ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their five-game losing streak last night and are now 10-9 since the All-Star Break...went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 20-19 (.513) since then...are 48-60 (.444) overall, which is the third worst record in the American League...it matches the A's record after 108 games last year (lost game 109)...the 12 games under .500 is one short of the season high of 13 (six times, last: 47-60 on August 3)...are in fifth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 40 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 26 days in fifth.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Jed Lowrie and Jesse Hahn on the 15-day disabled list today and have now used the DL 24 times this year, which is one short of the Oakland record of 25 set in 2008...the 24 players have combined to miss 1071 games (44.6 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record...the current mark is 1397 in 2010...currently have a season-high 13 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Hahn, Lambo, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard)...today is the 17th day the A's have at least 13 players on the DL...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 5-9 (.357) in interleague play (1-3 vs. Milwaukee, 1-2 vs. Cincinnati, 3-1 vs. San Francisco, 0-3 vs. Pittsburgh), which is tied for the third worst record in the majors...after this three game series with the Cubs, the A's conclude interleague play with a three-game series at St. Louis Aug. 26-28...have finished with a winning record against the National League in each of the previous four seasons and 12 times in 19 years of interleague play...last had a losing record in 2010 (8-10)...are 196-162 (.547) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best in Major League history.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's defeated Los Angeles (AL) 8-6 in 10 innings last night...have now won each of their last three extra inning games and are 5-3 (.625) in extra innings...improved to 13-11 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for third in the American League in last at bat wins...three of the A's last four home wins and four of their last eight road losses have been walk-offs...the A's are 6-7 in walk-off games...are tied for second in the AL in walk-off games (Houston, 14) and tied for third in walk-off wins...have won seven of their last 11 one-run games but are 16-17 (.485) for the season...rank fourth in the AL in one-run games (33)...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied with Kansas City and Texas for the most in the majors...had just five such wins all last year.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed a home run in a season-high 10 consecutive games (20 home runs total)...compiled a 5.52 ERA on the last road trip after logging a 3.69 ERA on the last homestand...overall, have a 5.32 ERA (281 er in 475.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.06 (218 er in 483.0 ip) at home...the road ERA is second highest in the majors (Cincinnati, 5.56)...for the season, have the second highest ERA in the American League (4.69), the second most wild pitches (54) and the third highest opponents batting average (.269), slugging percentage (.434) and on-base percentage (.333).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in four of the last five games and 33 times this year...that is the most in the majors and matches the A's season total from last year...are 0-3 with a 11.95 ERA (27 er in 20.1 ip) over that span and have allowed at least five runs in each game...that marks the first time A's starters have allowed five or more runs in five consecutive games since Sept. 23-26, 1999...starters are 28-45 with a 5.18 ERA (335 er in 582.1 ip) for the season...have finished the season with an ERA of 5.00 or more four times in Oakland history, all over a five-year span from 1993-97...have the fewest innings pitched in the American League and third fewest in the majors...have the second highest ERA and second fewest wins in the AL and the third most losses.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .258 (170-for-660) with 29 home runs since the All-Star Break...are tied for third in the American League in post-break home runs...for the season, rank last in the AL in on-base percentage (.306), second in fewest walks (276) and fewest strikeouts (732) and fourth in lowest slugging percentage (.405)...are on pace for 414 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last three games after making one over the previous 10 contests...have 69 errors for the season, which is second most in the American League...A's outfielders have 14 assists, which is tied with Detroit for the fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a 10-game homestand tonight against Chicago-NL (three games), Baltimore (four games) and Seattle (three games)...it will be the A's second consecutive 10-game homestand as they went 7-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (3-1)...are 24-29 (.453) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and are 24-31 (.436) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 12-11 since then...are batting .260 (504-for-1939) on the road compared to .243 (427-for-1757) at home...have the fourth best road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home batting average.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have lost 11 of the last 14 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 12-16 (.429) in games against left-handed starters for the season, which is the third worst record in the American League...the A's have lost the first game in each of the last four series but are 19-16 in series openers for the season...A's pinch hitters rank second in the AL in hits (18), RBI (13) and plate appearances (81) and fourth in extra base hits (5)...A's designated hitters are tied for last in the AL in RBI (42) and have the fourth lowest batting average (.225)...the A's have scored 44 of their 80 runs since the All-Star Break with two outs (55.0%)

IN JULY: The A's finished July with a losing record for the second consecutive season as they were 12-14 (10-14 last year)...the pitching staff compiled a 4.49 ERA, which was fourth highest in the American League...ranked fifth in the AL with 207 strikeouts, which are the most in franchise history in July (previous: 203 in 2011)...tied for third in the AL in saves (8)...hit .238, which was fourth lowest in the AL.

