OAKLAND ATHLETICS (48-61) VS. CHICAGO CUBS (67-41)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost six of their last seven games to fall a season-high tying 13 games under .500 for the seventh time this year (last: 47-60 on August 3)...are 48-61 (.440), which is the third worst record in the American League...it matches the A's record after 109 games last year (lost game 110)...went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 20-20 (.500) since then...are 10-10 since the All-Star Break...are in fifth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 40 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 27 days in fifth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's are 5-10 (.333) in interleague play (1-3 vs. Milwaukee, 1-2 vs. Cincinnati, 3-1 vs. San Francisco, 0-3 vs. Pittsburgh, 0-1 vs. Chicago), which is tied with St. Louis for the second worst record in the majors (Cincinnati, 4-11)...with one more loss, will clinch their first losing record against the National League since 2010 (8-10)...have just five losing records in the previous 19 years of

interleague play...have lost more than 10 interleague games just once and that was in 2009 when they went 5-13...after this three-game series with the Cubs, the A's conclude interleague play with a three-game series at St. Louis Aug. 26-28...are 196-163 (.546) all-time in interleague play, which is sixth best in Major League history.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than five innings in five of the last six games and 34 times this year...that is the most in the majors and second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (35 in 2009)...are 0-4 with a 13.11 ERA (34 er in 23.1 ip) over that span and have allowed at least five runs in each game...the streak of six consecutive games with five or more runs allowed by the starting pitchers is tied for third longest in Oakland history and is one short of the record of 7 (May 18-25, 1982 and July 3-12 1997)...starters are 28-46 with a 5.26 ERA (342 er in 585.1 ip) for the season...the ERA is the highest in the majors, the innings pitched are the fewest in the American League and the losses are tied for the most in the AL...have the second fewest wins in the AL...have finished the season with an ERA of 5.00 or more four times in Oakland history, all over a five-year span from 1993-97.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed a home run in a season-high 11 consecutive games (22 home runs total)...have compiled a 6.53 ERA (37 er in 51.0 ip) over the last six games and have allowed 14 home runs...now have a 4.71 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second most wild pitches (55), the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.333) and the third highest opponents batting average (.270) and slugging percentage (.435).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .254 (176-for-692) with 30 home runs since the All-Star Break...are tied for second in the American League in post-break home runs...for the season, rank last in the AL in on-base percentage (.306), second in fewest walks (277) and fewest strikeouts (742) and fourth in lowest slugging percentage (.405)...are on pace for 411 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed five errors in the last four games after making one over the previous 10 contests...have 69 errors for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...A's outfielders have 14 assists, which is tied with Detroit for the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 13).

CLOSE CALLS: Three of the A's last four home wins and four of their last eight road losses have been walk-offs...the A's are 6-7 in walk-off games... are tied for second in the American League in walk-off games (Houston, 14) and tied for third in walk-off wins...are 13-11 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for fourth in the AL in last at bat wins...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied with Kansas City and Texas for the most in the majors...had just five such wins all last year...

have won seven of their last 11 one-run games but are 16-17 (.485) for the season...rank fourth in the AL in one-run games (33)...the A's have won each of their last three extra inning games and are 5-3 (.625) in extra innings

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-1 on this 10-game homestand against Chicago-NL (0-1), Baltimore (four games) and Seattle (three games)...it is the A's second consecutive 10-game homestand as they went 7-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (3-1)...are 24-30 (.444) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and are 24-31 (.436) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 12-11 since then...are batting .260 (504-for-1939) on the road compared to .242 (433-for-1789) at home...have the fourth best road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home batting average...have a 5.32 ERA (281 er in 475.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.12 (225 er in 492.0 ip) at home.

THIS AND THAT: A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (18), RBI (13) and plate appearances (81)...A's designated hitters are last in the AL in RBI (42) and have the third lowest batting average (.224)... the A's have lost 12 of the last 15 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 12-17 (.414) in games against left-handed starters for the season, which is the second worst record in the AL (Seattle, 15-24)... the A's have lost the first game in each of the last five series but are 19-17 in series openers for the season...the A's have scored 44 of their 82 runs since the All-Star Break with two outs (53.7%)

