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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (47-57) VS. CLEVELAND INDIANS (59-42)

SUNDAY, JULY 31, 2016 — PROGRESSIVE FIELD — 1:10 P.M. EDT RHP SONNY GRAY (5-9, 5.43) VS. RHP COREY KLUBER (9-8, 3.44) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost two straight but won five of the last eight games and are now 9-6 (.600) since the All-Star Break, which is the fourth best record in the American League...went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 19-16 (.543) since then...are 12-13 in July...went 10-14 last July after posting a winning record in each of the previous three Julys from 2012-14...are 47-57 (.452) overall, which is tied for the third worst record in the AL...are tied for fourth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 40 days in fourth, 14 days tied for fourth and 23 days in fifth.

SERIES NOTES: The A's have dropped the first two games of this three-game series at Cleveland to snap their streak of consecutive series wins at four, which marked the first time the A's have won four consecutive series since May 9-22, 2014 when they also won four straight...have won the first game in 10 of the last 14 series but have lost the final game in 10 of the last 13 series...for the season, are 19-15 in the first game of a series compared to 11-22 in the final game of a series.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's scored four times in the eighth inning Wednesday to overcome a 3-2 deficit and defeat Texas 6-4...it marked the seventh time this year the A's won a game when trailing after seven innings, which is tied with Kansas City and Texas for the most in the majors...had just five such wins all last year...three of the A's last five road losses and four of the last eight have been walk-off losses...three of the A's last four home wins have been walk-off wins...the A's are 6-6 in walk-off games and the 12 walk-off games are tied for third most in the majors...four of the A's last eight games have been decided in the last at bat and the A's are 3-1 in those games... are 12-10 in games decided in the last at bat for the season...10 of the A's last 18 games have been decided by one run and they are 7-3 in those 10 games...are 16-16 (.500) for the season and rank fourth in the AL in one-run games (32)...have won each of their last two extra inning games and are 4-3 in extra innings for the season...the Oakland record for fewest extra inning games in a non-strike season is nine in 1974 and 1975.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff struck out at least 10 batters in three consecutive games Monday through Wednesday, which matches the longest such streak by an Athletics team since at least 1913 (13th time, last: June 1-4, 2016)...recorded 34 strikeouts in 26.2 innings over that span... has compiled a 3.74 ERA (65 er in 156.1 ip) over the last 17 games but has a 4.62 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...ranks second in most wild pitches (51) and has the third highest opponents batting average (.268) and slugging percentage (.431).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 4-4 with a 4.91 ERA (46 er in 84.1 ip) in 15 games since the All-Star Break...are 28-43 with a 4.98 ERA (313 er in 565.1 ip) for the season...are tied for second in the American League in fewest wins and rank third in most losses, highest ERA, fewest innings pitched and fewest home runs (80).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .251, which ranks ninth in the American League...however, have a .305 on-base percentage, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...have drawn just 262 walks, which is second fewest in the AL and third fewest in the majors...are on pace to walk 408 times, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...rank second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (702) and have the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.403).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's snapped their seven-game streak without an error Friday, which followed a season-high streak of seven consecutive games with an error, which followed an Athletics record streak of 15 consecutive games without an error...have now committed 11 errors over the last 31 games after making 53 over the first 73 contests...have committed 64 errors for the season, which is fifth most in the American League...A's outfielders have 12 assists, which is second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 11).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on their first post-break road trip, an 11-day, nine-game trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-2) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-4 on the last road trip to Minnesota (1-2) and Houston (2-2) and are 23-28 (.451) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 11-8 since then...went 7-3

on the last homestand but are 24-29 (.453) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...are batting .259 (465-for-1796) on the road compared to .243 (427-for-1757) at home... have the fourth highest road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home batting average...have a 5.24 ERA (257 er in 441.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.06 (218 er in 483.0 ip) at home...have the second highest road ERA in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.63).

