### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (40-52) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (50-42)

MONDAY, JULY 18, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (5-6, 4.37) VS. RHP MIKE FIERS (6-3, 4.35) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won two of three from Toronto to open up post All-Star Break play and are now 5-8 (.385) in July...went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 12-11 (.522) since then...are 40-52 (.435) overall, which is tied for the third worst record in the American League...the 12 games under .500 is one short of the season high of 13 (five times, last: 38-51 on July 10)...are tied for fourth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 33 days in fourth, 11 days tied for fourth, and 20 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: Rich Hill left the game after five pitches yesterday and became the first A's pitcher since at least 1913 to have no batters faced in a starting assignment...it was the 28th time this year an A's starter has pitched fewer than five innings, which is the most in the majors...starters are now 8-5 with a 4.92 ERA (62 er in 113.1 ip) over the last 21 games after going 0-9 with a 5.29 ERA over a 17-game stretch from June 3 to 22... are 25-39 with a 5.07 ERA (276 er in 490.1 ip) for the season...have the second fewest innings pitched in the American League (Baltimore, 485.1) and rank third in highest ERA, most losses and fewest wins...are tied for the second most walks (190) but are tied for the second fewest home runs (68)...are one of five AL teams without a complete game and the A's streak of 143 consecutive games without a complete game is second longest in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009) and the second longest active streak in the AL (Baltimore, 276).

**PITCHING:** The A's have compiled a 5.14 ERA (307 er in 537.2 ip) over the last 61 games after posting a 3.91 ERA over the first 31 games through May 7...have a 4.72 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.269) and on-base percentage (.335) and have issued the fourth most walks (296).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .230 (100-for-435) in July, which ranks third lowest in the American League...overall, have a .305 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors... rank second in the AL in fewest walks (230), strikeouts (619) and doubles (143) and third in lowest slugging percentage (.400)...have homered 10 times in the last six games after tallying just two home runs over the previous six contests...20 of the A's last 37 home runs have come with runners on base.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed at least one error in four consecutive games (seven errors total) to snap an Athletics franchise record streak of 15 consecutive games without an error...now have 60 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...rank fourth in double plays (94)...A's outfielders have 10 assists, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors (San Francisco and St. Louis, 9).

**IN THE PINCH:** Yonder Alonso had a pinch hit two-run game-tying double in the sixth inning yesterday and A's pinch hitters are now 5 for their last 10 (.500) with seven RBI...are batting .246 (17-for-69) with two doubles, a triple, two home runs and 13 RBI for the season...lead the American League and rank ninth in the majors in RBI...rank second in the AL in hits and plate appearances (70) and tied for second in extra base hits (5)...are the only team without a pinch walk.

CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's last seven games have been decided by two runs or fewer and the A's are 4-3 over that span...are 12-15 (.444) in one-run games and 8-6 (.571) in two-run contests...are 3-5 in walk-off games and the five losses are tied for third most in the American League... have lost each of their last three extra inning games and are 2-3 in extra inning games for the season...the Oakland record for fewest extra inning games in a non-strike season is nine in 1974 and 1975.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on this 10-game homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (three games) and Tampa Bay (four games)...will play 20 of their first 29 games after the All-Star Break at home as the A's will sandwich two 10-game homestands around a nine-game road trip from July 25-Aug. 14...went 1-4 on the last homestand and have lost 11 of their last 16 home games...are 19-27 (.413) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (1-2) and Houston (2-2) and are 21-25 (.457) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to

June 11 and are 9-5 since then...are batting .243 (368-for-1513) at home compared to .259 (419-for-1619) on the road...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL...have a 4.19 ERA (193 er in 415.0 ip) at home compared to 5.28 (234 er in 398.2 ip) on the road.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have won the first game of a series in nine of the last 10 series but have lost the final game of a series in nine of the last 10 series...for the season, are 18-12 in the first game of a series, 9-21 in the final game of a series...the A's have a nine-game losing streak in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...the A's designated hitter has homered just once over the last 42 games (Khris Davis, June 17 vs. Los Angeles)...have eight home runs for the season, which is tied with Chicago for the fewest in the American League.

