RAY MATTER—The Rays 13-inning, 1-0 loss here last night snapped Tampa Bay's 3-game win streak...the Rays were held to 7 singles making last night's game the Rays longest game (by innings) they have ever played without getting an extra base hit...only one Rays base runner made it as far as third base...the Rays are 3-2 on this 9-game road trip (2-1 at Colorado and 1-1 here)...the Rays have won 4 of the their last 6 games (2.72-ERA; 56.1-IP, 17-ER) following their worst-ever 3-24 stretch that sent them from 31-32 (5.5 GB) on June 16 to 34-56 (19.5 GB) on July 16.

**EXTRA!** EXTRA!—Last night was the 9th extra inning, 1-0 game in Rays history and the Rays have lost 8 of them...it matched the Rays 2nd longest scoreless game in club history...the Rays and Boston were scoreless thru 15 innings on July 17, 2011 before the Red Sox won 1-0 in 16...and on Sep 13, 2015 the same two teams were scoreless thru 12 before the Sox won 2-0 in 13...the Rays are 2-2 in extra innings this season, but 4-15 over the past two seasons...going back to July 3, 2015 the Rays have now lost 9 of their last 10 extra inning road games.

IT WASN'T ALL BAD—Last night's game was played in 3 hours and 31 minutes...it was the majors' shortest game of 13 or more innings since May 18, 2015 when Arizona won at Miami in 13 innings...that game took only 3 hours, 11 minutes...last night's game was the shortest American League game of 13 or more innings since Aug 9, 2003 when the Indians defeated the Angels in 13 innings in 3 hours and 30 minutes.

SCORELESS AND WALKLESS—Last night, Rays starter Jake Odorizzi and A's starter Sean Manaea both pitched 8 shutout innings innings without a walk...the last time opposing starters had final lines of 8-plus innings, no runs and no walks was Sep 17, 2002 and it happened here: OAK Mark Mulder (9-IP) vs. LAA Jarrod Washburn (8-IP) faced off and the Angels won in 10 innings...according to Baseball Reference, during the expansion era (since 1961) there have been only 6 such games...the others:

**QUALITY IS JOB 1 IN SECOND HALF**—The Rays have had quality starts in each of their last 4 games, matching their longest such streak in 2016... over those 4 games, Rays starters are 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA (27-IP, 14-H, 5-ER) and have held the opposition to a .152 (14-for-92) batting average.

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK—The Rays are 4-4 since the All-Star break...despite last night's goose egg, the Rays 41 runs are tied for the most in the majors and their 27 extra base hits are 4th...the Rays ranked 26th in runs scored in the first half...Evan Longoria's 7 XBH lead the majors...Tim Beckham's .529 (9-for-17) avg. is 2nd in the majors behind HOU Jose Altuve's .571 (16-for-26) mark...Rays starting pitchers have had 6 quality starts...they had only 5 quality starts in the final 21 games of the first half...the Rays have pitched to a 2.78 ERA (74.1-IP, 23-ER).

RAYS vs. A's—Last night was the 14th extra inning game between these two teams...A's are 8-6 and have won the last 3 extra inning games here... A's lead the season series 3 games to 2...the Rays are 7-6 since Aug 6, 2014...they took 2 of 3 games from the A's here last season and have won 3 of their last 5 here...the Rays have made a total of 24 trips here, and last year's series win was only their fifth series win...they are 17-19 at Oakland since becoming the Rays in 2008, but were 8-35 in their first 10 seasons.

GRIFFEY, PIAZZA, MAKE 13—Tomorrow in Cooperstown, Ken Griffey Jr. and Mike Piazza will be inducted into the Hall of Fame and thus become the 12th and 13th Hall of Famers to have played against the Rays...join Cal Ripken Jr., Randy Johnson, Greg Maddux, John Smoltz, Frank Thomas, Paul Molitor, Pedro Martinez, Roberto Alomar, Tom Glavine, Craig Biggio and Rickey Henderson...the list doesn't include the only Hall of Famer to play for the Rays—Wade Boggs...he never played against them.

<u>WEB GEMS</u>—In the past 11 games, the Rays have made only five errors and none of them have made by an infielder...outfielders **Steven Souza** 

**Jr.**, **Brandon Guyer**, **Kevin Kiermaier** and **Corey Dickerson** and catcher **Luke Maile** have made the errors...Rays catchers have caught 6 of the last 16 (37.5 pct.) would-be stealers compared to 12 of 61 (19.6 pct.) prior.

