OAKLAND ATHLETICS (46-55) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (58-43)

WEDNESDAY, JULY 27, 2016 — GLOBE LIFE PARK — 7:05 P.M. CDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (3-5, 4.61) VS. RHP YU DARVISH (2-2, 3.12) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four of the last five games and are now 8-4 since the All-Star Break, which is tied with New York for the second best record in the American League (Los Angeles, 8-3)...are 11-11 in July...went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 18-14 (.563) since then...are 46-55 (.455) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3... have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 37 days in fourth, 13 days tied for fourth and 23 days in fifth.

SERIES NOTES: The A's have split the first two games of this three-game series after winning each of their previous three series...have not won four straight series since May 9-22, 2014...have won the first game in 10 of the last 13 series but have lost the final game in 10 of the last 12 series...for the season, are 19-14 in the first game of a series compared to 10-22 in the final game of a series.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 3.56 ERA (52 er in 131.1 ip) over the last 14 games but have a 4.62 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...rank second in most wild pitches (49) and have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.266) and slugging percentage (.428).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-2 with a 4.63 ERA (35 er in 68.0 ip) in 12 games since the All-Star Break...are 28-41 with a 4.95 ERA (302 er in 549.0 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in highest ERA, fewest wins and fewest home runs (75) and fourth in most losses...last Saturday, Kendall Graveman tossed the A's first complete game since Aug. 7, 2015 (Gray vs. Houston)...it snapped a streak of 148 consecutive games without a complete game, which was the second longest such streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .252, which ranks ninth in the American League...however, have a .306 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the AL and fifth lowest in the majors...have drawn just 257 walks, which is second fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...are on pace to walk 412 times, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...rank second in the AL in fewest strike-outs (676) and have the third lowest slugging percentage (.401).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone six straight games without an error, which follows a season-high streak of seven consecutive games with an error, which followed an Athletics record streak of 15 consecutive games without an error...have 63 errors for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...A's outfielders have 12 assists, which is second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 10).

CLOSE CALLS: Each of the A's last three road losses and four of the last six have been walk-off losses...three of the A's last four home wins have been walk-off wins...the A's are 6-6 in walk-off games and the 12 walk-off games are tied with Cleveland, Houston, Los Angeles (NL) and Texas for the most in the majors...four of the A's last five games have been decided in the last at bat and the A's are 3-1 in those games...are 12-10 in games decided in the last at bat for the season...the wins and games (22) are tied for third most in the American League...four of the A's last five games and 10 of the last 15 have been decided by one-run...the A's are 7-3 in those 10 games and are 16-16 (.500) for the season...rank fourth in the AL in one-run games (32)...the loss Monday night was the A's fourth when leading after eight innings, which is tied for the most in the AL (Seattle and Texas)...

have six wins when trailing after seven innings, which is third most in the AL...have won each of their last two extra inning games and are 4-3 in extra innings for the season...the Oakland record for fewest extra inning games in a non-strike season is nine in 1974 and 1975.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-1 on their first post-break road trip, an 11-day, nine-game trip to Texas (1-1), Cleveland (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (1-2) and Houston (2-2) and are 22-26 (.458) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 9-6 since then...went 7-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (3-1) but are 24-29 (.453) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...are batting .261 (441-for-1691) on the road compared to .243 (427-for-1757) at home...

have the fourth highest road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home batting average...have a 5.27 ERA (244 er in 416.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.06 (218 er in 483.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.93).

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters are batting .209 (73-for-350) with nine home runs and 36 RBI...rank last in the American League in home runs and RBI and have the second lowest batting average (Houston, .186)...the A's DH has homered just twice over the last 51 games (Butler on Sunday, Davis on June 17).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 5 for their last 16 (.313) with a walk and seven RBI...are batting .227 (17-for-75) with two doubles, a triple, two home runs and 13 RBI for the season...rank second in the American League in hits and RBI and tied for second in plate appearances (77) and extra base hits (5).

