OAKLAND ATHLETICS (42-52) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (50-44)

WEDNESDAY, JULY 20, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 12:35 P.M. PDT RHP DANIEL MENGDEN (1-4, 5.54) VS. RHP DOUG FISTER (9-6, 3.64) MLB NETWORK — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Are 4-1 since the All-Star Break, which is tied with Miami for the second best record in the majors behind Los Angeles-AL (5-0)... are 7-8 (.467) in July...went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 14-11 (.560) since then...are 42-52 (.447) overall, which is tied for the third worst record in the American League...are tied for fourth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 33 days in fourth, 13 days tied for fourth and 20 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-0 with a 4.28 ERA (23 er in 48.1 ip) over the last nine games, which matches their longest winning streak of the season...are 26-39 with a 5.02 ERA (281 er in 503.2 ip) overall...rank third in the American League in highest ERA, most losses, fewest innings and fewest wins...have issued the fourth most walks (191) but have surrendered the third fewest home runs (70)...are one of five AL teams without a complete game and the A's streak of 145 consecutive games without a complete game is second longest in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009) and the second longest active streak in the AL (Baltimore, 278)...the A's last complete game was by Sonny Gray on Aug. 7, 2015 against Houston.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.06 ERA (313 er in 556.2 ip) over the last 63 games after posting a 3.91 ERA over the first 31 games through May 7...have a 4.68 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.269), on-base percentage (.334) and slugging percentage (.432) and have issued the fourth most walks (299).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting an American League leading .287 (48-for-167) since the All-Star Break...also lead the AL in home runs since the break (8), rank second in runs scored (27) and stolen bases (4) and third in doubles (10)...for the season, the A's have the second lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.308), the second fewest walks (242), the third lowest slugging percentage (.402) and the third fewest strikeouts (638).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in a season-high tying six consecutive games (10 errors total) to snap an Athletics franchise record streak of 15 consecutive games without an error... now have 63 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League...rank fourth in double plays (95)...A's outfielders have 10 assists, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors (San Francisco and St. Louis, 9).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's defeated the Astros last night 4-3 in 10 innings... six of the A's last eight games have been decided by one run and the A's are 4-2 in those games...are 13-15 (.464) in one-run games for the season...the 28 one-run games are fourth most in the American League... snapped a three-game losing streak in extra innings last night and are now 3-3 in extra inning games for the season...the Oakland record for fewest extra inning games in a non-strike season is nine in 1974 and 1975... improved to 4-5 in walk-off games and 9-9 in games decided in the last at bat with the win last night.

WITH RISP: The A's are batting .350 (78-for-223) with runners in scoring position since June 13 after batting .246 with RISP over the first 62 games...are hitting .279 with RISP for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League.

IN THE PINCH: The A's became the last team in the majors to draw a pinch walk when Yonder Alonso drew a free pass in the eighth inning last night...A's pinch hitters are 5 for their last 12 (.417) with a walk and seven RBI...are batting .239 (17-for-71) with two doubles, a triple, two home runs and 13 RBI for the season...rank second in the American League in hits, RBI and plate appearances (73) and tied for second in extra base hits (5).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-1 on this 10-game homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-0) and Tampa Bay (four games)...will play 20 of their first 29 games after the All-Star Break at home as the A's will sandwich two 10-game homestands around a nine-game road trip from July 25-Aug. 14...went 1-4 on the last homestand and are 21-27 (.438) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League... went 3-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (1-2) and Houston (2-2) and are

21-25 (.457) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 9-5 since then...are batting .246 (390-for-1584) at home compared to .259 (419-for-1619) on the road...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL...have a 4.13 ERA (199 er in 434.0 ip) at home compared to 5.28 (234 er in 398.2 ip) on the road.

THIS AND THAT: With the win Monday, the A's have now won the first game in 10 of the last 11 series...however, have lost the final game in nine of the previous 10 series...for the season, are 19-12 in the first game of a series, 9-21 in the final game of a series...the A's scored the winning run last night with two outs...have scored 18 of their 27 runs since the break with two outs (66.7%)...snapped their nine-game losing streak in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher last night...it was their first win in a game started by a lefty since June 13 against Texas (Ramos)...the A's designated hitter has homered just once over the last 44 games (Khris Davis, June 17 vs. Los Angeles)...have eight home runs for the season, which is tied with Chicago for the fewest in the American League.