<u>0-0-DORIZZI</u>—Last night, **Jake Odorizzi** (8-IP, R-0) took his 12th no decision of the season, tops in the majors...according to Baseball-Reference, since 1913 only two pitchers have had more no decisions through the first 100 games of a season: **Steve Trout** (13) with the Cubs in 1986 and **Jose Quintana** (13) with the White Sox in 2013...it was also the fifth time in his career Odorizzi has had a no decision in a scoreless start...in Rays history only **Chris Archer** (6) and **Scott Kazmir** (6) have had as many.

+ Odorizzi has made 14 scoreless starts since the start of the 2014 season...the only AL pitchers with more over that span are TB Chris Archer (16) and MIN Kyle Gibson (15).

<u>SNELL HOPING TO JOIN ARROJO</u>—Tomorrow, LH Blake Snell will attempt to become the Rays first rookie starter to win at Oakland since 1998 when **Rolando Arrojo** (the first rookie to start a game for the franchise) beat the A's twice here: 7-2 on May 26 and 5-2 on Sep 4.

**EVAN ALMIGHTY**—**Evan Longoria** reached 50 extra-base hits on Wednesday, one of only 5 in the AL to reach that plateau so far...only one other player in Rays history has had 50 extra-base hits after 96 games: **Aubrey Huff** (51 in 2003)...Longo is on pace for 178 hits, 84 extra base hits, 37 home runs and 93 RBI...only 4 third basemen have ever reached those levels in one season: **Alex Rodriguez** (2007), **Chipper Jones** (2009), **Miguel Cabrera** (2012) and **Josh Donaldson** (2015).

COLOME CLOSING IN ON ANOTHER CLUB RECORD—Thursday, Rays All-Star RH Alex Colome converted his 21st consecutive save, extending his club record to start the season...it was one of only two save opportunities he's had in the past 37 days (including a DL stint)...it is the Rays longest streak without a blown save (at any point of the season) since RH Fernando Rodney converted a club-record 22 straight from May 27–Aug 13, 2012...only 2 pitchers in the majors have recorded as many saves without a blown save: NYM Jeurys Familia (34) and BAL Zach Britton (31).

NEWS OF THE INFIRMED—2015 American League save leader RH Brad Boxberger (left oblique injury) is scheduled to make his third rehab appearance tonight for Class-A Charlotte vs. Brevard County (Brewers)...he last pitched Thursday and worked one inning for Charlotte (2-SO, 11 pitches)... RH Chase Whitley (Tommy John surgery) will make his second rehab appearance on Sunday for Charlotte vs. Brevard County...he is scheduled for 2 innings...RH Alex Cobb (Tommy John surgery) is scheduled to throw a 2-inning simulated game today at Charlotte Sports Park...OF Desmond Jennings (left hamstring strain) is scheduled to take part in that game... OF Mikie Mahtook (left hand fracture) will begin hitting of a tee tomorrow.

MILLER ON COURSE FOR CLUB RECORDS—With a career-high 15 HR, SS Brad Miller needs one more to shatter the Rays team record for most homers by a shortstop, a mark held by Asdrubal Cabrera in 2015 and Julio Lugo in 2003...according to Baseball Reference, since 1901 only five left-handed hitting shortstops have hit more than 15 HR in a season including LAD Corey Seager (17 this season)...the others: DET Dick McAuliffe (24 in 1964 and 23 in 1966), SF Brandon Crawford (21 in 2015), ARI Stephen Drew (21 in 2008) and Hall of Famer PIT Arky Vaughan (19 in 1935).

**THE COMPETITION**—Prior to this road trip, the Rays had played 26 of 30 games against teams over .500...they went 5-21 in those games...this series continues a stretch of 7 games vs. sub-.500 opponents (3-2 so far)... the Rays are 15-10 this season vs. teams currently under .500, compared to 23-48 (.328) vs. teams currently at .500 or better...their 71 games vs. teams .500 or better are the most in the majors.

THIS DATE IN RAYS HISTORY—July 23, 2002...In the first half of a daynight doubleheader with Boston, the Rays lose 22-4, allowing 3 HR to Nomar Garciaparra, who becomes the first player to hit three on his birthday... the Rays trail 4-0 in the 9th inning of the second game, but an Andy Sheets 2-run double and a 3-run homer from Jared Sandberg (now the manager of Triple-A Durham) put the Rays ahead 5-4...they split the doubleheader despite allowing 26 straight runs to Boston before that 9th inning.