A's vs. CUBS: The A's are 4-5 against the Cubs during the regular season...this is the fourth series between the two clubs...the A's won two of three in their last meeting in Oakland in 2013...lost two of three in each of their two meetings in Chicago in 2004 and 2010...the two clubs have also met twice in the World Series, with the A's winning in five games in both 1910 and 1929.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .448 with runners in scoring position...started the season 0-for-9 with RISP but is 26-for-49 (.531) since then...**Khris Davis** has matched his career highs with 27 home runs and 69 RBI...**Ryan Dull** has a 1.11 ERA (4 er in 32.1 ip) and .125 (14-for-112) opponents batting average over his last 32 games...opponents are 3-for-57 (.053) with runners in scoring position...**Liam Hendriks** has a 1.57 ERA (4 er in 23.0 ip) and .190 (16-for-84) opponents batting average in 18 games since he was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list on June 19...**Marcus Semien** ranks second among ML shortstops in home runs (Story, COL 27) and fourth among AL shortstops in RBI...**Jake Smolinski** has not committed an error in 134 career games as an outfielder (including 82 with Oakland).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1952** Bobby Shantz wins his 20th game...in **1992** Jose Canseco walks in his first two at bats against the Texas Rangers after tying a club record with five walks the day before to set an Oakland record with seven consecutive walks...in **2008** Brad Ziegler tosses 2.0 scoreless innings at Toronto to extend his scoreless streak to 34.0 innings, breaking the Oakland record for consecutive scoreless innings by a reliever...the streak, which broke Paul Lindblad's record of 32.1 set in 1975, reached 39 innings before coming to an end.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Dillon Overton (1-2, 9.33 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was recalled from Triple-A Nashville last Saturday for his third stint with the A's this year and allowed five runs in 3.1 innings that day at Cleveland for the loss...was selected for the first time June 25 and went 1-1 with an 11.42 ERA in two starts before he was option back to Nashville July 1...returned July 19, had a no decision in the A's 4-3, 10-inning win over Houston that day (3 er in 6.1 ip), and was sent back to Nashville the next day...is 1-2 with a 9.33 ERA overall...the ERA is the highest in the American League among pitchers with 15 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he also has the highest opponents batting average (.395) and slugging percentage (.826) and the third highest on-base percentage (.430).

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed nine home runs in 18.1 innings over the first four starts of his Major League career after yielding 14 home runs in 266.2 career innings in the minors (0.47 per nine innings)...is the only Major League pitcher since at least 1913 to allow more than eight home runs over his first four career games...no pitcher since at least 1913 has allowed more than nine home runs over the first five games of his career.

RUNS AND HITS: Has allowed 19 runs and 34 hits, both of which are the most in Oakland history by a pitcher over the first four games of his career...the most runs over five games is 24 by Blake Stein and the most hits is 36 by Steve Karsay.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in his Major League debut, a 7-3 A's win at Los Angeles (AL) June 25...became the 15th pitcher in Oakland history to pick up the win in his debut, the first since Bobby Cramer on Sept. 13, 2010 at Kansas City...tossed 108 pitches, which were the most by an A's pitcher in his debut since pitch counts were tracked beginning in 1988 (previous: Mazzaro, 105 on June 2, 2009)...became the third pitcher in Oakland history to allow three home runs in his debut (Jeff Kaiser, April 11, 1985; Rick Rodriguez, Sept. 17, 1986)...all three home runs were solo shots, including back-to-back home runs by Calhoun and Trout in the first and a two-out shot by Pujols in the fifth.

SECOND START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 12-6 loss to San Francisco on June 30...allowed a walk in the first and a single in the second but then surrendered six runs in the third inning when the Giants sent 10 men to the plate...Belt had a two-run double, Posey a three-run homer and Crawford a solo home run...also allowed a RBI double to Pagan in the fourth and was relieved by Triggs, who allowed Pagan to score.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Houston in 10 innings on July 19 in Oakland...allowed a RBI single to Valbuena in the third inning and two more runs in the fifth on a Springer home run and a Correa sacrifice fly...was relieved by Coulombe after retiring the first batter in the seventh and left with the A's trailing 3-0...the A's scored twice in the bottom of the seventh, once in the ninth and once in the 10th for the win.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-3 loss at Cleveland last Saturday...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed solo home runs to Kipnis in the bottom of the first and Ramirez in the second...the A's tied the game with a run in the fourth but he allowed three runs in the bottom of the fourth, including a leadoff home run by Almonte and a RBI double by Kipnis...was relieved by Hendriks to who allowed a two-run home to Napoli.