BEFORE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's had a 38-51 (.427) record at the All-Star Break, which was fifth worst in Oakland history and the worst since 2011 (39-53, .424)...were 15½ games out of first place in the American League West, which matched the third largest deficit at the break in Oakland history and was the worst since 2001 (19)...the offense drew just 222 walks, which was the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season since 1958 (214).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 21 times this year, which marks the sixth time in the last 10 years they have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 21 players have combined to miss 894 games (42.6 games per stint)...currently have 12 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard, Triggs)...today is the 16th day the A's have had at least 12 players on the DL...prior to this year, have never had more than 11 players on the DL at one time...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011... have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ASTROS: The season series is even at six games each...the A's are 4-1 in Oakland and 2-5 in Houston...have won nine of the last 11 games in the Coliseum...lost the season series to the Astros for the first time last year...lead the all-time series 46-29 (.613), which is the fifth best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 60 or more times...16 of the A's 29 losses to Houston have been by one run...are 25-12 in Oakland and 21-17 in Houston.

Khris Davis is 6-for-20 (.300) with five runs, four home runs and six RBI in five games since the All-Star Break...*Ryan Dull* has a 0.72 ERA (2 er in 24.0 ip) over his last 24 games dating back to May 25...*Marcus Semien* has reached base safely in each of his 12 games against Houston this year and now has a 26-game reaching base streak against the Astros dating back to April 26, 2015...*Stephen Vogt* is 12-for-21 (.571) with eight runs, three doubles, a triple, two home runs, six RBI and four multiple hit games over his last six games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1969**, at the age of 19 years, 357 days, Vida Blue becomes the first Oakland teenage pitcher to start a game...he takes the loss in the A's 7-3 decision at California...in **1973** Jim Hunter becomes the first Oakland Athletic to win 100 games as he defeats the Cleveland Indians 6-5 in the Coliseum...in **2009** the A's trail Minnesota 12-2 entering the bottom of the third inning but come back to win 14-13, setting an Oakland record for biggest come-from-behind victory...in **2011** Hideki Matsui homers at Detroit for the 500th home run in professional career...the total includes 332 in the Japanese Leagues.

ODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (1-4, 5.54 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 11 and is scheduled to make his eighth start of the season and his career...the eight starts are fifth most among American League rookies...made his Major League debut June 11 at Cincinnati after just 43 minor league appearances, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...had not pitched above Single-A prior to this year...became the 46th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut (Overton became the 47th)...is the first of those to take the loss since Brett Anderson on April 10, 2009 against Seattle.

LAST THREE. FIRST FOUR: Is 0-1 with a 10.80 ERA (16 er in 13.1 ip) and .333 (19-for-57) opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 1-3 with a 2.81 ERA and .221 opponents batting average over his first four starts.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 0-4 with a 3.86 ERA (10 er in 23.1 ip) in four starts during the day compared to 1-0 with an 8.04 ERA (14 er in 15.2 ip) in three starts at night.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-1 with a 4.34 ERA (9 er in 18.2 ip) in three starts on four days rest compared to 0-3 with a 6.64 ERA (15 er in 20.1 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more.

STRIKEOUTS: Has 39 strikeouts in 39.0 innings over the first seven starts of his career (9.00 per nine innings)...since 1913, his 39 strikeouts are fifth most by an A's pitcher over the first seven games of his career...they are the most since Tim Hudson had 49 in 1999.

AL AND NL: Has made four of his first seven career starts against National League teams...is 1-3 with a 4.01 ERA (11 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts in interleague play compared to 0-1 with an 8.16 ERA (13 er in 14.1 ip) in three starts against American League teams.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .172 (10-for-58) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .259 (14-for-54) the second time and .400 (16-for-40) after that ... opponents are batting .146 (6-for-41) with two outs, including .091 (1-for-11) with runners in scoring position and two outs...has allowed a .294 (10-for-34) average with RISP overall...the opponents number five hitter is 1-for-17 (.059) and the three hitter is 2-for-19 (.105)...however, the seven through nine hitters are batting a combined .422 (19-for-45)...three of the four home runs he has allowed have come with runners on base.

THIS AND THAT: Received eight runs of support in his lone win on June 27 at San Francisco...has a total of 11 runs of support in his other six starts (31.1 ip, 3.16 RSA)...has not allowed a run in the first inning and has not yielded an earned run in the second inning...has an 8.64 ERA (24 er in 25.0 ip) from the third inning on... is the eighth starting pitcher in Oakland history to allow to allow three runs or fewer in each of his first four starts, the first since A.J. Griffin in 2012...was charged with the loss in each of his first three starts to join Brad Rigby (1997) and Mike Morgan (1978) as the only three pitchers in Oakland history to lose each of the first three games of their career...is just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1913 to lose each of his first three career games while allowing three runs or fewer in each game...the others are Duane Pillette (1949 Yankees), Jim McAndrew (1968 Mets) and Kyle Drabek (2010 Blue Jays)...allowed four runs or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of his first five career starts. since 1913, the only other Major League pitcher to do that and lose at least four of those games is Tony Armas, who went 0-4 with a 2.97 ERA over his first five career starts with Montreal from Aug. 16, 1999-May 30, 2000.

