27TH HEAVEN: The Chicago Cubs yesterday recorded their sixth-straight win with a 4-0 victory in Oakland ... the win improved Chicago's major league-best record to 68-41 and moved the club to a season-high 27 games over .500 for the second time ... Chicago found itself 47-20 following a 10-5 victory vs. Pittsburgh on June 19.

© Jake Arrieta yesterday spun 8.0 innings of shutout ball to record his first victory since June 27 at Cincinnati ... according to Elias, it was Arrieta's 18th scoreless outing since the start of last season, the most starts of that kind in the majors in that span ... the next three on that list are Clayton Kershaw (14), Jacob deGrom (13) and Zack Greinke (13).

© Yesterday's shutout was Chicago's 10th of the season, tied for second-most in the majors with the Dodgers ... the Phillies lead with 11.

© The Cubs enter today with nine series sweeps this season, equaling their nine series sweeps a season ago ... Chicago has swept two interleague series thus far, a pair of two-game sets at the Angles (April 4-5 to start the season) and vs. the White Sox (July 27-28).

HAVING HIMSELF A SEASON: Kyle Hendricks enters today with a 2.22 season ERA (31 ER/125.2 IP), the second-lowest mark in the majors behind the Dodgers Clayton Kershaw (1.79) ... Hendricks, who in his last start on Monday spun a complete game shutout vs. Miami, has allowed three or fewer earned runs in each of his last 13 starts dating to May 22, posting a 1.63 ERA (15 ER/82.2 IP) in those outings.

© Hendricks has limited his opponents to a .593 OPS, the fifth-lowest mark in the majors ... Kershaw is first with a .475 opponent OPS and teammate Jake Arrieta is second with a .542 mark.

THIS AND THAT: Following today's game in Oakland, the Cubs return home to an off day before starting a 10-game homestand against the Los Angeles Angels, St. Louis Cardinals and Milwaukee Brewers, capping a run following the All Star Break that sees the Cubs play 24 of 32 games at Wrigley Field.

© With 109 games in the books, the Cubs have completed just over two-thirds of their season with a 68-41 record, which puts the club on pace for a 101-win campaign ... the Cubs have started a season 68-41 through 109 games for the first time since also starting 68-41 in 1969.

THE LAST 22: The Cubs, 9-1 in their last 10 games, are 16-6 in their last 22 contests dating to July 10 following a stretch in which the team was 7-15 in 22 games from June 18 to July 9 ... the Cubs have the best record in all of baseball starting July 10.

© Chicago pitching has recorded a 2.50 ERA (55 ER/198.1 IP) in its last 22 games, including a 2.77 ERA (43 ER/139.2 IP) from the starters and a 1.84 ERA (12 ER/58.2 IP) from the bullpen ... in the previous 22 games, the team had a 5.48 ERA (120 ER/197.0 IP), including a 5.66 ERA (74 ER/117.2 IP) from the starters and a 5.22 mark (46 ER/79.1 IP) from the bullpen.

YOU GO, WE GO: Dexter Fowler has scored a run in eight-straight games (11 runs total), one shy of his career-best nine-straight games with a run, May 27-June 4 ... he's scored a run in 10 of his 14 games since returning from the D.L., July 22.

© The Cubs are 21-4 when Fowler reaches base safely at least twice in a game ... the team is 35-8 when Fowler scores at least one run.

© Fowler's leadoff home run Friday night was the 19th of his career and his fifth this season ... Fowler has now hit 10 home runs to lead off a game in his two seasons with the Cubs after hitting a total of nine home runs to lead off a game in his first seven big league campaigns prior to Chicago.

INTERLEAGUE INTERLUDE: Chicago is 15-7 in its last 22 interleague games dating to July 12, 2015, including a 10-4 record this season ... the Cubs have played 309 interleague games and have posted a 150-159 (.485) record ... that includes 67-85 record on the road.

© Cubs designated hitters have batted .143 (3-for-21) with a homer and five RBI in four games this season ... all told, Cubs DHs have recorded a .272 average (164-for-604) with 26 homers and 106 RBI in 152 interleague road games.

DISCERNING EYES: The Cubs have averaged nearly four walks per game since the All-Star break, collecting 81 free passes in 21 games ... their 81 free passes in the season's "second half" rank second in the majors, 10 behind Milwaukee ... Chicago has drawn at least five walks in eight games since the break, going 8-0 in those contests.

