COMEBACK KIDS: The Chicago Cubs, owners of the best record in baseball and winners of four-straight games, tonight play the first of three contests against the Oakland Athletics following Wednesday's ninth inning come-from-behind victory to complete a three-game sweep of the Miami Marlins at Wrigley Field ... Chicago, down 4-2 in the ninth, plated three runs off closer A.J. Ramos including the winning run on a wild pitch that plated Matt Szczur.

© Wednesday's walk-off victory completed a 7-1 homestand against the White Sox (2-0), Mariners (2-1) and Marlins (3-0) ... Chicago's nine series sweeps this season are tied for the most in baseball with Cleveland and Detroit.

© The Cubs won two of their last four games on the homestand in walk off fashion, including Sunday evening's 7-6 win vs. Seattle that ended on a Jon Lester walk-off bunt to plate Jason Heyward, followed by Wednesday's comeback win.

THE LAST 20: Chicago is 14-6 in its last 20 contests dating to July 10 following a stretch in which the team was 5-15 in 20 games from June 20 to July 9 ... the team is hitting .255 (48-for-188) with runners in scoring position in the last 20 games, 85 points higher than its .170 mark (28-for-165) in the previous 20 contests.

© Chicago pitching has recorded a 2.65 ERA (53 ER/180.1 IP) in its last 20 games, including a 2.96 ERA (41 ER/124.2 IP) from the starters and a 1.94 ERA (12 ER/55.2 IP) from the bullpen ... in the previous 20 games, the team had a 5.63 ERA (112 ER/179.0 IP), including a 5.96 ERA (70 ER/105.2 IP) from the starters and a 5.15 mark (42 ER/73.1 IP) from the bullpen.

HEAD WEST, YOUNG MEN: Remarkably, this trip to play the A's marks the first time the Cubs have been west of Chicago in over two full months since series in San Francisco and St. Louis, May 20-25 ... including this series against the A's, Chicago's next two road trips are against teams out West ... Chicago's following trip is a nine-gamer at Colorado, San Diego and Los Angeles, August 19-28.

© The flight to Oakland following Wednesday's game was Chicago's first team flight since finishing the "first half" of the season, July 10 in Pittsburgh ... Chicago emerged from the All-Star break with 14 of its first 19 games at home, with the five road contests needing just short bus rides to Milwaukee against the Brewers and to the south side of Chicago against the White Sox.

© Overall, the Cubs play 24 of their first 32 games after the break at home after heading into the break playing only four of their final 18 games at home.

INTERLEAGUE INTERLUDE: Chicago is 13-7 in its last 20 interleague games dating to July 12 of 2015, including an 8-4 record this season ... the Cubs have played 307 interleague games and have posted a 148-159 (.482) record ... that includes 65-85 record on the road.

© Cubs designated hitters have batted .118 (2-for-17) with two RBI in four games this season ... all told, Cubs DHs have recorded a .272 average (162-for-596) with 25 homers and 102 RBI in 150 interleague road games.

YOU GO, WE GO: Dexter Fowler on Tuesday night reached safely three times in a game for the 24th time this season, tied for sixth-most in the N.L. despite missing 28 games due to a hamstring strain from June 20-July 22 ... teammate Anthony Rizzo is tied for third in the N.L., reaching three times in a game 25 times, including Wednesday.

© The Cubs are 20-4 when Fowler reaches base safely at least twice in a game ... the team is 33-8 when Fowler scores at least one run.

© Fowler has scored a run in six-straight games (nine runs total), his longest such streak since an eight-game run in 2012.

DISCERNING EYES: The Cubs have averaged just over four walks per game since the All-Star break, collecting 77 free passes in 19 games ... their 77 free passes in the season's "second half" lead the majors, three ahead of Milwaukee ... Chicago has drawn at least five walks in eight games since the break, going 8-0 in those contests.

© On the season, Chicago leads the majors with 452 walks, well ahead of Toronto, who is second with 413 walks ... the next-closest N.L. team is Milwaukee, who has drawn 393 free passes.

© Ben Zobrist ranks fifth in the N.L. with 62 walks, Anthony Rizzo is tied for sixth with 58 free passes and Kris Bryant is tied for eighth with 52 walks.

