### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (43-54) VS. TAMPA BAY RAYS (38-58)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's are 5-3 since the All-Star Break and are 8-10 in July...went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 15-13 (.536) since then...are 43-54 (.443) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League...are in fifth place in the AL West for the third consecutive day and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 33 days in fourth, 13 days tied for fourth and 23 days in fifth.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's defeated Tampa Bay last night 1-0 in 13 innings...it was the fourth longest 1-0 win in Oakland history and was the longest since a 14-inning victory on July 20, 2004 against Toronto...the game lasted 3 hours and 31 minutes, which was the A's fastest game of 13 or more innings since July 20, 1980 against Cleveland (3:23 in 14 innings)...seven of the A's last 11 games have been decided by one run and the A's are 5-2 in those games...are 14-15 (.483) in one-run games for the season and rank fourth in the American League in one-run games (29)...have won each of their last two extra inning games (both in the last four games) and are 4-3 in extra innings for the season...improved to 5-5 in walk-off games and 10-9 in games decided in the last at bat with the win last night.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's have lost 10 of their last 11 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher and have won 13 of the last 17 games when the opponent starts a right-hander...the one win against lefties came on Tuesday night against Houston (Keuchel) and it snapped a nine-game losing streak against lefties...are 10-15 (.400) in games started by a lefty compared to 33-39 (.458) against righties...the mark against lefties is the worst in the American League and third worst in the majors.

**PITCHING:** The A's tossed their third shutout of the season last night, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...it was the 13th extra-inning shutout in Oakland history, the first since July 4, 2014 (1-0 vs. Toronto in 12 innings)...now have a 3.48 ERA (37 er in 95.2 ip) over the last 10 games but have a 4.66 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.268) and have issued the fourth most walks (309).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 2-2 with a 5.31 ERA (24 er in 40.2 ip) and .290 (47-for-162) opponents batting average in eight games since the All-Star Break...are 26-41 with a 5.02 ERA (291 er in 521.2 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in highest ERA, tied for second in most losses and third in fewest innings pitched, fewest wins and fewest home runs (72)...are one of five AL teams without a complete game and the A's streak of 148 consecutive games without a complete game is second longest in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009) and the second longest active streak in the AL (Baltimore, 281)...the A's last complete game was by Sonny Gray on Aug. 7, 2015 against Houston.

**OFFENSE:** The A's have scored four runs over the last three games and are 19-for-106 (.179) over that span...are batting .230 (141-for-612) in July, which is the lowest batting average in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have gone homerless in nine of 18 games this month and have the third fewest July home runs in the AL (15)...for the season, the A's have the lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.305), the second fewest walks (248) and second lowest slugging percentage (.396), the third fewest strikeouts (660) and the fourth fewest home runs (99).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have gone back-to-back games without an error to end their season-high streak of seven consecutive games with an error...have 64 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League...rank fourth in double plays (96)...A's outfielders have 11 assists, which is the fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors.

**IN THE PINCH:** A's pinch hitters are 5 for their last 14 (.357) with a walk and seven RBI...are batting .233 (17-for-73) with two doubles, a triple, two home runs and 13 RBI for the season...rank second in the American League in hits, RBI and plate appearances (75) and tied for second in extra base hits (5).

**SERIES NOTES:** The A's have won the first game in 10 of the last 12 series...however, have lost the final game in each of their last six series and

