OAKLAND ATHLETICS (47-55) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (57-42)

FRIDAY, JULY 29, 2016 — PROGRESSIVE FIELD — 7:10 P.M. EDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (7-6, 4.15) VS. RHP TREVOR BAUER (7-4, 3.65) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight and five of the last six and are now 9-4 (.692) since the All-Star Break, which is tied with Los Angeles (AL) for the second best record in the majors (Colorado, 10-4)...went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 19-14 (.576) since then...are 12-11 in July...went 10-14 last July after posting a winning record in each of the previous three July's from 2012-14...are 47-55 (.461) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...are in fourth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 39 days in fourth, 13 days tied for fourth and 23 days in fifth.

SERIES NOTES: The A's won two of three at Texas to start the road trip and have now won each of their four series since the All-Star Break...it marks the first time the A's have won four consecutive series since May 9-22, 2014 when they also won four straight...have won the first game in 10 of the last 13 series but have lost the final game in 10 of the last 13 series...for the season, are 19-14 in the first game of a series compared to 11-22 in the final game of a series.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's scored four times in the eighth inning Wednesday to overcome a 3-2 deficit and defeat Texas 6-4...it marked the seventh time this year the A's won a game when trailing after seven innings, which is tied with Kansas City and Texas for the most in the majors...had just five such wins all last year...each of the A's last three road losses and four of the last six have been walk-off losses...three of the A's last four home wins have been walk-off wins...the A's are 6-6 in walk-off games and the 12 walk-off games are tied for the most in the majors...four of the A's last six games have been decided in the last at bat and the A's are 3-1 in those games... are 12-10 in games decided in the last at bat for the season...10 of the A's last 16 games have been decided by one run and they are 7-3 in those 10 games...are 16-16 (.500) for the season and rank fourth in the AL in one-run games (32)...have won each of their last two extra inning games and are 4-3 in extra innings for the season...the Oakland record for fewest extra inning games in a non-strike season is nine in 1974 and 1975.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has struck at least 10 batters in each of the last three games, which matches the longest such streak by an Athletics team since at least 1913 (13th time, last: June 1-4, 2016)...have 34 strikeouts in 26.2 innings over that span...have compiled a 3.59 ERA (56 er in 140.1 ip) over the last 15 games but have a 4.62 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...rank second in most wild pitches (50) and have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.267) and slugging percentage (.429).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-2 with a 4.58 ERA (38 er in 74.2 ip) in 13 games since the All-Star Break...are 28-41 with a 4.96 ERA (305 er in 555.2 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in highest ERA, fewest wins and fewest home runs (76), fourth in fewest innings pitched and tied for fourth in most losses...last Saturday, Kendall Graveman tossed the A's first complete game since Aug. 7, 2015 (Gray vs. Houston)...it snapped a streak of 148 consecutive games without a complete game, which was the second longest such streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .252, which ranks 10th in the American League...however, have a .306 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the AL and fifth lowest in the majors...have drawn just 257 walks, which is second fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...are on pace to walk 408 times, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...rank second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (685) and have the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.403).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone seven straight games without an error, which follows a season-high streak of seven consecutive games with an error, which followed an Athletics record streak of 15 consecutive games without an error...have committed 10 errors over the last 29 games after making 53 over the first 73 contests...A's outfielders have 12 assists, which is second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 10).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-1 on their first post-break road trip, an 11-day, nine-game trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (1-2) and Houston (2-2) and are 23-26 (.469) on the road...started the

year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 11-6 since then...went 7-3 on the last homestand but are 24-29 (.453) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...are batting .261 (450-for-1726) on the road compared to .243 (427-for-1757) at home...have the fourth highest road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home batting average...have a 5.25 ERA (248 er in 425.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.06 (218 er in 483.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.82).

