THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY: JULY 20

2003 - Jeff Bagwell has a memorable night, hitting his 400th career HR in a 6-3 win over the Reds in Cincinnati. Bagwell ends up with 2 HR and 4 RBI in the win. He becomes the 35th player in MLB history to reach 400 dingers.

1986 - Astros outlast the Mets in a 9-8, 15-inning victory in the Astrodome. Alan Ashby has 3 hits and 3 RBI. Bill Doran also has 3 hits and scores the game-winning run in the 15th.

TODAY'S MEDIA AVAILABILITY

The Astros clubhouse will be open at 10 a.m. this morning...Astros manager **A.J. Hinch** will be available at approx. 10:30 a.m.

TODAY'S GAME: Today is the finale of a 3-game series vs. the A's in Oakland...**RHP Doug Fister** (9-6) will start for the Astros vs. A's RHP Daniel Mengden (1-4).

FIST BUMP: **RHP Doug Fister** is 8-3 with a 3.15 ERA (31ER/88.1IP) in his last 14 starts, dating back to May 1...since that date, he ranks T-7th in the AL in wins...

WINNING THE WEST: Fister is 6-3 in 10 starts vs. the AL West with a 2.57 ERA (18ER/63IP).

WINDSDAYS: The Astros 11-3 record on Wednesdays this season is their best on any day of the week.

IN THE DAYTIME: The Astros are 19-14 (.576) in day games this season, which ranks 4th in the AL.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP: The Astros were edged by the A's in 10 innings last night, 4-3...**RHP Pat Neshek** (2-2) took the loss in relief (0.2 IP, 1 ER, 1 SO)...**LHP Dallas Keuchel** started the game, tallying his 6th straight quality start (6.1 IP, 2 ER, 3 BB, 6 SO)...**Jose Altuve** led the way on offense, going 4x5 with a 2B and 3B and 2 runs scored...**George Springer** added a solo HR (#21).

BIG D: Prior to last night, the Astros had been victorious in **LHP Dallas Keuchel's** last 5 starts...in his last 6 starts, Keuchel is 3-0 with a 2.79 ERA (12ER/38.2IP)...quality starts in each outing.

GUNSLINGER: **Colby Rasmus** tallied his 10th OF assist of the season last night, which ranks T-2nd in the AL (Adam Eaton, 13)...Colby's 9 assists as a leftfielder are tops in the AL.

VS. THE A'S: The Astros are 24-21 against the A's since April 26, 2014, which includes a season series victory over Oakland in 2015 (10-9)...Houston's 24-21 record in their last 45 games opposite Oakland is a stark difference from their 1st 30 matchups, with the Astros going just 5-25 in those contests.

ROAD WARRIORS: The Astros have won 5 of 8 and 9 of their last 13 games on the road and are 15-9 (.625) on the road since May 28, which is tops in the AL.

FURY ROAD: **2B Jose Altuve** has hit safely in 18 straight road games at a torrid .514 (38x74) clip and has reached safely in 34 consecutive road games, hitting .474 (65x137) with a .519 OBP in that span (began 4/30)... Altuve is just the 2nd player in franchise history to reach base safely in 34 straight road games, joining **Jeff Bagwell** (2x, last 52g from 1998-99).

HOT CLUB: Since bottoming out on May 22 with a record of 17-28, Houston has gone 33-16 (.673) since May 23, the best record in MLB in that time frame.

BATTING LEADER: **2B Jose Altuve** leads the Majors in batting (.354) and hits (131) and leads the AL in steals (25)...Altuve also ranks 3rd among AL position players in WAR (5.2), 2nd in OBP (.418) and 4th in OPS (.984)...he also ranks 2nd among AL 2nd basemen in fielding % (.992, 3 E, 363 TC).

PITCHING IN: Since May 1, the Astros have posted the 2nd-best record in the AL (43-27, .614), with their pitching staff T-1st in the AL in team ERA, 1st in bullpen ERA and 3rd in starter's ERA (3.98) in that span.

COLLIN CARD: **RHP Collin McHugh** has posted a 2.41 ERA (10ER/37.1IP) over his last 6 starts, limiting opponents to 3-or-fewer earned runs in those outings... dating back to May 19, McHugh has posted a 3.46 ERA (26ER/67.2IP) in 11 starts, while recording 74 strikeouts, which ranks 5th in the AL in that time frame.

WILL THE THRILL: Prior to last night, All-Star **RHP Will Harris** had gone 9-for-9 in save opportunities... for the season, he has allowed just 6 extra-base hits in his 40 apps. (40IP) for a .270 opp. SLG. with 9 saves in 10 chances.

SMOOTH SOUNDS OF KENNY G: **RHP Ken Giles** has a 2.00 ERA (6ER/27.0IP) in his last 29 appearances, dating back to May 9...in that time frame, he has posted 36 strikeouts in his 27.0 innings pitched.

I AM IRON MAN: **2B Jose Altuve** has played in 185 consecutive team games, which is the longest games-played streak in the Majors.

KNOCK'EM IN: Since June 20, **SS Carlos Correa's** 26 RBI (in 24g) are 2nd in the Majors...Correa has hit .293 (27x92) in that span with 5 homers, 12 doubles and a .597 SLG.

HOME-COOKIN: On Friday, the Astros will begin a 6-game homestand, during which they will host the Angels (Fri-Sun) and Yankees (Mon-Wed)...the Astros are 28-19 (.596) at Minute Maid Park in 2016, giving them the 6th-best home record in the AL...since May 24, they are 18-6 at home for a .750 winning pct. in that span.