QUITE THE DIFFERENCE: Chicago's +171 run differential is by far the highest in the majors ... Washington is second at +136 ... the Cubs have allowed the fewest runs in the majors (371) while plating the fourth-most in the majors (542) behind the Red Sox (584), Rockies (557) and Cardinals (543).

© Chicago's current +171 run differential ties its season high, also reached following a 10-5 win over the Pirates on June 19 ... the team last had a run differential greater than +171 following their final game of the 2008 campaign (+184) ... thanks to Ed Hartig.

HAVING HIMSELF A SEASON: Kyle Hendricks on Monday tossed his second career shutout and lowered his season ERA to 2.22, second-best in the majors behind only the Dodgers Clayton Kershaw (1.79) ... he's allowed three or fewer earned runs in each of his last 13 starts dating to May 22, posting a 1.63 ERA (15 ER/82.2 IP) in those outings.

IN THE BULLPEN: Via Fangraphs, the Cubs has five pitchers in the bullpen with an average fastball velocity of at least 94 miles per hour this season: Aroldis Chapman (100.1), Hector Rondon (95.9), Carl Edwards Jr. (95.1), Pedro Strop (94.8) and Justin Grimm (94.3).

© Travis Wood has stranded 27 of 30 inherited runners, good for a 90.0 percent success rate, third-best in the N.L. ... San Francisco's Josh Osich leads with a 95.0 percent success rate (38/40) ... Wood is tied for fourth in the majors with 53 appearances this season, two behind the major league leaders.

THAT'S A DYNAMIC DUO: Kris Bryant is tied for third in the N.L. with 26 home runs while teammate Anthony Rizzo is seventh with 24 homers ... Bryant's 26 homers equal the amount he hit during his 2015 N.L. Rookie of the Year campaign ... the two have combined for 108 of Chicago's 343 extra-base hits ... Rizzo's 57 extra-base hits are second in the N.L. while Bryant's 51 extra-base hits rank 10th.

IT WOULD BE ACCURATE TO SAY HE'S RAKING: Anthony Rizzo has hit safely in 47 of his last 57 contests since May 29 ... he's batted .335 (70-for-209) with 21 doubles, two triples, 13 homers and 44 RBI in those last 57 games, and his 36 extra-base hits are tied for the most in the majors in that span with Minnesota's Brian Dozier.

© Rizzo has 79 RBI this season, fourth in the N.L. and seventh in the majors ... his 79 RBI prior to August 1 are the most by a Cub through the end of July since Derrek Lee had 83 RBI through July of 2005.

ON THE RECORD: At 66-41, the Cubs have the best record in the majors yet are just one game over .500 in their last 53 games starting June 5 (27-26) ... however, the Cubs have lost no ground in the division in that time, entering today with a 9.5-game lead just as they did when this stretch began ... going back a bit further, the Cubs have actually seen their division lead grow from 5.0 games on May 24 to 9.5 games today.

2016 Season

Jon tonight makes his 22nd start this season and 12th on the road ... has posted a 1.99 ERA (15 ER/68.0 IP) in 10 home starts, all quality efforts ... has a 4.03 ERA (27 ER/60.1 IP) in 11 road starts.

