#### OAKLAND NOTES

- The **Oakland A's** have won four of five games since the All-Star Break and are 6-3 in their last nine...won their fourth walk-off game this season, the first since June 17 vs Los Angeles-AL...snapped a nine-game losing streak in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher and improved to 10-14 (.417) against left-handed starters this season...played in a one-run contest in six of the last eight games and are now 13-15 (464) in one-run games...improved to 21-27 (.438) at home...are now 27-30 (.474) at night...are tied 6-6 in the season series with the Astros...have won nine of the last 11 games at the Coliseum against Houston and are 46-29 (.613) all-time against the Astros, including a 25-12 mark in Oakland...are 4-1 on this current 10-game homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-0), and Tampa Bay (four games).
- The **A's** have committed at least one error in six consecutive games (10 errors total) to snap an Athletics franchise record streak of 15 consecutive games without an error...**A's pinch hitters** are 5 for their last 12 (.417) with seven RBI...drew their first pinch walk of the year when Alonso earned a free pass in the eighth inning...were the last team in the American League to draw a pinch walk.
- Dillon Overton** is 1-1 with a 8.40 ERA (14 er in 15.0 ip) in three starts this season...has allowed a home run in each of those three starts (six home runs total)...set career highs in innings pitched (6.1), hits allowed (9) and strikeouts (6).
- Coco Crisp** (2-for-4, 2b, rbi, bb) snapped an 0-for-15 hitless streak with a single in the seventh inning.
- Ryon Healy** (2-for-4, 2b, 2 rbi, 2 so) has started each of the A's five games at third base since being selected from Triple-A Nashville (6-for-19, .316).
- Josh Reddick** (1-for-2, rbi) had his sixth career game-ending RBI, his fifth as an Athletic, with a RBI single in the bottom of the 10th
- Marucs Semien** (1-for-4, bb, 2 sb) has reached base safely in each of his 12 games against Houston and is 13-for-41 (.317) with eight walks.
- Stephen Vogt** (1-for-2, r, 2b) is 12-for-21 (.571) with seven runs and two doubles over his current six-game hitting streak.

#### HOUSTON NOTES

- The **Houston Astros** are 3-4 in their past seven games...fell to 22-25 (.478) on the road...dropped to 31-30 (.517) in night games...are tied 6-6 in the season series with the A's, and are 12-25 (.324) all-time in Oakland...are 2-3 on this six-game road trip to Seattle (2-1) and Oakland (0-2).
- Dallas Keuchel** is 3-0 with a 2.79 ERA (12 er in 38.2 ip) over his last six starts...is 3-4 with a 4.59 ERA (33 in 64.2 ip) in 10 starts against American League West competition...is 2-3 with a 2.78 ERA (27 er in 87.1 ip) in 14 appearances, including 12 starts, against Oakland.
- Jose Altuve** (4-for-5, 2 r, 2b, 3b, so) has reached base safely in 34 straight road games, which is the longest streak by an Astros player since Jeff Bagwell had a 51-game streak from Sept. 23, 1998-July 31, 1999...has hit safely in each of his last 18 road games (38-for-74, .514)...is batting .415 (78-for-188) on the road this season...is a .328 (94-for-287) career hitter against Oakland...collected his sixth four-hit game, which leads the Major Leagues...is fourth in Houston history in four-hit games with 18.
- Carlos Correa** (1-for-3, rbi, bb, sf) is 27-for-92 (.293) with 12 doubles, five home runs and 26 RBI in his last 24 games.
- Evan Gattis** (2-for-4, 2b) is batting .296 (24-for-81) with six doubles in 22 games at catcher.
- Colby Rasmus** (0-for-4) has nine outfield assists as a left-fielder, which is the most in the AL...his 10 assists overall are second in the AL (Adam Eaton, 13).
- George Springer** (1-for-5, r, hr, rbi, 2 so) has hit 21 homers this season, which is a career high (previous: 20, 2014).