+ July 23, 2009...LH Mark Buehrle threw the 18th perfect game in major league history, beating the Rays 5-0 at U.S. Cellular Field.

- + LAST START—On Mon at COL, yielded an RBI triple to Carlos Gonzalez in the 1st, a pair of runs in a 31-pitch 4th and a 2-run homer to Trevor Story (5th inning)...suffered his career-high 11th loss...increased his season ERA to 5.64, its highest since his season debut (6.75)...pitched on 11 days' rest, his first start following the All-Star break...threw a season-low 7 curveballs (out of 100 pitches) in the high altitude, compared to 21.8 pct. on the season prior to that.
- + SNAP THE SKID—Is 0-7 over his last 10 starts, longest losing streak by a Rays starter since Chris Archer from Sep 6, 2015—April 20, 2016 (7) and the longest within a single season since James Shields from May 25—June 29, 2010 (7)...Shields did pick up a win in relief over his stretch...the longest losing streak in club history is 11, by Geremi Gonzalez in 2003-04...it's the longest losing streak of his career (prev. 3, May 8-31, 2014)...he is seeking his first win since May 16 at TOR.
  - + His .154 winning pct. is the lowest in the majors (STATS LLC)... his 11 losses are T-3rd in the majors.
- + SNAP THE SKID, PART TWO—Has yielded at least 5 runs in 4 straight starts, longest streak by a Ray since Wade Davis (4) in May—June 2011...no Rays pitcher has allowed 5 runs in 5 straight outings since Mark Hendrickson in Aug 2004 (5 straight)...Smyly has yielded 5-plus runs in 8 of his 18 starts this season, compared to 5 of 55 career starts entering 2016.
- + NEARING 500—Enters tonight 4 strikeouts shy of 500 for his career.
- + STRIKEOUTS—Ranks among AL leaders in SO (111, 12th), SO/9 IP (9.48, 5th) and SO/BB (3.83, 9th)...opponents miss on 27.0 percent of their swings, 6th in the AL...has gotten strikeouts with the fastball (55), curveball (37), cutter (12) and changeup (7), according to PITCHf/x.
  - + Has 3 double-digit strikeout games, one of seven AL pitchers to make that claim this season (David Price, Chris Archer, Justin Verlander, Matt Shoemaker, Rich Hill, Lance McCullers).
- + BEFORE & AFTER—Since the beginning of May, is 1-8 with a 7.13 ERA (70.2-IP, 56-ER) in 13 starts, including 8 starts of 5 IP or fewer... min. 50 IP, his .567 opp SLG is the highest in the AL over that span and his ERA is 2nd highest in the majors to BAL Ubaldo Jimenez (8.74)... this coming after he ranked among AL leaders for April in IP (34.2, 3rd), SO (41, 3rd), WHIP (0.69, 2nd) and opp avg. (.151, 1st).

- + SAID ANOTHER WAY—A breakdown of his first 24 starts following his trade to the Rays (Aug 5, 2014–April 29, 2016) vs. his last 13:
  - + First 24 GS: 9-6, 2.54 ERA, 0.93 WHIP, 20 HR, .190/.244/.346
  - + Last 13 GS: 1-8, 7.13 ERA, 1.68 WHIP, 16 HR, .330/.375/.567
- + THE LONG BALL—Has yielded a career-high 21 HR (18, 2014), T-5th most in the majors...has allowed homers in 9 of his last 10 starts (14 HR over that span)...seven times he's yielded multiple homers, tied with KC lan Kennedy for most such apps/starts in the majors.
  - + Has yielded a career-high-tying 4 HR vs. LHB (0 in 2015).
  - + So far this year, 18.4 pct. of his hits allowed have been home runs...15.0 pct. of his fly balls allowed have been home runs.
  - + Since 2015, has yielded 32 HR in 172 IP for a 1.67 HR/9 IP ratio...during that time, 51 of his 96 runs allowed (53 pct.) have scored via HR—35 of 72 (48.6 pct.) this year and 16 of 24 (66.7 pct.) last year.
- + THE BIG INNING—Ten times this season he has allowed at least 3 runs in a single inning...only two pitchers in the majors have done that more often: PHI Aaron NoIa (11) and PIT Jeff Locke (11)...other pitchers to do it 10 times are CIN Alfredo Simon, KC Edinson Volquez, ARI Patrick Corbin, MIN Tyler Duffey and SEA Wade Miley...he only did this 7 times in 395 career innings prior to this season.
- + FIRST HALF WRAP—Smyly and RH Chris Archer became the second pair of teammates in major league history to record 100 strikeouts and 10 losses before the All-Star break...joined RH Clay Kirby (6-11, 126-SO) and RH Steve Arlin (8-11, 115-SO) of the 1972 Padres.
  - + Only one other pitcher in major league history (and none in the AL) had as high an ERA (5.47) with as many strikeouts (108) at the All-Star break—COL **Pedro Astacio** (5.67, 109) in 1999.
  - + His 20 HR before the All-Star break tied for the most in club history, along with **Esteban Yan** in 2000.
- + HOME vs. ROAD—Both wins have come on the road (April 24 at NYY, May 16 at TOR) despite a 6.28 ERA, 2nd highest in the AL to teammate Chris Archer (6.37)...averaging 6.44 R/9 IP in run support on the road (57.1-IP, 41-RS), 10th in the AL, while his 1.50 R/9 IP at home is the lowest in the majors.

