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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (39-51) VS. TORONTO BLUE JAYS (51-41)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won the first game after the All-Star Break for the fifth time in the last seven years...went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 11-10 (.524) since then...are 39-51 (.433), which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by 14½ games...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 32 days in fourth, 10 days tied for fourth, and 20 days in fifth.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.18 ERA (299 er in 519.2 ip) over the last 59 games after posting a 3.91 ERA over the first 31 games through May 7...have a 4.74 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.270)...have a 5.54 ERA (77 er in 125.0 ip) over the last 14 games...have allowed 10 runs or more four times over that stretch and two runs or fewer five times.

STARTING PITCHING: Daniel Mengden tossed 3.1 innings last night, marking the 27th time this year an A's starting pitcher tossed fewer than five innings...that is the most in the majors...starters are 7-5 with a 4.95 ERA (59 er in 107.1 ip) over the last 19 games after going 0-9 with a 5.29 ERA over a 17-game stretch from June 3 to 22...are 24-39 with a 5.07 ERA (273 er in 484.1 ip) for the season...are tied for the most losses in the American League, have the third highest ERA, the third fewest innings pitched and the third fewest wins...are tied for the second most walks (186) but have surrendered the second fewest home runs (67)...are one of five AL teams without a complete game and the A's streak of 141 consecutive games without a complete game is second longest in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009) and the second longest active streak in the AL (Baltimore, 274).

OFFENSE: The A's hit three home runs last night after tallying just five over the previous nine games...19 of the A's last 33 home runs have come with runners on base...are batting .231 (86-for-373) with nine home runs and 39 runs scored in 11 games in July (3.5 runs per game)...are tied for the second fewest home runs in the American League this month, have the third lowest batting average and the fourth fewest runs scored...have a .305 on-base percentage overall, which is the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors...rank second in the AL in fewest walks (225) and strikeouts (604) and third in lowest slugging percentage (.399).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last two games, including a season-high four errors in the final game before the All-Star Break, to snap their Athletics franchise record streak of 15 consecutive games without an error...broke the previous mark of 12 from June 3-15, 2002...now have 58 errors for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...also rank fourth in double plays (93)...A's outfielders have 10 assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for third fewest in the majors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this 10-game homestand against Toronto (1-0), Houston (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games)...will play 20 of their first 29 games after the All-Star Break at home as the A's will sandwich two 10-game homestands around a nine-game road trip from July 25-Aug. 14...went 1-4 on the last homestand against San Francisco (1-1) and Pittsburgh (0-3) and have lost 10 of their last 14 home games... are 18-26 (.409) at home for the season, which is the fourth worst home record in the American League...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (1-2) and Houston (2-2) and are 21-25 (.457) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 9-5 since then...are batting .244 (354-for-1451) at home compared to .259 (419-for-1619) on the road...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL...have a 4.19 ERA (185 er in 397.0 ip) at home compared to 5.28 (234 er in 398.2 ip) on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have played four consecutive one-run games for the first time this year and are 2-2 in those games...are 11-15 (.423) in one-run games for the season...have lost 12 of their last 18 one-run games after winning five of the first eight...each of the A's last two losses are walk-off losses and the A's are now 3-5 in walk-off games...the five

walk-off losses are tied for second most in the majors (Texas, 9)...have lost each of their last three extra inning games and are 2-3 for the season... the Oakland record for fewest extra inning games in a non-strike season is nine in 1974 and 1975.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 4 for their last 9 (.444) and are batting .235 (16-for-68) for the season...are tied for the American League lead in RBI (11), rank second in hits (16) and plate appearances (69) and tied for third in extra base hits (4)...are the only team without a pinch walk.

DESIGNATED HITTER: The A's designated hitter is batting .208 (64for-308) with eight home runs and 30 RBI...the RBI are the fewest in the American League, the home runs are tied with Chicago for the fewest and the batting average is second lowest (Houston, .179)...the A's DH has homered just once over the last 40 games (Khris Davis, June 17 vs. Los Angeles)...the A's DH has entered the game defensively seven times this year, which is the most times that has happened since 1995 when they also did it seven times.

