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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (42-53) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (37-57)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's are 4-2 since the All-Star Break, which is tied for the third best record in the American League...are 7-9 (.438) in July... went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 14-12 (.538) since then...are 42-53 (.442) overall, which is the third worst record in the AL...are in fifth place in the AL West for the first time since June 23 and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 33 days in fourth, 13 days tied for fourth and 21 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-1 with a 4.39 ERA (26 er in 53.1 ip) over the last 10 games and are 26-40 with a 5.02 ERA (284 er in 508.2 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in highest ERA, most losses, fewest innings and fewest wins...have issued the third most walks (196) but have surrendered the third fewest home runs (70)...are one of five AL teams without a complete game and the A's streak of 146 consecutive games without a complete game is second longest in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009) and the second longest active streak in the AL (Baltimore, 279)...the A's last complete game was by Sonny Gray on Aug. 7, 2015 against Houston.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.67 ERA (30 er in 73.2 ip) over the last eight games and now have a 4.70 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...have the third highest opponents batting average (.269) and fourth highest on-base percentage (.335)...have issued the fourth most walks (307).

OFFENSE: The A's rank fourth in the American League with a .263 (52-for-198) batting average since the All-Star Break but are last with a .235 (126for-537) average in July...have gone homerless in back-to-back games and in eight of their 16 games this month...have the third fewest July home runs in the AL (14)...for the season, the A's have the lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.306), the second fewest walks (244), the third lowest slugging percentage (.400), the third fewest strikeouts (646) and the fourth fewest home runs (98).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed at least one error in a season-high seven consecutive games (11 errors total) to snap an Athletics franchise record streak of 15 consecutive games without an error (June 25-July 9)...now have 64 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League...rank fourth in double plays (95)...A's outfielders have 10 assists, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors (San Francisco and St. Louis. 9).

WITH RISP: The A's are hitting .344 (78-for-227) with runners in scoring position since June 13 after batting .246 with RISP over the first 62 games...are hitting .278 with RISP for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 5 for their last 12 (.417) with a walk and seven RBI...are batting .239 (17-for-71) with two doubles, a triple, two home runs and 13 RBI for the season...rank second in the American League in hits and RBI and tied for second in plate appearances (73) and extra base hits (5).

SERIES NOTES: The A's have won the first game in each of their last four series and 10 of the last 11...however, have lost the final game in each of their last six series and 10 of the last 11...for the season, are 19-12 in the first game of a series compared to 9-22 in the final game of a series

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-2 on this 10-game homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (four games)...will play 20 of their first 29 games after the All-Star Break at home as the A's will sandwich two 10-game homestands around a nine-game road trip from July 25-Aug. 14...went 1-4 on the last homestand and are 21-28 (.429) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...lave following the game Sunday for a 11-day, nine-game road trip to Texas (three games), Cleveland (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (1-2) and Houston (2-2) and are 21-25 (.457) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 9-5 since then...are batting .244 (394-for-1615) at home compared to .259 (419-for-1619) on the road...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL...have a 4.19 ERA (206 er in 443.0 ip) at home compared to 5.28 (234 er in 398.2 ip) on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: Six of the A's last eight games have been decided by one run and the A's are 4-2 in those games...are 13-15 (.464) in one-run games for the season...the 28 one-run games are fourth most in the American League...snapped a three-game losing streak in extra innings Tuesday night and are now 3-3 in extra inning games for the season...the Oakland record for fewest extra inning games in a non-strike season is nine in 1974 and 1975...improved to 4-5 in walk-off games and 9-9 in games decided in the last at bat with the win Tuesday night.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have scored 18 of their 27 runs since the break with two outs (66.7%)...snapped their nine-game losing streak in games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher Tuesday night...it was their first win in a game started by a lefty since June 13 against Texas (Ramos)...the A's designated hitter has homered just once over the last 45 games (Khris Davis, June 17 vs. Los Angeles)... A's designated hitters have eight home runs for the season, which is tied with Chicago for the fewest in the American League.