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters are batting .219 (79-for-360) with 12 home runs and 41 RBI...are tied for the fewest RBI in the American League, have the second lowest batting average (Houston, .181) and have the fifth fewest home runs...have three home runs in the last three games, which is one more than the home run total for A's designated hitters over the previous 51 games.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have won 15 of the last 21 games in which the opponent has started a right-handed pitcher but have lost 11 of the last 14 games when they start a left-hander...are 12-16 (.429) in games started by a lefty compared to 35-41 (.461) against righties.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have scored 36 of their 62 runs since the All-Star Break with two outs (58.1%)...are hitting .323 (60-for-186) with runners in scoring position since June 27 and are batting .274 with RISP for the season, which ranks fourth in the American League...are 31-34 (.477) in night games compared to 16-23 (.410) during the day...A's pinch hitters rank second in the AL in hits (17) and RBI (13), tied for second in plate appearances (77) and tied for third extra base hits (5).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 22 times, which marks the sixth time in the last 10 years they have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 22 players have combined to miss 1024 games (46.5 games per stint)...currently have 13 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Hill, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard, Triggs)...today is the 27th day the A's have had at least 12 players on the DL...prior to this year, never had more than 11 players on the DL at one time...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's have dropped the first two games of 2016...won the season series last year 4-3...split four games in Oakland and won two of three in Cleveland...have won five of the last eight games at Progressive Field...have won each of the last two season series and five of the last eight...are 31-24 against Cleveland dating back to 2009...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 268-234 against the Indians...that breaks down to 141-103 in Oakland and 127-131 in Cleveland...including 42-62 at Progressive Field...all-time, the A's are 903-1027 against the Indians.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .436 with runners in scoring position...Khris Davis ranks fourth in the American League with 26 home runs...that is the second best total of his career and one shy of his career high of 27 from last year...has 46 home runs and 109 RBI over his last 148 games dating back to Aug. 6, 2015...Ryan Dull has a 0.89 ERA (3 er in 30.1 ip) and .108 (11-for-102) opponents batting average over his last 29 games (since May 25)...Josh Reddick is 16-for-49 (.327) with three doubles, three home runs (.571 slugging percentage) and five walks (.389 on-base percentage) in 14 games since the All-Star Break...Marcus Semien has career highs in home runs (22) and RBI (50)...ranks second among Major League shortstops in home runs (Story, COL 27) and tied for fourth among American League shortstops in RBI.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1972 Vida Blue tosses a two-hit shutout as the A's defeat Texas 2-0 in 1:52...Joe Rudi drives in both of the A's runs with sacrifice flies as the A's are also limited to two hits...in 1973 Ken Holtzman pitches all 11 innings of the A's 4-3 win over Minnesota...Ray Fosse drives in the winning run with a sacrifice fly.

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TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (5-9, 5.43 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 5 and is 2-4 with a 4.83 ERA (32 er in 59.2 ip) in 10 starts since his return...was placed on the DL Mav 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA in nine starts before going on the DL...has a 5.43 ERA for the season, which is the highest in the American League, third highest in the majors and more than two runs higher than his previous career high (3.08 in 2014).

CAREER HIGHS: Allowed two home runs in his last start and has now surrendered 17

home runs in 107.2 innings, which matches his career high from last year in 208.0 innings...has nine losses, which is one short of his career high of 10 from 2014.

LAST 15 STARTS: Is 2-8 with a 6.31 ERA (57 er in 81.1 ip) and .294 (97-for-330) opponents batting average over his last 15 starts after going 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA and .232 opponents batting average over his first four starts...had a career-high seven-game losing streak from April 27 to July 6, which was the longest by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross had an eight-game losing streak from May 19-Sept. 24, 2012...had a 6.16 ERA and .293 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 12 starts from April 27 to July 6...the streak of 12 consecutive starts without a win tied for second longest by an A's starter this century (13, Braden, April 29-Sept. 29, 2007; 12, Bassitt, Aug. 9, 2015-April 28, 2016)

WILD PITCHES: Has 14 wild pitches, which are four more than any other pitcher and one short of his career high of 15 from 2014...13 came before the All-Star Break, which are most in Athletics history before the break... had three wild pitches May 20 against New York and is the first A's pitcher with three wild pitches in a game since Doug Johns on Sept. 6, 1995 at Boston...has 44 career wild pitches, which is seventh most in Oakland history (Mike Norris is 6th with 53).

