ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of four games since the All-Star Break and are 6-8 (.429) in July...went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 13-11 (.542) since then...are 41-52 (.441) overall, which is tied for the third worst record in the American League...are tied for fourth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 33 days in fourth, 12 days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have a nine-game losing streak in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 9-14 (.391) against left-handed starting pitchers compared to 32-38 (.457) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is the worst in the American League and third worst in the majors...are batting .260 against lefties, .250 against righties.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-0 with a 4.29 ERA (20 er in 42.0 ip) over the last eight games, which matches their longest winning streak of the season...are 26-39 with a 5.03 ERA (278 er in 497.1 ip) overall...have the second fewest innings pitched in the American League (Baltimore, 492.0) and rank third in highest ERA, most losses and fewest wins...have issued the second most walks (191) but have surrendered the third fewest home runs (69)...are one of five AL teams without a complete game and the A's streak of 144 consecutive games without a complete game is second longest in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009) and the second longest active streak in the AL (Baltimore, 277)...the A's last complete game was by Sonny Gray on Aug. 7, 2015 against Houston.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.10 ERA (310 er in 546.2 ip) over the last 62 games after posting a 3.91 ERA over the first 31 games through May 7...have a 4.70 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.269), on-base percentage (.334) and slugging percentage (.432) and have issued the fourth most walks (297).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting an American League leading .285 (37-for-130) since the All-Star Break...also lead the AL in home runs since the break (8) and rank second in runs scored (23)...for the season, the A's have the second lowest on-base percentage (.307) and the second fewest walks (236) in the AL and the third lowest slugging percentage (.401)...are tied for the second fewest strikeouts (628).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in five consecutive games (nine errors total) to snap an Athletics franchise record streak of 15 consecutive games without an error...now have 62 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...rank fourth in double plays (95)...A's outfielders have 10 assists, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors (San Francisco and St. Louis, 9).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 5 for their last 10 (.500) with seven RBI...are batting .246 (17-for-69) with two doubles, a triple, two home runs and 13 RBI for the season...rank second in the American League in hits and RBI and tied for second in plate appearances (70) and extra base hits (5)...are the only team without a pinch walk.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on this 10-game homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (1-0) and Tampa Bay (four games)...will play 20 of their first 29 games after the All-Star Break at home as the A's will sandwich two 10-game homestands around a nine-game road trip from July 25-Aug. 14...went 1-4 on the last homestand and are 20-27 (.426) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (1-2) and Houston (2-2) and are 21-25 (.457) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 9-5 since then...are batting .245 (379-for-1547) at home compared to .259 (419-for-1619) on the road...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL...have a 4.16 ERA (196 er in 424.0 ip) at home compared to 5.28 (234 er in 398.2 ip) on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: Five of the A's last seven games have been decided by one run and seven of the last eight have been decided by two runs or fewer...are 12-15 (.444) in one-run games and 8-6 (.571) in two-run contests...have lost each of their last three extra inning games and are 2-3 in

extra inning games for the season...the Oakland record for fewest extra inning games in a non-strike season is nine in 1974 and 1975.

THIS AND THAT: The A's scored all eight of their runs yesterday with two outs and each rally began the with the bases empty...have scored 17 of their 23 runs since the break with two outs (73.9%)...with the win yesterday, the A's have now won the first game in 10 of the last 11 series...however, have lost the final game in nine of the previous 10 series...for the season, are 19-12 in the first game of a series, 9-21 in the final game of a series...the A's designated hitter has homered just once over the last 43 games (Khris Davis, June 17 vs. Los Angeles)...have eight home runs for the season, which is tied with Chicago for the fewest in the American League.

