OAKLAND ATHLETICS (45-54) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (57-42)

MONDAY, JULY 25, 2016 — GLOBE LIFE PARK — 7:05 P.M. CDT RHP DANIEL MENGDEN (1-5, 5.52) VS. LHP MARTIN PEREZ (7-7, 4.37) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight and are now 7-3 since the All-Star Break, which is tied with Colorado for the best record in the majors... went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 17-13 (.567) since then...are 45-54 (.455) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 35 days in fourth, 13 days tied for fourth and 23 days in fifth.

CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's last three games have been decided in the last at bat, all wins...are now 12-9 in games decided in the last at bat and the wins are tied for second most in the American League (Houston, 13)...have won three consecutive games by one run for the first time over the last three years...nine of the A's last 13 games have been decided by one run and Oakland is 7-2 in those games...are 16-15 (.517) in one-run games for the season and rank fourth in the American League in one-run games (31)...have won each of their last two extra inning games and are 4-3 in extra innings for the season...the Oakland record for fewest extra inning games in a non-strike season is nine in 1974 and 1975...had three walk-off wins over a five-game stretch from July 19-23 and are 6-5 in walk-off games...have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied with Texas for second most in the AL (Kansas City, 7).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's are scheduled to face a left-handed starting pitcher for the third consecutive game and sixth time in the last nine games today...have lost 10 of their last 13 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher and have won 13 of the last 17 games when the opponent starts a right-hander...are 12-15 (.444) in games started by a lefty compared to 33-39 (.458) against righties...the mark against lefties is tied for third worst in the American League.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed at least 7.2 innings in each of the last three games (4 er in 24.2 ip, 1.46 ERA) but have just one win and two no decisions over that span...are now 3-2 with a 4.40 ERA (28 er in 57.1 ip) and .271 (60-for-222) opponents batting average in 10 games since the All-Star Break...are 27-41 with a 4.93 ERA (295 er in 538.1 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in highest ERA, tied for second in most losses and fewest home runs (72), third in fewest wins and fourth in fewest innings pitched...on Saturday, Kendall Graveman tossed the A's first complete game since Aug. 7, 2015 (Gray vs. Houston)...it snapped a streak of 148 consecutive games without a complete game, which was the second longest such streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.33 ERA (42 er in 113.2 ip) over the last 12 games but have a 4.61 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.267) and have issued the fourth most walks (311).

OFFENSE: The A's are 37-for-173 (.214) with 11 runs scored over the last five games...are batting .234 (159-for-679) in July, which is the second lowest batting average in the American League (Tampa Bay, .232)...are tied for the third fewest home runs (18)...for the season, the A's have the lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.305), the second fewest walks (252) and strikeouts (668), the second lowest slugging percentage (.398) and the fourth lowest batting average (.251).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone four straight games without an error, which follows a season-high streak of seven consecutive games with an error, which followed an Athletics record streak of 15 consecutive games without an error...have 64 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League...rank fourth in double plays (99)...A's outfielders have 11 assists, which is second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 10).

SERIES NOTES: The A's won three of four from Tampa Bay to close out the last homestand and have now won three consecutive series for the first time since 2014 when they won their first three after the All-Star Break (July 18-27)...have won the first game in 10 of the last 12 series but have lost the final game in 10 of the last 12 series...for the season, are 19-13 in the first game of a series compared to 10-22 in the final game of a series.

DESIGNATED HITTERS: Billy Butler's game-winning home run in the eighth inning yesterday was just the second home run by an A's designated

hitter over the last 49 game and the first since June 17 against Los Angeles-AL (Khris Davis)...A's designated hitters have nine home runs for the season, which is tied with Texas for the fewest in the American League... rank last in the AL in RBI (35) and are batting .204 (70-for-343), which is second lowest to Houston (.190).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin the first post-break road trip tonight, an 11-day, nine-game trip to Texas (three games), Cleveland (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (1-2) and Houston (2-2) and are 21-25 (.457) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 9-5 since then...went 7-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (3-1) but are 24-29 (.453) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...are batting .259 (419-for-1619) on the road compared to .243 (427-for-1757) at home...have the fourth highest road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home batting average...have a 5.28 ERA (234 er in 398.2 ip) on the road compared to 4.06 (218 er in 483.0 ip)...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.89).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 5 for their last 16 (.313) with a walk and seven RBI...are batting .227 (17-for-75) with two doubles, a triple, two home runs and 13 RBI for the season...rank second in the American League in hits, RBI and plate appearances (77) and tied for second in extra base hits (5).

