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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (47-60) VS. LOS ANGELES ANGELS (49-58)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost each of the last five games, which is their longest losing streak since losing a season-high seven straight from June 3-11...the losing streak has dropped the A's to a season-high tying 13 games under .500 for the sixth time this year (last: 38-51 on July 10)...are 47-60 (.439), which is the third worst record in the American League and matches the A's record after 107 games last year (won game 108)...are 9-9 since the All-Star Break...went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 19-19 (.500) since then...are in fifth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 40 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 25 days in fifth.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 31-36 (.463) in night games compared to 16-24 (.400) during the day...have the worst day record in the American League and fifth worst in the majors...are batting .264 (617-for-2333) and averaging 4.57 runs per game at night (306 runs) compared to .229 (303-for-1322) and 3.30 runs per game during the day (132 runs)...the runs per game during the day are second fewest in the majors (Atlanta, 3.18) and the batting average during the day is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their fourth walk-off loss in their last 11 road games last night, the third by home run...are now 6-7 in walk-off games for the season...are tied for second in the American League in walk-off losses (Texas, 9) and games (Houston, 14)...are 12-11 in games decided in the last at bat...have won seven of their last 11 one-run games but are 16-17 (.485) for the season...rank fourth in the AL in one-run games (33)...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied with Kansas City and Texas for the most in the majors...had just five such wins all last year...have won each of their last two extra inning games and are 4-3 in extra innings.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed a home run in a season-high nine consecutive games (18 home runs total)...have compiled a 5.67 ERA (42 er in 66.2 ip) over the first eight games of the road trip after logging a 3.69 ERA on the last homestand...overall, have a 5.34 ERA (276 er in 465.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.06 (218 er in 483.0 ip) at home...the road ERA is second highest in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.56)...for the season, have the second highest ERA in the American League (4.69), the second most wild pitches (53) and the third highest opponents batting average (.269), slugging percentage (.433) and on-base percentage (.332).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in three of the last four games (22 er in 16.1 ip, 12.12 ERA) and 32 times this year, which is the most in the majors...are 1-4 with a 7.88 ERA (35 er in 40.0 ip) on the road trip...are 28-45 with a 5.14 ERA (330 er in 578.1 ip) for the season...have finished the season with an ERA of 5.00 or more four times in Oakland history, all over a five-year span from 1993-97...have the fewest innings pitched in the American League and third fewest in the majors...have the second highest ERA and second fewest wins in the AL and are tied for second in most losses.

OFFENSE: The A's grounded into a season-high four double plays last night and have 93 for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...are batting .246 (111-for-452) with 45 runs scored over the last 13 games (3.5 runs per games)...are hitting .196 (18-for-92) with runners in scoring position over that stretch...for the season, the A's rank last in the AL in on-base percentage (.306) and have the second fewest walks (274)...are on pace for 414 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966)...rank second in the AL in fewest strikeouts (722) and have the fourth lowest slugging percentage (.404).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed two errors in each of the last two games, marking the first time they have back-to-back multiple error games since April 7-8...have four errors in the last two games after making just one over the previous 10 contests...have 68 errors for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...A's outfielders have 13 assists, which is second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 12).

SERIES NOTES: The A's have lost the final game in 11 of the last 14 series...have lost the first game in each of their last four series after winning

the first game in 10 of the previous 11...for the season, are 19-16 in the first game of a series compared to 11-23 in the final game of a series...the sweep by the Indians last weekend ended a four-series winning streak for the A's, which was their longest in over two years (May 9-22, 2014)...it was the eighth time the A's were swept this year.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-6 on their first post-break road trip, an 11-day, nine-game trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (0-2)...went 3-4 on the last road trip and are 23-31 (.426) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 11-11 since then...return home following the game today for a 10-game homestand against Chicago-NL (three games), Baltimore (four games) and Seattle (three games)...it will be the A's second consecutive 10-game homestand as they went 7-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (3-1)...are 24-29 (.453) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...are batting .260 (493-for-1898) on the road compared to .243 (427-for-1757) at home...have the fourth best road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home batting average.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have scored 42 of their 72 runs since the All-Star Break with two outs (58.3%)...A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (17) and RBI (13), tied for second in plate appearances (79) and fourth in extra base hits (5)...A's designated hitters are tied for last in the AL in RBI (42)...have lost 11 of the 14 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher.