BEFORE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's had a 38-51 (.427) record at the All-Star Break, which was fifth worst in Oakland history and the worst since 2011 (39-53, .424)...were 15½ games out of first place in the American League West, which matched the third largest deficit at the break in Oakland history and was the worst since 2001 (19)...allowed 105 home runs, which tied for third most and was the most since 1997 (114)...had 670 strikeouts, which was third most behind 2014 (728) and 2015 (680)...the offense drew just 222 walks, which was the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season 1958 (214).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Andrew Triggs on the 15-day disabled list today and have now used the DL 21 times this year...this marks the sixth time in the last 10 years the A's have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 21 players have combined to miss 882 games (42.0 games per stint)...currently have 12 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard, Triggs)...today is the 15th day the A's have had at least 12 players on the DL...prior to this year, have never had more than 11 players on the DL at one time...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's trail in the season series, 5-6...are 2-5 in Houston and 3-1 in Oakland...have won eight of the last 10 games in the Coliseum...lost the season series to the Astros for the first time last year...lead the all-time series 45-29 (.608), which is the sixth best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 60 or more times...16 of the A's 29 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 24-12 in Oakland and 21-17 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS
Khris Davis has homered in three of four games since the All-Star Break and is 6-for-15 (.400) with five runs, four home runs and six RBI over that span...**Ryan Dull** had his career-high 11.1-inning scoreless streak snapped yesterday and now has a 0.72 ERA (2 er in 24.0 ip) over his last 24 games dating back to May 25...**Ryan Madson** became the 12th active pitcher with 600 games pitched yesterday...**Marcus Semien** hit his 20th home run of the season Sunday to become the fifth shortstop in Athletics history to hit 20 home runs (Miguel Tejada 5 times, Eddie Joost twice, Bobby Crosby and Bert Campaneris once)...**Stephen Vogt** is 11-for-19 (.579) with seven runs, two double, a triple, two home runs, six RBI and four multiple hit games over his last five games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY
In **1992** Carney Lansford ties an Oakland record with three doubles in the A's 6-2 win against Detroit...he adds a single to finish the day a perfect 4 for 4...in **1999** Buddy Groom ties an Oakland record by pitching in his sixth consecutive game...he retires the only batter he faces in the A's 10-5 win over Colorado...in **2002** Cory Lidle tosses a one-hitter in the A's 10-0 win over Texas...it is his first of two one-hitters in 2002.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Dillon Overton (1-1, 11.42 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today for his second stint with the A's this year...was selected for the first time June 25 and went 1-1 with an 11.42 ERA in two starts before he was option back to Nashville July 1...made his Major League debut June 25 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 53 minor league appearances, including 50 starts, in three professional seasons...had not pitched above Double-A prior to this year...became the 47th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the third this year (Manaea and Mengden)...became the fifth pitcher to make his first ML start for the A's this year (Neal and Triggs)...became the 15th pitcher in Oakland history to pick up the win in his debut, the first since Bobby Cramer on Sept. 13, 2010 at Kansas City.

THE LONG BALL: Allowed three home runs in his first start and two in his second start and his five home runs are the most by an Athletics pitcher over the first two games of his career since at least 1904...has surrendered five home runs in 8.2 innings in the majors (5.19 per nine innings) after yielding 14 in 259.2 innings in the minors (0.49 per nine innings).

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in his Major League debut, a 7-3 A's win at Los Angeles (AL) June 25...tossed 108 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in his ML debut since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988 (previous: Mazzaro, 105 on June 2, 2009)...became the third pitcher in Oakland history to allow three home runs in his debut (Jeff Kaiser, April 11, 1985; Rick Rodriguez, Sept. 17, 1986)...all three home runs were solo shots, including back-to-back home runs by Calhoun and Trout in the first and a two-out shot by Pujols in the fifth.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-6 loss to San Francisco on June 30...allowed a walk in the first and a single in the second but then surrendered six runs in the third inning when the Giants sent 10 men to the plate...Belt had a two-run double, Posey a three-run homer and Crawford a solo home run...also allowed a RBI double to Pagan in the fourth and was relieved by Triggs, who allowed Pagan to score.

WITH NASHVILLE: Made two starts with Nashville following his July 1 option and went 2-0 with a 2.77 ERA...is 10-4 with a 2.98 ERA in 16 games, including 15 starts, overall with the Sounds...he is leading the Pacific Coast League in wins, ranks fourth in ERA and is ninth in strikeouts (81)...went 1-4 with a 4.89 ERA and .305 opponents batting average over his first seven games but is 9-0 with a 1.71 ERA (11 er in 58.0 ip) and .231 (50-for-216) opponents batting average over his last nine starts.