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters are batting .215 (76-for-354) with 11 home runs and 39 RBI...have the fewest RBI in the American League, the second lowest batting average (Houston, .184) and are tied for the third fewest home runs...Khris Davis homered twice as the A's DH on Wednesday, matching the home run total for A's designated hitters over the previous 51 games.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have won 15 of the last 19 games in which the opponent has started a right-handed pitcher but have lost 11 of the last 14 games when they start a left-hander...are 12-16 (.429) in games started by a lefty compared to 35-39 (.473) against righties...the mark against lefties is second worst in the American League (Seattle, 14-20).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have scored 32 of their 56 runs since the All-Star Break with two outs (57.1%)...are hitting .333 (58-for-174) with runners in scoring position since June 27 and are batting .276 with RISP for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...are 31-32 (.492) in night games compared to 16-23 (.410) during the day...A's pinch hitters rank second in the AL in hits (17) and RBI (13) and tied for second in plate appearances (77) and extra base hits (5).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 21 times, which marks the sixth time in the last 10 years they have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 21 players have combined to miss 990 games (47.1 games per stint)...currently have 12 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard, Triggs)...today is the 25th day the A's have had at least 12 players on the DL...prior to this year, have never had more than 11 players on the DL at one time...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. INDIANS: This is the first meeting between the two clubs this year...the Indians are the only team the A's have not faced this year and Oakland has completed the season series with five teams (Detroit, Minnesota, New York, Tampa Bay, Toronto)...won the season series last year, 4-3...split four games in Oakland and won two of three in Cleveland... have won five of the last six games at Progressive Field...have won each of the last two season series and five of the last eight...are 31-22 against Cleveland dating back to 2009...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 268-232 against the Indians...that breaks down to 141-103 in Oakland and 127-129 in Cleveland...including 42-60 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 903-1025 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .436 with runners in scoring position...Khris Davis had his fourth multi-homer game of the season and the 10th of his career on Wednesday...has 25 home runs for the season, which is two short of his career high of 27 from last year...has 45 home runs and 108 RBI over his last 146 games dating back to Aug. 6, 2015...Liam Hendriks has an 8.2 inning scoreless streak and has a 1.40 ERA (3 er in 19.1 ip) since being reinstated from the disabled list June 19...Marcus Semien ranks second among ML shortstops in home runs (21) and fourth among AL shortstops in RBI (49).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1969 Reggie Jackson becomes the first Oakland Athletic to hit 40 home runs when he hits a solo shot in the first inning of the A's 6-5 win against the New York Yankees...a young rookie named Vida Blue recorded his first major league win in that game...in 1989 Rickey Henderson steals five bases but the A's lose 14-6 to Seattle...in 1992 Dennis Eckersley saves his 33rd consecutive game to set what was then a ML record with 36 consecutive saves dating back to 1991...he would save 36 straight to start the season for a total of 40 consecutive saves.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (7-6, 4.15 ERA)

SIX-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 6-0 with a 3.25 ERA (23 er in 63.2 ip) over his last 10 starts...the six-game winning streak doubles his previous career high (3, June 24-July 4, 2015), matches the longest by an A's pitcher this year (Hill) and is tied for the fifth longest active streak in the American League...was 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...has allowed just three home runs (0.42 per nine innings) and issued 14 walks (1.98 per nine innings) during the winning streak after allowing 10 home runs (1.91 per nine innings) and walking 19 (3.64 per nine innings) over his first nine starts.

CAREER NOTES: Picked up his seventh win of the season in his last start, which is a new career high, surpassing his six from last year...has 110.2 innings pitched, which is five short of his high of 115.2 from last year...has 70 strikeouts, which is seven short of his best of 77 from last year...went 1-2 with a 7.29 ERA over the first nine games (four starts) of his career through April 25, 2015, 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA over a nine-start stretch from May 23-July 4, 2015, 1-11 with a 5.57 ERA over a 17-start stretch from July 10, 2015-May 24, 2016 and is 6-0 with a 3.25 ERA (23 er in 63.2 ip) over his last 10 starts.

