LAST NIGHT:

- Last night, the Blue Jays dropped the opener of a 3-GM set to Oakland by a 7-6 score...The club fell to 9-16 in one-run contests this season and 13-16 in the opening game of a series...Marked just the time in 22 games the team has lost a game when scoring 7+ runs...Also lost on April 8 vs. BOS by an 8-7 score.
- Marcus Stroman snapped a string of 2ER or less allowed by the starting rotation in **12** straight starts by giving up **6ER** in **4.2** innings...Over his first **eight** starts posted a **3.54** ERA...Since then in his last 11, has recorded an ERA of 6.54.

 KEEP ON RUNNUNG:
 In the 29 games since June 11, TOR has scored 190 runs (6.55 runs per game); most in ML (MIN 2nd at 171)...Have scored 10+ runs an AL-best 10 times this season with eight of those contests coming since June 11...Have also scored 5+ runs in eight of their last 10

Josh Donaldson and Edwin Encarnacion rank 1st and 2nd in the AL since June 11 in runs scores with 34 & 30 respectively...In fact Josh Donaldson currently leads the Majors with 81 runs scored, six more than Mookie Betts.

STARTING ON RIGHT FOOT:

- Have a ML-leading 59 quality starts...The rotation has limited the opposition to 3ER or less in 12 of their last 13 and 2ER or less in nine of their last 13 games...Lead all of baseball with 584.0 innings from the rotation.
- Of the top 10 pitchers with the lowest batting average in RISP, the Blue Jays have three starters among the group...R.A. Dickey ranks 3^{rd} at .190 (16-84), while J.A. Happ is 4^{th} at .200 (18-90) & Aaron Sanchez sits at 5^{th} with a .208 (21-101) mark...Overall the club ranks T1st (CLE) in the AL with a .238 opp. Avg. with RISP.
- Opponents are **hitting only** .050 (1-for-20) against Blue Jays starting pitchers on 0-0 counts over the past 14 days (10 starts). (**MLB Rank:** 1st of 30 teams' SP's; League Avg: .336).

RETURNING TO FORM:

- Over his last **19** contests, **Troy Tulowitzki** is batting **.325** (26-80) with **7**-HR, **21**-RBI & a **.995** OPS... Over his first **47** games this season posted a **.199** AVG (34-171) with **8** HR, **23** RBI & just a **.658** OPS.
- Tulowitzki has not swung and missed (30 swings) on low fastballs in the past 30 days. (MLB Rank: 1st of 157 full-time players; League Avg: 14.0%)

THE JULY ROAD TRIP:

- Today, the Blue Jays continue the lone road trip for the month of July...Will play the **second** of a **3-GM** set in Oakland, before finishing the trip with a **2-GM** series in Arizona.
- Michael Saunders is batting .293 with 21-XBH (11-HR) & a .580 SLG on the road this season...The .580 SLG ranks 4th in the AL, while his **.941** OPS ranks 5th on the road.
- Josh Donaldson has posted a .554 SLG on the road in 2016, the 10th best mark in the AL.

BLUE JAYS vs. ATHLETICS:

- All-Time: 189-214...All-Time, Road: 97-106...2016: 2-2
 Have won six of their last eight & seven of their last 10 vs. the Athletics, dating back to last season....Have outscored them 60-36 over this stretch, while out homering them 16-9.
- Since 2014, the Jays are **10-7** vs. OAK...In that time the pitching staff has held the A's to a **2.85** ERA (148.2IP/47ER).
- Five Blue Jays currently sit with a lifetime average of .300 or better vs. Oakland...Darwin Barney - .571 (4-7), Russell Martin - .367 (11-30), Kevin Pillar - .364 (16-44), Ezequeil Carrera - .304 (7-23) & Josh Donaldson - .317 (13-41).

LEGENDARY COMPANY:

- Only five players in AL history have ever scored 80 runs and hit 20 homers prior to the All-Star break...Josh Donaldson joined that group on Sunday...The list includes Lou Gehrig (1936), Ted Williams (1946), Reggie Jackson (1969), Frank Thomas (1994) & Alex Rodriguez (2000).
- Josh has recorded a hit in 28 of his last 32G while batting .403 (50-124) with 22-XBH, 34-RBI, 26-BB, .513 OBP & a .774 SLG... Has reached base safely in 43 of his last 44 contests while batting .364 (60-165) with 25-XBH & a .490 OBP (39-BB) over that period...Ranks 2^{nd} in WAR on the season at 5.4 (Mike Trout – 5.5). Josh Donaldson's OBP is .517 in the past 30 days (24 games). (MLB
- Rank: 1st of 224 full-time players; League Avg: .337).

ED "WING

- Edwin Encarnacion currently ranks 1st in the Majors with 80 RBI & T3rd in the AL with 23 HR ... His 80 RBI are 3rd most in Blue Jays history prior to the break...Delgado with 97 & Wells with 84 both in **2003** are the only players with more...Is now just **3** HR shy of Vernon Wells for **4th** on the all-time Blue Jays list at **223**.
- Edwin is hitting .400 (10-for-25) with RISP in the past 30 days. (MLB Rank: 2nd of 39 full-time players; League Avg: .268).