THE LONG BALL: Surrendered just three home runs in 96.2 innings, an average of 0.28 per nine innings...allowed two home runs on May 6 against Memphis...then had a nine-game, 64.0-inning, 264-batter homerless streak before allowing his next home run July 10 against New Orleans.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .263 opponents batting average, including .260 (71-for-273) against right-handed hitters compared to .271 (29-for-107) against left-handers...surrendered all three of his home runs to righties...walked just three batters to lead off an inning...opponents hit .223 with the bases empty compared to .319 with runners on base...they were 3-for-9 (.333) with a grand slam with the bases loaded

THIS AND THAT: Tossed at least six innings in 12 of his 16 appearances...walked one batter or fewer 12 times, allowed two runs or fewer 10 times and yielded five hits or fewer nine times...allowed 15 of his 36 runs in the second inning for an 8.40 ERA (14 er in 15.0 ip)...had a 1.98 ERA (18 er in 81.2 ip) in all other innings

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a season-high eight batters in a season-low 4.0 innings in his first start April 9 against Oklahoma City and took the loss...tossed his lone complete game of the season in the second game of an April 20 doubleheader at Colorado Springs, an 8-1 win (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 5 so)...made his only relief appearance April 25 against New Orleans in a game started by Henderson Alvarez on a rehab assignment (4.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season high 11 hits in a 7-6 loss to Memphis May 6...began his nine-game winning streak May 17 against Fresno when he matched his season-high with eight

strikeouts...allowed just one run in 6.2 innings then allowed one run in 6.0 innings in his next start May 23 at Las Vegas...walked a season-high four batters in 5.0 innings May 28 at Salt Lake...matched his season-high with four walks June 10 at Oklahoma City...tossed 6.0 shutouts innings that day, allowed two unearned runs in his next start and then logged 7.1 scoreless innings in his final start before his first promotion on June 20 at Round Rock...went 4-0 with a 0.99 ERA in four starts in June...allowed a run in the second inning of his first start following his return on July 5 at Memphis, snapping a 26.1-inning streak without allowing an earned run.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He extended his Triple-A winning streak to nine games in Nashville's 8-2 win over New Orleans on July 10...retired each of the first 11 batters before Xavier Scruggs singled with two outs in the fourth...had a 7-0 lead when he allowed an Adrian Nieto RBI single in the fifth inning...surrendered a lead-off home run to Isaac Galloway in the seventh, snapping a nine-game, 64.0-inning, 264-batter Triple-A homerless streak.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP: Was a non-roster invitee with the A's this spring and did not allow a run in three relief appearances (6.0 ip, 5 h, 1 bb, 7 so)...opponents went 5-for-22 (.227)...was reassigned to minor league camp March 13.

2015 RECAP: Started the year at Single-A Stockton and was 2-4 with a 3.82 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, when he was promoted to Double-A Midland July 2...went 5-2 with a 3.06 ERA in 13 starts with the RockHounds and combined for a 7-6 record and a 3.43 ERA in 27 games, including 25 starts...led the A's farm system in ERA and tied for third in strikeouts (106)...walked just 27 batters in 126.0 innings, an average of 1.93 per nine innings...allowed a .265 opponents batting average, including .249 (43-for-173) against left-handed hitters compared to .274 (84-for-307) against right-handers...was rated as the A's eighth best prospect by *Baseball America* following the season.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's second round selection in the 2013 First-Year Player Draft but did not pitch until 2014 after undergoing "Tommy John" surgery...is the first A's pick from that draft to reach the majors (Ryon Healy is the second)...is 17-13 with a 3.05 ERA (88 er in 259.2 ip) in 55 games, including 52 starts, as a minor leaguer...has walked just 54 batters in 259.2 innings, an average of 1.87 per nine innings...led the A's farm system in ERA (3.43) in 2015...was rated as the A's eighth best prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2014 and 2015 seasons.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Daniel Mengden (1-4, 5.54 ERA): Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 11 and is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season and his career...the eight starts will rank fifth among American League rookies...is 0-1 with a 10.80 ERA and .333 opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 1-3 with a 2.81 ERA and .221 opponents batting average over his first four starts...had a no decision in his last start, an 8-7 A's win over Toronto last Friday (3.1 ip, 6 h, 7 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 2 so)...had a no decision in his only career start against Houston, a 10-9 A's loss at Houston July 8 (4.2 ip, 6 h, 6 r, 6 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...began the season at Midland and went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts before he was promoted to Nashville May 1...went 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds and combined for a 5-1 record and a 1.19 ERA overall...the ERA was sixth lowest in all of the minors at the time of his promotion.

- Has tossed 325.1 innings, which is the most in the AL and tied for third most in the majors.
- Has allowed 36-of-158 (22.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 18.9%).
- Is tied for second in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (33) and tied for fourth in strikeouts (304)...is tied for second in wild pitches (20) and tied for fourth in most home runs (40).
