OAKLAND ATHLETICS (45-55) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (58-42)

ABOUT THE A'S: Had their three-game winning streak snapped last night and are now 7-4 since the All-Star Break, which is tied for the second best record in the American League (Los Angeles, 7-3)...are 10-11 in July... went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 17-14 (.548) since then...are 45-55 (.450) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 36 days in fourth, 13 days tied for fourth and 23 days in fifth.

CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's last three road losses and four of the last six have been walk-off losses...three of the A's last four home wins have been walk-off wins...the A's are 6-6 in walk-off games and the 12 walk-off games are tied with Houston, Los Angeles (NL) and Texas for the most in the majors...each of the A's last four games have been decided in the last at bat and the A's are 3-1 in those games...are 12-10 in games decided in the last at bat for the season...the wins and games (22) are tied for third most in the American League...each of the A's last four games and 10 of the last 14 have been decided by one-run...the A's are 7-3 in those 10 games and are 16-16 (.500) for the season...rank fourth in the AL in one-run games (32)...the loss last night was the A's fourth when leading after eighth innings, which is tied for the most in the AL (Seattle and Texas) ... have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied for third most in the AL...have won each of their last two extra inning games and are 4-3 in extra innings for the season...the Oakland record for fewest extra inning games in a non-strike season is nine in 1974 and 1975.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 3-2 with a 4.65 ERA (32 er in 62.0 ip) in 11 games since the All-Star Break...are 27-41 with a 4.96 ERA (299 er in 543.0 ip) for the season...rank second in the American League in highest ERA, tied for second in most losses and third in fewest wins and home runs (73)...last Saturday, Kendall Graveman tossed the A's first complete game since Aug. 7, 2015 (Gray vs. Houston)...it snapped a streak of 148 consecutive games without a complete game, which was the second longest such streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.60 ERA (49 er in 122.1 ip) over the last 13 games but have a 4.64 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.267) and slugging percentage (.428).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .233 (49-for-210) with 17 runs scored over their last six games (2.8 runs per game)...have drawn two walks in each of those games, which is the A's longest streak of consecutive games with two walks or fewer since a seven-game streak from April 8-15, 2006... have 254 walks for the season, which is second fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...are on pace to draw 411 walks, which would break the Oakland record for fewest walks in a season (433 in 1978)...have the lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.306), the second fewest strikeouts (673) and the third lowest slugging percentage (.399).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone five straight games without an error, which follows a season-high streak of seven consecutive games with an error, which followed an Athletics record streak of 15 consecutive games without an error...have 64 errors for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...A's outfielders have 11 assists, which is second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 10).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on their first post-break road trip, an 11-day, nine-game trip to Texas (0-1), Cleveland (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (1-2) and Houston (2-2) and are 21-26 (.447) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 9-6 since then...went 7-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (3-1) but are 24-29 (.453) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...are batting .260 (431-for-1656) on the road compared to .243 (427-for-1757) at home... have the fourth highest road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home batting average...have a 5.32 ERA (241 er in 407.1 ip) on the road

compared to 4.06 (218 er in 483.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.87).

SERIES NOTES: The A's won three of four from Tampa Bay to close out the last homestand and have now won three consecutive series for the first time since 2014 when they won their first three after the All-Star Break (July 18-27)...have won the first game in 10 of the last 13 series but have lost the final game in 10 of the last 12 series...for the season, are 19-14 in the first game of a series compared to 10-22 in the final game of a series.

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters are batting .210 (73-for-347) with nine home runs and 36 RBI...rank last in the American League in RBI, tied for last with Texas in home runs and have the second lowest batting average (Houston, .188)...the A's DH has homered just twice over the last 50 games (Butler on Sunday, Davis on June 17).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 5 for their last 16 (.313) with a walk and seven RBI...are batting .227 (17-for-75) with two doubles, a triple, two home runs and 13 RBI for the season...rank second in the American League in hits, RBI and plate appearances (77) and tied for second in extra base hits (5).

