OAKLAND ATHLETICS (47-59) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (48-58)

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 3, 2016 — ANGEL STADIUM — 7:05 P.M. EDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (7-7, 4.15) VS. RHP JERED WEAVER (8-8, 5.14) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost each of the last four games after winning five of the previous six contests...that drops the A's to 12 games under .500, which is one short of the season high of 13 (five times, last: 38-51 on July 10)...are 9-8 since the All-Star Break...went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 19-18 (.514) since then...are 47-59 (.443) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League...are in fifth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 40 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 24 days in fifth.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed a home run in a season-high eight consecutive games (15 home runs total)...have compiled a 5.37 ERA (35 er in 58.2 ip) over the first seven games of the road trip after logging a 3.69 ERA on the last homestand...overall, have a 5.29 ERA (269 er in 457.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.06 (218 er in 483.0 ip) at home...the road ERA is second highest in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.56)...for the season, the have the second highest ERA in the American League (4.66), the second most wild pitches (53), third highest opponents batting average (.268) and the fourth highest slugging percentage (.432) and on-base percentage (.332).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have taken the loss in each of the last four games (19 er in 18.2 ip, 9.16 ERA) and are 1-4 with a 7.25 ERA (29 er in 36.0 ip) on the road trip...are 28-45 with a 5.08 ERA (324 er in 574.1 ip) for the season...have finished the season with an ERA of 5.00 or more four times in Oakland history, all over a five-year span from 1993-97...are tied with Kansas City and Minnesota for the most losses in the American League, have the second highest ERA and the second fewest wins and innings pitched.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .236 (98-for-416) with 39 runs scored over the last 11 games (3.25 runs per games)...for the season, the A's rank last in the American League in on-base percentage (.305) and have the second fewest walks (268)...are on pace for 410 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)... rank second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (718) and have the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.403).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's committed two errors last night after making just one over their previous 10 games...now have 13 errors in their last 33 games after making 53 over the first 73 contests...have 66 errors for the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...A's outfielders have 13 assists, which is second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 12).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-5 on their first post-break road trip, an 11-day, nine-game trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (0-1)...went 3-4 on the last road trip and are 23-30 (.434) on the road... started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 11-10 since then...return home following the game tomorrow for a 10-game homestand against Chicago-NL (three games), Baltimore (four games) and Seattle (three games)...it will be the A's second consecutive 10-game homestand as they went 7-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (3-1)...are 24-29 (.453) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...are batting .258 (480-for-1862) on the road compared to .243 (427-for-1757) at home.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won seven of their last 11 one-run games but are 16-17 (.485) for the season...rank fourth in the American League in one-run games (33)...are 12-10 in games decided in the last at bat and 6-6 in walk-off games...are tied for third in the AL in walk-off games (12)... have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied with Kansas City and Texas for the most in the majors...had just five such wins all last year...have won each of their last two extra inning games and are 4-3 in extra innings...the Oakland record for fewest extra inning games in a non-strike season is nine in 1974 and 1975.

SERIES NOTES: The A's have lost the first game in each of their last four series after winning the first game in 10 of the previous 11...have lost the final game in 11 of the last 14 series...for the season, are 19-16 in the first game of a series compared to 11-23 in the final game of a series...the

sweep by the Indians last weekend ended a four-series winning streak for the A's, which was their longest in over two years (May 9-22, 2014)...it was the eighth time the A's were swept this year.

DESIGNATED HITTERS: A's designated hitters are batting .221 (81-for-367) with 13 home runs and 42 RBI...are tied with Houston for the fewest RBI in the American League and have the third lowest batting average... the A's DH has four home runs in the last five games after tallying two over the previous 51 contests.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have scored 39 of their 66 runs since the All-Star Break with two outs (59.1%)...are batting .182 (14-for-77) with runners in scoring position over the last 11 games after hitting .380 with RISP over the previous 19 contests...A's pinch hitters rank second in the AL in hits (17) and RBI (13), third in plate appearances (78) and fourth in extra base hits (5)...are 31-35 (.470) in night games compared to 16-24 (.400) during the day...have the worst record in day games in the American League... the A's have lost 11 of the 14 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher.

