# THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY: JULY 19

**2006** - Roger Clemens moves into 8th place on the all-time wins list with a 4-2 victory over Greg Maddux and the Cubs. He tosses six shutout innings to notch his 343rd career win.

**1966** - In the first game ever played an an all-Astroturf field, the Astros top the Phillies, -2 in the Dome. Starter Dick Farrell has a banner day, going the distance while tallying 3 hits, including a 3-run HR. Jimmy Wynn is also 3-for-4 with a 3-run HR.

## TODAY'S MEDIA AVAILABILITY

The Astros clubhouse will be open from 4-4:50 p.m...Astros manager **A.J. Hinch** will be available at approx. 4:50 p.m. in the Astros dugout.

**TONIGHT'S GAME:** Tonight is the 2nd game of a 3-game series vs. the A's in Oakland...**LHP Dallas Keuchel** (6-9) will start for the Astros vs. A's LHP Dillon Overton (1-1).

**BIG D:** The Astros have been victorious in **LHP Dallas Keuchel's** last 5 starts...Keuchel is 3-0 in that span with a 2.78 ERA (10ER/32.1IP)...**vs. the A's:** Keuchel defeated the A's, 2-1, on 7/10 at Minute Maid Park in what was the final game before the Break (7 IP, 1 ER).

**LAST NIGHT'S RECAP:** The Astros lost last night's series opener here in Oakland, 7-4...**RHP Mike Fiers** (6-4) took the loss (3.2 IP, 6 ER)...**Jose Altuve** (2x4) and **Carlos Correa** (2x4, 2 2B, RBI) contributed offensively...**Jason Castro** (2x4) also had a multi-hit game...**Marwin Gonzalez** added his 8th HR (solo)... prior to last night, the Astros had won 5 straight and 6 of the last 7 games started by Fiers.

**VS. THE A'S:** The Astros are 24-20 against the A's since April 26, 2014, which includes a season series victory over Oakland in 2015 (10-9)...Houston's 24-20 record in their last 44 games opposite Oakland is a stark difference from their 1st 30 matchups, with the Astros going 5-25 in those contests.

**RDAD WARRIDRS:** The Astros have won 5 of 7 and 9 of their last 12 games on the road and are 15-8 (.682) on the road since May 28, which is tops in the AL.

**FURY ROAD:** 2B Jose Altuve has hit safely in 17 straight road games at a torrid .493 (34x69) clip and has reached safely in 33 consecutive road games, hitting .462 (61x132) with a .510 OBP in that span... including Altuve, only 4 Astros players have reached base safely in 33 straight road games: **Craig Biggio** (33g, 2001), **Jose Cruz** (33g, 1984) and **Jeff Bagwell** (2x, last 52g from 1998-99).

**HOT CLUB:** Since bottoming out on May 22 with a record of 17-28, the Astros have gone 33-15 (.688) since May 23, the best record in the Majors in that time frame.

**48-GAME RUN:** The Astros 33-15 mark since May 23 gives them their best record in a 48-game span since they won 33 games from July 27-Sept. 17, 2008 ...the franchise record for wins in a 48-game span is 36, set in 2004.

**COLLIN CARD:** RHP Collin McHugh has posted a 2.41 ERA (10ER/37.1IP) over his last 6 starts, limiting opponents to 3-or-fewer earned runs in those outings... dating back to May 19, McHugh has posted a 3.46 ERA (26ER/67.2IP) in 11 starts, while recording 74 strikeouts, which ranks 5th in the AL in that time frame.

**PITCHING IN:** Since May 1, the Astros have posted the best record in the AL (43-26, .623), with their pitching staff leading the AL in team ERA and in bullpen ERA, while ranking 3rd in starter's ERA (3.99) in that span.

