### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (47-56) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (58-42)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won five of the last seven games and are now 9-5 (.643) since the All-Star Break, which is tied with Detroit and Los Angeles for the best record in the American League and tied for fourth best in the majors...went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 19-15 (.559) since then...are 12-12 in July...went 10-14 last July after posting a winning record in each of the previous three Julys from 2012-14...are 47-56 (.456) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the AL...are in fourth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 40 days in fourth, 13 days tied for fourth and 23 days in fifth.

**SERIES NOTES:** The A's won two of three at Texas to start the road trip and have now won each of their four series since the All-Star Break...it marks the first time the A's have won four consecutive series since May 9-22, 2014 when they also won four straight...have won the first game in 10 of the last 14 series but have lost the final game in 10 of the last 13 series...for the season, are 19-15 in the first game of a series compared to 11-22 in the final game of a series.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's scored four times in the eighth inning Wednesday to overcome a 3-2 deficit and defeat Texas 6-4...it marked the seventh time this year the A's won a game when trailing after seven innings, which is tied with Kansas City and Texas for the most in the majors...had just five such wins all last year...three of the A's last four road losses and four of the last seven have been walk-off losses...three of the A's last four home wins have been walk-off wins...the A's are 6-6 in walk-off games and the 12 walk-off games are tied for the most in the majors...four of the A's last seven games have been decided in the last at bat and the A's are 3-1 in those games...are 12-10 in games decided in the last at bat for the season...10 of the A's last 17 games have been decided by one run and they are 7-3 in those 10 games...are 16-16 (.500) for the season and rank fourth in the AL in one-run games (32)...have won each of their last two extra inning games and are 4-3 in extra innings for the season...the Oakland record for fewest extra inning games in a non-strike season is nine in 1974 and 1975.

**PITCHING:** The A's pitching staff struck out at least 10 batters in three consecutive games Monday through Wednesday, which matches the longest such streak by an Athletics team since at least 1913 (13th time, last: June 1-4, 2016)...recorded 34 strikeouts in 26.2 innings over that span...have compiled a 3.58 ERA (59 er in 148.1 ip) over the last 16 games but have a 4.61 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...rank second in most wild pitches (51) and have the fourth highest opponents batting average (.267).

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers are 4-3 with a 4.56 ERA (41 er in 81.0 ip) in 14 games since the All-Star Break...are 28-42 with a 4.93 ERA (308 er in 562.0 ip) for the season...are tied for second in the American League in fewest home runs (77), rank third in fewest wins and fewest innings pitched, tied for third in most losses and fourth in highest ERA...a week ago today, Kendall Graveman tossed the A's first complete game since Aug. 7, 2015 (Gray vs. Houston)...it snapped a streak of 148 consecutive games without a complete game, which was the second longest such streak in Athletics history (151, July 9, 2008-July 5, 2009).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .251, which ranks 10th in the American League...have a .305 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the AL and fifth lowest in the majors...have drawn just 260 walks, which is second fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...are on pace to walk 409 times, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...rank second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (693) and have the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.402).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's snapped their seven-game streak without an error last night, which follows a season-high streak of seven consecutive games with an error, which followed an Athletics record streak of 15 consecutive games without an error...have now committed 11 errors over the last 30 games after making 53 over the first 73 contests...have committed 64 errors for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...A's outfielders have 12 assists, which is second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 10).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-2 on their first post-break road trip, an 11-day, nine-game trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-1) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (1-2) and Hous-

ton (2-2) and are 23-27 (.460) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 11-7 since then...went 7-3 on the last homestand but are 24-29 (.453) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...are batting .259 (457-for-1762) on the road compared to .243 (427-for-1757) at home...have the fourth highest road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home batting average...have a 5.21 ERA (251 er in 433.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.06 (218 er in 483.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.70).

**DESIGNATED HITTERS:** A's designated hitters are batting .218 (78-for-357) with 11 home runs and 40 RBI...have the fewest RBI in the American League, the second lowest batting average (Houston, .183) and are tied for the third fewest home runs...Khris Davis homered twice as the A's DH on Wednesday, matching the home run total for A's designated hitters over the previous 51 games.