IN JULY: The A's finished July with a losing record for the second consecutive season as they were 12-14 (10-14 last year)...the pitching staff compiled a 4.49 ERA, which was fourth highest in the American League...ranked fifth in the AL with 207 strikeouts, which are the most in franchise history in July (previous: 203 in 2011)...tied for third in the AL in saves (8)...hit .238, which was fourth lowest in the AL.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 22 times, which marks the sixth time in the last 10 years they have used the DL 20 or more times in a season...the 22 players have combined to miss 1059 games (48.1 games per stint)...last year, the A's used the DL 23 times and players missed 1103 games...currently have 11 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Lambo, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard)...today is the 32nd consecutive day the A's have had at least 11 players on the DL...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's are 4-8 against the Angels...that includes 3-3 in Anaheim and 1-5 in Oakland...have lost seven of the last eight games in Oakland...have lost the season series in each of the previous two years after winning three straight prior to that...are 53-54 against the Angels since the start of the 2011 season...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 418-350 against the Angels...that includes 216-166 in Oakland and 202-184 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 467-427 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .439 with runners in scoring position...**Khris Davis** has matched his career highs with 27 home runs and 69 RBI...**Ryan Dull** has a 1.15 ERA (4 er in 31.1 ip) and .120 (13-for-108) opponents batting average over his last 31 games...**Liam Hendriks** has a 1.57 ERA (4 er in 23.0 ip) in 18 games since he was reinstated from the DL June 19...**Marcus Semien** ranks second among ML shortstops in home runs (Story, COL 27) and fifth among AL shortstops in RBI...**Jake Smolinski** has not committed an error in 133 career games as an outfielder (including 81 with Oakland).

In **1910** Jack Coombs and Ed Walsh of the Chicago White Sox duel 16 innings to a scoreless tie...Coombs allows just three hits...in **1992** Jose Canseco ties an Oakland record when he walks five times in the A's 9-0 win at Texas...in **2002** Miguel Tejada hits a three-run home run in the A's 4-0 win over Detroit to extend his hitting streak to 24 games...he falls one short of Jason Giambi's Oakland record of 25.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Hahn (2-4, 5.53 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville today for his fourth stint with the A's this year...was recalled for the first time April 30 and went 1-1 with a 3.00 ERA and .250 opponents average in two starts before he was optioned to Nashville May 8...returned a second time May 17 and went 1-3 with an 8.34 ERA and .368 opponents batting average in five starts before returning to Nashville June 10...was recalled July 24 for his third stint, allowed one run on four hits in 7.2 innings in a no decision that day against Tampa Bay, and was optioned back to Nashville the following day.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-1 with a 2.77 ERA (8 er in 26.0 ip) and .200 (18-for-90) opponents batting average in four starts during the day compared to 0-3 with a 9.92 ERA (18 er in 16.1 ip) and .427 (32-for-75) opponents average in four starts at night...last year, he went 4-1 with a 1.52 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in six starts during the day compared to 2-5 with a 4.72 ERA and .284 opponents average in 10 starts at night...his career numbers are 8-3 with a 1.91 ERA (19 er in 89.1 ip) during the day, 7-11 with a 4.98 ERA (68 er in 123.0 ip) at night.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed six home runs in 42.1 innings this year (1.28 per nine innings) after surrendering nine home runs in 170.0 innings over his first two seasons (0.48 per nine innings)...the six home runs are a career high...four of the six home runs he has allowed this year have been solo shots...six of his nine home runs entering the season came with runners on base...five of his six home runs this year and 12 of 15 in his career have been hit by left-handed hitters.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 2-1 with a 3.03 ERA (11 er in 32.2 ip) and .237 (28-for-118) opponents batting average in five starts at home compared to 0-3 with a 13.97 ERA (15 er in 9.2 ip) and .468 (22-for-47) opponents batting average in three starts on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .364 (28-for-77) batting average against left-handed hitters compared to .250 (22-for-88) against right-handers...has surrendered five of his six home runs to lefties for a .610 slugging percentage (.318 vs. righties)...has yielded a .419 (18-for-43) batting average, .462 (2 bb) on-base percentage and .628 (3 2b, 2 hr) slugging percentage to hitters leading off an inning...last year, he yielded a .215 batting average, .277 on-base percentage and .290 slugging percentage to batters leading off an inning...opponents are 8-for-16 (.500) with runners in scoring position and two outs