WILL THE THRILL: All-Star RHP Will Harris has gone 9-for-9 in save opportunities and has posted a 1.62

ERA (7ER/39IP), which ranks 10th in the American League...in his 39 appearances this season, he's allowed just 31 hits (27 singles) in his 39.0 IP for a .250 opponent slugging percentage (4th in AL).

**SMOOTH SOUNDS OF KENNY G: RHP Ken Giles** has a 2.05 ERA (6ER/26.1IP) in his last 28 appearances, dating back to May 9...in that time frame, he has posted 36 strikeouts in his 26.1 innings pitched.

**BATTING LEADER: 2B Jose Altuve** leads the AL in batting (.348) and steals (25)...Altuve also ranks 3rd among AL position players in WAR (4.9) and OBP (.418), while ranking 4th in OPS (.968).

I AM IRON MAN: 2B Jose Altuve has played in 184 consecutive team games, which is the longest games-played streak in the Majors.

**KNOCK'EM IN:** Since June 20, **SS Carlos Correa's** 25 RBI (in 23g) are tied for tops in the Majors with MIN's **Max Kepler** (25 RBI)...Correa has hit .292 (26x89) in that span with 5 homers, 12 doubles and a .596 SLG.

**UP THE CHARTS: SS Carlos Correa** has hit 36 home runs, including 35 as a shortstop, which ranks tied for 1st among shortstops in franchise history.

**EN FUEGO:** 3B Luis Valbuena is hitting .289 (58x201) with 13 doubles, 12 home runs, 33 RBI and a .913 OPS in his last 60 games, dating back to May 4...since that date, Valbuena ranks 13th in the AL in OPS.

**WHAT A STEAL!:** Jose Altuve's SB last night was the 194th of his career, moving him past **Michael Bourn** and into 7th place on the club's all-time list... **Jeff Bagwell** is 6th with 202...club record is 487 held by **Cesar Cedeno**.

**GURRIEL SIGNING:** On Saturday, the Astros announced the signing of Cuban star **IF Yulieski Gurriel** to a Major League contract...**IF Matt Duffy** was desginated for assignment to make room on the 40-man roster.

**HEART AND HUSTLE: OF George Springer** has been named the Astros winner of the Heart and Hustle Award...the MLB Players Alumni Assoc. presents this award to a player from each MLB club each year...the award honors active players who demonstrate a passion for the game of baseball and best embody the values, spirit and traditions of the game.

LAST START - 7/10 VS. DAK: took a no-decision in the Astros 2-1 walk-off win over the A's, in what was the last game for the Astros in the first half of this season...gave up just 1 run on 4 hits in 7.0 innings of work.

THE BEARD IS BACK: the reigning AL Cy Young Award winner is set to make his 1st start since the Astros returned from the All-Star Break...will be his 20th start of the season, and 12th on the road.