BEFORE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's had a 38-51 (.427) record at the All-Star Break, which was fifth worst in Oakland history and the worst since 2011 (39-53, .424)...were 15½ games out of first place in the American League West, which matched the third largest deficit at the break in Oakland history and was the worst since 2001 (19)...allowed 105 home runs, which tied for third most and was the most since 1997 (114)...had 670 strikeouts, which was third most behind 2014 (728) and 2015 (680)... had a 4.73 ERA, which was the first time the A's had an ERA above 4.24 since 2000 (4.80)...the offense drew just 222 walks, which was the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season 1958 (214).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 20 times this year and currently have 11 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard)... Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker and Sogard are on the 60-day DL...this marks the sixth time in the last 10 years the A's have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 20 players have combined to miss 870 games (43.5 games per stint)...today is the 51st day the A's have had at least 11 players on the DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's trail in the season series, 4-6...are 2-5 in Houston and 2-1 in Oakland...have won seven of the last nine games in the Coliseum...lost the season series to the Astros for the first time last year... lead the all-time series 44-29 (.603), which is the sixth best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 60 or more times...16 of the A's 29 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 23-12 in Oakland and 21-17 in Houston.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

Khris Davis has 22 home runs, which is tied for sixth in the American League and two more than Josh Reddick's team-leading total from last year... Ryan Dull has a career-high 11.1-inning scoreless streak, which is 0.1 innings short of the A's season high by Madson... Ryan Madson has pitched in 599 games in his career and needs one more to become the 12th active pitcher with 600 games pitched... Marcus Semien hit his 20th home run of the season yesterday to become the fifth shortstop in Athletics history to hit 20 home runs (Miguel Tejada 5 times, Eddie Joost twice, Bobby Crosby and Bert Campaneris once)... Stephen Vogt is 9-for-15 (.600) with six runs, a double, triple, two home runs and six RBI over his last four games.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1927** Ty Cobb, who spent most of his career with Detroit, collects his  $4000^{th}$  career hit in an A's uniform against the Tigers...he doubles off Sam Gibson in the A's 5-3 loss...in **1983** the A's turn the fifth triple play in Oakland history vs. Detroit when John Wockenfuss hits into a Ricky Peters to Tony Phillps to Bill Almon to Wayne Gross triple play...in **1988** Stan Javier collects five hits in five at bats in the A's 7-2 victory over Cleveland...in **2004** Mark Mulder extends his winning streak to 11 games in the A's 5-3 win over Chicago...the streak, which would end in his next start, is the second longest in Oakland history.

## TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (5-6, 4.37 ERA)

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 4-0 with a 3.40 ERA (18 er in 47.2 ip) over his last eight starts...the four-game winning streak is a career high (previous: 3, June 24-July 4, 2015)...was 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...has allowed just two home runs during the winning streak (0.38 per nine innings) after allowing 10 over his first nine starts (1.91 per nine innings)

SUPPORT: Has left with the lead in three of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (April 12 vs. Los Angeles-AL, June 17 vs. Los Angeles, June 28 vs. San Francisco)...his run support average of 3.80 (40 rs in 94.2 ip) is eighth lowest in the American League...has received two runs of support or fewer in seven of his 17 starts, including no runs three times and one run three times...is 0-5 with two runs of support or fewer, 5-1 with three runs of support or more...is now 1-14 in 20 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 10-1 in 18 starts with three runs of support or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Has made 11 of his 17 starts this year on the road. is 1-3 with a 2.97 ERA (12 er in 36.1 ip) in six starts at home compared to 4-3 with a 5.25 ERA (34 er in 58.1 ip) in 11 starts on the road...has surrendered just two home runs in 36.1 innings at home compared to 10 in 58.1 innings on the road.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 2-1 with a 3.59 ERA (17 er in 42.2 ip) in seven starts against American League West competition compared to 3-5 with a 5.02 ERA (29 er in 52.0 ip) in 10 starts against everyone else

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has issued 23 of his 31 walks this year and 47 of 69 in his career to left-handed hitters...has a .252 (69-for-274) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup, .365 (35-for-96) after that...has allowed a .142 (21-for-148) batting average with two strikes, which ranks ninth lowest among American League pitchers that qualify for the ERA title.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 2-0 with a 1.84 ERA (3 er in 14.2 ip) in two starts in July...has won more than two games in a month just once in his career (3 in June, 2015)...went 1-0 with a 4.33 ERA in five starts in June...was 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in six starts in May...his May loss total tied for second in the American League...it was the first time he has lost four games in a month in his career...went 1-2 with a 4.03 ERA in four starts in April.

THIS AND THAT: Picked up his fifth win of the season in his last start, which is one short of his career high of six from last year...tossed a careerhigh tying 8.0 innings in his last start, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to June 18 of last year...that was the fifth longest such streak in Oakland history...has tossed fewer than six innings in 10 of his 17 starts this year...has a 2.12 ERA (4 er in 17.0 ip) in the first inning...allowed a career-high 10 hits in back-to-back starts on April 25 at Detroit and May 2 against Seattle and is the first A's pitcher with at least 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)...allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts.

