ABOUT THE A'S: The A's are 4-3 since the All-Star Break but are 7-10 in July...are 42-54 (.438) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League...the 12 games under .500 is one short of the season high of 13 (five times, last: 38-51 on July 10)...went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 14-13 (.519) since then...are in fifth place in the AL West for the second consecutive day and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 33 days in fourth, 13 days tied for fourth and 22 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 2-2 with a 6.61 ERA (24 er in 32.2 ip) and .313 (42-for-134) opponents batting average in seven games since the All-Star Break...are 26-41 with a 5.10 ERA (291 er in 513.2 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in highest ERA, tied for second in most losses and third in fewest innings pitched, fewest wins, most walks (196) and fewest home runs (72)...are one of five AL teams without a complete game and the A's streak of 147 consecutive games without a complete game is second longest in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009) and the second longest active streak in the AL (Baltimore, 280)...the A's last complete game was by Sonny Gray on Aug. 7, 2015 against Houston.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed exactly 10 hits in each of the last five games and have a .270 (50-for-185) opponents batting average and 4.70 ERA (24 er in 46.0 ip) over that span...for the season, have second highest ERA in the American League (4.73), the third highest opponents batting average (.269), the fourth highest opponents slugging percentage (.433) and the fourth most walks (307).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored three runs on nine hits over the last two games...are batting .230 (131-for-569) in July, which is the lowest batting average in the majors...have gone homerless in eight of 17 games this month and have the third fewest July home runs in the American League (15)...for the season, the A's have the lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.306), the second fewest walks (246) and second lowest slugging percentage (.398), the third fewest strikeouts (654) and the fourth fewest home runs (99).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's did not commit an error last night, ending their season-high streak of seven consecutive games with an error...have 64 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League...rank fourth in double plays (95)...A's outfielders have 11 assists, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors.

WITH RISP: The A's are hitting .356 (47-for-132) with runners in scoring position since June 27 after batting .258 with RISP over the first 75 games...are hitting .277 with RISP for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 5 for their last 13 (.385) with a walk and seven RBI...are batting .236 (17-for-72) with two doubles, a triple, two home runs and 13 RBI for the season...rank second in the American League in hits, RBI and plate appearances (74) and tied for second in extra base hits (5).

SERIES NOTES: The A's have won the first game in 10 of the last 12 series...however, have lost the final game in each of their last six series and 10 of the last 11...for the season, are 19-13 in the first game of a series compared to 9-22 in the final game of a series.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-3 on this 10-game homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (0-1)...will play 20 of their first 29 games after the All-Star Break at home as the A's will sandwich two 10-game homestands around a nine-game road trip from July 25-Aug. 14...started the year 14-16 at home (through June 13), but are 7-13 since then...are 21-29 (.420) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...leave following the game Sunday for a 11-day, nine-game road trip to Texas (three games), Cleveland (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (1-2) and Houston (2-2) and are 21-25 (.457) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 9-5 since then...are batting .242 (399-for-1647) at home compared to .259 (419-for-1619) on the road...have the third lowest home batting average in

the AL...have a 4.30 ERA (216 er in 452.0 ip) at home compared to 5.28 (234 er in 398.2 ip) on the road.

CLOSE CALLS: Six of the A's last 10 games have been decided by one run and the A's are 4-2 in those games...are 13-15 (.464) in one-run games for the season...the 28 one-run games are fourth most in the American League...snapped a three-game losing streak in extra innings Tuesday night and are now 3-3 in extra inning games for the season...the Oakland record for fewest extra inning games in a non-strike season is nine in 1974 and 1975...improved to 4-5 in walk-off games and 9-9 in games decided in the last at bat with the win Tuesday night.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have lost 10 of their last 11 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...the one win came on Tuesday night against Houston (Keuchel) and it snapped a nine-game losing streak against lefties...are 10-15 (.400) in games started by a lefty compared to 32-39 (.451) against righties...the mark against lefties is tied with Minnesota for the worst in the American League.