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have won 14 of the last 18 games in which the opponent has started a right-handed pitcher but have lost 11 of the last 14 games when they start a left-hander...are 12-16 (.429) in games started by a lefty compared to 34-39 (.466) against righties...the mark against lefties is second worst in the American League (Seattle, 14-20).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have scored 31 of their 50 runs since the All-Star Break with two outs (62.0%)...are hitting .339 (58-for-171) with runners in scoring position since June 27 and are batting .277 with RISP for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...are 30-32 (.484) in night games compared to 16-23 (.410) during the day.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 21 times, which marks the sixth time in the last 10 years they have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 21 players have combined to miss 978 games (46.6 games per stint)...currently have 12 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard, Triggs)...today is the 23rd day the A's have had at least 12 players on the DL...prior to this year, have never had more than 11 players on the DL at one time...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's lead the season series, 5-4...have split the first two games in Texas after going 4-3 in two series in Oakland...will return to Arlington in three weeks and will be in Houston two weeks after that...the A's have won three of the previous four season series and are 45-40 against Texas over the last five years...are 337-347 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 177-167 in Oakland and 160-180 in Texas...are 93-92 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 434-429 against the Rangers/Senators franchise.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .436 with runners in scoring position...*Khris Davis* is 10-for-27 (.370) with 10 runs, five home runs and 16 RBI in eight games against Texas...*Liam Hendriks* has an 8.2 inning scoreless streak and has a 1.40 ERA (3 er in 19.1 ip) since being reinstated from the disabled list June 19...*Josh Reddick* hit his 13th career home run against Texas last night, which are his most against any team...*Marcus Semien* hit his 21st home run last night, which is the most by an A's shortstop since Bobby Crosby had 22 in 2004...ranks second among ML shortstops in home runs and fourth among AL shortstops in RBI (49).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1956** Hector Lopez and Vic Power have five hits each but the A's lose 10-9 to New York in 14 innings...in **1996** Geronimo Berroa and Matt Stairs homer in the A's 6-4 loss at Toronto...it is the 23rd consecutive game in which the A's hit a homer, a club record which ended the following day...in **2008** Brad Ziegler tosses 2.0 scoreless innings to extend his career opening scoreless streak to a Major League record 27.0 innings, breaking the previous mark of 25 set by George McQuillian of the 1907 Philadelphia Phillies...the streak would reach 39.0 innings before he allowed his first run.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (3-5, 4.61 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Has not allowed a run in three of his four starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 29...is 1-1 with a 2.35 ERA (8 er in 30.2 ip) and .228 (26-for-114) opponents batting average in five games total over that span...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA and .282 opponents batting average in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...made one start on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton June 24 against San Jose and had a no decision (3.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 eb, 3 so, 1 hr, 64 pitches)...was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is making his Major League debut.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Is tied for second among American League rookies in games started (13), ranks second in strikeouts (66), third in innings pitched (80.0) and tied for eighth in wins (3).

DON'T WALK: Has not walked a batter in his last three games, 20.0 innings and 79 batters faced...last walked a batter on July 5 at Minnesota (Grossman to lead off the fifth)...has walked just four batters in 30.2 innings (1.17 per nine innings) since he was reinstated from the DL June 29.

RUN SUPPORT: Tossed 8.0 shutout innings in his last start but had a no decision as he received no runs of support for the third time in his 13 starts...has two runs of support or fewer in nine of his 13 starts and seven runs or more in three of his starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .194 (12-for-62) batting average and four extra base hits (two doubles, two home runs)... right-handers are batting .279 (69-for-247) with nine of his 11 home runs and 16 of his 20 walks...has a .780 OPS against righties, .576 against lefties...opponents are batting .200 (14-for-70) with runners in scoring position...has a .208 (25-for-120) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .259 (29-for-112) the second time and .351 (27-for-77) after that...has held the opponents number three hitter to a .188 (6-for-32) batting average but the four and five hitters are a combined 29-for-71 (.408) with seven home runs and 16 RBI...opponents are 24-for-53 (.453) with six doubles, four home runs and 16 RBI when putting the first pitch in play.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-1 with a 2.76 ERA (10 er in 32.2 ip) in five starts on four days rest, 2-4 with a 6.17 ERA (29 er in 42.1 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 1-0 with a 3.54 ERA (11 er in 28.0 ip) in five starts against American League West competition compared to 2-5 with a 5.19 ERA (30 er in 52.0 ip) in nine games against all other teams.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.66 ERA (12 er in 40.2 ip) and .215 (32-for-149) opponents batting average over innings one through three and a 6.64 ERA (29 er in 39.1 ip) and .306 (49-for-160) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on.