MAKE IT EIGHT:

Kevin Pillar went 1-4 last night to extend his hitting streak to eight games...Over that stretch is hitting .414 (12-29). In 11 games vs. AL West clubs this season is hitting .425 (17-40) with

7-2B and a .600 SLG

ROAD WARRIOR:

Devon Travis comes into the game today on an 11-GM road hitting streak...Over that stretch owns.500 (21-42) average with 5-2B, 4HR, **13RBI** & a **1.448** OPS...Has **eight** multi-hit games in those **11** contests...Has a 1.469 OPS over the past month, 1st in MLB.

COMING AROUND:

- From April through May, Blue Jays relievers had posted a **4.38 ERA**, **.265 opp. Avg** and an **8-18** record...Since July 1 are **2-3** with a **2.38** ERA, (38.0IP/9ER) and a **.201 opp avg...Both marks represent** the best figures in the AL since July 1.
- Blue Jays relief pitchers have walked 11 of 352 right-handed batters (3.1%) over the past 60 days. (MLB Rank: 1st of 30 teams' RP's; League Avg: 8.1%).
- Relievers also have a first-pitch strike percentage of **65.1%** (691/1061). (**MLB Rank: this leads MLB of 30** teams' RP's; League Avg: 59.5%)

A STEADY CLIMB:

Overall this season TOR ranks 2nd in runs scored (454), OBP (.334) & 3rd in HR (131)...Began the season slowly, however, have proved offensive totals in each month.

TODAY'S START & HIGHLIGHTS:

- Since joining the Blue Jays in 2013, has posted a 1st half record of 25-38 with a 4.32 ERA...Post All-Star break has recorded a 21-8 reocrd with a 3.30 ERA...Over those seasons leads MLB in games starts with 120, while ranking 9th in AL with 559 SO.
- Has induced 15 GIDP this year, ranking 3rd in AL behind Martin Perez and Mike Pelfrey (21)...RH hitters have ground into 13 double plays in 52 opportunities (25.0%), the 5th highest percentage in baseball.
- The club has scored more than three runs just eight times in his 19starts this season, resulting in a 7-12 team record...Since June 1, however, has received 4.9 runs of support per start (5-3 since that point).
- Has allowed just one stolen base over his last 35 starts and just 18 since joining the club in 2013 (771.1 IP).
- As a Blue Jay has allowed 106 home runs, most in MLB over that span (since 2013)...lan Kennedy is 2nd at 95.
- \blacksquare Has held batters to a .190 average (16-84) with RISP this season, the 5th lowest mark in baseball...Over his last eight starts, has surrendered only three hits in 32 opportunities with RISP, while allowing just a .413 OPS.
- Won back-to-back starts for just the second time this season after a 6-1 victory July 10 vs. DET...Allowed a SB to C. Maybinin the 3rd inning, the first SB he has given up in 35 starts (since July 4, 2015 at DET)...In the outing had a strike percent of 87.5% (14/16) with two strikes...Has tossed 7.0 innings in three consecutive outings, the first time to do so since recording four starts of at least 7.0 IP July 23-August 7, 2015...In his last three starts has allowed just six earned runs...Has now made 60 straight home starts with at least 5.0 innings pitched, the longest active streak in MLB.
- \blacksquare Earned his first win at home this season, snapping a streak of six consecutive losses at Rogers Centre July 5 vs. KC.
- 🛛 Allowed four home runs, all solos in a 10-8 win at CWS on June 25...Three of the home runs came in succession in the 2nd inning...Marked the first time in 10 starts to win a game when he has allowed 3+ HR's in a game...Snapped a string of five straight starts with 3 runs or less allowed.
- 🛛 Did not allow a hit through the first 5.0 innings, June 3 at BOS...Did not surrender an ER over his 6.2 IP, his second outing this season where he has not given up an earned run over at least 6.0 P...Walked a season-high five batters, his most since June 18, 2015 vs. NYM.
- Snapped a four-game losing streak May 13 at TEX...Tossed 8.0 scoreless innings in the victory, the first time to record at least 8.0 innings without allowing a run since July 29, 2015 vs. PHI...Marked the 4th time as a Blue Jay to hold the opposition scoreless over at least 8.0 IP...Overall it was the 16th time in his career to record at least 8.0 scoreless innings.
- 🛛 Is one of four different Blue Jay pitcher to win a game at 40+ years of age having done so 11 times...Joined Darren Oliver (6x), Dan Plesac (1x) & Dave Stieb (1x) on that list.
- VS. THE A's:

🛛 Is making his 15th career start vs. OAK this evening...Has held the Athletics to three earned runs or fewer in 10 consecutive starts, dating back to 2005 (18ER/70 IP)...His 2.78 ERA at Oakland Coliseum ranks as his 3rd lowest career mark among ballparks in which he has made at least six starts. CAREER NOTES:

🛛 Became the 10th pitcher since 1900 to record consecutive one-hitters (June 12, 2012 at TB and June 18, 2012 vs. BAL).

🛛 Won his 1st career Gold Glove in 2013 after posting a .962 fielding percentage, beating out teammate Mark Buehrle.
