RAY MATTER—After winning the first game of this 4-game series, the Rays have lost the last two to the A's in walkoff fashion...Rays had won their prev. 3 games...it's the eighth time the Rays have lost back-to-back games in walkoff style (including two times in 2015)...the Rays are 3-3 on this 9-game road trip (2-1 at Colorado and 1-2 here)...they are 4-3 in their last 7 games (2.91-ERA; 65.0-IP, 21-ER) following their worst-ever 3-24 stretch that sent them from 31-32 (5.5 GB) on June 16 to 34-56 (19.5 GB) on July 16.

WALKOFF LOSSES—Last night's loss was the Rays fourth walkoff loss of the season and their 17th over the past two seasons...only one other team has had as many over 2015-16: the Dodgers with 19...last night's walkoff HR by Ryon Healy was the ninth walkoff homer the Rays have surrendered since they last hit one: May 22, 2014 Sean Rodriguez off Oakland's Luke Gregerson...it was the 52nd walkoff HR the Rays have allowed and Alex Colome became the 36th Rays pitcher to allow one.

COLOME FALLS ONE SHY OF CLUB RECORD—Last night Rays All-Star RH Alex Colome suffered his first blown save after converting his first 21 save opportunities of 2016...it was the longest streak to begin the season and one game shy of the Rays longest streak without a blown save (at any point of the season) since RH Fernando Rodney converted a club-record 22 straight from May 27–Aug 13, 2012.

WHAT WERE THE CHANCES?—Prior to surrendering game-tying and game-winning 9th inning home runs last night to right-handed hitters Jake Smolinski and Ryon Healy, RH Alex Colome had allowed only 1 HR to 207 right-handed hitters faced dating back to June 16, 2015...Alex became just the fifth Rays pitcher during the "Rays era" (since 2008) to give up 2 HR in the 9th inning, first since RH Kyle Farnsworth on Sep 10, 2011 vs. BOS...on April 4, 2003, Alex's uncle Jesus allowed 3 9th-inning HR vs. NYY at Tropicana Field.

QUALITY STARTS STREAK IS SEASON'S LONGEST—The Rays have had quality starts in each of their last 5 games, their longest such streak in 2016... over those 5 games, Rays starters are 3-0 with a 1.67 ERA (33-IP, 20-H, 6-ER) and a .174 (20-for-115) opp avg. ...in this series, Rays starters have worked 21 innings and allowed 4 runs (all earned).

SINCE THE ALL-STAR BREAK—The Rays are 4-5 since the All-Star break...their 41 runs are tied for third most in the majors...the Rays ranked 26th in runs scored in the first half...the Rays are batting .364 (24-66) with RISP after hitting .232 (139-599) in the first half...Evan Longoria's 7 XBH lead the AL...Tim Beckham's .529 (9-for-17) avg. is 3rd in the majors behind CIN Joey Votto (.538, 14-for-26) and HOU Jose Altuve (.531, 17-for-32)...Rays starting pitchers have had 7 quality starts...they had only 7 quality starts in the final 24 games of the first half...the Rays have pitched to a 2.93 ERA (83.0-IP, 27-ER) incl. a 2.91 ERA (58.2-IP, 19-ER) by starters.

RAYS vs. A's—Last night was ninth walkoff loss the Rays have suffered here, tied with Kansas City and Cleveland for their most in a ballpark outside the AL East...the Rays have 5 walkoff losses here in the past 5 years... Ryon Healy hit the A's fourth walkoff HR vs. the Rays, first since Billy Mc-Millon hit one off Danys Baez on Aug 29, 2004...the A's win last night clinched the season series for the A's, as they lead 4 games to 2...it's their fourth season series win over the Rays in the last 6 seasons...this is the Rays 25th trip here, and this will be the 20th time they have come away without winning the series...they are 17-20 at Oakland since becoming the Rays in 2008, but were 8-35 in their first 10 seasons.

UP NEXT, AT DODGERS.—The Rays finish this 9-game road trip with a 2-game series at Dodger Stadium, where they have never won...the Rays have played major league games in 41 parks; Dodger Stadium is the only one they haven't won a game in...Rays have never homered there...the Rays were swept in a 3-game set in their only appearance there from Aug 9-11, 2013 losing the final two games to RH **Zack Greinke** and LH **Clayton Kershaw**, both in front of a national TV audience...overall, Dodgers lead the all-time series 7 games to 4...the two teams split a 2-game series at Tropicana Field earlier this season, May 3-4.