BEFORE THE ALL-STAR BREAK: The A's had a 38-51 (.427) record at the All-Star Break, which was fifth worst in Oakland history and the worst since 2011 (39-53, .424)...were 151/2 games out of first place in the American League West, which matched the third largest deficit at the break in Oakland history and was the worst since 2001 (19)...the offense drew just 222 walks, which was the fewest by an A's team in a non-strike season since 1958 (214).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 21 times, which marks the sixth time in the last 10 years they have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 21 players have combined to miss 906 games (43.1 games per stint)...currently have 12 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard, Triggs)...today is the 17th day the A's have had at least 12 players on the DL...prior to this year, have never had more than 11 players on the DL at one time...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RAYS: The A's lead the season series 2-1 after winning two of three at Tampa Bay in May...lost the season series last year for the first time since 2010 as they went 3-4...are 49-45 against the Rays dating back to 2005 after going 49-17 over the first seven years...all-time, the A's are 98-62 against Tampa Bay...that is the fifth best record of any team against any opponent based on a minimum of 100 games...are 53-24 in Oak-

land and 45-38 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any American League team.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .423 with runners in scor ing position... Khris Davis is tied for fifth in the American League with 23 home runs...that is the second best total of his career and four shy of his career high of 27 from last year... Ryan Dull has a 0.72 ERA (2 er in 24.0 ip) over his last 24 games dating back to May 25... *Marcus Semien* ranks second among Major League shortstops in home runs (20) and fourth among AL shortstops in RBI (48)... Danny Valencia has five home runs against the Rays, which match the most ever in one season by an Athletic against Tampa Bay (Chavez and Durazo, 2004... Stephen Vogt is 13-for-25 (.520) with eight runs, three doubles, a triple, two home runs, six RBI and four multiple hit games over his last seven games.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1945 the A's and Tigers play to a 1-1 tie in a 24 inning game...in 1971 Sal Bando hits a two-run home run in the bottom of the ninth inning and adds the game winning sacrifice fly in the 12th inning as the A's defeat Cleveland, 4-3...in 1996 the A's hit five home runs in an 11-8 win at Texas...Terry Steinbach has two of those homers, his first of back-toback two-homer games.

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TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (4-8, 5.12 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 5 and is 1-3 with a 4.07 ERA (22 er in 48.2 ip) in eight starts since his return...was placed on the DL May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA in nine starts before going on the DL...has a 5.12 ERA for the season, which is fourth highest in the American League.

high seven-game losing streak, which was the longest by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross had an eight-game losing streak from May 19-Sept. 24, 2012...it ended a streak of 12 consecutive starts without a win, which tied for second longest by an A's starter this century (13, Braden, April 29-Sept. 29, 2007; 12, Bassitt, Aug. 9, 2015-April 28, 2016)...had a 6.16 ERA and .293 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 12 starts from April 27 to July 6.

WILD PITCHES: Has 13 wild pitches, which is four more than any other pitcher...all 13 came before the All-Star Break, which are most in Athletics history before the break...had three wild pitches May 20 against New York and is the first A's pitcher with three wild pitches in a game since Doug Johns on Sept. 6, 1995 at Boston...has 43 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53).

AGAINST THE EAST: Is 2-2 with a 7.01 ERA (20 er in 25.2 ip) in five starts against American League East competition compared to 2-6 with a 4.44 ERA (35 er in 71.0 ip) in 12 starts against everyone else...is now 7-9 with a 4.00 ERA (59 er in 132.2 ip) in 22 career starts against the AL East compared to 30-19 with a 3.02 ERA (153 er in 455.0 ip) in 71 games against everyone else.

SPOTS IN THE ORDER: Has held the opponents number seven hitter to a .136 (6-for-44) batting average, which is the lowest in the majors among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...however, the opponents number eight hitter is batting .436 (17-for-39) and the nine hitter is hitting .444 (16-for-36), both of which are the highest marks in the majors...the four and five hitters are a combined 14-for-80 (.175) with no home runs.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-1 with a 2.86 ERA (11 er in 34.2 ip) in six starts during the day compared to 2-7 with a 6.39 ERA (44 er in 62.0 ip) in 11 starts at night...is tied for third in the American League in night losses...over the last two years, he is 7-3 with a 2.17 ERA (23 er in 95.1 ip) in 15 starts during the day, 11-12 with a 4.08 ERA (95 er in 209.1 ip) in 33 starts at night.