IN JULY: The A's finished July with a losing record for the second consecutive season as they were 12-14 (10-14 last year)...the pitching staff compiled a 4.49 ERA, which was fourth highest in the American League... ranked fifth in the AL with 207 strikeouts, which are the most in franchise history in July (previous: 203 in 2011)...tied for third in the AL in saves (8)... hit .238, which was fourth lowest in the AL.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 22 times, which marks the sixth time in the last 10 years they have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 22 players have combined to miss 1048 games (47.6 games per stint)...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times and players missed 1103 games...currently have 11 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard)...today is the 31st consecutive day the A's have had at least 11 players on the DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 4-7 against the Angels...that includes 3-2 in Anaheim and 1-5 in Oakland...have won four of the last six games in Anaheim and have lost seven of the last eight games in Oakland...have lost the season series in each of the previous two years after winning three straight prior to that...are 53-53 against the Angels since the start of the 2011 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 418-349 against the Angels...that includes 216-166 in Oakland and 202-183 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 467-426 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .436 with runners in scoring position...Khris Davis hit his 27th home run of the season last night, matching his career high from last year...it was his 69th RBI, which matches his best from 2014...Ryan Dull has a 0.86 ERA (3 er in 31.1 ip) and .113 (12-for-106) opponents batting average over his last 30 games...Liam Hendriks has a 1.69 ERA (4 er in 21.1 ip) in 17 games since he was reinstated from the DL June 19...Marcus Semien ranks second among ML shortstops in home runs (Story, COL 27) and fifth among AL shortstops in RBI...Jake Smolinski has not committed an error in 133 career games as an outfielder (including 81 with Oakland).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1933 Lefty Grove became the first pitcher since August 2, 1931, a span of 308 games, to shutout the New York Yankees, winning 7-0... in 1991 Dave Henderson hits three home runs and the A's blast a total of six, but all are solo shots as the A's lose 8-6 to Minnesota...the Twins score seven runs in the eighth and add an insurance run in the ninth... in 1998 Matt Stairs homers in his fifth consecutive game to tie what was then the Athletics franchise record for consecutive games with a home run...Kansas City's George Alusik set the record in 1962 and Dave Kingman matched it in 1986...in 2002 Mark Ellis ties an Oakland record with two triples and the A's tie an Oakland record with three as a team in an 8-4 win over Detroit.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (7-7, 4.15 ERA)

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Had his career-high winning streak snapped at six games in his last start...the streak doubled his previous best (3, June 24-July 4, 2015) and matched the longest by an A's pitcher this year (Hill)...compiled a 3.25 ERA and .264 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 10 starts from May 30 to July 23.

LAST 11, FIRST NINE: Is 6-1 with a 3.34 ERA (26 er in 70.0 ip) over his last 11 starts after going 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...has allowed just four home runs (0.51 per nine innings) and issued 16 walks (2.06 per nine innings) over his last 11 starts after allowing 10 home runs (1.91 per nine innings) and walking 19 (3.64 per nine innings) over his first nine starts.

CAREER NOTES: Is scheduled to make his 21st start of the season today, which matches his career high from last year...also has career highs in wins (7) and innings pitched (117.0) and his 71 strikeouts are six short of his best of 77 from last year...went 1-2 with a 7.29 ERA over the first nine games (four starts) of his career through April 25, 2015, 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA over a nine-start stretch from May 23-July 4, 2015, 1-11 with a 5.57 ERA over a 17-start stretch from July 10, 2015-May 24, 2016 and is 6-1 with a 3.34 ERA (26 er in 70.0 ip) over his last 11 starts.

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 4-1 with a 2.68 ERA (11 er in 37.0 ip) and .219 (30-for-137) opponents batting average in five starts in July...the wins tied for third in the American League and were his most ever in a month...had just three wins over the first three months of the season...went 1-0 with a 4.33 ERA in five starts in June...was 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in six starts in May...his May loss total tied for second in the AL...it was the first time he has lost four games in a month in his career...went 1-2 with a 4.03 ERA in four starts in April.

SUPPORT: Has left with the lead in four of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (April 12 vs. Los Angeles-AL, June 17 vs. Los Angeles, June 28 vs. San Francisco, July 29 at Cleveland)...is averaging 5.40 (42 rs in 70.0 ip) runs of support over his last 11 starts after receiving an average of 2.30 runs of support over his first nine starts...is 0-5 with two runs of support or fewer, 7-1 with three runs of support or more...is now 1-14 in 20 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 12-1 in 21 starts with three runs of support or more.

