THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY: JULY 18

2001 - Jeff Bagwell hits for the cycle during a 17-11 win over St. Louis at Enron Field.

1994 - In a historic comeback, the Astros rally from an 11-0 deficit by exploding for 11 runs in the 6th inning en route to a 15-12 shocker at the Dome.

TODAY'S MEDIA AVAILABILITY

The Astros clubhouse will be open from 4-4:50 p.m...Astros manager **A.J. Hinch** will be available at approx. 4:50 p.m. in the Astros dugout.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Tonight is the opener of this 3-game series between the Astros and the home-standing A's...RHP **Mike Fiers** (6-3) will start for Houston opposite RHP **Kendall Graveman** (5-6) and the Athletics.

FIERS STARTER: The Astros have won 5 straight and are 6-1 in the last 7 starts made by RHP **Mike Fiers**, in which he's posted a 3-0 record and a 3.11 ERA (13ER/37.2IP).

ROAD WARRIORS: On the road, the Astros have won 5 of 6 games, are 9-2 in their last 11 contests and have gone 15-7 (.682) in their last 22 road games, dating back to May 28...since that date, they lead the AL and rank tied for 1st in the Majors in winning percentage on the road.

FURY ROAD: 2B **Jose Altuve** has hit safely in his last 16 road games at a .492 (32x65) clip and has reached safely in 32 consecutive road games, hitting .461 (59x128) with a .510 OBP in that span...including Altuve, only 5 Astros players have reached base safely in 32 straight road games: **Lance Berkman** (32g, 2006), **Craig Biggio** (33g, 2001), **Jose Cruz** (33g, 1984) and **Jeff Bagwell** (2x, last 52g from 1998-99).

HOT CLUB: Since bottoming out on May 22 with a record of 17-28, the Astros have gone 33-14 (.702) since May 23, the best record in the Majors in that time frame.

BEST RECORDS IN THE MAJORS (SINCE MAY 23):

47-GAME RUN: The Astros are 33-14 in their last 47 games, marking the 1st time they've won 33 games in a 47-game span since July 27-Sept. 16, 2008...the franchise record for wins in a 47-game span is 36, set in 2004.

SINCE THE SWITCH: The Astros 33-14 record in their last 47 games coincides with RF **George Springer** being moved to the leadoff spot in the lineup...since the switch, Springer has hit 11 home runs with a .356 on-base percentage and an .840 OPS.

YESTERDAY IN SEATTLE: The Astros won the rubber game of their 3-game series in Seattle yesterday, downing the Mariners by a score of 8-1...RHP **Collin McHugh** (6-6) was solid for Houston, tossing 6.0 scoreless innings, and was backed by DH **Jose Altuve**, who went 4x5 with a homer and 3 RBI, and CF **Carlos Gomez** (1x4, 4RBI), who blasted a grand slam in the top of the 7th.

COLLIN CARD: RHP **Collin McHugh** has posted a 2.41 ERA (10ER/37.1IP) over his last 6 starts, limiting opponents to 3-or-fewer earned runs in those outings... dating back to May 19, McHugh has posted a 3.46 ERA (26ER/67.2IP) in 11 starts, while recording 74 strikeouts, which ranks 5th in the AL in that time frame.

STEADY PACE: At 50-42, the Astros have the same record through 92 games as they did in 2015...a win tonight would move them to 51-42, which would be their best record through 93 games in a season since starting 52-41 in 2001.

VS. THE A'S: The Astros are 24-19 against the A's since April 26, 2014, which includes a season series victory over Oakland in 2015 (10-9)...Houston's 24-19 record in their last 43 games opposite Oakland is a stark difference from their 1st 30 matchups, with the Astros going 5-25 in those contests.

PITCHING IN: Since May 1, the Astros have posted the best record in the AL (43-25, .632), with their pitching staff leading the AL in team ERA and in bullpen ERA, while ranking 3rd in starter's ERA (3.90) in that span.

WILL THE THRILL: All-Star RHP **Will Harris** has gone 9-for-9 in save opportunities and has posted a 1.62 ERA (7ER/39IP), which ranks 10th in the American League...in his 39 appearances this season, he's allowed just 31 hits (27 singles) in his 39.0 IP for a .250 opponent slugging percentage (4th in AL).