<u>WEB GEMS</u>—In the past 12 games, the Rays have made only six errors and none of them have made by an infielder...their outfielders have made 5 errors: **Brandon Guyer** (2), **Steven Souza Jr.** (1), **Kevin Kiermaier** (1) and **Corey Dickerson** (1)...the other was by catcher **Luke Maile**...Rays catch-

ers have caught 6 of their last 16 (37.5 pct.) would-be stealers compared to 12 of 61 (19.6 pct.) prior to that.

THE COMPETITION—After today, 54 of the Rays final 64 games of the season are against teams currently over .500...the Rays are 15-11 this season vs. teams currently under .500, compared to 23-48 (.328) vs. teams currently at .500 or better...their 71 games vs. teams .500 or better are the most in the majors.

GRIFFEY, PIAZZA, MAKE 13—Today in Cooperstown, Ken Griffey Jr. and Mike Piazza will be inducted into the Hall of Fame and thus become the 12th and 13th Hall of Famers to have played against the Rays...join Cal Ripken Jr., Randy Johnson, Greg Maddux, John Smoltz, Frank Thomas, Paul Molitor, Pedro Martinez, Roberto Alomar, Tom Glavine, Craig Biggio and Rickey Henderson...the list doesn't include the only Hall of Famer to play for the Rays—Wade Boggs...he never played against them.

COVERING GROUND—The Rays 2015 Platinum and Gold Glove winner Kevin Kiermaier returned from disabled immediately following the All Star break and since then has 7 more putouts than any other center fielder... Kiermaier was second among major league center fielders in putouts last season...he had a club-record 410, trailing only LAA Mike Trout (428).

<u>SNELL HOPING TO JOIN ARROJO</u>—Today, LH **Blake Snell** will attempt to become the Rays first rookie starter to win at Oakland since 1998 when **Rolando Arrojo** (the first rookie to start a game for the franchise) beat the A's twice here: 7-2 on May 26 and 5-2 on Sep 4.

EVAN ALMIGHTY—**Evan Longoria** reached 50 extra-base hits on Wednesday, one of only 5 in the AL to reach that plateau so far...only one other player in Rays history has had 50 extra-base hits after 97 games: **Aubrey Huff** (51 in 2003)...Longo is on pace for 178 hits, 83 extra base hits, 37 home runs and 92 RBI...only 4 third basemen have ever reached those levels in one season: **Alex Rodriguez** (2007), **Chipper Jones** (2009), **Miguel Cabrera** (2012) and **Josh Donaldson** (2015).

+ Longoria's .979 fielding pct. is the best among AL 3B and would break his own club record for a 3B (.976, 2015).

NEWS OF THE INFIRMED—2015 American League save leader RH Brad Boxberger (left oblique injury) made his third rehab app last night for Class-A Charlotte vs. Brevard County (Brewers)...his line: 1-IP, 2-H, 1-R/ER, 0-BB, 1-SO)...RH Chase Whitley (Tommy John surgery) will make his second rehab app tomorrow for Charlotte vs. Brevard County, and is scheduled for 2 innings...RH Alex Cobb (Tommy John surgery) threw 35 pitches in a 2-inning simulated game yesterday at Charlotte Sports Park.

MILLER ON COURSE FOR CLUB RECORDS—With a career-high 15 HR, SS Brad Miller needs one more to shatter the Rays team record for most homers by a shortstop, a mark held by Asdrubal Cabrera in 2015 and Julio Lugo in 2003...according to Baseball Reference, since 1901 only five left-handed hitting shortstops have hit more than 15 HR in a season including LAD Corey Seager (17 this season)...the others: DET Dick McAuliffe (24 in 1964 and 23 in 1966), SF Brandon Crawford (21 in 2015), ARI Stephen Drew (21 in 2008) and Hall of Famer PIT Arky Vaughan (19 in 1935).

THIS DATE IN RAYS HISTORY—July 24, 2003...Everyone in the Rays lineup gets at least one hit and scores at least one run...they total 21 hits in a 15-9 win at Fenway Park...RF Damian Rolls and 3B Antonio Perez each finish with 5 RBI and RH Victor Zambrano gets the win despite giving up four home runs in 6.2 innings.

RAYS AND INTERLEAGUE—The Rays resume interleague play after tomorrow's off day when they visit Dodger Stadium...the Rays are 6-9 in interleague and must go at least 4-1 in their final 5 games IL games (also 3 vs. SD) to avoid their first losing IL season since 2010 (7-11)...the Rays are 5-3 in NL parks: 1-1 at MIA, 2-1 at ARI and 2-1 at COL.