- is riding a 3-game winning streak, his longest since a 4-game winning streak from Sept. 21, 2015-April 5, 2016.
- has thrown 5 consecutive quality starts, going 3-2 with a 3.73 ERA (13ER/31.1IP), 7 walks and 31 strikeouts in that span.
- the 28-year-old is coming off one of the greatest individual seasons in club history in which he went 20-8 with a 2.48 ERA...was named the 2015 AL Cy Young Award winner while receiving his 2nd consecutive Rawlings Gold Glove Award.
- **THE TURN:** has posted 11 quality starts in his 19 outings in what has been an up and down season for Keuchel.
- 7 of his last 9 starts have been quality starts...the Astros have won each of his last 5 starts, all of which have been quality starts for Keuchel... looking for his first 4-game winning streak of the season.
- IN COMMAND: has regained his command over the strike zone in his last 10 starts, striking out 57 and walking just 12...in that 10-start span (since May 22 vs. TEX), ranks 9th in the AL in strikeout to walk ratio (4.75) and 8th in walks per 9.0 innings (1.69).
- walked 25 and struck out 47 over his first 9 starts of the year for a 1.88 strikeout to walk ratio, and a 3.99 walks per 9.0 innings ratio.
- VS. DAK: has faced the A's 13 times (11 starts) in his career, which is 3rd most against any opponent.
- in his last 4 starts vs. OAK since the start of 2015, is 1-1 with a 1.17 ERA (4ER/30.2IP)...has gone at least 7.0 IP in each of those games, which is the longest active streak against the A's...the last pitcher to go at least 4 starts of 7.0+ IP vs. OAK was Felix Hernandez (5GS, 5/10/15-4/10/16).
- K'S UP: ranks T-14th in the AL in strikeouts...ranks 5th in the AL in strikeouts since 2015 (320), trailing only Chris Sale, Chris Archer, Corey Kluber and David Price.
- his 627 career strikeouts rank 6th in club history by a left-hander...trails Billy Wagner by 67 strikeouts for 5th place (694).
- **SUPPORT SYSTEM:** owns the 9th-lowest run support average among qualifying AL pitchers at 3.90...the club is 9-10 in games started by Keuchel, and has scored more than 2 runs in just 2 of those 10 losses.
- **GROUNDED:** ranks 3rd in the AL and 6th in the Majors in groundball to flyball ratio (2.79)...leads all active pitchers in career groundball to flyball ratio (2.88, min. 750IP).
- GLOVEWORK: has established himself as the premier defensive pitcher in the Majors, winning an AL Gold Glove Award in each of the last 2
- ranks T-1st among AL pitchers in assists (22) this season...leads all Major League pitchers in assists (122) and total chances (164) since 2014.
- has made 2 errors since 2014 and has not committed an error this season...his .982 career fielding % (220TC/4E) is the best by a pitcher in club history, directly ahead of Roy Oswalt (.981).
- HOT AT HOME: leads the AL in ERA at home since the start 2014 season (2.36, 71ER/271IP)...ranks T-4th in the AL in home wins in that span (21) behind LHP Chris Sale (22), RHP Collin McHugh (22) and RHP Felix Hernandez (23).

- went 2x4 with a steal and a run scored last night at OAK...has hit in all 4 games
  on the road trip...owns a 17-game road hitting streak (longest active in the AL)
  in which he's hit .485 (32x66) with 4 doubles, 1 triple, 2 HR, 10 RBI, a .514 OBP
  and 11 multi-hit games...leads the AL in batting (.407, 74x182), hits, OBP (.471)
  and OPS (1.076) on the road this season.
- has also reached base safely in 33 straight road games, which is the longest streak by an Astros player since Craig Biggio had a 33-game run in 2001...the only Astros player to put together a longer streak was Jeff Bagwell: 51 games from Sept. 23, 1998-July 31, 1999 and 43 games from June 10-Sept. 18, 1998... the last AL player with a longer streak: Edwin Encarnacion, 45 games in 2015.
- leads AL in batting (.346) and leads the Majors in hits (127)...ranks 3rd among MLB position players in WAR (5.3)...also leads the AL in steals (25) and ranks 3rd in OBP (.418), 4th in OPS (.968), 5th in runs (71) and 6th in SLG (.551).
- had a 4-hit day with a 2-run HR as the DH on Sun. at SEA...leads the Majors with 5 games of 4+ hits...17 career 4-hit games rank T-4th in club history with Derek Bell...trails Cesar Cedeno (25) for 3rd place...in 6 games as a DH this season is batting .476 (10x21) with 2 HR, 8 RBI and a 1.242 OPS (.480 OBP/.762 SLG).
- his 15 HR tie his career high set in 2015...has 15 HR in 93 games, compared to 154 games last year...his 42 walks are a career high (previously 40 in 2012).
- has played in 184 consecutive games, which is the longest games-played streak in the Majors, immediately ahead of OF Mike Trout (154) and 2B Robinson Cano (150)...did not start 1 game this year (May 7 vs. SEA), but entered as a defensive replacement and got 1 AB...last missed a game on June 21, 2015 at SEA.
