OAKLAND ATHLETICS (47-58) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (47-58)

TUESDAY, AUGUST 2, 2016 — ANGEL STADIUM — 7:05 P.M. EDT LHP SEAN MANAEA (3-5, 4.57) VS. RHP MATT SHOEMAKER (5-11, 4.17) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's were swept by Cleveland in a three-game series over the weekend after winning five of the previous six games...are now 9-7 (.563) since the All-Star Break, which is the third best record in the American League behind Detroit (11-5) and Los Angeles (10-6)...went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 19-17 (.528) since then...are 47-58 (.448) overall, which is tied with the Angels for the third worst record in the AL...are in a tie for fourth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 40 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 23 days in fifth.

IN JULY: The A's finished July with a losing record for the second consecutive season as they were 12-14 (10-14 last year)...the pitching staff compiled a 4.49 ERA, which was fourth highest in the American League... ranked fifth in the AL with 207 strikeouts, which are the most in franchise history in July (previous: 203 in 2011)...tied for third in the AL in saves (8)... hit .238, which was fourth lowest in the AL.

SERIES NOTES: The sweep by the Indians ended a four-series winning streak for the A's, which was their longest in over two years (May 9-22, 2014)...it was the eighth time the A's were swept this year...the A's have won the first game in 10 of the last 14 series but have lost the final game in 11 of the last 14 series...for the season, are 19-15 in the first game of a series compared to 11-23 in the final game of a series.

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.51 ERA (31 er in 50.2 ip) over the first six games of the road trip after logging a 3.69 ERA on the last homestand...overall, have a 5.31 ERA (265 er in 449.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.06 (218 er in 483.0 ip) at home...the road ERA is second highest in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.56)...for the season, the have the second highest ERA in the American League (4.66), the second most wild pitches (53), third highest opponents batting average (.268) and slugging percentage (.432) and fourth highest on-base percentage (.332)

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed 3.1 innings in each of the last two games, which marks the third time this year they have tossed fewer than four innings in consecutive games...last did it from May 8-11 when they had a four-game streak...have 18 games this year with fewer than four innings pitched, which is the most in the majors (Minnesota, 15)...starters are 1-3 with a 7.42 ERA (25 er in 30.1 ip) on the road trip and 28-44 with a 5.06 ERA (320 er in 568.2 ip) for the season...have the second highest ERA in the American League, the second fewest wins and innings pitched and the third most losses.

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout for the third time in July on Sunday after being blanked three times total over the first three months of the season...are now batting .233 (89-for-382) with 35 runs scored over the last 11 games (3.2 runs per games)...for the season, the A's rank last in the American League in on-base percentage (.305) and have the second fewest walks (265)...are on pace for 408 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...rank second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (710) and have the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.402).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed just one error in their last 10 games...now have 11 errors in their last 32 games after making 53 over the first 73 contests...A's outfielders have 13 assists, which is second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 12).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-4 on their first post-break road trip, an 11-day, nine-game trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-4 on the last road trip and are 23-29 (.442) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 11-9 since then...return home following the game Thursday for a 10-game homestand against Chicago-NL (three games), Baltimore (four games) and Seattle (three games)...it will be the A's second consecutive 10-game homestand as they went 7-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (3-1)...are 24-29 (.453) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...are batting .258 (471-for-1828) on the road compared to .243 (427-for-1757) at home.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won seven of their last 10 one-run games and are 16-16 (.500) for the season...rank fourth in the American League in one-run games (32)...are 12-10 in games decided in the last at bat and 6-6 in walk-off games...are tied for third in the AL in walk-off games (12)... have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied with Kansas City and Texas for the most in the majors...had just five such wins all last year...have won each of their last two extra inning games and are 4-3 in extra innings...the Oakland record for fewest extra inning games in a non-strike season is nine in 1974 and 1975.