SMOOTH SOUNDS OF KENNY G: RHP **Ken Giles** has a 2.05 ERA (6ER/26.1IP) in his last 28 appearances, dating back to May 9...in that time frame, he has posted 36 strikeouts in his 26.1 innings pitched.

BATTING LEADER: 2B **Jose Altuve** leads the AL in batting with a .346 clip while ranking 2nd in the Majors to Washington's 2B **Daniel Murphy** (.350)...Altuve also ranks 3rd among AL position players in WAR (5.1) and in OBP (.417), while ranking 4th in OPS (.968)...his 24 stolen bases are tied for 1st in the AL.

I AM IRON MAN: 2B **Jose Altuve** has played in 183 consecutive team games, which is the longest games-played streak in the Majors.

KNOCK'EM IN: Since June 20, SS **Carlos Correa** has 24 RBI (in 22g), which ranks 2nd in the Majors to **Max Kepler** (25 RBI)...Correa has hit .282 (24x85) in those 22 games with 5 homers, 10 doubles and a .576 SLG.

UP THE CHARTS: SS **Carlos Correa** has hit 36 home runs, including 35 as a shortstop, which ranks tied for 1st among shortstops in franchise history.

EN FUEGO: 3B **Luis Valbuena** is hitting .289 (58x201) with 13 doubles, 12 home runs, 33 RBI and a .913 OPS in his last 60 games, dating back to May 4...since that date, Valbuena ranks 13th in the AL in OPS.

GURRIEL SIGNING: On Saturday, the Astros announced the signing of Cuban star IF **Yulieski Gurriel** to a Major League contract...IF **Matt Duffy** was designated for assignment to make room on the 40-man roster.

LAST START - 7/6 VS. SEA: did not factor into the decision in Houston's 9-8 win...went just 3.1 innings, his shortest start since June 2, 2013 at PHI (career-low 1.2IP)...started the game with 3.0 scoreless frames before giving up 4 runs on 3 HR in the 4th inning, snapping his home scoreless innings streak at 17.2 innings.

- despite the rough start, kept his 3-game winning streak intact, which ties his longest this season (also 4/17-5/9)...during the streak (5 starts since June 11), owns a 2.73 ERA (8ER/26.1IP).

ABOUT FIERS: 31-year-old is making his 17th start and 18th overall appearance of the season in what is his 2nd year with the Astros...will be his 99th career appearance.

- was acquired via trade along with **OF Carlos Gomez** from Milwaukee prior to the 2015 trade deadline.

- in 25 total starts with the Astros since his trade from Milwaukee, has gone 8-4 with a 3.69 ERA (60ER/146.1IP).

VS. OAK: has pitched well against Oakland in his career, despite the Astros going 0-5 in his 5 career starts against the club...his last 2 starts against the club have been quality starts, and 3 of his 4 career starts vs. the A's have been quality starts.

YOU SHALL NOT PASS: has had just 1 start all season in which he's walked more than 2 batters...ranks 11th in the AL in walks per 9.0 innings ratio (2.03, 21BB/93IP).

- began the season with 13 consecutive starts in which he allowed 2 walks or less...tied the franchise record to start a season with **RHP Collin McHugh** (2015) and **RHP Shane Reynolds** (2001).

DEEP IN THE HEART: has posted a 6-2 record and a 2.80 ERA (26ER/83.2IP) in 14 starts at Minute Maid Park since joining the Astros.

- since making his Minute Maid debut on Aug. 16, 2015, ranks 6th in the AL in ERA and 5th in opponent average (.214, 67x313) at home (min. 60 IP).

CHANGE OF PACE: 20.3% of his pitches thrown this season have been changeups...marks the highest usage of the pitch in his career, besting his 2015 season in which 15.6% of his pitches were changeups...of his 60 strikeouts this season, 24 have come via the change (most K's on any pitch).

- has thrown a higher % of changeups than all but 6 starting pitchers in the AL (min. 80IP), behind only **Marco Estrada**, **Hector Santiago**, **David Price**, **Edinson Volquez**, **Jake Odorizzi** and **Wade Miley**.