THIS AND THAT: The A's played 2:21 yesterday and after playing 2:22 on Saturday, marking the first time they have played consecutive games in two hours and 22 minutes or less since Aug. 18-19, 2011 against Toronto... are hitting .338 (52-for-154) with runners in scoring position since June 27 and are batting .275 with RISP for the season, which ranks fourth in the AL...have scored 22 of their 37 runs since the All-Star Break with two outs (59.5%)...are 29-31 (.483) in night games compared to 16-23 (.410) during the day.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 21 times, which marks the sixth time in the last 10 years they have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 21 players have combined to miss 954 games (45.4 games per stint)...currently have 12 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard, Triggs)...today is the 21st day the A's have had at least 12 players on the DL...prior to this year, have never had more than 11 players on the DL at one time...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series 4-3 with all seven games coming in Oakland...will return to Arlington in three weeks and will be in Houston two weeks after that...the A's have won three of the previous four season series and are 44-39 against Texas over the last five years...are 336-346 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 177-167 in Oakland and 159-179 in Texas...are 92-91 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 433-428 against the Rangers/Senators

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .426 with runners in scoring position...Khris Davis had a RBI double in the first inning yesterday to give the A's the lead and he is tied for ninth in the American League in go-ahead RBI (17)...Marcus Semien ranks second among ML shortstops in home runs (20) and fourth among AL shortstops in RBI (48)... Jake Smolinski has a career-high tying seven-game hitting streak (11-for-23, .478).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1930** the A's have two triple steals in the same game...Al Simmons, Bing Miller and Dib Williams turn the trick in the first inning and Mickey Cochrane, Simmons and Jimmie Foxx steal together in the fourth inning...in **1936** Frankie Hayes ties a major league record with four doubles in a game against Cleveland...in **1996** Mark McGwire hits a 488 foot home run into the fifth deck at SkyDome...at the time it was the longest home run in the majors since all home runs have been measured starting in 1992.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Daniel Mengden (1-5, 5.52 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville June 11 and is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season and his career...the nine starts rank fifth among American League rookies...made his Major League debut June 11 at Cincinnati after just 43 minor league appearances, including 34 starts, in three professional seasons...had not pitched above Single-A prior to this year...became the 46th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut (Overton became the 47th)...is the first of those to take the loss since Brett Anderson on April 10, 2009 against Seattle.

LAST FOUR, FIRST FOUR: Is 0-2 with a 9.33 ERA (19 er in 18.1 ip) and .312 (24-for-77) opponents batting average in his four starts in July after going 1-3 with a 2.81 ERA and .221 opponents batting average in his four starts in June.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-0 with an 8.04 ERA (14 er in 15.2 ip) in three starts at night compared to 0-5 with a 4.13 ERA (13 er in 28.1 ip) in five starts during the day...is tied for second in the American League in day losses (Quintana, CWS 6).

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-2 with a 4.56 ERA (12 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts on four days rest compared to 0-3 with a 6.64 ERA (15 er in 20.1 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.69 ERA (3 er in 16.0 ip) in innings one and two, a 5.87 ERA (10 er in 15.1 ip) in innings three and four and a 9.95 ERA (14 er in 12.2 ip) from the fifth inning on.

STRIKEOUTS: Has 44 strikeouts in 44.0 innings over the first eight starts of his career (9.00 per nine innings)...since 1913, his 44 strikeouts are tied for fourth most by an A's pitcher over the first seven games of his career... they are the most since Sonny Gray also had 44 in 2013.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has a .185 (12-for-65) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .279 (17-for-61) the second time and .348 (16-for-46) after that...opponents are batting .184 (9-for-49) with two outs, including .133 (2-for-15) with runners in scoring position and two outs...has allowed a .282 (11-for-39) average with RISP overall...the opponents number five hitter is 1-for-20 (.050) and the three hitter is 4-for-22 (.182)...however, the seven through nine hitters are batting a combined .392 (20-for-51)...three of the four home runs he has allowed have come with runners on base.