LEFT AND RIGHT: After facing a left-handed starting pitcher in three straight and six of the last nine games, the A's are scheduled to face a righty in the final two games of this series and all three games of the Cleveland series...have lost 11 of their last 14 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher and have won 13 of the last 17 games when the opponent starts a right-hander...are 12-16 (.429) in games started by a lefty compared to 33-39 (.458) against righties...the mark against lefties is second worst in the American League (Seattle, 13-20).

THIS AND THAT: The A's scored all seven of their runs yesterday with two outs...have now scored 29 of their 44 runs since the All-Star Break with two outs (65.9%)...are hitting .337 (56-for-166) with runners in scoring position since June 27 and are batting .276 with RISP for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...are 29-32 (.475) in night games compared to 16-23 (.410) during the day.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 21 times, which marks the sixth time in the last 10 years they have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 21 players have combined to miss 966 games (46.0 games per stint)...currently have 12 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard, Triggs)...today is the 22nd day the A's have had at least 12 players on the DL...prior to this year, have never had more than 11 players on the DL at one time...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RANGERS: The season series is even at four games each...the A's lost the first game in Texas last night after going 4-3 in two series in Oakland...will return to Arlington in three weeks and will be in Houston two weeks after that...the A's have won three of the previous four season series and are 44-40 against Texas over the last five years...are 336-347 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 177-167 in Oakland and 159-180 in Texas...are 92-92 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 433-429 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .426 with runners in scoring position...**Khris Davis** is 10-for-27 (.370) with 10 runs, five home runs and 16 RBI in eight games against Texas...**Marcus Semien** ranks second among ML shortstops in home runs (20) and fourth among AL shortstops in RBI (48).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1977** Vida Blue tosses a complete game four hitter in the A's 2-1 win over California...it is the 100th complete game of his career as he becomes the first and only Oakland Athletic to reach the century mark...in **1994** Stan Javier ties an Oakland record by collecting three doubles in the A's 6-0 win at California...Steve Ontiveros, Bob Welch and Bill Taylor combine on the three-hit shutout.

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 3.02 ERA (14 er in 41.2 ip) and .190 (29-for-153) opponents batting average since the All-Star Break...has a 4.15 ERA (160 er in 347.1 ip) for the season, which is fifth highest in the American League.
- Has tossed 347.1 innings, which is the most in the AL and third most in the majors.
- Has allowed 37-of-164 (22.6%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 21.8%).
- Has converted 28-of-41 (68.3%) save opportunities...the 28 saves rank fifth in the AL but the 13 blown saves are tied for third most.
- Ranks second in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (34), fourth in strikeouts (326), tied for fourth in wins (18) and fifth in opponents on-base percentage (.311)...is tied for second in wild pitches (22) and ranks fifth in most home runs (43).
- Ranks third in the AL in first batter strikeouts (78) and has the third lowest first batter slugging percentage (.336).

- Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville a week ago today for his fifth stint with the A's this year and has not allowed a run in two games and 3.1 innings since then.
- Has a .228 opponents batting average...that includes .188 (9-for-48) against right-handed hitters and .290 (9-for-31) against left-handers.
- Has a win in three games against the Rangers (3.2 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 so, 2 hr, 7.36 ERA).
- Was with Oakland for the first time for a one-day stint on May 10 and pitched that night at Boston...pitched twice during his second stint from May 22-25...logged a 4.50 ERA in seven outings during his third stint from June 4-21...pitched in three games during his most recent stint from June 30-July 3 and posted a 4.15 ERA.
- Had two scoreless outings with Nashville following his most recent option on July 4...has a .200 opponents batting average overall and has not allowed a home run...his complete 2016 minor league stats:

- Has allowed two runs in his last four games (4.1 ip, 4.15 ERA) to snap his career-high 11.1-inning scoreless streak, which was 0.1 innings short of the A's season high of 11.2 (Madson, April 17-May 16).
- Has allowed 3 of his last 4 (75.0%) inherited runners to score after stranding each of his first 36 inherited runners, which was the longest streak by any pitcher in the expansion era...has allowed 3-of-40 (7.5%) inherited runners to score for the season, which is the second best percentage in the American League (Brach, BAL 5.3%).
- Leads AL relievers in opponents on-base percentage (.198), ranks second in batting average (.152), third in innings (50.2), tied for eighth in wins (4) and tied for ninth in strikeouts (53).
- Leads AL rookies and is tied for fifth among all AL pitchers in games pitched (46).
- First batters faced are 4-for-44 (.091) with two walks (.130 on-base percentage)...the first batter on-base percentage is third lowest in the AL and the batting average is tied for third lowest.