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters are batting .218 (79-for-363) with 12 home runs and 41 RBI...are tied with Houston for the fewest RBI in the American League, have the second lowest batting average (Houston, .184) and are tied for the fourth fewest home runs...the A's DH has three home runs in the last four games after tallying two over the previous 51 contests

THIS AND THAT: The A's have scored 36 of their 62 runs since the All-Star Break with two outs (58.1%)...are batting .192 (14-for-73) with runners in scoring position over the last 11 games after hitting .380 with RISP over the previous 19 contests...A's pinch hitters rank second in the AL in hits (17) and RBI (13), third in plate appearances (77) and fourth in extra base hits (5)...are 31-34 (.477) in night games compared to 16-24 (.400) during the day...have the worst record in day games in the AL...the A's have lost 11 of the 14 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 22 times, which marks the sixth time in the last 10 years they have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 22 players have combined to miss 1037 games (47.1 games per stint)...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times and players missed 1103 games...currently have 11 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard)...today is the 30th consecutive day the A's have had at least 11 players on the DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 4-6 against the Angels...that includes 3-1 in Anaheim and 1-5 in Oakland...have won four of the last five games in Anaheim and have lost seven of the last eight games in Oakland...have lost the season series in each of the previous two years after winning three straight prior to that...are 53-52 against the Angels since the start of the 2011 season...including 43-12 when scoring four or more runs...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 418-348 against the Angels...that includes 216-166 in Oakland and 202-182 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 467-425 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .436 with runners in scoring position...Khris Davis has hit seven home runs since the All-Star Break, which is tied for the most in the majors...is tied for fourth in the American League in home runs (26) and tied for eighth in RBI (68)... the home runs and RBI are one short of his career high...had 27 home runs last year and 69 RBI in 2014...Ryan Dull has a 0.89 ERA (3 er in 30.1 ip) and .108 (11-for-102) opponents batting average over his last 29 games...Liam Hendriks has a 1.71 ERA (4 er in 21.0 ip) and .205 (16-for-78) opponents batting average in 16 games since he was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list on June 19...Jake Smolinski has not committed an error in 132 career games as an outfielder (including 80 with Oakland)...Marcus Semien has career highs in home runs (22) and RBI (50)...ranks second among ML shortstops in home runs (Story, COL 27) and fifth among AL shortstops in RBI.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1924 Joe Hauser becomes the second American Leaguer to hit three home runs in a game...he also adds a double for a then-record 14 total bases...in 1933 Mickey Cochrane hits for the cycle for the second time in his career but the A's lose to New York, 16-3...in 1972 Catfish Hunter pitches a five-hit shutout as the A's defeat Kansas City 5-0...it follows a three-hit shutout by Ken Holtzman, which followed a two-hit shutout by Vida Blue.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (3-5, 4.57 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 1-1 with a 2.65 ERA (11 er in 37.1 ip) in six games, including five starts, since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 29...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...made one start on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton June 24 against San Jose and had a no decision (3.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 1 hr, 64 pitches)...was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is making his Major League debut.

DON'T WALK: Has not walked a batter in his last four games, 26.2 innings and 108 batters faced...last walked a batter on July 5 at Minnesota (Grossman to lead off the fifth)...has walked just four batters in 37.1 innings (0.96 per nine innings) since he was reinstated from the DL June 29...has 35 strikeouts over that span for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 8.44... had 40 strikeouts and 16 walks in 49.1 innings before going on the DL (2.50 strikeout-to-walk ratio).

RUN SUPPORT: Is 0-0 despite a 1.69 ERA (5 er in 26.2 ip) over his last four games...has just six runs of support over that span (2.03 RSA)...has received two runs of support or fewer in 10 of his 14 starts and seven runs or more in three of his starts.

ROOKIE LEADERS: Ranks second among American League rookies in strikeouts (75), innings pitched (86.2) and games started (14) and tied for ninth in wins (3).

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-3 with a 6.99 ERA (22 er in 28.1 ip) and .328 (39-for-119) opponents average in five starts on the road compared to 3-2 with a 3.39 ERA (22 er in 58.1 ip) and .242 (53-for-219) opponents batting average in 10 games at home...the last A's pitcher to start his career with a three-game losing streak on the road is Ariel Prieto in 1995...the only Oakland pitcher to start his career with a losing streak greater that three games on the road is Mike Morgan, who had a six-game streak in 1978-79...has surrendered seven home runs in 28.1 innings on the road (2.22 per nine innings), five in 58.1 innings in Oakland (0.77 per nine innings)... has a .926 OPS on the road, .667 at home.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .191 (13-for-68) batting average and four extra base hits (two doubles, two home runs)... right-handers are batting .293 (79-for-270) with 10 of his 12 home runs and 16 of his 20 walks...has an .809 OPS against righties, .555 against lefties...opponents are batting .203 (15-for-74) with runners in scoring position...has a .225 (29-for-129) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .264 (32-for-121) the second time and .352 (31-for-88) after that...has allowed a .475 (19-for-40) batting average to the opponents number four hitter but the nine hitter is 3-for-31 (.097)...opponents are 25-for-56 (.446) with six doubles, four home runs and 16 RBI when putting the first pitch in play.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Is 1-0 with a 3.63 ERA (14 er in 34.2 ip) in six starts against American League West competition compared to 2-5 with a 5.19 ERA (30 er in 52.0 ip) in nine games against all other teams.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.68 ERA (13 er in 43.2 ip) and .233 (38-for-163) opponents batting average over innings one through three and a 6.49 ERA (31 er in 43.0 ip) and .309 (54-for-175) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 1-1 with a 2.97 ERA (13 er in 39.1 ip) in six starts on four days rest, 2-4 with a 6.17 ERA (29 er in 42.1 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-4 with a 5.05 ERA (32 er in 57.0 ip) in 10 starts at night compared to 1-1 with a 3.64 ERA (12 er in 29.2 ip) in five games during the day...has surrendered two home runs in 29.2 innings during the day (0.61 per nine innings), 10 in 57.0 innings at night (1.58 per nine innings).

