OAKLAND ATHLETICS (48-62) VS. CHICAGO CUBS (68-41)

ABOUT THE A'S: The A's have lost two straight and seven of their last eight games to fall a season-high 14 games under .500 at 48-62 (.436)... that is the third worst record in the American League and it matches the A's record after 110 games last year (won game 111)...with a loss today, the A's would have their worst record after 111 games since 1997 (43-68)... went 13-12 (.520) in April, 15-29 (.341) over a 44-game stretch from May 1 to June 19 and are 20-21 (.488) since then...are 10-11 since the All-Star Break...are in fifth place in the AL West and have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 40 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 28 days in fifth.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Sonny Gray on the 15-day disabled list today and have now used the DL an Oakland record tying 25 times (also 2008)...the 25 players have combined to miss 1097 games (43.9 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record...the current mark is 1397 in 2010...now have a season-high 14 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hahn, Lambo, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard), including 10 on the 60-day DL (all but Doolittle, Gray, Hahn and Lowrie)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's have clinched a losing record in interleague games for the first time since 2010 (8-10) and just the sixth time in 20 years of interleague play...are 5-11 (1-3 vs. Milwaukee, 1-2 vs. Cincinnati, 3-1 vs. San Francisco, 0-3 vs. Pittsburgh, 0-2 vs. Chicago), which is the second worst record in the majors (Cincinnati, 4-11)...the 11 losses are second most in Oakland history to the 2009

club, which went 5-13...after this three-game series with the Cubs, the A's conclude interleague play with a three-game series at St. Louis Aug. 26-28...are 196-164 (.544) all-time in interleague games, which is sixth best in Maior League history.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have tossed fewer than six innings in each of the last seven games and are 0-5 with an 11.44 ERA (36 er in 28.1 ip) and .403 (54-for-134) opponents batting average over that span...now have a 5.24 ERA (344 er in 590.1 ip) for the season, which is the highest in the majors...have finished the season with an ERA of 5.00 or more four times in Oakland history (5.94 in 1997, 5.57 in 1996, 5.31 in 1995, 5.19 in 1993)...have tossed fewer than five innings in five of the last seven games and 34 times this year...that is the most in the majors and second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (35 in 2009)...have 590.1 innings pitched for the season, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...are tied for the most losses in the AL (47) and have the second fewest wins (28)

PITCHING: The A's did not allow a home run yesterday to snap their season-high streak of 11 consecutive games with a home run (22 home runs total)...have compiled a 6.15 ERA (41 er in 60.0 ip) over the last seven games and now have a 4.70 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second most wild pitches (55), the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.332) and the third highest opponents batting average (.226970) and slugging percentage (.433).

OFFENSE: The A's were shutout for the second time in the last six games and the fourth time in the last 26 contests yesterday...are batting .242 (214-for-886) with 98 runs scored over that span (3.8 runs per game)... have been blanked seven times for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...rank last in the AL in on-base percentage (.305), second in fewest walks (278) and fewest strikeouts (747) and fourth in lowest slugging percentage (.403) and fewest runs scored (448)...are on pace for 409 walks, which would break the Athletics record for fewest walks in a 162-game season (421 in 1966).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors in the last five games after making one over the previous 10 contests...have 70 errors for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...A's outfielders have 14 assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 13).

CLOSE CALLS: Three of the A's last four home wins and four of their last eight road losses have been walk-offs...the A's are 6-7 in walk-off games... are tied for second in the American League in walk-off games (Houston, 14) and tied for third in walk-off wins...are 13-11 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for fourth in the AL in last at bat wins...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied with Kansas City and Texas for the most in the majors...had just five such wins all last year... have won seven of their last 11 one-run games but are 16-17 (.485) for the season...rank fourth in the AL in one-run games (33)...have won each of their last three extra inning games and are 5-3 (.625) in extra innings

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this 10-game homestand against Chicago-NL (0-2), Baltimore (four games) and Seattle (three games)...it is the A's second consecutive 10-game homestand as they went 7-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (3-1)...are 24-31 (.436) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and are 24-31 (.436) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 12-11 since then...are batting .260 (504-for-1939) on the road compared to .240 (437-for-1819) at home...have the fourth best road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home batting average...have a 5.32 ERA (281 er in 475.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.11 (229 er in 501.0 ip) at home.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have lost the final game in 11 of the last 15 series and are 12-23 in the final game of a series...have lost the first game in each of the last five series but are 19-17 in series openers for the season...A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (18), RBI (13) and plate appearances (82)...A's designated hitters are last in the AL in RBI (42) and have the second lowest batting average (.224)...the A's have lost 12 of the last 15 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 12-17 (.414) in games against left-handed starters for the season, which is the second worst record in the AL (Seattle, 16-24)... the A's have scored 44 of their 82 runs since the All-Star Break with two outs (53.7%).