**LEFT AND RIGHT:** The A's have won 15 of the last 20 games in which the opponent has started a right-handed pitcher but have lost 11 of the last 14 games when they start a left-hander...are 12-16 (.429) in games started by a lefty compared to 35-40 (.467) against righties.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's have scored 33 of their 59 runs since the All-Star Break with two outs (55.9%)...are hitting .328 (59-for-180) with runners in scoring position since June 27 and are batting .275 with RISP for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...are 31-33 (.484) in night games compared to 16-23 (.410) during the day...A's pinch hitters rank second in the AL in hits (17) and RBI (13), tied for second in plate appearances (77) and tied for third extra base hits (5).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have used the disabled list 22 times, which marks the sixth time in the last 10 years they have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 22 players have combined to miss 1011 games (46.0 games per stint)...currently have 13 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Hill, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard, Triggs)...today is the 26th day the A's have had at least 12 players on the DL...prior to this year, had never had more than 11 players on the DL at one time...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. INDIANS:** The A's lost the first game of 2016 last night...won the season series last year, 4-3...split four games in Oakland and won two of three in Cleveland...have won five of the last seven games at Progressive Field...have won each of the last two season series and five of the last eight...are 31-23 against Cleveland dating back to 2009...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 268-233 against the Indians...that breaks down to 141-103 in Oakland and 127-130 in Cleveland...including 42-61 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 903-1026 against the Indians.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Coco Crisp** is batting a Major League leading .436 with runners in scoring position...**Khris Davis** has 26 home runs, which is one short of his career high of 27 from last year...has 46 home runs and 109 RBI over his last 147 games dating back to Aug. 6, 2015...**Liam Hendriks** has an 8.2-inning scoreless streak and has a 1.40 ERA (3 er in 19.1 ip) since being reinstated from the disabled list June 19...**Josh Reddick** is 14-for-45 (.311) with two doubles, three home runs (.556 slugging percentage) and five walks (.380 on-base percentage) in 13 games since the All-Star Break...**Marcus Semien** ranks second among Major League shortstops in home runs (21) and tied for fourth among American League shortstops in RBI (49).

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1901** Nap Lajoie becomes the second player in American League history to hit for the cycle, following teammate Harry Davis who was the first 20 days earlier...in **2000** Sal Fasano has a career high five RBI and drives in every run in the A's 5-2 win over Boston.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Dillon Overton (1-1, 8.40 ERA)

**FOR STARTERS:** Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today for his third stint with the A's this year...was selected for the first time June 25 and went 1-1 with an 11.42 ERA in two starts before he was optioned back to Nashville July 1...returned July 19, had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win over Houston that day (3 er in 6.1 ip), and was sent back to Nashville the next day...made his Major League debut June 25 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 53 minor league appearances, including 50 starts, in three professional seasons...had not pitched above Double-A prior to this year...became the 47th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the third this year (Manaea and Mengden)...became the fifth pitcher to make his first ML start for the A's this year (Neal and Triggs)...became the 15th pitcher in Oakland history to pick up the win in his debut, the first since Bobby Cramer on Sept. 13, 2010 at Kansas City.

**THE LONG BALL:** Allowed three home runs in his first start, two in his second start and one in his third start...joins Brad Rigby as the A's pitchers since at least 1904 to allow six home runs over the first three games of their career...was the only A's pitcher with five home runs over his first two games...has surrendered six home runs in 15.0 innings in the majors (3.60 per nine innings) after yielding 14 in 266.2 innings in the minors (0.47 per nine innings).

**FIRST START:** He was the winning pitcher in his Major League debut, a 7-3 A's win at Los Angeles (AL) June 25...tossed 108 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in his ML debut since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988 (previous: Mazzaro, 105 on June 2, 2009)...became the third pitcher in Oakland history to allow three home runs in his debut (Jeff Kaiser, April 11, 1985; Rick Rodriguez, Sept. 17, 1986)...all three home runs were solo shots, including back-to-back home runs by Calhoun and Trout in the first and a two-out shot by Pujols in the fifth.

**SECOND START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-6 loss to San Francisco on June 30...allowed a walk in the first and a single in the second but then surrendered six runs in the third inning when the Giants sent 10 men to the plate...Belt had a two-run double, Posey a three-run homer and Crawford a solo home run...also allowed a RBI double to Pagan in the fourth and was relieved by Triggs, who allowed Pagan to score.

**LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START:** He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Houston in 10 innings on July 19 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Valbuena in the third inning and two more runs in the fifth on a Springer home run and a Correa sacrifice fly...was relieved by Coulombe after retiring the first batter in the seventh and left with the A's trailing 3-0...the A's scored twice in the bottom of the seventh, once in the ninth and once in the 10th for the win.

**WITH NASHVILLE:** Is 10-4 with a 3.21 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, overall with Nashville...he is tied for second in the Pacific Coast League in wins, ranks fourth in ERA and is ninth in strikeouts (89)...issued 23 walks in 103.2 innings, an average of 2.00 per nine innings...went 1-4 with a 4.89 ERA and .305 opponents batting average over his first seven games but is 9-0 with a 2.21 ERA (16 er in 65.0 ip) and .240 (59-for-246) opponents batting average over his last 10 starts.