MONTH BY MONTH: Is 4-0 with a 2.35 ERA (8 er in 30.2 ip) and .214 (24-for-112) opponents batting average in four starts in July...the four wins are tied for second in the American League and are his most ever in a month... over the last 11 years, the only A's pitcher to win five games in July is Sonny Gray in 2014...went 1-0 with a 4.33 ERA in five starts in June...was 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in six starts in May...his May loss total tied for second in the American League...it was the first time he has lost four games in a month in his career...went 1-2 with a 4.03 ERA in four starts in April.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents have grounded into 14 double plays, which is tied for seventh most in the American League...has issued 25 of his 33 walks this year and 49 of 71 in his career to left-handed hitters...has allowed a .149 (26-for-174) batting average with two strikes...opponents are batting .300 (51-for-170) with runners on base but that mark drops to .238 (20-for-84) with runners in scoring position.

SUPPORT: Has left with the lead in three of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (April 12 vs. Los Angeles-AL, June 17 vs. Los Angeles, June 28 vs. San Francisco)...is averaging 5.51 (39 rs in 63.2 ip) runs of support during his current six-game winning streak (last nine starts) after receiving an average of 2.30 runs of support over his first nine starts... is 0-5 with two runs of support or fewer, 7-1 with three runs of support or more...is now 1-14 in 20 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 12-1 in 20 starts with three runs of support or more.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-3 with a 2.92 ERA (17 er in 52.1 ip) in eight starts at home compared to 4-3 with a 5.25 ERA (34 er in 58.1 ip) in 11 starts on the road...has surrendered just three home runs in 63.1 innings at home compared to 10 in 58.1 innings on the road.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 1.89 ERA (4 er in 19.0 ip) in the first inning, a 5.26 ERA (21 er in 36.2 ip) in the second and third inning and a 4.17 ERA (25 er in 54.0 ip) from the fourth inning on...has allowed nine of his 13 home runs over the first three innings of a game.

THIS AND THAT: Has tossed seven or more innings in each of his last three starts and has issued one walk or fewer in each outing...has walked one batter or fewer in 10 of his 19 starts this year...has tossed seven or more innings just four times this year and 10 times in 40 career starts... tossed 8.0 innings July 9, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to June 18 of last year...that was the fifth longest such streak in Oakland history.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts...picked up his first win of the season and struck out a career-high eight batters April 20 at New York (AL)...it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 10, 2015...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned nine starts...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat that day...then lost each of his next five starts from April 25 to May 19...logged a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which fell one short of his career high of six...allowed a career-high 10 hits in back-to-back starts on April 25 at Detroit and May 2 against Seattle...is the first A's pitcher with at least 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)...yielded a career-high four home runs in an 11-3 loss at Baltimore May 8...snapped his five-game losing streak in a 3-2 win over Minnesota May 30...issued a career high tying four walks but allowed just one run in 6.2 innings of work in a 3-1 win at Minnesota July 4... tossed a career-high 112 pitches in 7.0 innings in a 7-4 win over Houston July 18.

LAST START: He tossed his second career complete game in the A's 4-3 win over Tampa Bay last Saturday in Oakland...his other complete game was a 1-0 loss at Los Angeles (AL) on June 13, 2015...allowed nine hits, which were the most by an A's pitcher in a complete game since Mark Redman allowed 12 on May 13, 2004 against Detroit...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Arcia in the second...then allowed a RBI groundout to Guyer in the fourth and a RBI single to Forsythe in the seventh...retired each of the final seven batters he faced and the A's scored three times in the bottom of the ninth for the win.

LHP Dillon Overton (1-1, 8.40 ERA): Will be recalled from Triple-A Nash-ville tomorrow for his third stint with the A's this year...was selected for the first time June 25 and went 1-1 with an 11.42 ERA in two starts before he was option back to Nashville July 1...returned July 19, had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win over Houston that day (6.1 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 6 so, 1 hr), and was sent back to Nashville the next day...is 10-4 with a 3.21 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, overall with Nashville...he is tied for second in the Pacific Coast League in wins, ranks fourth in ERA and is ninth in strikeouts (89)...has surrendered just three home runs in 103.2 innings, an average of 0.26 per nine innings...issued 23 walks, an average of 2.00 per nine innings...had a no decision in his last minor league start, a 6-5 Nashville win over Omaha last Sunday (7.0 ip, 9 h, 5 r, 5 er, 8 so)... had not pitched above Double-A prior to this year.