LAST START - 7/15 AT SEA: notched his 9th win of the season in Houston's 7-3 victory...went 5.0 innings, allowing 3 runs on 5 hits...walked 2 with 3 strikeouts...snapped a season-high tying 3-game losing streak.

MISTER FISTER: 32-year-old veteran starter is set to make his 19th start of the season, and his 11th on the road...signed a 1-year contract with Houston as a free agent this offseason...spent the previous 2 seasons with Washington (2014-15).

- is tied for the club lead in quality starts (12) and ranks 2nd in ERA and innings pitched.

STINGY STARTS: has allowed 3 runs or less in 15 of his 18 starts this season...is 1 of only 4 AL pitchers to hold the opposition to 3 runs or less in at least 15 starts this season: also **RHP Danny Salazar** (16), **RHP Aaron Sanchez** (15) and **LHP J.A. Happ** (15).

- allowed 3 runs or less in a career-long 12 straight starts from April 20-June 20...only 2 other Major League pitchers this season put together streaks that long: **RHP Julio Teheran** (13 games) and **LHP Rich Hill** (12 games).

FORGET APRIL: since the start of May, has gone 8-3 with a 3.15 ERA (31ER/88.2IP) in 14 starts...among AL pitchers in that span, ranks 9th in ERA, T-7th in wins and T-16th in innings pitched.

I GO, YOU GO: the Astros have won 11 of the last 14 starts (since May 1) made by Fister and have gone 12-6 overall in his 18 outings.

- Houston won 10 straight games started by Fister from May 1-June 20, which tied the single-season franchise record: also **RHP Donne Wall** (May 15-July 2, 1996), **RHP Nolan Ryan** (1983) and **RHP Joe Niekro** (1979)...the overall club record is an 11-game run by **RHP Collin McHugh** across the 2014-15 seasons.

VS. OAK: will start opposite the Athletics for the 17th time in his career, which are his most starts against any team during his career.

- faced the club 2 starts ago on July 7, going 8.0 innings and allowing just 2 runs in a 3-1 Houston loss...has allowed just 3 runs in 20.2 innings against the club this season for a 1.31 ERA.

THE PRICE IS RIGHT: has been virtually unhittable against right-handed hitters, holding them to a .199 batting average (40x201), .261 on-base percentage and .284 slugging percentage...among all AL starters against right-handed hitters, ranks 2nd in opponent batting average, 2nd in opponent slugging percentage and 7th in opponent OBP.

WHAT A STREAK IT WAS: had a 7-game winning from May 1-June 20, which tied the longest of his career (also Aug. 20-Sept. 26, 2011)...is the tied for the 4th-longest win streak in the AL the season...became the 1st Astros pitcher to record a 7-game winning streak in a single season since **RHP Collin McHugh** did so to end the 2014 season.

IN TUNE JUNE: had a stellar month of June, taking the win in 4 of his 5 starts, while posting a stingy 2.45 ERA...struck out 25 in his 33.0 innings, while walking 6...ranked among the top 10 AL pitchers in several categories including wins (T-2nd), ERA (8th) and WHIP (7th).

IN CONTROL: has a career 1.89 walks per 9.0 innings ratio, which ranks 2nd among all active Major League pitchers with at least 1000 innings pitched behind only **RHP Jordan Zimmermann** (1.81).

ASTROS FRONT COURT: at 6-foot-8, joins **RHP J.R. Richard** (6'8") and **LHP Randy Johnson** (6'10") as the tallest pitchers in Astros history.

- recorded his 2nd 4-hit game in his last 3 contests last night at OAK...finished a homer shy of the cycle...his 6 4-hit hits leads the Majors this season...has hit in all 5 games on the road trip...owns a 18-game road hitting streak (longest active in the AL) in which he's hit .514 (38x74) with 6 doubles, 2 triples, 2 HR, 10 RBI, a .543 OBP and 12 multi-hit games...leads the Majors in batting (.417, 78x187), hits, OBP (.479) and OPS (1.105) on the road this season.
- has also reached base safely in 34 straight road games...the only Astros player to put together a longer streak was **Jeff Bagwell**: 51 games from Sept. 23, 1998-July 31, 1999 and 43 games from June 10-Sept. 18, 1998...the last AL player with a longer streak: **Edwin Encarnacion**, 45 games in 2015.
- leads AL in batting (.354) and leads the Majors in hits (131)...ranks 3rd among MLB position players in WAR (5.3)...also leads the AL in steals (25) and ranks 2nd in OBP (.422), 4th in OPS (.984), 5th in runs (73) and 5th in SLG (.562).**
- 18 career 4-hit games rank 4th in club history...trails **Cesar Cedeno** (25) for 3rd place...in 6 games as a DH this season is batting .476 (10x21) with 2 HR, 8 RBI and a 1.242 OPS (.480 OBP/.762 SLG).
- his 15 HR tie his career high set in 2015...has 15 HR in 94 games, compared to 154 games last year...his 42 walks are a career high (previously 40 in 2012).
- has played in 185 consecutive games, which is the longest games-played streak in the Majors, immediately ahead of **OF Mike Trout** (155) and **2B Robinson Cano** (151)...did not start 1 game this year (May 7 vs. SEA), but entered as a defensive replacement and got 1 AB...last missed a game on June 21, 2015 at SEA.