A's vs. CUBS: The A's have lost the first two games of 2016 and are now 4-7 against the Cubs during the regular season...that includes 2-3 in Oakland and 2-4 in Chicago...this is the fourth series between the two clubs... the A's won two of three in their last meeting in Oakland in 2013...lost two of three in each of their two meetings in Chicago in 2004 and 2010...the two clubs have also met twice in the World Series, with the A's winning in five games in both 1910 and 1929.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .448 with runners in scoring position...started the season 0-for-9 with RISP but is 26-for-49 (.531) since then...Khris Davis has matched his career highs in home runs (27) and RBI (69)...Ryan Dull has a 1.11 ERA (4 er in 32.1 ip) and .125 (14-for-112) opponents batting average over his last 32 games... opponents are 3-for-57 (.053) with runners in scoring position...Marcus Semien has career highs in home runs (22) and RBI (53)...ranks second among ML shortstops in home runs and fourth among American League shortstops in RBI (53)...Jake Smolinski has not committed an error in 136 career games as an outfielder (including 84 with Oakland).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1968 Joe Keough homers in his first major league at bat off New York's Lindy McDaniel at Yankee Stadium...in 1971 Vida Blue becomes Oakland's first 20-game winner when he shuts out the White Sox 1-0 on a five hitter at the Coliseum...he would go on to win 24 games and the American League MVP and Cy Young awards.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sean Manaea (3-6, 4.68 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is 1-2 with a 3.14 ERA (15 er in 43.0 ip) in seven games, including six starts, since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 29...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...made one start on a rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton June 24 against San Jose and had a no decision (3.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 3 so, 1 hr, 64 pitches)...was selected from Triple-A Nashville April 29 and is making his Major League debut.

DON'T WALK: Walked Yunel Escobar with two outs in the fifth inning of his last start to snap a streak of four games, 30.2 innings and 126 batters faced without a walk...the streak of 30.2 innings without a walk was the longest single season streak in Oakland history, topping the previous mark of 29.0 by Lary Sorensen (July 8-31, 1984)...it was fifth longest overall in Oakland history...has walked just seven batters in 43.0 innings (1.47 per nine innings) since he was reinstated from the DL June 29...has 39 strike-outs over that span for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 5.57...had 40 strikeouts and 16 walks in 49.1 innings before going on the DL (2.50 strikeout-to-walk ratio).

ROOKIE LEADERS: Ranks second among American League rookies in strikeouts (79), innings pitched (92.1) and games started (15) and tied for 10th in wins (3).

RUN SUPPORT: Is 0-1 despite a 2.51 ERA (9 er in 32.1 ip) over his last five games...has just eight runs of support over that span (2.23 RSA)...has received two runs of support or fewer in 11 of his 15 starts and seven runs or more in three of his starts.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-2 with a 3.39 ERA (22 er in 58.1 ip) and .242 (53-for-219) opponents batting average in 10 games at home compared to 0-4 with a 6.88 ERA (26 er in 34.0 ip) and .317 (45-for-142) opponents average in six starts on the road...is the second pitcher in Oakland history to start his career with a losing streak of four or more games on the road...the other is Mike Morgan, who lost each of his first six road starts from June 17, 1978-July 24, 1979...has surrendered nine home runs in 34.0 innings on the road (2.38 per nine innings), five in 58.1 innings in Oakland (0.77 per nine innings)...has a .924 OPS on the road, .667 at home.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on four days rest today...is 1-1 with a 2.97 ERA (13 er in 39.1 ip) in six starts on four days rest, 2-5 with a 6.19 ERA (33 er in 48.0 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-1 with a 3.64 ERA (12 er in 29.2 ip) in five games during the day compared to 2-5 with a 5.17 ERA (36 er in 62.2 ip) in 11 starts at night...has surrendered two home runs in 29.2 innings during the day (0.61 per nine innings), 12 in 62.2 innings at night (1.72 per nine innings).

INNING BY INNING: Has a 2.51 ERA (13 er in 46.2 ip) and .227 (39-for-172) opponents batting average over innings one through three and a 6.90 ERA (35 er in 45.2 ip) and .312 (59-for-189) opponents batting average from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has held left-handed hitters to a .183 (13-for-71) batting average and four extra base hits (two doubles, two home runs)... right-handers are batting .293 (85-for-290) with 12 of his 14 home runs and 19 of his 23 walks...the batters average against lefties is third lowest in the American League among pitchers with 90 or more innings and his .533 OPS is fifth lowest...has an .825 OPS against righties...nine of his 14 home runs have come with runners on base...opponents are batting .211 (16-for-76) with runners in scoring position, including .171 (6-for-35) with RISP and two outs...has a .217 (30-for-138) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .277 (36-for-130) the second time and .344 (32-for-93) after that...has allowed a .442 (19-for-43) batting average to the opponents number four hitter, which is the highest in the majors among pitchers with 90 or more innings...the nine hitter is 4-for-33 (.121), which is third lowest in the AL...opponents are 28-for-61 (.459) with seven doubles, five home runs and 18 RBI when putting the first pitch in play.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Is 1-1 with a 3.55 ERA (12.2 ip, 12 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 10 so) in two career interleague starts, both this year.