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list 24 times this year, which is one short of the Oakland record of 25 set in 2008...the 24 players have combined to miss 1084 games (45.2 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record...the current mark is 1397 in 2010...currently have a season-high 13 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Hahn, Lambo, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard)...today is the 18th day the A's have at least 13 players on the DL...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least six players on the DL all year and at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. CUBS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2016 last night and are now 4-6 against the Cubs during the regular season...that includes 2-2 in Oakland and 2-4 in Chicago...this is the fourth series between the two clubs... the A's won two of three in their last meeting in Oakland in 2013...lost two of three in each of their two meetings in Chicago in 2004 and 2010...the two clubs have also met twice in the World Series, with the A's winning in five games in both 1910 and 1929.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .448 with runners in scoring position...started the season 0-for-9 with RISP but is 26-for-49 (.531) since then...Ryan Dull has a 1.11 ERA (4 er in 32.1 ip) and .125 (14-for-112) opponents batting average over his last 32 games...opponents are 3-for-57 (.053) with runners in scoring position...Liam Hendriks has a 1.57 ERA (4 er in 23.0 ip) and .190 (16-for-84) opponents batting average in 18 games since he was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list on June 19...Marcus Semien ranks second among ML shortstops in home runs (22) and fourth among AL shortstops in RBI (53)...Jake Smolinski has not committed an error in 135 career games as an outfielder (including 83 with Oakland).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1923 Joe Hauser has five hits and Sammy Hale and Bing Miller add four each as the A's collect 22 hits in a 14-4 win over Chicago...in 1933 Pinky Higgins hits for the cycle in the A's 12-8 win over the Washington Senators...in 2001 the A's defeat the Tigers 6-3 to complete a four-game sweep of Detroit, their first four-game sweep of the Tigers since July 1-3, 1955

FOR STARTERS: Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list June 5 and is 2-5 with a 5.57 ERA (39 er in 63.0 ip) in 11 starts since his return...was placed on the DL May 22 retroactive to May 21 with a strained right trapezius...was 3-5 with a 6.19 ERA in nine starts before going on the DL.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has a 5.84 ERA, which is the highest in the majors (Locke, PIT 5.63)...has 15 wild pitches, which is five more than any other pitcher...has the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.348) and slugging percentage (.488) in the American

League (.348) and the fourth highest opponents batting average (.288)...is also tied for fourth in the AL in most runs (78).

CAREER HIGHS: Was charged with his 10th loss of the season in his last start, which matches his career high from 2014...allowed his 18th home run in his last start, which is a new career high (17 in 2015)...has matched his career high with 15 wild pitches...his 72 earned runs are three short of his career high (75 in 2014) and his 78 runs are six short (84 in 2014)... his 5.84 ERA is more than 2½ runs higher than his previous high (3.08 in 2014).

THE BIG INNING: Has allowed six runs in an inning once this year, five runs three times and four runs twice...when you combine the single biggest inning of his 20 starts, he has allowed 56 of his 78 runs for a 27.00 ERA (52 er in 17.1 ip)...has a 1.92 ERA (20 er in 93.2 ip) in all other innings.

LAST 16 STARTS: Is 2-9 with a 6.80 ERA (64 er in 84.2 ip) and .303 (105-for-346) opponents batting average over his last 16 starts after going 3-1 with a 2.73 ERA and .232 opponents batting average over his first four starts...had a career-high seven-game losing streak from April 27 to July 6, which was the longest by an A's pitcher since Tyson Ross had an eight-game losing streak from May 19-Sept. 24, 2012...had a 6.16 ERA and .293 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 12 starts from April 27 to July 6...the streak of 12 consecutive starts without a win tied for second longest by an A's starter this century (13, Braden, April 29-Sept. 29, 2007; 12, Bassitt, Aug. 9, 2015-April 28, 2016).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 0-2 with a 4.58 ERA (19.2 ip, 19 h, 11 r, 10 er, 3 bb, 15 so, 1 hr) in three interleague starts this year...is now 3-4 with a 3.61 ERA (27 er in 67.1 ip) in 11 career interleague appearances, including 10 starts.

IN JULY: Went 2-4 with a 7.79 ERA in six starts in July...the losses tied for the most in the American League and it marked the second time in his career he lost four games in a month (Aug. 2014)...the ERA was second highest in the majors (Wisler, ATL 8.89) and second highest of his career (9.61 in May 2016)...had single-month career highs in hits (41), runs (28), earned runs (28) and home runs (7).