2016 START-BY-START: He combined with Axford and Madson on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win over Houston **April 30** in Oakland...tossed 6.2 innings and allowed three of the hits...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-2 loss in the night game of the day/night doubleheader at Baltimore **May 7**...walked a career-high tying four batters...retired six of the seven batters he faced over the first two innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 10.2 innings...then allowed four runs in the third...had a no decision in the A's 8-5 win over Texas in Oakland on **May 17**...allowed a career-high tying 10 hits...left after 6.2 innings with a 4-3 lead but Madson allowed two runs in the ninth before Davis hit a walk-off grand slam in the bottom of the ninth for the win...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-4 loss to New York (AL) **May 22** in Oakland...left with a 3-2 lead and runners on first and second and two outs in the sixth...Axford allowed both of the inherited runners to score for the blown save...picked up his second win of the season in the A's 12-3 victory over Detroit **May 28** in Oakland...issued a career-high tying four walks...was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-2 loss at Houston **June 3**...allowed seven runs in just two-thirds of an inning...the runs were a career high and the innings pitched were a career low...became the eighth starting pitcher in Oakland history to allow seven or more runs in less than an inning, the first since Joe Blanton allowed eight runs in 0.1 innings against Tampa Bay on May 25, 2005... was the losing pitcher in the A's 4-0 loss at Milwaukee on **June 8**...was relieved after throwing 74 pitches in 3.2 innings...three Brewers pitchers combined to shut out the A's on three hits and no walks.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2 win over Tampa Bay on July 24 in Oakland...shutout the Rays on three hits and a walk over the first seven innings and had a 2-0 lead entering the eighth...allowed a one-out single to Kiermaier and retired the next batter before he was relieved by Dull...Dull allowed a two-run home run to Forsythe for the blown save but the A's scored once in the bottom of the eighth for the win.

a two-run single to Aybar in the first inning and a solo home run to Trout in the third...the A's scored a run in the fourth and he left after five innings trailing 3-1...Oakland scored twice in the bottom of the sixth to get him off the hook...then picked up the win in a 4-1 decision in Oakland on June 20...shutout the Angels on two hits and two walks over the first five innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Aybar in the sixth...that was the only run he would allow in 7.2 innings and the A's scored three times in the bottom of the sixth for the win.

WITH NASHVILLE: Was 1-6 with a 3.66 ERA in 13 starts with Nashville...the starts were the first of his career at the Triple-A level...surrendered just three home runs in 59.0 innings, an average of 0.46 per nine innings...however, issued 29 walks (4.42 per nine innings) and struck out just 40 for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 1.38...allowed a .260 opponents batting average, including .228 (29-for-127) against right-handed hitters compared to .300 (30-for-100) against left-handers...yielded a .183 average with runners in scoring position...opponents hit .179 with a .246 on-base percentage when leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: Was 0-1 with a 2.04 ERA in four starts when he was recalled by Oakland the first time on April 30...picked up his only win during his second stint with the Sounds from May 9 to 16, allowing a run in 5.2 innings in a 7-2 win at Iowa on May 12...went 0-4 with a 5.02 ERA in seven starts following his June 10 option...the Sounds were 5-8 in his starting assignments...tossed fewer than five innings in six of his 13 starts and more than six just once...had three starts without a run and three more with just one...walked three batters or more six times

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He was the losing pitcher in the Sounds 3-2 loss to Colorado Springs last Friday in Nashville...it was his only start following his July 25 option...Nashville scored twice in the first and he shut out the Sky Sox on two hits and three walks over the first six innings...then surrendered a three-run home run to Yadiel Rivera in the seventh for the loss.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Dillon Overton (1-2, 9.33 ERA): Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Saturday for his third stint with the A's this year and was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss at Cleveland that day (3.1 ip, 10 h, 5 r, 5 er, 1 bb, 1 so)...has allowed nine home runs in 18.1 innings over the first four starts of his Major League career after yielding 14 in 266.2 career innings in the minors (0.47 per nine innings)...is the only ML pitcher since at least 1913 to allow more than eight home runs over his first four career games...has allowed 19 runs and 34 hits, both of which are the most in Oakland history by a pitcher over the first four games of his career...went 10-4 with a 3.21 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, with Nashville...at the time of is July 30 promotion, he was tied for second in the Pacific Coast League in wins, ranks fourth in ERA and is ninth in strikeouts (89)... went 9-0 with a 2.21 ERA and .240 opponents batting average over his last 10 starts

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.52 ERA (18 er in 64.1 ip) and .182 (42-for-231) opponents batting average since the All-Star Break...has a 3.99 ERA for the season, which is sixth highest in the American League.
- Has tossed 370.0 innings, which is the most in the AL and fourth most in the majors.
- Has allowed 43-of-181 (23.8%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 22.2%).
- Is tied for third in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (35), ranks fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.307), fifth in strikeouts (346) and walks per nine innings (2.99) and tied for fifth in wins (19)...ranks second in most wild pitches (25), tied for fourth in blown saves (14) and tied for fifth in walks (123) and home runs (45).
- First batters faced are 72-for-313 (.230) with 23 walks (.281 on-base percentage)...ranks second in the AL in first batter on-base percentage and slugging percentage (.329), tied for third in strikeouts (84) and fourth in batting average.