BEFORE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's had a 38-51 (.427) record at the All-Star Break, which was fifth worst in Oakland history and the worst since 2011 (39-53, .424)...were 15½ games out of first place in the American League West, which matched the third largest deficit at the break in Oakland history and was the worst since 2001 (19)...allowed 105 home runs, which tied for third most and was the most since 1997 (114)...had 670 strikeouts, which was third most behind 2014 (728) and 2015 (680)... had a 4.73 ERA, which was the first time the A's had an ERA above 4.24 since 2000 (4.80)...the offense drew just 222 walks, which was the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season 1958 (214).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 20 times this year and currently have 11 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard)... Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...this marks the sixth time in the last 10 years the A's have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 20 players have combined to miss 848 games (42.4 games per stint)...today is the 49th day the A's have had at least 11 players on the DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. BLUE JAYS: The season series is even at two games each...the A's won the first game in Oakland last night after losing two of three at Toronto in April...have lost six of their last eight games to the Blue Jays... went 1-5 against Toronto last year, marking the first time they lost the season series to the Blue Jays since 2010...are 31-38 against the Blue Jays dating back to 2008 but are 214-189 all-time...that includes 106-95 in Oakland, 108-92 in Toronto and 0-2 in Las Vegas.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's overcame a four-run deficit to win last night, matching the season high (May 15 at Tampa Bay)...have been successful in 11-of-17 (64.8%) replay challenges, which is the second best percentage in the majors (Miami 66.7%)...*Khris Davis* hit his 20th home run of the season last night, his third consecutive season with 20 or more home runs... *Ryan Dull* has a 10.0-inning scoreless streak and has a 0.39 ERA (1 er in 23.0 ip) and .091 (7-for-77) opponents batting average over his last 22 games...*Marcus Semien* leads AL shortstops and ranks second in the majors with a career-high 19 home runs...*Stephen Vogt* is batting .358 (19-for-53) with 12 runs scored and 13 RBI over his last 15 games

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1971** Vida Blue tosses a one-hitter as the A's defeat Detroit 4-0...Blue improves to 18-3 with the victory and would go on to win both the MVP and the Cy Young Award...in **1991** the A's score three times in the bottom of the 13th inning after Cleveland scores twice in the top of the 13th for a 7-6 win...Mike Gallego has a two-run triple to tie the game and scores the winning run when Terry Steinbach walks with the bases loaded...in **2011** Ryan Sweeney extends his errorless streak to 166 games, setting an Oakland record for consecutive errorless games by an outfielder.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (3-8, 5.16 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 5 and is 0-3 with a 4.01 ERA (19 er in 42.2 ip) in seven starts since his return...was placed on the DL May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA in nine starts before going on the DL.

SEVEN-GAME LOSING STREAK: Is 0-7 with a 6.16 ERA (44 er in 64.1 ip) and .293 (77for-263) opponents batting average over his last 12 starts...the seven-game losing streak is a career high (previous: 4, Aug. 1-16, 2014) and is tied for the longest active streak in the

majors (Morgan, PHI)...it is the longest losing streak by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross had an eight-game losing streak from May 19-Sept. 24, 2012... his last win came on April 22 at Toronto and his streak of 12 consecutive starts without a win is tied for second longest by an A's starter this century (13, Braden, April 29-Sept. 29, 2007; 12, Bassitt, Aug. 9, 2015-April 28, 2016)...went 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA and .232 opponents batting average over his first four starts.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has a 5.16 ERA, which is sixth highest in the American League...has the eighth highest opponents on-base percentage (.338), is tied for the eighth lowest winning percentage (.273) and is tied for 10th in losses (8).

WILD PITCHES: Has 13 wild pitches, which is five more than any other pitcher...they are most in Athletics history before the All-Star Break...had three wild pitches May 20 against New York and is the first A's pitcher with three wild pitches in a game since Doug Johns on Sept. 6, 1995 at Boston...has 43 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53).

RUN SUPPORT: Received no run support in his last start for the third time this year...it was the ninth time in 16 starts this year he received two runs of support or fewer in a start...is 1-6 in those games compared to 2-2 with runs of support or more...is 31-4 in 49 starts with three runs of support or more in his career.

BEFORE THE BREAK: Went 3-8 with a 5.16 ERA in 16 starts before the All-Star Break...the eight losses were two more than his combined pre-All-Star Break total from the previous two seasons (20-6, 2.42 ERA in 37 starts)...is now 23-14 with a 3.13 ERA in 54 career appearances before the All-Star Break compared to 13-14 with a 3.38 ERA (90 er in 239.2 ip) in 38 games after the break.

AGAINST THE EAST: Is 1-2 with a 7.78 ERA (17 er in 19.2 ip) in four starts against American League East competition compared to 2-6 with a 4.44 ERA (35 er in 71.0 ip) in 12 starts against everyone else...is now 6-9 with a 3.98 ERA (56 er in 126.2 ip) in 21 career starts against the AL East compared to 30-19 with a 3.02 ERA (153 er in 455.0 ip) in 71 games against everyone else.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-1 with a 2.51 ERA (8 er in 28.2 ip) in five starts during the day compared to 2-7 with a 6.39 ERA (44 er in 62.0 ip) in 11 starts at night...has the second highest night ERA in the American League and is tied for second in losses...over the last two years, he is 6-3 with a 2.01 ERA (20 er in 89.1 ip) in 14 starts during the day, 11-12 with a 4.08 ERA (95 er in 209.1 ip) in 33 starts at night.