**THE LONG BALL:** Surrendered just three home runs in 103.2 innings, an average of 0.26 per nine innings...allowed two home runs on May 6 against Memphis...then had a nine-game, 64.0-inning, 264-batter homerless streak before allowing his next home run July 10 against New Orleans.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Allowed a .266 opponents batting average, including .258 (77-for-299) against right-handed hitters compared to .288 (32-for-111) against left-handers...surrendered all three of his home runs to righties...walked just three batters to lead off an inning...opponents hit .225 with the bases empty compared to .324 with runners on base...they were 3-for-9 (.333) with a grand slam with the bases loaded

and yielded five hits or fewer nine times...allowed 15 of his 41 runs in the second inning for a 7.88 ERA (14 er in 16.0 ip)...had a 2.36 ERA (23 er in 87.2 ip) in all other innings.

**2016 HIGHLIGHTS:** Struck out a season-high eight batters in a season-low 4.0 innings in his first start April 9 against Oklahoma City and took the loss...tossed his lone complete game of the season in the second game of an April 20 doubleheader at Colorado Springs, an 8-1 win (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 5 so)...made his only relief appearance April 25 against New Orleans in a game started by Henderson Alvarez on a rehab assignment (4.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season high 11 hits in a 7-6 loss to Memphis May 6...began his nine-game winning streak May 17 against Fresno when he matched his season-high with eight strikeouts...allowed just one run in 6.2 innings then allowed one run in 6.0 innings in his next start May 23 at Las Vegas...walked a season-high four batters in 5.0 innings May 28 at Salt Lake...matched his season-high with four walks June 10 at Oklahoma City...tossed 6.0 shutouts innings that day, allowed two unearned runs in his next start and then logged 7.1 scoreless innings in his final start before his first promotion on June 20 at Round Rock...went 4-0 with a 0.99 ERA in four starts in June...allowed a run in the second inning of his first start following his return on July 5 at Memphis, snapping a 26.1-inning streak without allowing an earned run...surrendered a lead-off home run to Isaac Galloway in the seventh inning on July 10 against New Orleans, snapping a nine-game, 64.0-inning, 264-batter Triple-A homerless streak.

**LAST MINOR LEAGUE START:** He had his first no decision since April 25 in the Sounds 6-5 win over Omaha last Sunday...matched his season high with eight strikeouts and did not walk a batter...allowed two runs in the first inning on a RBI double by Hunter Dozier and a RBI single by Jorge Bonifacio...then shutout the Storm Chasers on three hits over the next six innings...was relieved by Tucker Healy with a 4-3 lead, runners on first and second and no outs in the eighth inning and Healy allowed both runs to score for the blown save.

**2015 RECAP:** Started the year at Single-A Stockton and was 2-4 with a 3.82 ERA in 14 games, including 12 starts, when he was promoted to Double-A Midland July 2...went 5-2 with a 3.06 ERA in 13 starts with the RockHounds and combined for a 7-6 record and a 3.43 ERA in 27 games, including 25 starts...led the A's farm system in ERA and tied for third in strikeouts (106)...walked just 27 batters in 126.0 innings, an average of 1.93 per nine innings...allowed a .265 opponents batting average, including .249 (43-for-173) against left-handed hitters compared to .274 (84-for-307) against right-handers...was rated as the A's eighth best prospect by *Baseball America* following the season.

**CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:** Was the A's second round selection in the 2013 First-Year Player Draft but did not pitch until 2014 after undergoing "Tommy John" surgery...is the first A's pick from that draft to reach the majors (Ryon Healy is the second)...is 17-13 with a 3.14 ERA (93 er in 266.2 ip) in 56 games, including 53 starts, as a minor leaguer...has walked just 54 batters in 266.2 innings, an average of 1.86 per nine innings...led the A's farm system in ERA (3.43) in 2015...was rated as the A's eighth best prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2014 and 2015 seasons.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Sonny Gray (5-9, 5.43 ERA):** Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 5 and is 2-4 with a 4.83 ERA in 10 starts since his return...was placed on the DL May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA in nine starts before going on the DL...has a 5.43 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the majors and more than two runs higher than his previous career high...has allowed 17 home runs, which matches his career high...is 2-8 with a 6.31 ERA and .294 opponents batting average over his last 15 starts after going 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA and .232 opponents batting average over his first four starts...was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-3 A's win at Texas on Monday (6.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 8 so)...is 2-0 with a 0.64 ERA (28.0 ip, 13 h, 2 r, 2 er, 11 bb, 29 so, 1 hr) in four starts in his career against Cleveland.

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.77 ERA (15 er in 48.2 ip) and .192 (34-for-177) opponents batting average since the All-Star Break...has a 4.09 ERA for the season, which is sixth highest in the American League.
- Has tossed 354.1 innings, which is the most in the AL and fourth most in the majors.
- Has allowed 40-of-172 (23.3%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 23.1%).
- Has converted 29-of-43 (67.4%) save opportunities...the 29 saves rank fifth in the AL but the 14 blown saves are third most.
- Is tied for second in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (34), tied for third in wins (19) and ranks fourth in strikeouts (335) and opponents on-base percentage (.310)...ranks second in wild pitches (24) and fifth in most home runs (43).