## SMYLY vs. A's

CAREER—Is 1-2-1 with a 6.87 ERA (18.1-IP, 14-ER) in 6 career apps, 3 GS... all 3 starts have been less than 6 IP, and all 3 have come at Oakland Coliseum where he is 1-2-1 with a 4.91 ERA (18.1-IP, 10-ER) in 4 apps (3 starts).

LAST START—Last faced them on Aug 21, 2015 at OAK, picking up the win with 5.2 scoreless innings (6-H, 0-BB, 2-SO).

ALSO OF NOTE—Made his Rays debut on Aug 5, 2014 at OAK, suffering a 3-0 loss to ex-Ray Jason Hammel...made 2 relief apps for Detroit in the 2013 ALDS vs. OAK (1-IP, 1-H, 0-R).

## TOMORROW'S STARTER—LH BLAKE SNELL (2-4, 3.11)

- + LAST START—On Tue at COL, had the best start of his young career after a two-hour rain delay to start the game...over 6 scoreless innings, his only hit allowed was a 4th-inning leadoff single by Charlie Blackmon...had a career-high 9 SO, including Nolan Arenado twice...in his first career plate apps, went 0-for-2 with a walk off Tyler Chatwood... was helped by the Rays 5-run rally in the 3rd...threw 96 pit, 58 str.
- + ROOKIES > ROCKIES—In his last start, became the second visiting rookie in Coors Field history to pitch 6 or more scoreless innings and allow one hit or fewer, joining SD Oliver Perez on July 7, 2002 (6.2-IP, 1-H)...his 9 SO matched the 2nd most ever by a visiting rookie at Coors Field...Perez had 13 SO in the aforementioned game, and SD
- Cory Luebke also had 9 SO on Sep 11, 2011.
- + BALLS & STRIKES—A comparison of his last 2 starts vs. his first 5 starts, as well as the major league average:

### #16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Has been ejected 4 times as manager, once this year (April 29 vs. TOR).
- + Recorded 100 career wins faster than any manager in club history on May 20 at DET...was the youngest to do it since CLE **Eric Wedge** in 2004.
- + Marks his second season as Rays manager...38-year-old is the youngest active manager in MLB, five months older than SD **Andy Green**.
- + Is the fifth manager in Rays history...is the sixth Tampa-born manager in ML history and second to manage the Rays...joins Hall of Famers Al
- Lopez and Tony La Russa, Lou Piniella, Dave Miley and John Hart.
- + Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, including parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10)...spent two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).

- + Batting .239/.321/.413 (11-for-46) with 2 HR and 6 RBI in 18 games (14 starts) with the Rays—with all of his RBI coming against the Orioles...has reached in 4 of his last 7 PA since Sun at BAL, breaking out of an 0-for-21 slump with the fourth opposite field homer of his career (per BB-Ref).
- Acquired from the Twins for a player to be named or cash considerations...hit .240 with 40 HR and 120 RBI in 251 career games with Minnesota.
- Had 34 HR in 723 at-bats over the 2013-14 seasons with the Twins, including a 20 HR season as a 23-year-old...since then, has 8 HR in 207 AB.