- Is tied for fifth among American League relievers in saves (21)...however, is tied for the most blown saves in the majors (6).
- Has a 6.30 ERA (7 er in 10.0 ip) in July...his ERA has increased each month as he had a 1.42 ERA in April, 3.72 ERA in May and 4.22 ERA in June.
- Has a 1.65 ERA (3 er in 16.1 ip) in 17 games during the day, a 5.06 ERA (15 er in 26.2 ip) in 27 games at night.

- First batters faced are 12-for-39 (.308) with six walks (.400 on-base percentage)...the walks are tied for third most in the AL.

- Homered Sunday for the first time since June 7 and just the third time this year...his fewest home runs in a season is eight in 92 games during his rookie campaign of 2007.
- Is batting .316 (31-for-98) with three home runs and 19 RBI over his last 37 games (since May 28) after hitting .200 with no home runs and six RBI over his first 29 contests.
- Has started each of the A's 28 games against a left-handed starting pitcher...is hitting .317 (26-for-82) against left-handers compared to .221 (19-for-86) against right-handers...however, his home run Sunday was his first against a lefty.
- Is 5-for-19 (.263) with five RBI as a pinch hitter...ranks second among American League pinch hitters in hits and RBI and tied for second in plate appearances (19)...had five career pinch RBI entering the season.

Last Year: Batted .251 with 15 home runs and 65 RBI in 151 games in his first season with the A's...the batting average was 20 points below his previous career low of .271 in 2014...his .323 on-base percentage matched his career low from 2014.

4 COCO CRISP

- Was scratched from the starting lineup Sunday with neck soreness.
- Is 3-for-25 (.120) with four walks in six games since the All-Star Break.
- Is batting a Major League leading .426 with runners in scoring position...started the season 0-for-9 with RISP but is 23-for-45 (.511) since then.
- Is tied for fifth in the American League in reaching base on an error (6).
- Of his last 24 hits, 12 are for extra bases (eight doubles, two triples, two home runs).
- Had his eighth career regular season game-ending RBI Friday night against Tampa Bay, his sixth as an Athletic.
- Has not been hit by a pitch since May 9, 2011 (C.J. Wilson) and his streak of 599 consecutive games without being hit is the longest active streak in the majors and the longest by an Athletic since at least 1912.

Last Year: Was limited to just 44 games due to two stints on the DL and batted a career-low .175...also had the lowest on-base percentage (.252) and slugging percentage (.222) of his career and his games played were his fewest since 2002 (32).

2 CHRIS DAVIS

- Is batting .197 (13-for-66) with four home runs and 11 RBI over his last 17 games.
- Ranks seventh in the American League with 23 home runs...that is the second best total of his career and four shy of his career high of 27 from last year...has hit 17 as a left fielder, which is tied for second among Major League left fielders (Duvall, CIN 22)...14 have come at home, which match the most by an Athletic over the last four years...this is his third consecutive season with 20 or more home runs.
- Had a RBI double in the first inning Sunday to give the A's the lead and he is tied for ninth in the AL in go-ahead RBI (17).
- Is 10-for-27 (.370) with 10 runs, five home runs and 16 RBI in eight games against Texas...is a .355 (11-for-31) career hitter against the Rangers with six home runs and 17 RBI in nine games.
- Is hitting .287 (64-for-223) with 18 of his 23 home runs at night compared to .184 (23-for-125) during the day...is tied for second in the AL in night home runs and is third in RBI (51).
- Is tied for seventh in the AL in hit by pitches (7) and tied for ninth in sacrifice flies (4).