<u>PINE TAR ANNIVERSARY</u>—July 25, 1983...George Brett's 9th-inning homer putting the Royals ahead is disallowed when the umpires rule the third baseman used too much pine tar on his bat... American League president Lee MacPhail will overrule the decision, and on August 18 the game resumes with the Royals beating the Yankees, 4-3.

- + LAST START—On Tuesday at Coors Field, turned in the best start of his young career after a two-hour rain delay to start the game...over 6 scoreless innings, his only hit allowed was a leadoff single by Charlie Blackmon in the 4th...logged a career-high 9 SO, including Nolan Arenado twice...in his first career plate apps, went 0-for-2 with a walk off Tyler Chatwood...was helped by the Rays 5-run rally in the 3rd.
 - + Became the second visiting rookie in Coors Field history to pitch 6 or more scoreless innings, allowing one hit or fewer, joining SD Oliver Perez on July 7, 2002 (6.2-IP, 1-H).
 - + His 9 SO matched the 2nd most ever by a visiting rookie at Coors Field...Perez had 13 SO in the aforementioned game, and SD Cory Luebke also had 9 SO on Sep 11, 2011.
 - + Relied on his curveball less in the high altitude, throwing only 8 total (8.3 pct.)...had thrown 16.8 pct. curveballs over his first 6 starts.
- + BALLS & STRIKES—A comparison of his last 2 starts vs. his first 5 starts, as well as the major league average:

- + NO HOMERS CLUB—The homer by DET Ian Kinsler on July 2 remains his only one allowed in 37.2 IP...didn't allow one in his first 4 starts, which was the 2nd-longest streak to start a player's career in club history...only one longer was James Shields, who didn't allow one in his first 6 starts...that streak of 4 straight starts without a homer remains the longest by a Rays starting pitcher at any point this season.
- + FREEBIES—Five of his 18 runs allowed have been unearned, all coming through the first 3 games of his career—the most a Rays starter ever allowed in his first 3 games...his defense has made 8 errors behind him through his 37.2 innings...in comparison, LAD Clayton Kershaw went 40 starts before allowing his first unearned run and didn't allow his fifth unearned run until his 72nd start.

- + JERSEY NUMBER—Wears No. 4, the first pitcher in Rays history to don a single digit...previous lowest was Hideo Nomo, who wore No. 11 in 2005...recent single-digit numbers worn by pitchers include COL Adam Ottavino (No. 0), TOR Marcus Stroman (No. 6), LAD Julio Urias (No. 7) and STL Mike Leake (No. 8)...according to the Tampa Bay Times, No. 4 has been his favorite since he started playing youth sports...wore No. 11 in the minors because he knew it was customary for pitchers to wear double digits, but that was taken by Logan Forsythe.
- + WITH DURHAM—Went 3-5 with a 3.29 ERA (63-IP, 23-ER) in 12 starts...at the time of his recall, his 90 SO led the IL and ranked 2nd in the minors...also led the IL with 12.9 SO/9 IP.
- + PRIZED PROSPECT—Entered the season rated as the Rays No. 1 prospect by Baseball America, the No. 12 overall prospect in baseball and the No. 2 LHP prospect in the game behind LAD Julio Urias.
- + BANNER YEAR—Went a combined 15-4 with a 1.41 ERA and 163 SO across three levels in 2015, becoming the ninth player (fifth pitcher) to win both Baseball America and USA Today Minor League Player of the Year honors...the previous eight players: CHC Kris Bryant (2014), KC Wil Myers (2012), TB Jeremy Hellickson (2010), ATL Jason Heyward (2009), COL Jeff Francis (2004), FLA Josh Beckett (2001), STL Rick Ankiel (1999) and ATL Andruw Jones (1996 and 1995).
- + BEST IN A DECADE—His 1.41 ERA was the lowest of any full-season pitcher since Tigers RH Justin Verlander's 1.29 mark in 2005...he also led all minor league pitchers with a .182 opp avg. and ranked 4th in wins and strikeouts...he combined to strike out 31.3 pct. of all BF.