10 of the last 11...for the season, are 19-13 in the first game of a series compared to 9-22 in the final game of a series.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 5-3 on this 10-game homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (1-1)...will play 20 of their first 29 games after the All-Star Break at home as the A's will sandwich two 10-game homestands around a nine-game road trip from July 25-Aug. 14...started the year 14-16 at home (through June 13), but are 8-13 since then...are 22-29 (.431) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...leave following the game tomorrow for an 11-day, nine-game road trip to Texas (three games), Cleveland (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (1-2) and Houston (2-2) and are 21-25 (.457) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 9-5 since then...are batting .242 (409-for-1690) at home compared to .259 (419-for-1619) on the road...have the third lowest home batting average in the AL...have a 4.18 ERA (216 er in 465.0 ip) at home compared to 5.28 (234 er in 398.2 ip) on the road.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's have scored 21 of their 31 runs since the All-Star Break with two outs (67.7%)...the A's are hitting .348 (48-for-138) with runners in scoring position since June 27...the A's designated hitter has homered just once over the last 47 games (Chris Davis, June 17 vs. Los Angeles)...A's designated hitters have eight home runs for the season, which is the fewest in the American League.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 21 times, which marks the sixth time in the last 10 years they have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 21 players have combined to miss 930 games (44.3 games per stint)...currently have 12 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard, Triggs)...today is the 19th day the A's have had at least 12 players on the DL...prior to this year, have never had more than 11 players on the DL at one time...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. RAYS:** The A's lead the season series, 3-2...have split the first two games in Oakland after winning two of three at Tampa Bay in May...lost the season series last year for the first time since 2010 as they went 3-4...are 50-46 against the Rays dating back to 2005 after going 49-17 over the first seven years...all-time, the A's are 99-63 against Tampa Bay, which is the fourth best record of any team against any opponent based on a minimum of 100 games...are 54-25 (.684) in Oakland and 45-38 at Tropicana Field...the mark in the Coliseum is the A's best record against any American League team.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

The walk-off single by **Coco Crisp** last night improved his Major League leading batting average with runners in scoring position to .434...**Chris Davis** is tied for sixth in the American League with 23 home runs...**Ryan Dull** has a 0.69 ERA (2 er in 26.0 ip) over his last 25 games...**Marcus Semien** ranks second among ML shortstops in home runs (20) and fourth among AL shortstops in RBI (48)...**Danny Valencia** has five home runs against the Rays, which match the most ever in one season by an Athletic against Tampa Bay (Chavez and Durazo, 2004).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1964** Bert Campaneris homers twice in his major league debut as the A's defeat Minnesota, 4-3...the first home run comes on the first pitch he sees from Jim Kaat...in **1976** Vida Blue tosses a six-hit shutout and strikes out 13 in the A's 2-0 win over Kansas City to record his 100th career victory...he would go on to win 124 games in an Oakland uniform, second only to Catfish Hunter's 131...in **1996** Terry Steinbach hits his eighth career grand slam in the A's 8-4 win at Chicago...it was his fifth homer in three days.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (6-6, 4.25 ERA)

**FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK:** Is 5-0 with a 3.29 ERA (20 er in 54.2 ip) over his last nine starts...the five-game winning streak is a career high (previous: 3, June 24-July 4, 2015) and the second longest by an A's pitcher this year (6, Hill)...was 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...has allowed just three home runs during the winning streak (0.49 per nine innings) after allowing 10 home runs over his first nine starts (1.91 per nine innings).

**CAREER NOTES:** Picked up his sixth win of the season in his last start, which matches his career high from last year...has allowed 13 home runs, which is two short of his high of 15 from last year...went 1-2 with a 7.29 ERA over the first nine games (four starts) of his career through April 25, 2015, 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA over a nine-start stretch from May 23-July 4, 2015, 1-11 with a 5.57 ERA over a 17-start stretch from July 10, 2015-May 24, 2016 and is 5-0 with a 3.29 ERA (20 er in 54.2 ip) over his last nine starts.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Is 2-3 with a 2.91 ERA (14 er in 43.1 ip) in seven starts at home compared to 4-3 with a 5.25 ERA (34 er in 58.1 ip) in 11 starts on the road...has surrendered just three home runs in 43.1 innings at home compared to 10 in 58.1 innings on the road.