AL AND NL: Has made four of his first eight career starts against National League teams...is 1-3 with a 4.01 ERA (11 er in 24.2 ip) in four starts in interleague play compared to 0-2 with a 7.45 ERA (16 er in 19.1 ip) in four starts against American League teams.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 1-1 with a 5.00 ERA (10 er in 18.0 ip) in three starts on the road compared to 0-4 with a 5.88 ERA (17 er in 26.0 ip) in five starts at home...the four-game home losing streak is tied for the third longest career-opening home losing streak in Oakland history...the longest is five by Steve Ontiveros (1985-86) and Dallas Braden (2007).

THIS AND THAT: Received eight runs of support in his lone win on June 27 at San Francisco...has a total of 11 runs of support in his other seven starts (36.1 ip, 2.72 RSA)...is the eighth starting pitcher in Oakland history to allow to allow three runs or fewer in each of his first four starts, the first since A.J. Griffin in 2012...was charged with the loss in each of his first three starts to join Brad Rigby (1997) and Mike Morgan (1978) as the only three pitchers in Oakland history to lose each of the first three games of their career...is just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1913 to lose each of his first three career games while allowing three runs or fewer in each game...the others are Duane Pillette (1949 Yankees), Jim McAndrew (1968 Mets) and Kyle Drabek (2010 Blue Jays)...allowed four runs or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of his first five career starts... since 1913, the only other Major League pitcher to do that and lose at least four of those games is Tony Armas, who went 0-4 with a 2.97 ERA over his first five career starts with Montreal from Aug. 16, 1999-May 30, 2000.

2016 START-BY-START: He was the losing pitcher in his Major League debut, a 2-1 A's loss at Cincinnati *June 11*...at the age of 23 years, 113 days, he became the youngest A's pitcher to start a game since Trevor Cahill on June 19, 2011 (23 years, 110 days)...struck out the first batter he faced (Cozart)...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to Texas *June 16* in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on a hit and a walk over the first six innings and had retired 15 straight when he allowed a leadoff home run to Desmond in the seventh...lost his third consecutive start in the A's 4-2 loss to Milwaukee *June 22* in Oakland...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the fifth inning...picked up his first Major League win in the A's 8-3 victory at San Francisco *June 27*...retired each of the first 13 batters and shutout the Giants on two hits and a walk over the first seven innings...had an 8-0 lead when he allowed his only two runs in the eighth inning...was

the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss to Pittsburgh *July 3* in Oakland...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed a RBI triple to Frazier and a RBI single to Kratz in the sixth inning for the loss...had his first career no decision in the A's 10-9 loss at Houston *July 8*...had a 3-2 lead when he allowed four runs in the fifth inning...had a no decision in the A's 8-7 win over Toronto *July 15* in Oakland...left after 3.1 innings trailing 7-3 but the A's came back to score five unanswered runs.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-0 loss to Houston last Wednesday in Oakland...allowed a run to score on a fielders choice in the first inning and then surrendered two more runs in the second on a Springer RBI double and a Correa bases loaded walk...did not allow a run over his final three innings...Fister and Devenski combined to shutout the A's on four hits and two walks.

RHP Sonny Gray (4-9, 5.49 ERA): Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 5 and is 1-4 with a 4.86 ERA in nine starts since his return... has a 5.49 ERA overall, which is second highest in the majors (Locke, PIT 5.54)...is 1-8 with a 6.45 ERA and .299 opponents batting average over his last 14 starts after going 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA and .232 opponents batting average over his first four starts...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-3 loss to Tampa Bay last Thursday in Oakland (5.0 ip, 9 h, r, 7 er, 6 so)... the loss was his ninth of the season, which is tied for sixth in the AL and is one short of his career high of 10 in 2014...is 7-3 with a 2.36 ERA (76.1 ip, 62 h, 21 r, 20 er, 24 bb, 64 so, 5 hr) in 11 career starts against Texas...the wins are his most against any team...is 5-0 with a 0.96 ERA in five starts in Texas...had a no decision in his only start this year, a 7-5 A's loss in Oakland on June 15 (6.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 3 so).