© On the season, Chicago leads the majors with 456 walks, well ahead of Toronto, who is second with 420 walks ... the next-closest N.L. team is Milwaukee, who has drawn 410 free passes.

QUITE THE DIFFERENCE: Chicago's +180 run differential is its season high and by far the highest in the majors ... Washington is second at +134 ... the Cubs have allowed the fewest runs in the majors (373) while plating the third-most in the majors (553) behind only the Red Sox (593) and Rockies (572).

© Chicago last had a run differential greater than +180 following their final game of the 2008 campaign (+184) ... thanks to Ed Hartig.

IN THE BULLPEN: Via Fangraphs, the Cubs have five pitchers in the bullpen with an average fastball velocity of at least 94 miles per hour this season: Aroldis Chapman (100.1), Hector Rondon (95.9), Carl Edwards Jr. (95.1), Pedro Strop (94.8) and Justin Grimm (94.3).

© Travis Wood has stranded 27 of 30 inherited runners, good for a 90.0 percent success rate, third-best in the N.L. ... San Francisco's Josh Osich leads with a 95.0 percent success rate (38/40) ... Wood is fifth in the majors with 54 appearances this season, two behind the major league leaders.

THAT'S A DYNAMIC DUO: Kris Bryant is tied for fourth in the N.L. with 26 home runs while teammate Anthony Rizzo is tied for seventh with 24 homers ... Bryant's 26 homers equal the amount he hit during his 2015 N.L. Rookie of the Year campaign ... the two have combined for 109 of Chicago's 349 extra-base hits ... Rizzo's 58 extra-base hits are tied for the N.L. lead while Bryant's 51 extra-base hits rank 10th.

HAPPY EARLY BIRTHDAY WISHES, ANTHONY! Anthony Rizzo, who tomorrow celebrates his 27th birthday, has hit safely in 49 of his last 59 contests since May 29 ... he's batted .330 (72-for-218) with 22 doubles, two triples, 13 homers and 44 RBI in those last 59 games, and his 37 extra-base hits are tied for second most in the majors, one behind Minnesota's Brian Dozier.

© Rizzo has 79 RBI this season, fourth in the N.L. and tied for seventh in the majors ... his 79 RBI prior to August 1 are the most by a Cub through the end of July since Derrek Lee had 83 RBI through July of 2005.

ON THE RECORD: At 68-41, the Cubs have the best record in the majors yet are just three games over .500 in their last 55 games starting June 5 (29-26) ... however, the Cubs have actually gained a game in the division in that time, entering today with a 10.5-game lead after holding a 9.5-game lead when this stretch started ... going back a bit further, the Cubs have actually seen their division lead grow from 5.0 games on May 24 to 10.5 games today.

2016 Season

Kyle leads all Cubs starters and ranks second in the majors with a 2.22 ERA ... has posted a 1.19 ERA (10 ER/75.1 IP) in 12 games at Wrigley Field, the best home ERA in the majors ... has posted a 3.75 ERA (21 ER/50.1 IP) in nine road outings ... his ten wins are a career-high.

- Has posted a 1.59 ERA (15 ER/84.2 IP) since May 22, the best ERA in the N.L. over that span ... has allowed three or fewer earned runs in 13-straight starts, the longest streak of his career ... over his last nine appearances (since June 19), he has gone 6-1 with a major league best 1.04 ERA (6 ER/52.0 IP).
- His 1.19 ERA at Wrigley Field would be the second-best single-season mark in franchise history (min. 10 GS at Wrigley Field) ... Grover Cleveland "Pete" Alexander posted a 1.11 ERA (25 ER/202.2 IP) at Wrigley Field in 1920.
- Owens a WHIP of 1.06, which is the best mark of his career thus far, ranks seventh-best in the National League.
- Holding opponents to a .214 batting average against, including a .202 mark by righties ... has limited opponents to a .142 average with two strikes.
- 52.9 percent of balls in play against Kyle are ground balls ... according to Fangraphs, 25.9 percent of his batted balls are hit softly, which leads the majors.
- Threw 6.2 innings against the D-backs in his season debut, April 9 ... allowed only four hits and two runs, while fanning five.
- Only allowed one run on two hits over 5.0 innings of work against Milwaukee on April 26 ... was lifted for a pinch hitter after tossing 69 pitches.
- Picked up his second win of the season after throwing 6.0-scoreless innings against Washington, May 5.
- Tossed a complete-game, one-run victory against Philadelphia, May 28 ... his second-career complete game ... pitched 8.0 innings in his next start, June 2 vs. the Dodgers, marking the first time in his career he tossed at least 8.0 innings in consecutive outings.
- Fanned a career-high 12 batters and walked none, June 19 vs. Pittsburgh, picking up the win in the Cubs 10-5 victory ... became the first Cubs pitcher with 12 strikeouts and no walks in a game since Matt Garza, April 3, 2011 vs. Pittsburgh.
- Did not allow a run in three-straight appearances (two starts), July 7-20 vs. Atlanta, Texas and the Mets (14.1 IP) ... made his first-career relief appearance July 7 vs. Atlanta, tossing 2.0-scoreless frames.
- Won a career-high tying five-straight games, June 19-July 20.
- Posted a 2.55 ERA in the first half of the season, which led the Cubs and ranked sixth in the National League.