2016 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, a 2-1 A's loss at Cincinnati June 11 ... at the age of 23 years, 113 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to start a game since Trevor Cahill on June 19, 2011 (23 years, 110 days)...struck out the first batter he faced (Cozart)...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Texas June 16 in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on a hit and a walk over the first six innings and had retired 15 straight when he allowed a leadoff home run to Desmond in the seventh...Colby Lewis retired the first 23 Athletics before Alonso walked in the eighth and had a no-hitter until Muncy doubled to lead off the ninth...lost his third consecutive start in the A's 4-2 loss to Milwaukee June 22 in Oakland...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the fifth inning...picked up his first Major League win in the A's 8-3 victory at San Francisco June 27 ... retired each of the first 13 batters and shutout the Giants on two hits and a walk over the first seven innings... had an 8-0 lead when he allowed his only two runs in the eighth inning... was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to Pittsburgh July 3 in Oakland.. had a 3-2 lead when he allowed a RBI triple to Frazier and a RBI single to Kratz in the sixth inning for the loss...had his first career no decision in the A's 10-9 loss at Houston July 8...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-7 win over Toronto last Friday in Oakland...the A's scored twice in the first and he allowed an unearned run in the second...then yielded two runs in the third on a wild pitch and a Saunders sacrifice fly...the A's tied the game with a run in the bottom of the third but he allowed four runs in the fourth, highlighted by RBI singles by Pillar, Travis and Donaldson...left after 3.1 innings trailing 7-3 but the A's came back to score five unanswered runs.

MINORS: Began the season at Double-A Midland and went 2-0 with a 0.78 ERA in four starts before he was promoted to Triple-A Nashville May 1... went 3-1 with a 1.39 ERA in seven starts with the Sounds and combined for a 5-1 record and a 1.19 ERA in 11 minor league starts overall ... the ERA was sixth lowest in all of the minor leagues at the time of his promotion...allowed just three home runs in 68.1 innings, an average of 0.40 per nine innings...went 4-0 with a 0.79 ERA over his first nine starts and was 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA over his final two starts...allowed a .179 opponents batting average, including .177 against right-handed hitters compared to .182 against left-handers...yielded a .068 batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents were 8-for-64 (.125) with four walks and a hit by pitch (.188 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...his teams combined for a 9-2 (.818) record in his 11 starts...had five starts where he did not allow a run but had just two wins and three no decisions in those games...had a 24.0 inning scoreless streak from April 26 to May 13.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was originally drafted by Houston in the fourth round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft ... was traded to Oakland with catcher Jacob Nottingham for left-handed pitcher Scott Kazmir on July 23, 2015...has compiled a 15-5 record and a 2.87 ERA (67 er in 210.0 ip) in 43 games, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...has 209 strikeouts in 210.0 innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (4-8, 5.12 ERA): Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 5 and is 1-3 with a 4.07 ERA in eight starts since his return...was placed on the DL May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA in nine starts before going on the DL...has a 5.12 ERA for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League...defeated Toronto in his last start last Saturday, a 5-4 A's win (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 2 so)...it was his first win since April 22, also against the Blue Jays, and it snapped a career-high seven-game losing streak (6.16 ERA)...is 2-1 with a 3.11 ERA (37.2 ip, 35 h, 17 r, 13 er, 11 bb, 25 so, 7 hr) in six career starts against Tampa Bay...including a no decision in his only start this year, a 7-6 A's win at Tropicana Field May 15 (5.2 ip, 6 h, 6 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...is 2-2 with a 7.01 ERA in five starts against American League East competition this year.

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 4.84 ERA (127 er in 236.0 ip) over its last 67 games after posting a 2.42 ERA over its first 27 games through May 2...has a 4.16 ERA for the season, which is the fifth highest in the American League
- Has tossed 329.0 innings, which is the most in the AL and third most in the maiors.
- Has allowed 36-of-161 (22.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 21.4%).
- Is tied for second in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (33) and tied for fourth in strikeouts (306)...is tied for second in wild pitches (20) and ranks fifth in most home runs (40).