LOSING STREAKS SNAPPED: Defeated Minnesota May 30 to snap his losing streak at five games...had a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned five starts from April 25 to May 19...the losing streak fell one short of his career high of six, which he ended with his first win of the season this year on April 20...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during that losing streak, which spanned nine starts from July 10, 2015 to April 7, 2016...it was the longest losing streak by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross lost eight straight from May 19 to Sept. 24, 2012.

START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-1 loss to Chicago (AL) April 7 in Oakland...the scored was tied at 0-0 when allowed a two-run home run to Abreu in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 12 in Oakland...allowed just one run in 6.0 innings and left with a 3-1 lead but Doolittle allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-2 win at New York (AL) on *April 20*...it was his first win since July 4, 2015 against Seattle...struck out a career-high eight batters on a career-high tying 111 pitches...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat...was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-3 loss at Detroit April 25...allowed a careerhigh 10 hits and left after 4.2 innings trailing 6-0...was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-3 loss to Seattle May 2 in Oakland...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits for the second consecutive start...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-3 loss at Baltimore on May 8... yielded a career-high four home runs, which are the most allowed by an A's starting pitcher since May 6, 2013 at Cleveland when Jarrod Parker also allowed four home runs...lost his fourth consecutive start in the A's 6-0 loss at Tampa Bay May 14...allowed a two-run home run to Miller in the third inning and two more runs in the

sixth...Andriese shut out the A's on two hits, no walks and a hit batter was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-1 to New York (AL) in Oakland on May 19...allowed a RBI double to Beltran in the third inning and a RBI double to Hicks in the sixth inning...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Seattle *May 24*...tossed just 4.2 innings and allowed two runs...picked up his second win of the season in the A's 3-2 win over Minnesota May 30 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Centeno in the second and a Dozier sacrifice fly in the fifth...had a no decision in the A's 6-5 loss at Houston in 12 innings on June 4...left after 4.1 innings trailing 5-3 but the A's scored single runs in the sixth and ninth innings to get him off the hook...he had a no decision in the A's 6-1 win at Cincinnati June 12...the A's scored four times in the second inning and he allowed his only run in the bottom of the second on a RBI double by Cabrera...had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win over Los Angeles June 17 in Oakland...allowed just one run in seven innings of work and left with a 2-1 lead but Madson allowed a run in the ninth inning for the blown save...was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-4 win at Los Angeles (AL) June 23...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed two runs in the fourth on a Giavotella RBI single and a Bandy sacrifice fly...had a no decision in the A's 13-11 win at San Francisco June 28...left with a 5-4 lead but Axford allowed three runs in the sixth inning for the blown save... picked up his fourth win of the season in the A's 3-1 victory at Minnesota July 4...issued a career high tying four walks but allowed just one run in 6.2 innings of work.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 3-2 win at Houston July 9...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings...retired each of the first 14 batters before Reed singled with two outs in the fifth...shutout the Astros on three hits over the first eight innings and had a 3-0 lead when he allowed back-to-back singles to Marisnick and Gonzalez to start the ninth...was relieved by Dull who allowed both inherited runners to score.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Dillon Overton (1-1, 11.42 ERA): Will be recalled from Triple-A Nashville tomorrow for his second stint with the A's this year...was selected for the first time June 25 and went 1-1 with an 11.42 ERA in two starts before he was option back to Nashville July 1...made his Major League debut June 25 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 53 minor league appearances, including 50 starts, in three professional seasons...had not pitched above Double-A prior to this year...took the loss in his last Major League start June 30 against San Francisco, a 12-6 decision (3.0 ip, 8 h, 8 r, 8 er, 3 bb, 1 so)...made two starts with Nashville following his July 1 option and went 2-0 with a 2.77 ERA...is 10-4 with a 2.98 ERA in 16 games, including 15 starts, overall with the Sounds...allowed just three home runs in 96.2 innings...leads the Pacific Coast League in wins and ranks fourth in ERA... is 9-0 with a 1.71 ERA over his last nine Triple-A starts.

#### ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

15-13, 4.20 ERA (151 er in 323.1 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 26-for-37 (70.3%)

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 4.92 ERA (126 er in 230.1 ip) over its last 65 games after posting a 2.42 ERA over its first 27 games through May 2...has a 4.20 ERA for the season, which is the fifth highest in the American League.
- Tossed 9.0 innings yesterday, which was its most since Sept. 14, 2015 when it pitched 10.2 innings in an 8-7, 14-inning loss at Chicago...has tossed 323.1 innings for the season, which is the most in the AL and third most in the majors.
