desmond in the seventh...an Alonso error contributed to an unearned run later in the inning and he was relieved by Dull with the bases loaded and one out in the seventh and the A's trailing 2-1...Dull struck out the final two batters in the inning...Colby Lewis retired the first 23 Athletics before Alonso walked in the eighth and had a no-hitter until Muncy doubled to lead off the ninth.

THIRD START: He lost his third consecutive start in the A's 4-2 loss to Milwaukee June 22 in Oakland...shutout the Brewers on three hits and a walk over the first four innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the fifth inning...Flores scored on a Rivera sacrifice and Gennett added a two-run home run...was relieved by Rodriguez to start the seventh with the A's trailing 3-1.

FOURTH START: He picked up his first Major League win in the A's 8-3 victory at San Francisco June 27...retired each of the first 13 batters before allowing a one-out single to Pagan in the fifth inning...shutout the Giants on two hits and a walk over the first seven innings and had an 8-0 lead when he allowed his only two runs in the eighth inning...loaded the bases with no outs before Stratton grounded into a double play to score a run...was relieved by Rodriguez who allowed a run to score on a wild pitch.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to Pittsburgh July 3 in Oakland...the A's scored twice in the second and he blanked the Pirates on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...loaded the bases with one out in the fifth and then allowed a two-run single to Polanco before striking out the final two batters...the A's scored a run in the bottom of the fifth to take a 3-2 lead but he allowed a RBI triplez to Frazier and a RBI single to Kratz in the sixth for the loss.

LAST START: He had his first career no decision in the A's 10-9 loss at Houston a week ago today...retired each of the first six batters and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed his first hit, a leadoff single by Altuve in the fourth...Correa followed with a home run and Mengden was charged with four more runs in the fifth inning, including RBI singles by Gonzalez and Correa...left after 4.2 innings, the first time he did not complete at least five innings.

MINORS: Began the season at Double-A Midland and went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts before he was promoted to Triple-A Nashville May 1...went 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds and combined for a 5-1 record and a 1.19 ERA in 11 minor league starts overall...the ERA was sixth lowest in all of the minor leagues at the time of his promotion...allowed just three home runs in 68.1 innings, an average of 0.40 per nine innings...went 4-0 with a 0.79 ERA over his first nine starts and was 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA over his final two starts...allowed a .179 opponents batting average, including .177 against right-handed hitters compared to .182 against left-handers...yielded a .068 batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents were 8-for-64 (.125) with four walks and a hit by pitch (.188 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...his teams combined for a 9-2 (.818) record in his 11 starts...had five starts where he did not allow a run but had just two wins and three no decisions in those games...had a 24.0 inning scoreless streak from April 26 to May 13.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was originally drafted by Houston in the fourth round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft...was traded to Oakland with catcher Jacob Nottingham for left-handed pitcher Scott Kazmir on July 23, 2015...has compiled a 15-5 record and a 2.87 ERA (67 er in 210.0 ip) in 43 games, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...has 209 strikeouts in 210.0 innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER												
RHP Sonny Gray (3-8, 5.16 ERA): Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 5 and is 0-3 with a 4.01 ERA in seven starts since his return...was placed on the DL May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...is 0-7 with a 6.16 ERA and .293 opponents batting average over his last 12 starts...the seven-game losing streak is a career high and is tied for the longest active streak in the majors (Morgan, PHI)...has a 5.16 ERA, which is seventh highest in the American League...is tied for the seventh lowest winning percentage (.273), has the eighth highest opponents on-base percentage (.338) and is tied for ninth in losses (8)...has 13 wild pitches, which is five more than any other pitcher...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 4-0 A's loss at Minnesota July 6 (6.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 4 bb, 5 so)...is 2-1 with a 2.67 ERA (27.0 ip, 23 h, 10 r, 8 er, 11 bb, 20 so, 3 hr) in four career starts against Toronto.

- Has tossed 305.2 innings, which is the most in the AL and fourth most in the majors.
- Has allowed 36-of-151 (23.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 18.2%).
- Is tied for second in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (31) and ranks fourth in walks per nine innings (2.89)...is tied for the second most wild pitches (20) and ranks fifth in most home runs allowed (38).