SPOTS IN THE ORDER: Has held the opponents number seven hitter to a .146 (6-for-41) batting average, which is the lowest in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Pomeranz, SD .139) among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...however, the opponents number eight hitter is batting .447 (17-for-38) and the nine hitter is hitting .424 (14-for-33), both of which are the highest marks in the majors...the four and five hitters are a combined 13-for-74 (.176) with no home runs.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has yielded a .317 (26-for-82) batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents are batting .229 (30-for-131) the first time through the lineup, .274 (34-for-124) the second time and .340 (35-for-103) after that...has surrendered nine of his 12 home runs to right-handed hitters and has a .522 opponents slugging percentage against righties compared to .399 against lefties...opponents are 23-for-51 (.451) with four doubles and four home runs (.765 slugging percentage) when putting the first pitch in play.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.68 ERA (14 er in 47.0 ip) and .211 (36-for-171) opponents batting average over the first three innings of the game compared to a 7.83 ERA (38 er in 43.2 ip) and .337 (63-for-187) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

IN JULY: Is 0-2 with a 6.00 ERA (8 er in 12.0 ip) in two starts in July...had allowed just 16 runs in 77.0 career July innings entering this year (1.64

ERA)...is now 7-3 with a 2.22 ERA (22 er in 89.0 ip) in 14 career appearances in the month of July...the ERA is his lowest for any month of the season.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Was scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start on April 4 against Chicago (AL) due to food poisoning...started two days later against the White Sox and picked up the win in a 2-1 decision... tossed 6.1 innings to go over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career in a 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 11...was 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA over his first four starts...then matched the shortest outing of his career on April 27 at Detroit he tossed just 2.0 innings and allowed four runs in a 9-4 loss...it was his shortest outing as a starter (pitched 2.0 innings in his first two career outings, both in relief)...matched his career highs by allowing seven runs on 11 hits in an 8-2 loss to Seattle on May 3...allowed a career-high tying seven runs for the second consecutive start in a 14-7 loss at Boston May 9...allowed a career-high tying three home runs in a no decision at Tampa Bay May 15 (also Aug. 22, 2015 vs. Tampa Bay)...went 0-3 with a 9.61 ERA in four starts in May...allowed 25 runs, which were his most ever in a month (21, Aug. 2014)...surrendered five home runs, which match his most in a month (Aug. 2015)...had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss at Houston June 5...left with a 2-1 lead but Coulombe allowed a run in the sixth for the blown save ... it was the first of two times he left with the lead only to have the bullpen blown the save (Axford, June 26 at Los Angeles-AL)...allowed a career-high tying seven runs for the third time this year in a 7-3 loss to Pittsburgh July 1.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Minnesota on July 6...allowed four hits and walked three batters over the first four innings but did not yield a run...surrendered his only run in the fifth inning on a Mauer RBI double...left after six innings trailing 1-0...Santana shut out the A's on two hits and no walks.

RHP Rich Hill (9-3, 2.25 ERA): Was reinstated from the disabled list July 2 and is 1-0 with a 3.00 ERA in two starts since his return...was placed on the 15-day DL June 9 retroactive to May 30 with a strained left groin... is 6-0 with a 2.05 ERA and .184 opponents batting average over his last seven starts and has not allowed a home run...the winning streak equals his career high and matches the second longest active streak in the American League...based on a minimum of 70 innings pitched, he has the lowest opponents slugging percentage (.266) and fewest home runs per nine innings (0.24) in the majors...ranks second in the AL in ERA (2.25), opponents batting average (.201) and strikeouts per nine innings (10.66)...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's win at Houston July 7 (6.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 10 so)...is 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA in 10 career appearances, including three starts, against Toronto.

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 4.99 ERA (121 er in 218.1 ip) over its last 63 games after posting a 2.42 ERA over its first 27 games through May 2...has a 4.22 ERA for the season, which is the fifth highest in the American League
- Has tossed 311.1 innings, which is the most in the AL and fourth most in the maiors.
- Has allowed 36-of-153 (23.5%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 18.2%).
- Ranks second in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (33) and fifth in walks per nine innings (2.98)...is tied for the second most wild pitches (20) and ranks fifth in most home runs allowed (38).
- First batters faced are batting .235 (64-for-272) with 20 walks (.288 onbase percentage)...is tied for second in the AL in first batter strikeouts (73), has the third lowest on-base percentage and slugging percentage (.324) and fifth lowest batting average.