IN JULY: Is 2-3 with a 6.52 ERA (21 er in 29.0 ip) in five starts in July...the ERA is the highest in the American League...has posted an ERA above 5.40 in a month twice in his career (9.61 in May 2016 and 6.84 in Sept. 2015)...has lost more than three games in a month once in his career (4 in Aug. 2014)...has allowed six home runs this month, which are his most ever in a month...had allowed just 16 runs in 77.0 career July innings entering this year (1.64 ERA).

INNING BY INNING: Has a 3.05 ERA (19 er in 56.0 ip) and .206 (42-for-204) opponents batting average over the first three innings of the game compared to an 8.01 ERA (46 er in 51.2 ip) and .348 (77-for-221) opponents average from the fourth inning on.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Is 2-2 with a 3.00 ERA (7 er in 21.0 ip) in four starts against American League Central teams compared to 3-7 with a 6.02 ERA (58 er in 86.2 ip) in 15 starts against everyone else

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 2-1 with a 6.88 ERA (13 er in 17.0 ip) in three starts since the All-Star Break after going 3-8 with a 5.16 ERA in 16 starts before the break...the eight losses were two more than his combined pre-All-Star Break total from the previous two seasons (20-6, 2.42 ERA in 37 starts)...is now 23-14 with a 3.13 ERA in 54 career appearances before the All-Star Break compared to 15-15 with a 3.61 ERA (103 er in 256.2 ip) in 41 games after the break.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .340 opponents on-base percentage, which is fifth highest in the American League...has the fourth highest slugging percentage (.480) and sixth highest batting average (.280)...has issued 19 of his 40 walks with two outs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL...has yielded a .323 (31-for-96) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is fifth highest in the AL among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...opponents are batting .226 (35-for-155) the first time through the lineup, .293 (44-for-150) the second time and .333 (40-for-120) after that...has surrendered 11 of his 17 home runs to right-handed hitters...11 have been solo shots...opponents are 25-for-56 (.446) with five doubles and four home runs (.750 slugging percentage) when putting the first pitch in play...has allowed a .304 (31-for-102) batting average with four doubles, a triple and seven home runs (.569 slugging percentage) to batters leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is fourth highest in the AL.

SPOTS IN THE ORDER: The eight and nine hitters in the order are batting a combined .458 (38-for-83) with seven home runs and 20 RBI, while the four and five hitters are hitting a combined .189 (17-for-90) with one home run and nine RBI...the eight hitter is batting .465 (20-for-43) and the nine hitter is hitting .450 (18-for-40), both of which are the highest marks in the majors among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...the seven hitter is hitting .146 (7-for-48), which is third lowest in the AL.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-8 with a 6.66 ERA (54 er in 73.0 ip) in 13 starts at night compared to 2-1 with a 2.86 ERA (11 er in 34.2 ip) in six starts during the day...is tied for second in the American League in night losses (Archer, TB 9)...over the last two years, he is 7-3 with a 2.17 ERA (23 er in 95.1 ip) in 15 starts during the day, 12-13 with a 4.29 ERA (105 er in 220.1 ip) in 35 starts at night.

DAY REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 2-7 with a 5.82 ERA (39 er in 60.1 ip) in 11 starts on four days rest compared to 3-2 with a 4.94 ERA (26 er in 47.1 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win at Texas last Tuesday...shut out the Rangers on one walk over the first four innings and had a 5-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the fifth inning...Gallo homered with one out. Rua singled to center and Moreland followed with a two-run homer...retired each of the final five batters he faced.

LHP Sean Manaea (3-5, 4.61 ERA): Is 1-1 with a 2.65 ERA in six games, including five starts, since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 29...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...has not walked a batter in his last four games, 26.2 innings and 108 batters faced...has walked just four batters in 37.1 innings (0.96 per nine innings) since he was reinstated from the DL June 29...has 35 strikeouts over that span for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 8.44...is 0-0 despite a 1.69 ERA over his last four games...has just six runs of support over that span (2.03 RSA)...has received two runs of support or fewer in 10 of his 14 starts...has a 2.68 ERA over innings one through three and a 6.49 ERA from the fourth inning on...had a no decision in his last start, a 6-4 A's win at Texas on Wednesday (6.2 ip, 11 h, 3 r, 3 er,