He just looks like a 12-year-old throwing 98 miles per hour out there, locating all of his pitches. He's a lot to be excited about. . . . There's not a pitch he throws that is not a high quality pitch. But you do take into consideration that every hitter walks back and says, 'Man, that gets on you quick.' "

TUESDAY'S STARTER—RH CHRIS ARCHER (5-13, 4.60)

- + LAST START—On Wed at COL, earned an 11-3 win over Jorge de la Rosa in his first career start against the Rockies...broke his streak of losing 6 straight decisions (spanning 7 starts), one shy of his career long...it was his first win since June 6 at ARI...totaled 6 IP, 4 H, 2 R/ER, 2 BB, 11 SO, 105 pit, 67 str...both runs scored in the 2nd inning, on a sac bunt and a sac fly...at the plate, went 0-for-2 with his first career walk.
- + STRIKEOUTS—Leads the AL with 147 strikeouts, ahead of David Price (145) and Justin Verlander (139)...Wed at COL was his fifth double-digit strikeout game this season, 2nd in the AL to Price (7)...set the club record with 252 last season and is on pace for 243 this year... for reference, only three active pitchers have reached 250 SO twice:
- Max Scherzer, Justin Verlander and Tim Lincecum.
- + LOSSES—Leads the majors with 13 losses, already matching his career high (2015)...is on pace for 21 losses, which would break Tanyon Sturtze's club record (18 in 2002) and would be the first 20-loss season by any pitcher since DET Mike Maroth in 2003 (21).
- + INTERLEAGUE—Has made 12 career interleague apps (all starts) and gone 4-5 with a 3.18 ERA (70.2-IP, 25-ER)...is 4-1 in 6 interleague starts since the beginning of 2015.
 - + Is 0-for-18 in his career at the plate (9-SO, 1-BB, 0 sac bunts).
 - + Has never faced the Dodgers.

#16 KEVIN CASH, MANAGER

- + Has been ejected 4 times as manager, once this year (April 29 vs. TOR).
- + Recorded 100 career wins faster than any manager in club history on May 20 at DET...was the youngest to do it since CLE **Eric Wedge** in 2004.
- Marks his second season as Rays manager...38-year-old is the youngest active manager in MLB. five months older than SD Andy Green.
- Is the fifth manager in Rays history...is the sixth Tampa-born manager in ML history and second to manage the Rays...joins Hall of Famers AI
- Lopez and Tony La Russa, Lou Piniella, Dave Miley and John Hart.
 Played 12 professional seasons as a catcher, including parts of eight seasons in the majors (2002-10)...spent two years (2005-06) in the Rays org.
- + Played in the 1989 Little League World Series (Tampa Northside LL), 1999 College World Series (Florida State) and earned World Series rings in 2007 (Red Sox) and 2009 (Yankees).

- Left yesterday's game with a mild right elbow strain...had his first multi-hit game since June 30 vs. DET and first double since June 27 vs. BOS.
- Batting .265/.339/.449 (13-for-49) with 3 2B, 2 HR and 7 RBI in 19 games (15 starts) with the Rays...has reached base in 6 of his last 10 PA.
- On July 17 vs. BAL, broke out of an 0-for-21 slump with the fourth opposite field homer of his career, second this season per Baseball Reference.
- Acquired from the Twins for a player to be named or cash considerations...hit .240 with 40 HR and 120 RBI in 251 career games with Minnesota.
- Had 34 HR in 723 at-bats over the 2013-14 seasons with the Twins, including a 20 HR season as a 23-year-old...since then, has 8 HR in 207 AB.

+ Batting .529/.556/.882 (9-for-17) with 1 2B, 1 3B, 1 HR and 4 RBI during his 4-game hitting streak...this comes on the heels of an 0-for-16 slump.

- His 6th-inning pop out on Thu at OAK snapped streaks of hits in 8 straight at-bats and reaching in 9 straight PA, both tying club records...his 8 consecutive hits tied Ty Wiggington (2007) and Aubrey Huff (2004) and his reaching in 9 PA tied Logan Forsythe (2015) and Melvin Upton Jr. (2011).
- Ten of his 11 RBI this season have come on the road; hasn't had an RBI at Tropicana Field since his April 6 vs. TOR...had an RBI in 3 straight games from Mon at COL-Thu at OAK, second time in his career doing that...on Thu at OAK had his fourth homer, all on the road, first since June 6.
- Has played in 39 games with 30 starts (14-SS, 12-2B, 2-3B, 1-1B, 1-DH) in two stints with the Rays...tied the club record on Wed at COL with 5 hits (9th time, last Mikie Mahtook on Sep 18, 2015 vs. BAL)...was the first Ray to do it in a road game since Matt Joyce on June 29, 2014 at BAL.