AGAINST THE WEST: Is 3-1 with a 3.44 ERA (19 er in 49.2 ip) in eight starts against American League West competition compared to 4-6 with a 4.68 ERA (35 er in 67.1 ip) in 12 starts against everyone else...is 6-4 against the West over the last two years compared to 7-12 against all other teams.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents have grounded into 15 double plays, which is tied for seventh most in the American League...has walked just five batters to lead off an inning, which is tied for fourth fewest in the AL among pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...has allowed a .148 (27-for-183) batting average with two strikes, which is ninth lowest in the AL...has issued 27 of his 35 walks this year and 51 of 73 in his career to left-handed hitters

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-3 with a 2.92 ERA (17 er in 52.1 ip) in eight starts at home compared to 4-4 with a 5.15 ERA (37 er in 64.2 ip) in 12 starts on the road...has surrendered just three home runs in 63.1 innings at home compared to 11 in 64.2 innings on the road.

THIS AND THAT: Has a 1.80 ERA (4 er in 20.0 ip) in the first inning...has allowed nine of his 14 home runs over the first three innings of a game... has walked one batter or fewer in 10 of his 20 starts...has tossed seven or more innings just four times this year and 10 times in 41 career starts... tossed 8.0 innings July 9, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to June 18 of last year...that was the fifth longest such streak in Oakland history.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts...picked up his first win of the season and struck out a career-high eight batters April 20 at New York (AL)...it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 10, 2015...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned nine starts...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat that day...then lost each of his next five starts from April 25 to May 19...logged a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which fell one short of his career high of six...allowed a career-high 10 hits in back-to-back starts on April 25 at Detroit and May 2 against Seattle...is the first A's pitcher with at least 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)...yielded a career-high four home runs in an 11-3 loss at Baltimore May 8...snapped his five-game losing streak in a 3-2 win over Minnesota

May 30...issued a career-high tying four walks but allowed just one run in 6.2 innings of work in a 3-1 win at Minnesota July 4... tossed a career-high 112 pitches in 7.0 innings in a 7-4 win over Houston July 18...fired his second career complete game in the A's 4-3 win over Tampa Bay on July 23 in Oakland...it was his first complete game win...allowed nine hits, which were the most by an A's pitcher in a complete game since Mark Redman allowed 12 on May 13, 2004 against Detroit.

LAST START: He had his six-game winning streak come to an end in the A's 5-3 loss at Cleveland last Friday...shut out the Indians on three hits and a walk over the first five innings and had a 3-0 lead when he surrendered a lead off home run to Santana in the sixth...allowed a RBI single to Almonte in the seventh and was relieved by Rzepczynski with a 3-2 lead and runners on first and third with one out...Rzepczynski and Dull allowed both inherited runners to score.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Hahn (2-4, 5.53 ERA): Will be recalled from Triple-A Nashville tomorrow for his fourth stint with the A's this year...went 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA in two starts during his first stint (April 30-May), 1-3 with an 8.34 ERA in five starts during his second stint (May 17-June 10) and 0-0 with a 1.17 ERA during his third stint (July 24)...is 2-1 with a 2.77 ERA and .200 opponents batting average in four starts during the day compared to 0-3 with a 9.92 ERA and .427 opponents average in four starts at night...had a no decision in his last Major League start, a 3-2 win over Tampa Bay on July 24 in Oakland (7.2 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...is 1-0 with a 2.84 ERA in two career appearances against Los Angeles, both starts last year in Oakland...is 1-6 with a 3.66 ERA in 13 starts with Nashville...took the loss in his only start with the Sounds following his July 25 option from Oakland, a 3-2 loss at Colorado Springs last Friday (7.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 bb, 4 so).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

19-14, 4.01 ERA (163 er in 366.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 29-for-43 (67.4%)

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.54 ERA (17 er in 60.1 ip) and .181 (39-for-215) opponents batting average since the All-Star Break...has a 4.01 ERA for the season, which is sixth highest in the American League.
- Has tossed 366.0 innings, which is the most in the AL and fourth most in the majors
- Has allowed 42-of-177 (23.7%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 22.2%).