2016 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 7-4 A's win over Houston *April* 29 in Oakland...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...issued a career-high four walks...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Seattle in Oakland on *May* 4...left with an 8-4 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford)... had the first decision of his career, a loss in the A's 13-5 loss at Boston *May* 10...yielded a career-high eight runs on 10 hits in a career-low 2.2 innings...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969)...picked up his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas *May* 16 in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first six innings...was the losing pitcher in

the A's 5-1 loss to New York (AL) in Oakland on May 21...retired each of the first nine batters he faced before allowing the first four batters to reach base and score in the fourth inning...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 loss to Detroit May 27 in Oakland...left after six innings trailing 3-0 as the A's were shutout on three hits over the first eight innings...picked up the second win of his career in the A's 5-1 win over Minnesota June 1 in Oakland...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the sixth inning on an Escobar sacrifice fly...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-4 loss at Milwaukee June 7...surrendered a two-run home run to Carter in the second inning and a three-run home run to Carter in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 14-5 win over Texas on June 13 in Oakland...had a 10-2 lead when he left the game after 4.1 innings with a left pronator muscle strain...went on the DL the next day...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-1 victory over San Francisco June 29 in Oakland...did not allow a run in 5.2 innings for the first scoreless outing of his career...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-4 loss at Minnesota July 5...was trailing 3-1 when he yielded a two-run home run to Vargas a solo home run to Kepler on consecutive pitches in the fifth inning...had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss at Houston on July 10...tossed a career-high 106 pitches in 7.0 innings and did not allow a run or walk a batter...made his first career relief appearance in the A's 5-3 loss to Toronto July 17 in Oakland and had a no decision... entered the game to start the second inning in relief of Andrew Triggs, who left the game with a left shin contusion...Triggs relieved Rich Hill who left after five pitchers with a blister...Manaea had been scheduled to start two days later...tossed 5.0 innings, which is a season-high for an A's reliever... had a no decision in the A's 1-0, 13-inning win over Tampa Bay *July 22* in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings and allowed just five hits and no walks, but Odorizzi did the same for the Rays...retired each of the first 14 batters before Dickerson and Beckham had back-to-back singles in the fifth.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win last Wednesday at Texas...struck out a career-high nine batters but allowed a career-high 11 in 6.2 innings...the A's scored twice in the first and he allowed a run in the third on a Beltre RBI single...then surrendered a two-run home run to Desmond in the fifth and left after 6.2 innings trailing 3-2...the A's scored four times in the eighth for the win.

RHP Kendall Graveman (7-7, 4.15 ERA): Had his career-high winning streak snapped at six games in his last start, a 5-3 loss at Cleveland last Friday (6.1 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...the winning streak doubled his previous career high (3, June 24-July 4, 2015) and matched the longest by an A's pitcher this year (Hill)...compiled a 3.25 ERA and .264 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 10 starts from May 30 to July 23...is 6-1 with a 3.34 over his last 11 starts after going 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...has allowed just four home runs (0.51 per nine innings) and issued 16 walks (2.06 per nine innings) over his last nine starts after allowing 10 home runs (1.91 per nine innings) and walking 19 (3.64 per nine innings) over his first nine starts...is 1-1 with a 2.05 ERA (30.2 ip, 27 h, 8 r, 7 er, 6 bb, 17 so, 2 hr) in five career starts against Los Angeles...including 1-0 with a 1.38 ERA in three starts this year.

- Has allowed 42-of-176 (23.9%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 22.6%).