**MONTH BY MONTH:** Is 3-0 with a 2.08 ERA (5 er in 21.2 ip) and .192 (15-for-78) opponents batting average in three starts in July...the three wins are tied for fourth in the American League and match the best single-month total of his career (June, 2015)...his ERA ranks 10th...went 1-0 with a 4.33 ERA in five starts in June...was 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in six starts in May...his May loss total tied for second in the American League...it was the first time he has lost four games in a month in his career...went 1-2 with a 4.03 ERA in four starts in April.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has a 2.00 ERA (4 er in 18.0 ip) in the first inning, a 5.30 ERA (21 er in 35.2 ip) in the second and third inning and a 4.31 ERA (23 er in 48.0 ip) from the fourth inning on...has allowed nine of his 13 home runs over the first three innings of a game.

**SUPPORT:** Has left with the lead in three of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (April 12 vs. Los Angeles-AL, June 17 vs. Los Angeles, June 28 vs. San Francisco)...is averaging 5.76 (35 rs in 54.2 ip) runs of support during his current five-game winning streak (last nine starts) after receiving an average of 2.30 runs of support over his first nine starts...is 0-5 with two runs of support or fewer, 6-1 with three runs of support or more...is now 1-14 in 20 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 11-1 in 19 starts with three runs of support or more.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has issued 24 of his 32 walks this year and 48 of 70 in his career to left-handed hitters...has a .255 (74-for-290) opponents batting average the first two times through the lineup, .346 (37-for-107) after that...has allowed a .141 (23-for-163) batting average with two strikes, which ranks seventh lowest among American League pitchers that qualify for the ERA title.

**THIS AND THAT:** Tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings July 9, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to June 18 of last year...that was the fifth longest such streak in Oakland history...has tossed fewer than six innings in 10 of his 18 starts this year and 20 of 39 in his career...has walked one batter or fewer in nine of his 18 starts.

**2016 HIGHLIGHTS:** Allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts...picked up his first win of the season and struck out a career-high eight batters April 20 at New York (AL)...it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 10, 2015...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned nine starts...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat that day...then lost each of his next five starts from April 25 to May 19...logged a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which fell one short of his career high of six...allowed a career-high 10 hits in back-to-back starts on April 25 at Detroit and May 2 against Seattle...is the first A's pitcher with at least 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)...yielded a career-high four home runs in an 11-3 loss at Baltimore May 8...snapped his five-game losing streak in a 3-2 win over Minnesota May 30...issued a career high tying four walks but allowed just one run in 6.2 innings of work in a 3-1 win at Minnesota July 4...tossed a career-high tying 8.0 innings in a 3-2 win at Houston July 9.

**LAST START:** He won his third consecutive start in the A's 7-4 win over Houston on Monday in Oakland...tossed a career-high 112 pitches...allowed a Rasmus sacrifice fly in the second inning but the A's came back to

tie the game in the bottom of the second...surrendered an unearned run in the fourth when Correa doubled and later scored on a Healy error, but the A's scored five times in the bottom of the fourth to take a 5-2 lead...also yielded a solo home run to Gonzalez in the fifth.

**RHP Jesse Hahn (2-4, 6.49 ERA):** Will be recalled from Triple-A Nashville tomorrow for his third stint with the A's this year...was recalled for the first time April 30 and went 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA and .250 opponents average in two starts before he was optioned to Nashville May 8...returned a second time May 17 and went 1-3 with an 8.34 ERA and .368 opponents batting average in five starts before returning to Nashville June 10...was the losing pitcher in his last Major League start, a 4-0 A's loss at Milwaukee on June 8 (3.2 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...has never faced the Rays in his career...was 1-5 with a 3.63 ERA in 12 starts with Nashville...surrendered just two home runs in 52.0 innings...went 0-4 with a 5.02 ERA in seven starts following his June 10 option...including 0-1 with a 2.77 ERA over his final three starts...his last minor league start came on Wednesday at Albuquerque when he tossed just 1.0 inning and nine pitches (1 h).

- Has tossed 342.0 innings, which is the most in the AL and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed 36-of-161 (22.4%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 22.0%).