THIS AND THAT: The A's scored all three of their runs yesterday with two outs...have scored 21 of their 30 runs since the break with two outs (70.0%)...the A's designated hitter has homered just once over the last 46 games (Khris Davis, June 17 vs. Los Angeles)...A's designated hitters have eight home runs for the season, which is tied with Chicago for the fewest in the American League.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 21 times, which marks the sixth time in the last 10 years they have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 21 players have combined to miss 918 games (43.7 games per stint)...currently have 12 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard, Triggs)...today is the 18th day the A's have had at least 12 players on the DL...prior to this year, have never had more than 11 players on the DL at one time...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RAYS: The season series is even at two games each as the A's lost the first game in Oakland last night after winning two of three at Tampa Bay in May...lost the season series last year for the first time since 2010 as they went 3-4...are 49-46 against the Rays dating back to 2005 after going 49-17 over the first seven years...all-time, the A's are 98-63 against Tampa Bay...that is the fifth best record of any team against any opponent based on a minimum of 100 games...are 53-25 (.679) in Oakland and 45-38 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any American League team.

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .423 with runners in scoring position...**Khris Davis** is tied for sixth in the American League with 23 home runs...that is the second best total of his career and four shy of his career high of 27 from last year...**Ryan Dull** has a 0.72 ERA (2 er in 24.0 ip) over his last 24 games dating back to May 25...**Marcus Semien** ranks second among ML shortstops in home runs (20) and fourth among AL shortstops in RBI (48)...**Danny Valencia** has five home runs against the Rays, which match the most ever in one season by an Athletic against Tampa Bay (Chavez and Durazo, 2004)...**Stephen Vogt** is 13-for-29 (.448) with eight runs, three doubles, a triple, two home runs, six RBI and four multiple hit games over his last eight games.

In **1905** Weldon Henley no hits the St. Louis Browns, 6-0...it is one of just four wins for Henley all year...in **1996** Mark McGwire singles off Kevin Tapani in the second inning of the A's 6-5 win at Chicago for his 1000th career hit...he becomes the eighth Oakland Athletic to reach the 1000 mark...in **2012** Coco Crisp has a RBI single in the bottom of the 12th inning to lead the A's to a 5-4 win over New York...the win completes the A's second four-game series sweep of the Yankees since 1914.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (3-5, 5.13 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 14th appearance and 13th start of the season and his career...began his career with 12 consecutive starts before pitching in relief last Sunday when the starter Rich Hill left after five pitches with a blister, and his replacement, Andrew Triggs, left after one inning with a left shin contusion...is 1-1 with a 3.18 ERA (8 er in 22.2 ip) in four games since he was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 29...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...made one start on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton June 24 against San Jose and had a no decision (3.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 1 hr, 64 pitches)...was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is making his Major League debut.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Is tied for second among American League rookies in strikeouts (59), ranks third in innings pitched (72.0), tied for third in games started (12) and tied for seventh in wins (3).

HOME AND AWAY: Is scheduled to make his ninth home start of the season, compared to four starts on the road...is 3-2 with a 3.93 ERA (22 er in 50.1 ip) and .251 (48-for-191) opponents batting average in nine games at home compared to 0-3 with a 7.89 ERA (19 er in 21.2 ip) and .311 (28-for-90) opponents average in four games on the road...has surrendered six home runs in 21.2 innings on the road, five in 50.1 innings in Oakland.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.87 ERA (12 er in 37.2 ip) and .229 (32-for-140) opponents batting average over innings one through three and a 7.60 ERA (29 er in 34.1 ip) and .312 (44-for-141) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-1 with a 3.65 ERA (10 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts on four days rest, 2-4 with a 6.17 ERA (29 er in 42.1 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more.

AGAINST THE EAST: Is 0-2 with a 9.42 ERA (15 er in 14.1 ip) in three games, two starts, against American League East teams compared to 3-3 with a 4.06 ERA (26 er in 57.2 ip) in 10 starts against everyone else.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .179 (10-for-56) batting average and four extra base hits (two doubles, two home runs)...right-handers are batting .293 (66-for-225) with nine of his 11 home runs and 16 of his 20 walks...has an .828 OPS against righties, .567 against lefties...opponents are batting .209 (14-for-67) with runners in scoring position...has a .225 (25-for-111) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .262 (27-for-103) the second time and .358 (24-for-67) after that...has allowed a .383 (36-for-94) batting average, nine home runs and 21 RBI to the opponents four, five and six hitters compared to .214 (40-for-187) with two home runs and 10 RBI to all other spots in the order...opponents are 23-for-50 (.460) with six doubles, four home runs and 16 RBI when putting the first pitch in play.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-4 with a 6.17 ERA (29 er in 42.1 ip) in eight starts at night compared to 1-1 with a 3.64 ERA (12 er in 29.2 ip) in five games during the day...has surrendered two home runs in 29.2 innings during the day, nine in 42.1 innings at night.