SPOTS IN THE ORDER: The eight and nine hitters in the order are batting a combined .477 (41-for-86) with seven home runs and 21 RBI, while the four and five hitters are hitting a combined .191 (18-for-94) with two home runs and 11 RBI...the eight hitter is batting .489 (22-for-45) and the nine hitter is hitting .463 (19-for-41), both of which are the highest marks in the majors among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title...the five hitter is hitting .163 (8-for-49), which is third lowest in the AL.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has yielded a .340 (34-for-100) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is tied for the highest mark in the majors among pitchers that qualify for the ERA title (Smyly, TB)...opponents are batting .475 (28-for-59) with five doubles and five home runs (.814 slugging percentage) when putting the first pitch in play...the batting average is second highest in the American League and the slugging percentage is fifth highest...has allowed a .311 (33-for-106) batting average with four doubles, a triple and seven home runs (.566 slugging percentage) to batters leading off an inning...the slugging percentage is fourth highest in the AL...opponents are batting .227 (37-for-163) the first time through the lineup and .324 (90-for-278) after that...has surrendered 12 of his 18 home runs to right-handed hitters (.543 slugging percentage by righties, .432 by lefties)...11 have been solo shots.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-8 with a 6.66 ERA (54 er in 73.0 ip) in 13 starts at night compared to 2-2 with a 4.26 ERA (18 er in 38.0 ip) in seven starts during the day...is tied for third in the American League in night losses... over the last two years, he is 7-4 with a 2.74 ERA (30 er in 98.2 ip) in 16 starts during the day, 12-13 with a 4.29 ERA (105 er in 220.1 ip) in 35 starts at night.

DAY REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 2-8 with a 6.50 ERA (46 er in 63.2 ip) in 12 starts on four days rest compared to 3-2 with a 4.94 ERA (26 er in 47.1 ip) in eight starts on five days rest or more.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.93 ERA (13 er in 40.0 ip) and .192 (28-for-146) opponents batting average over the first two innings of the game compared to a 7.48 ERA (59 er in 71.0 ip) and .336 (99-for-295) opponents average from the third inning on.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Is 2-2 with an 8.85 ERA (20 er in 20.1 ip) in four starts since the All-Star Break after going 3-8 with a 5.16 ERA in 16 starts before the break...the eight losses were two more than his combined pre-All-Star Break total from the previous two seasons (20-6, 2.42 ERA in 37 starts)...is now 23-14 with a 3.13 ERA in 54 career appearances before the All-Star Break compared to 15-16 with a 3.81 ERA (110 er in 260.0 ip) in 42 games after the break.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 8-0 loss at Cleveland last Sunday...allowed a career-high tying seven runs for the fifth time this year and seventh time in his career...the five starts with seven or more runs match the most in Oakland history in one season (seventh time, last: Redman and Mulder in 2004)...retired the side in order in the first two innings but then allowed five runs in the third on a Kipnis two-run single, a Lindor sacrifice fly and a Napoli two-run home run...allowed a RBI single to Perez in the fourth and was relieved by Coulombe with one out...Coulombe allowed one inherited runner to score.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Sean Manaea (3-6, 4.68 ERA): Is 1-2 with a 3.14 ERA in seven games, including six starts, since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 29...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...ranks second among American League rookies in strikeouts (79), innings pitched (92.1) and games started (15)...is 0-1 despite a 2.51 ERA over his last five games... has just eight runs of support over that span (2.23 RSA)...is 3-2 with a 3.39 ERA in 10 games at home compared to 0-4 with a 6.88 ERA in six starts on the road...has held left-handed hitters to a .183 batting average, which is third lowest in the AL among pitchers with 90 or more innings...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-4 loss at Los Angeles last Tuesday (5.2 ip, 6 h, 5 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 4 so)...has never faced the Cubs in his career...is 1-1 with a 3.55 ERA in two career interleague starts.

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.12 ERA (18 er in 76.1 ip) and .186 (51for-274) opponents batting average since the All-Star Break...logged a 4.30 ERA and .258 opponents average before the break.
- Has tossed 382.0 innings, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 388.1).
- Has allowed 43-of-185 (23.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 22.2%).
- Is tied for second in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (36), ranks fourth in strikeouts (357) and opponents on-base percentage (.306) and tied for fourth in wins (20)...ranks second in most wild pitches (25), tied for third in blown saves (15) and tied for fifth in home runs (45).
- Ranks second in the AL in first batter on-base percentage (.277), slugging percentage (.324) and strikeouts (88) and is fourth in batting average (.227).