WITH NASHVILLE: Is 10-4 with a 3.21 ERA in 17 games, including 16 starts, with Nashville...at the time of is July 30 promotion, he was tied for second in the Pacific Coast League in wins, ranks fourth in ERA and is ninth in strikeouts (89)...issued 23 walks in 103.2 innings, an average of 2.00 per nine innings...went 1-4 with a 4.89 ERA and .305 opponents batting average over his first seven games but is 9-0 with a 2.21 ERA (16 er in 65.0 ip) and .240 (59-for-246) opponents batting average over his last 10 starts.

THE LONG BALL: Surrendered just three home runs in 103.2 innings, an average of 0.26 per nine innings...allowed two home runs on May 6 against Memphis...then had a nine-game, 64.0-inning, 264-batter homerless streak before allowing his next home run July 10 against New Orleans.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .266 opponents batting average, including .258 (77-for-299) against right-handed hitters compared to .288 (32-for-111) against left-handers...surrendered all three of his home runs to righties...walked just three batters to lead off an inning...opponents hit .225 with the bases empty compared to .324 with runners on base...they were 3-for-9 (.333) with a grand slam with the bases loaded

THIS AND THAT: Tossed at least six innings in 13 of his 17 appearances...walked one batter or fewer 13 times, allowed two runs or fewer 10 times and yielded five hits or fewer nine times...allowed 15 of his 41 runs in the second inning for a 7.88 ERA (14 er in 16.0 ip)...had a 2.36 ERA (23 er in 87.2 ip) in all other innings.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Struck out a season-high eight batters in a season-low 4.0 innings in his first start April 9 against Oklahoma City and took the loss...tossed his lone complete game of the season in the second game of an April 20 doubleheader at Colorado Springs, an 8-1 win (7.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 5 so)...made his only relief appearance April 25 against New Orleans in a game started by Henderson Alvarez on a rehab assignment (4.2 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...allowed a season-high seven runs on a season high 11 hits in a 7-6 loss to Memphis May 6...began his nine-game winning streak May 17 against Fresno when he matched his season-high with eight strikeouts...allowed just one run in 6.2 innings then allowed one run in 6.0 innings in his next start May 23 at Las Vegas...walked a season-high four batters in 5.0 innings May 28 at Salt Lake...matched his season-high with four walks June 10 at Oklahoma City...tossed 6.0 shutout innings that day, allowed two unearned runs in his next start and then logged 7.1 scoreless innings in his final start before his first promotion on June 20 at Round Rock...went 4-0 with a 0.99 ERA in four starts in June...allowed a run in the second inning of his first start following his return on July 5 at Memphis, snapping a 26.1-inning streak without allowing an earned run...surrendered a lead-off home run to Isaac Galloway in the seventh inning on July 10 against New Orleans, snapping a nine-game, 64.0-inning, 264-batter Triple-A homerless streak...matched his season high with eight strikeouts and did not walk a batter in a no decision on July 24 against Omaha.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Was the A's second round selection in the 2013 First-Year Player Draft but did not pitch until 2014 after undergoing "Tommy John" surgery...is the first A's pick from that draft to reach the majors (Ryon Healy is the second)...made his Major League debut June 25 at Los Angeles (AL) after just 53 minor league appearances, including 50 starts, in three professional seasons...had not pitched above Double-A prior to this year...is 17-13 with a 3.14 ERA (93 er in 266.2 ip) in 56 games, including 53 starts, as a minor leaguer...has walked just 54 batters in 266.2 innings, an average of 1.86 per nine innings...led the A's farm system in ERA (3.43) in 2015...was rated as the A's eighth best prospect by *Baseball America* following the 2014 and 2015 seasons.

RHP Sonny Gray (5-10, 5.84 ERA):	Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 5 and is 2-5 with a 5.57 ERA in 11 starts since his return...was placed on the DL May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA in nine starts before going on the DL...has a 5.84 ERA, which is the highest in the majors...has 15 wild pitches, which is five more than any other pitcher...has the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.348) and slugging percentage (.488) in the American League (.348) and the fourth highest opponents batting average (.288)...was the losing pitcher in his last start, an 8-0 loss at Cleveland on Sunday (3.1 ip, 7 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...it was his 10th loss of the season, which matches his career high from 2014...has never faced the Cubs in his career...is 0-2 with a 4.58 ERA in three interleague starts this year and 3-4 with a 3.61 ERA in 11 career appearances, including 10 starts.