2016 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 7-4 A's win over Houston **April 29** in Oakland...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...issued a career-high four walks...left with the score tied at 2-2 but then bullpen allowed two inherited runners to score before the A's tied the game in the eighth and won it on a three-run home run by Alonso in the ninth...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Seattle in Oakland on **May 4**...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning...the A's then scored six times in the bottom of the fifth to give him an 8-4 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford)...had the first decision of his career, a loss in the A's 13-5 loss at Boston **May 10**...yielded a career-high eight runs on a career-high 10 hits in a career-low 2.2 innings...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969)...picked up his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas **May 16** in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first six innings...had a 2-0 lead with runners on second and third and one out in the seventh inning...allowed a sacrifice fly to Stubbs and was relieved by Doolittle who got the final out of the inning...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to New York (AL) in Oakland on **May 21**...retired each of the first nine batters he faced before allowing the first four batters to reach base in the fourth inning...yielded four runs in the fourth on a Beltran RBI single, a Hicks sacrifice fly and a Refsnyder two-run double...also allowed a RBI double to Castro in the seventh...lost his second consecutive start

in the A's 4-1 loss to Detroit **May 27** in Oakland...shutout the Tigers on three hits over the first three innings but then allowed two runs in the fourth on a RBI double by Maybin and a RBI single by McCann...also allowed a leadoff home run to Castellanos in the sixth...left after six innings trailing 3-0 as the A's were shutout on three hits over the first eight innings...picked up the second win of his career in the A's 5-1 win over Minnesota **June 1** in Oakland...struck out a career-high eight batters...shut out the Twins on four hits and a walk over the first five innings...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the sixth inning...loaded the bases with no outs but got a sacrifice fly from Escobar before striking out Kepler and Centeno...was relieved by Dull to start the seventh inning with the A's leading 5-2...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-4 loss at Milwaukee **June 7**...allowed five runs in a career-high 7.0 innings...surrendered a two-run home run to Carter in the second inning and a three-run home run to Carter in the sixth...the A's were no-hit by Davies over the first six innings before Butler hit a two-run home run in the seventh inning...was relieved by Rodriguez to start the eighth with the A's trailing 5-2...had a no decision in the A's 14-5 win over Texas on **June 13** in Oakland...had a 10-2 lead when he left the game after 4.1 innings with a left pronator muscle strain...went on the DL the next day...had a 5-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Andrus in the fourth...surrendered a solo home run to Choo, the final batter he faced...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-1 victory over San Francisco **June 29** in Oakland...did not allow a run in 5.2 innings for the first scoreless outing of his career...put runners in scoring position in four of his six innings and retired the side in order in the third and fifth...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-4 loss at Minnesota **July 5**...the A's scored a run in the second but he allowed a Suzuki RBI groundout in the bottom of the second...surrendered two more runs in the fourth inning on a Suzuki RBI single and a Buxton RBI single...then yielded a two-run home run to Vargas a solo home run to Kepler on consecutive pitches in the fifth inning.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss at Houston on July 10...tossed a career-high 106 pitches in a career-high tying 7.0 innings and did not allow a run or walk a batter...allowed a runner to advance into scoring position in five of his seven innings...the A's scored a run in the sixth to take a 1-0 lead but Madson allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save and Hendriks surrendered a run in the 10th for the loss.

LAST APPEARANCE: He made his first career relief appearance in the A's 5-3 loss to Toronto last Sunday in Oakland and had a no decision...entered the game to start the second inning in relief of Andrew Triggs, who left the game with a left shin contusion...Triggs relieved Rich Hill who left after five pitches with a blister...Manaea had been scheduled to start two days later...set down the first six batters he faced but then allowed a two-run home run to Tulowitzki in the fourth...retired eight of the final nine batters he faced...tossed 5.0 innings, which is a season-high for an A's reliever.

NASHVILLE: Was 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA (18.0 ip, 16 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 21 so) in three starts with Triple-A Nashville...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA, fifth in strikeouts per nine innings (10.50) and tied for fifth in wins at the time of his April 29 promotion...allowed just one run in each of his starts...surrendered just one home run in 18.0 innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .077 (1-for-13) against left-handed hitters compared to .268 (15-for-56) against right-handers.