HOME AND AWAY: Is scheduled to make just his fifth road start of the season, compared to 10 games (nine starts) at home...is 0-3 with a 7.89 ERA (19 er in 21.2 ip) and .311 (28-for-90) opponents average on the road, 3-2 with a 3.39 ERA (22 er in 58.1 ip) and .242 (53-for-219) opponents batting average at home...has surrendered six home runs in 21.2 innings on the road (2.49 per nine innings), five in 58.1 innings in Oakland (0.77 per nine innings).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-4 with a 5.19 ERA (29 er in 50.1 ip) in nine starts at night compared to 1-1 with a 3.64 ERA (12 er in 29.2 ip) in five games during the day...has surrendered two home runs in 29.2 innings during the day (0.61 per nine innings), nine in 50.1 innings at night (1.61 per nine innings).

2016 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 7-4 A's win over Houston April 29 in Oakland...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...issued a career-high four walks...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Seattle in Oakland on May 4...left with an 8-4 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford)... had the first decision of his career, a loss in the A's 13-5 loss at Boston May 10 ... yielded a career-high eight runs on a career-high 10 hits in a career-low 2.2 innings...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969)...picked up his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas May 16 in Oakland ... shutout the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first six innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to New York (AL) in Oakland on May 21...retired each of the first nine batters he faced before allowing the first four batters to reach base and score in the fourth inning...lost his second

consecutive start in the A's 4-1 loss to Detroit May 27 in Oakland...left after six innings trailing 3-0 as the A's were shutout on three hits over the first eight innings...picked up the second win of his career in the A's 5-1 win over Minnesota June 1 in Oakland ... struck out a career-high eight batters...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the sixth inning on an Escobar sacrifice fly...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-4 loss at Milwaukee June 7...surrendered a two-run home run to Carter in the second inning and a three-run home run to Carter in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 14-5 win over Texas on June 13 in Oakland...had a 10-2 lead when he left the game after 4.1 innings with a left pronator muscle strain... went on the DL the next day...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-1 victory over San Francisco June 29 in Oakland...did not allow a run in 5.2 innings for the first scoreless outing of his career...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-4 loss at Minnesota July 5...was trailing 3-1 when he yielded a two-run home run to Vargas a solo home run to Kepler on consecutive pitches in the fifth inning...had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss at Houston on July 10 ... tossed a career-high 106 pitches in 7.0 innings and did not allow a run or walk a batter...made his first career relief appearance in the A's 5-3 loss to Toronto July 17 in Oakland and had a no decision...entered the game to start the second inning in relief of Andrew Triggs, who left the game with a left shin contusion ... Triggs relieved Rich Hill who left after five pitchers with a blister...Manaea had been scheduled to start two days later...tossed 5.0 innings, which is a season-high for an A's reliever.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 1-0, 13-inning win over Tampa Bay last Friday in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings and allowed just five hits and no walks, but Odorizzi did the same for the Rays...retired each of the first 14 batters before Dickerson and Beckham had back-to-back singles in the fifth...Crisp won the game with a RBI single in the 13th.

FRIDAY'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Kendall Graveman (7-6, 4.15 ERA): Is 6-0 with a 3.25 ERA over his last 10 starts...the six-game winning streak doubles his previous career high, matches the longest by an A's pitcher this year (Hill) and is tied for the fifth longest active streak in the American League...is 4-0 with a 2.35 ERA and .214 opponents batting average in four starts in July...the four wins are tied for second in the AL and are his most ever in a month...was 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...has allowed just three home runs and issued 14 walks in 10 starts during the winning streak after allowing 10 home runs and walking 19 over his first nine starts...tossed his second career complete game in his last start, a nine-hitter in the A's 4-3 win over Tampa Bay last Saturday in Oakland (3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...it was his seventh win of the season, which is a new career high...is 0-1 with a 2.92 ERA (4 er in 12.1 ip) in two career starts against Cleveland, both last year.