BEFORE THE BREAK: Picked up the win in his first start after the All-Star Break last Saturday after going 3-8 with a 5.16 ERA in 16 starts before the break...the eight losses were two more than his combined pre-All-Star Break total from the previous two seasons (20-6, 2.42 ERA in 37 starts)... is now 23-14 with a 3.13 ERA in 54 career appearances before the All-Star Break compared to 14-14 with a 3.41 ERA (93 er in 245.2 ip) in 39 games after the break.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has yielded a .307 (27-for-88) batting average with runners in scoring position...opponents are batting .232 (32-for-138) the first time through the lineup, .273 (36-for-132) the second time and .333 (37-for-111) after that...has surrendered 10 of his 13 home runs to right-handed hitters and has a .526 opponents slugging percentage against righties compared to .397 against lefties...opponents are 24-for-54 (.444) with five doubles and four home runs (.759 slugging percentage) when putting the first pitch in play.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 3.06 ERA (17 er in 50.0 ip) and .213 (39-for-183) opponents batting average over the first three innings of the game compared to a 7.33 ERA (38 er in 46.2 ip) and .333 (66-for-198) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

IN JULY: Is 1-2 with a 5.50 ERA (11 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts in July... had allowed just 16 runs in 77.0 career July innings entering this year (1.64 ERA)...is now 8-3 with a 2.37 ERA (25 er in 95.0 ip) in 15 career appearances in the month of July...the ERA is his lowest for any month of the season.

THIS AND THAT: Has tossed exactly six innings in each of his last six starts, which matches the longest such streak by a Major League pitcher since at least 1913 (eighth time)...is 1-6 in nine starts with two runs of support or fewer compared to 3-2 in eight starts with three runs of support or more...is 32-4 in 50 starts with three runs of support or more in his career.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Was scratched from his scheduled Opening Day start on April 4 against Chicago (AL) due to food poisoning...started two days later against the White Sox and picked up the win in a 2-1 decision... tossed 6.1 innings to go over the 500 innings pitched mark in his career in a 4-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on April 11...was 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA over his first four starts...then matched the shortest outing of his career on April 27 at Detroit he tossed just 2.0 innings and allowed four runs in a 9-4 loss...it was his shortest outing as a starter (pitched 2.0 innings in his first two career outings, both in relief)...allowed a career-high tying seven runs in back-to-back starts on May 3 against Seattle and May 9 at Boston... went 0-3 with a 9.61 ERA in four starts in May...allowed 25 runs, which were his most ever in a month (21, Aug. 2014)...surrendered five home runs, which match his most in a month (Aug. 2015)...had a no decision in the A's 5-2 loss at Houston June 5...left with a 2-1 lead but Coulombe allowed a run in the sixth for the blown save...it was the first of two times he left with the lead only to have the bullpen blown the save (Axford, June 26 at Los Angeles-AL).

LAST START: He snapped his seven-game losing streak in the A's 5-4 win over Toronto last Saturday in Oakland...allowed two runs in the second inning on a two-run double by Thole but the A's came back with four in the bottom of the second...surrendered a leadoff home run to Encarnacion in the third but that was the last run he would allow in six innings of work.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (3-5, 5.13 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 14th appearance and 13th start of the season and his career...began his career with 12 consecutive starts before pitching in relief last Sunday when the starter Rich Hill left after five pitches with a blister and his replacement, Andrew Triggs, left after one inning with a left shin contusion...had a no decision in the A's 5-3 loss (5.0 ip, 3 h, 2 r, 2 er, 4 so)...is 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA in four games since he was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 29...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...is 3-2 with a 3.93 ERA in nine games at home compared to 0-3 with a 7.89 ERA in four games on the road...has a 2.87 ERA and .229 opponents batting average over innings one through three and a 7.60 ERA and .312 opponents batting average from the fourth inning on...has never faced the Rays in his career.

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 4.91 ERA (131 er in 240.0 ip) over its last 68 games after posting a 2.42 ERA over its first 27 games through May 2...has a 4.22 ERA (156 er in 333.0 ip) for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League.
- Has tossed 333.0 innings, which is the most in the AL and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed 36-of-161 (22.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 21.4%).
- Is tied for second in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (33) and tied for fourth in strikeouts (310)...is tied for second in wild pitches (20) and ranks fifth in walks (111) and home runs (40).
- Ranks third in the AL in first batter strikeouts (75) and has the third lowest first batter slugging percentage (.334).