- ⊙ Finished June with a 4-0 record and a 1.41 ERA (7 ER/44.2 IP) in six starts, his best-career ERA in the month of June ... was named N.L. Pitcher of the Month.
- ⊙ Limiting righties to a .225 average (82-for-364) and lefties to a .208 mark (22-for-106) ... overall, opponents are hitting just .221 against the lefty.
- ⊙ He has allowed three or fewer earned runs in 17 of his 21 starts, including 13 starts with one or fewer earned runs allowed.
- ⊙ Jon strands 83.5 percent of runners on base, which ranks among the N.L. leaders (according to Fangraphs).
- ⊙ Threw 7.0 innings of four-hit, one-run baseball in his season opener vs. Los Angeles (A.L.), April 5 ... did not allow a walk.
- ⊙ Took a no-hitter into the seventh inning against Pittsburgh on May 15 and finished by allowing only one run on two hits over 6.2 IP.
- ⊙ Tossed at least 7.0 IP with one run allowed in three consecutive starts: April 17-29.
- ⊙ Has fanned 10 batters three times: April 17 vs. Colorado, April 29 vs. Atlanta and June 1 vs. the Dodgers.
- ⊙ Allowed one run or fewer in a career-high tying four-straight starts (April 17-May 4) ... also accomplished the feat August 28-September 14, 2008.
- ⊙ Punched out 26 batters and allowed zero walks in a three start span from June 1-12 ... the first Cubs pitcher to accomplish the feat since Jon Lieber fanned 27 and walked none in a three-start stretch, September 20-October 1, 1999.
- ⊙ Earned the win in five-straight starts, May 27-June 18, which was the second-longest streak of his career (six-straight starts, August 27-September 25, 2010).
- ⊙ Went 2-1 with a 1.83 ERA in five April starts ... set career bests for the month of April in ERA, opponents batting average (.207) and opponents OBP (.250).
- ⊙ Tossed his 13th-career complete game, June 1 vs. the Dodgers ... became the first Cubs pitcher to allow a leadoff homer then not allow another run in a complete game effort since Larry French, July 26, 1940 at the Giants ... was his first career complete game with 10 or more strikeouts and no walks ... retired his final 15 batters following a single to lead off the fifth inning.
- ⊙ Was named a National League All Star by Manager Terry Collins ... pitched 0.2 IP in relief, did not allow a hit and walked a batter.
- ⊙ Saw his ERA rise by nearly an entire run over a two-start stretch, July 3 at the Mets (8 ER/1.1 IP) and July 9 at Pittsburgh (5 ER/3.0 IP) ... finished July with a 7.36 ERA (18 ER/22.0 IP) in five starts.

Career vs. Athletics

Jon tonight faces the Athletics for the first time since he was a member of the A's during the final two months of the 2014 campaign ... overall, he has gone 5-4 with a 3.64 ERA (34 ER/84.0 IP) in 14 starts against Oakland ... struck out a career-high 15 batters May 3, 2014 vs. the A's at Fenway Park.

Career Notes

Jon tonight makes his 54th-career start with the Cubs ... owns a 138-83 record with a 3.51 ERA (753 ER/1,929.1 IP) in 306 games, all but one as a starter, with Boston (2006-14), Oakland (2014) and the Cubs (2015-16) ... signed a six-year deal with Chicago in December of 2014.

- ⊙ Has gone 22-16 with two complete games and a 3.19 ERA (118 ER/333.1 IP) in 53 starts with the Cubs ... has struck out 332 and walked just 85.
- ⊙ A four-time All-Star (including 2016) and two-time World Series Champion, he has twice finished fourth in A.L. Cy Young Award voting, doing so in 2010 and 2014.
- ⊙ Has surpassed the 200.0 inning mark four-straight seasons and in seven of the last eight ... has reached 31 starts in a season eight times.
- ⊙ Fanned 207 batters last season, setting a Cubs single-season franchise record for most strikeouts by a left-handed pitcher.
- ⊙ He ranks second among active left-handed pitchers with 138 wins, fourth with 1,789 strikeouts and fifth with 8.35 strikeouts per nine innings ... also ranks third with 0.83 home runs per nine innings.
- ⊙ Was named National League Player of the Week for June 6-12, 2016 after going 2-0 without yielding a run in 15.0 innings pitched.

Saturday's Starter at Oakland — RHP Jake Arrieta (12-5, 2.75)

Jake makes his 22nd start of the season tomorrow as the Cubs continue their three-game set against Oakland ... last time out, July 30 vs. Seattle, he cruised through his first 7.0 innings, allowing just two hits and no runs ... walked two batters to lead off the eighth, both of which came around to score as the Cubs lost 4-1 ... the Cubs have lost the last five games he has started ... he has gone 4-3 with a 1.71 ERA (12 ER/63.0 IP) in 10 home starts compared to 8-2 with a 3.66 ERA (29 ER/71.1 IP) in 11 road starts.

⊙ Has gone 0-2 with a 4.61 ERA (7 ER/13.2 IP) in three games (two starts) against the Athletics, most recently during the 2012 season with Baltimore.

⊙ Jake's no-hitter April 21 at Cincinnati was the 15th in Cubs history and the first since his first career no-hitter just 10 starts prior (August 30, 2015 at the Dodgers), the third shortest span between no-no's in major league history ... became the fourth reigning Cy Young Award winner to throw a no-hitter.