Career Notes

Kyle has gone 25-16 with a 3.08 ERA (132 ER/386.0 IP) in 66 games (65 starts) for Chicago since making his major league debut in 2014 ... is in his fourth full season in the organization since being acquired from Texas in July of 2012.

- Is one of 15 players with at least two shutouts since the beginning of 2015 ... joins Jake Arrieta and Mike Montgomery (two last season with Seattle).
- Walked three or fewer batters in each of his first 56 career starts, the longest stretch by a Cubs starter to begin his career since at least 1914 ... marked the fourth-longest stretch by a Cubs starter overall since at least 1914 (thanks STATS Inc.) ... the streak was snapped June 13 at Washington (four walks).
- The Cubs went 33-17 in Kyle Hendricks' first 50 career starts for the team ... that's the Cubs best record in a pitcher's first 50 starts for the team since going 35-15 in Hank Borowy's first 50 outings from 1945-47... thanks STATS Inc.
- Did not allow a home run in 10-straight starts at Wrigley Field from August 21, 2015 to May 28, 2016 ... tied for the second-longest streak by a Cubs pitcher in the last 30 seasons.
- Named a 2014 Pacific Coast League mid-season All-Star and was the National League Rookie of the Month in August of that season (4-0, 1.69 ERA) ... was the Cubs Minor League Pitcher of the Year in 2013.
- Claimed the Southern League ERA title in 2013 with Tennessee, boasting a 1.85 ERA (26 ER/126.1 IP) while leading the league with a .769 winning percentage (10-3) and a 1.05 WHIP.
- Attended Dartmouth College where he earned first team All-Ivy League honors as a junior in 2011 ... he is the only active player who went to Dartmouth.

John on Tuesday makes his 23rd start of the season as the Cubs open up a two-game set vs. the Angels ... in his last outing, August 3 vs. Miami, he allowed three runs in 7.0 innings and did not garner a decision in Chicago's 5-4 victory ... walked none and struck out eight.

- Has gone 4-2 with a 4.02 ERA (18 ER/40.1 IP) in six career starts against the Angels ... last faced his former team in 2013 while with the Red Sox.
- Has recorded 16 quality starts and held the opponent to a .224 batting average, a .288 on-base percentage and a .378 slugging mark ... has walked two or fewer in each of his last five starts ... has gone at least 6.0 innings in each of his last seven outings dating to June 30 at the Mets.

Javy is batting .312 (34-for-109) since June 29, including a two-run double Friday night ... is batting .301 (44-for-146) with nine doubles, six homers and 24 RBI in his last 43 games ... is batting .345 (30-for-87) off lefties, the seventh-highest mark in the National League ... has scored or driven in a run in 23 of his last 33 games with an at-bat ... went 3-for-5 with a run scored and RBI July 29 vs. Seattle ... hit a game-winning two-run homer July 27 ... went 3-for-4 with a double, homer, two runs and two RBI July 25 ... his 11 homers are a new career-high ... had a career-high seven-game hitting streak (10-24/.417), July 9-20 ... crushed a 15th inning grand slam June 28, the first of his career and latest by in franchise history ... set a career high with four hits June 8 in Philly, going 4-for-4 with a double.

⊙ Hit a walk-off homer in the 13th inning May 8 vs. Washington, his first career walk-off homer ... has seen time at first base, second base, third base, shortstop and left field – is the first Cub since Mark DeRosa in 2008 to play those positions in a season.