2016 START-BY-START: He had a no decision in his Major League debut, a 7-4 A's win over Houston *April* 29 in Oakland...had just 42 minor league appearances, all starts, in three professional seasons...became the 45th pitcher in Oakland history to start in his ML debut, the first since Dan Straily on Aug. 3, 2012 against Toronto...issued a career-high four walks...had his second consecutive no decision in the A's 9-8 loss to Seattle in Oakland on *May* 4...left with an 8-4 lead but the bullpen allowed two runs in the sixth inning and three more in the seventh for the blown save (Axford)... had the first decision of his career, a loss in the A's 13-5 loss at Boston *May* 10...yielded a career-high eight runs on 10 hits in a career-low 2.2 in-

nings...became just the second pitcher in Oakland history to allow at least four runs in each of his first three Major League appearances...the other is Vida Blue (July 20-Aug. 3, 1969)...picked up his first Major League win in the A's 3-1 victory over Texas *May 16* in Oakland...shutout the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first six innings...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss to New York (AL) in Oakland on May 21 ... retired each of the first nine batters he faced before allowing the first four batters to reach base and score in the fourth inning...lost his second consecutive start in the A's 4-1 loss to Detroit May 27 in Oakland...left after six innings trailing 3-0 as the A's were shutout on three hits over the first eight innings...picked up the second win of his career in the A's 5-1 win over Minnesota June 1 in Oakland...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his only run in the sixth inning on an Escobar sacrifice fly...was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-4 loss at Milwaukee June 7...surrendered a two-run home run to Carter in the second inning and a three-run home run to Carter in the sixth...had a no decision in the A's 14-5 win over Texas on June 13 in Oakland...had a 10-2 lead when he left the game after 4.1 innings with a left pronator muscle strain... went on the DL the next day...was the winning pitcher in the A's 7-1 victory over San Francisco *June* 29 in Oakland...did not allow a run in 5.2 innings for the first scoreless outing of his career...was the losing pitcher in the A's 11-4 loss at Minnesota July 5...was trailing 3-1 when he yielded a two-run home run to Vargas a solo home run to Kepler on consecutive pitches in the fifth inning...had a no decision in the A's 2-1, 10-inning loss at Houston on July 10...tossed a career-high 106 pitches in 7.0 innings and did not allow a run or walk a batter...made his first career relief appearance in the A's 5-3 loss to Toronto *July 17* in Oakland and had a no decision...entered the game to start the second inning in relief of Andrew Triggs, who left the game with a left shin contusion...Triggs relieved Rich Hill who left after five pitchers with a blister...Manaea had been scheduled to start two days later...tossed 5.0 innings, which is a season-high for an A's reliever...had a no decision in the A's 1-0, 13-inning win over Tampa Bay July 22 in Oakland...tossed a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings and allowed just five hits and no walks, but Odorizzi did the same for the Rays...retired each of the first 14 batters before Dickerson and Beckham had back-to-back singles in the fifth...had a no decision in the A's 6-4 win at Texas July 27...struck out a career-high nine batters but allowed a career-high 11 hits in 6.2 innings.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-4 loss at Los Angeles last Tuesday...shutout the Angels on two hits over the first four innings and had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a two-run home run to Bandy in the bottom of the fifth...surrendered a three-run home run to Marte in the sixth for the loss.

NASHVILLE: Was 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA (18.0 ip, 16 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 21 so in three starts with Triple-A Nashville...ranked second in the Pacific Coast League in ERA, fifth in strikeouts per nine innings (10.50) and tied for fifth in wins at the time of his April 29 promotion...allowed just one run in each of his starts...surrendered just one home run in 18.0 innings...allowed a .232 opponents batting average, including .077 (1-for-13) against left-handed hitters compared to .268 (15-for-56) against right-handers.

RHP Kendall Graveman (7-7, 4.46 ERA): Is 6-1 with a 3.89 ERA over his last 12 starts after going 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...has allowed six home runs (0.73 per nine innings) and issued 17 walks (2.07 per nine innings) over his last 12 starts after allowing 10 home runs (1.91 per nine innings) and walking 19 (3.64 per nine innings) over his first nine starts...is 3-3 with a 2.92 ERA in eight starts at home compared to 4-4 with a 5.64 ERA in 13 starts on the road...has surrendered just three home runs in 63.1 innings at home compared to 13 in 68.2 innings on the road... had a no decision in his last start, an 8-6 A's loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Wednesday (4.0 ip, 9 h, 6 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...is 0-2 with a 10.13 ERA in five career appearances, including three starts, against Baltimore...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, an 11-3 A's loss at Baltimore May 8 (2.2 ip, 5 h, 6 r, 6 er, 3 bb, 2 so, 4 hr).

- Has tossed 386.0 innings, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 393.1).
- Has allowed 43-of-185 (23.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 22.2%).
- Is tied for third in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (36), ranks fourth in strikeouts (361) and opponents on-base percentage (.306) and tied for fourth in wins (20)...ranks second in most wild pitches (25) and tied for third in blown saves (15).