IN 2015: made 10 appearances (9 starts) with Houston last season, going 2-1 with a 3.32 ERA (23ER/62.1IP) and 59 strikeouts...following his trade to Houston, ranked 3rd among AL pitchers in opponent batting average (.197) and 11th in strikeouts per 9.0 innings (min. 60IP).

- completed his 1st full season in the Major Leagues with Houston and Milwaukee, setting single-season career highs in starts, innings and strikeouts.

IMMORTALIZED: threw the 1st no-hitter in the history of Minute Maid Park last season in what was his 3rd start with the Astros (Aug. 21 vs. LAD)...threw 134 pitches in the outing, striking out 10 and walking 3.

- was also his 1st career complete game, and 7th double-digit strikeout game...retired the last 21 batters he faced.

LAST START - 7/10 VS. OAK: led Houston to a 2-1 victory over the A's in the final game of the 1st half...allowed 1 run on 4 hits in 7.0 innings, striking out 5 with 2 walks.

THE BEARD IS BACK: the reigning AL Cy Young Award winner is set to make his 1st start since the Astros returned from the All-Star Break...will be his 20th start of the season, and 12th on the road.

- is riding a 3-game winning streak, his longest since a 4-game winning streak from Sept. 21, 2015-April 5, 2016.
- has thrown 5 consecutive quality starts, going 3-2 with a 3.73 ERA (13ER/31.1IP), 7 walks and 31 strikeouts in that span.

- went 4x5 with a with a 2-run homer in a start at DH yesterday at SEA...4 hits tied a season high, accomplished 5 times this season which leads the Majors...in 6 games as a DH this season is batting .476 (10x21) with 2 HR, 8 RBI and a 1.242 OPS (.480 OBP/.762 SLG).
- his 15 home runs ties a career high set in 2015...has 15 HR in 92 games, compared to 154 games last year.
- leads AL in batting (.346) and leads the Majors in hits (125)...ranks 3rd among ML position players in WAR (5.1)...also is T-1st in the AL in SB (24), 3rd in OBP (.417) and 4th in OPS (.968).**
- led off and started at 2B for the AL in the 2016 All-Star Game (0x3)...was his 4th career ASG (also '12, '14-15) and 2nd start...became the 2nd player in club history to start consecutive ASG (also **Biggio** at 2B from '95-'98)...his 4 All-Star nods are T-3rd in club history with **Bagwell** and **Cedeno**, behind only **Biggio** (7) and **Berkman** (5)...received 3,013,214 fan votes to beat out the 2nd place finisher for 2nd basemen, **Robinson Cano** (1,560,041).
- had 2 sac-bunts and an IBB on 7/10 vs. OAK, marking 1st time in career with multiple sac-bunts...joined **Roger Metzger** (July 23, 1972 vs. CHC) as the only players in club history to record an IBB and 2 SH in the same game...was just the 6th time since 1913 that a player had a game like this with the DH rule in effect (last, **Jose Valentin** for CWS on July 5, 2000 at KC).
- Road Warrior:** leads the AL in batting average (.404, 72x179), OBP (.471) and OPS (1.078) on the road this season...owns a 16-game road hitting streak, which is the longest active streak in the AL...has hit .492 (32x65) with 10 multi-hit games during the streak.
- has played in 183 consecutive games, which is the longest games-played streak in the Majors, immediately ahead of **OF Mike Trout** (153) and **2B Robinson Cano** (149)...did not start 1 game this year (May 7 vs. SEA), but entered as a defensive replacement and got 1 AB...last missed a game on June 21, 2015 at SEA.
- his career .317 batting average vs. the A's ranks 4th among active players with at least 250 AB vs. the club.

- his 5 career walk-off hits are the most in club history by a shortstop...has been responsible for 4 walk-off victories this season (2 singles, double, E5), which mark the most in the Majors ahead of Washington's **Jayson Werth** (2).
- leads club with 57 RBI**...since being moved to cleanup on June 14, has 25 RBI in 27 gms with 10 doubles and 6 HR while posting a .910 OPS (.367 OBP/.544 SLG).
