OAKLAND ATHLETICS (48-63) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (63-47)

MONDAY, AUGUST 8, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (7-7, 4.46) VS. RHP KEVIN GAUSMAN (3-8, 4.08) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Were swept by the Cubs in a three-game series over the weekend and have now lost eight of the last nine games...are a season-high 15 games under .500 at 48-63 (.432)...that is the third worst record in the American League and tied for fifth worst in Oakland history after 111 games...it is the worst since the 1997 club started the year 43-68 (lost game 112)...are 1-5 (.167) in August, which is the worst record in the majors...are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by $16\frac{1}{2}$ games, which is $\frac{1}{2}$ game short of the season high of 17 (twice, last: June 22)...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 40 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 29 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 0-7 with a 9.07 ERA (41 er in 40.2 ip) and .365 (66-for-181) opponents batting average over the last nine games...have tossed fewer than five innings in five of those games and 34 for the season...that is the most in the majors and second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (35 in 2009)...have 596.1 innings pitched, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...have a 5.22 ERA (346 er in 596.1 ip) which is the highest in the majors...lead the AL in most losses (48) and have the second fewest wins (28).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.74 ERA (44 er in 69.0 ip) and .299 (84-for-281) opponents batting average over the last eight games and have surrendered 16 home runs over that span...have a 4.69 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second most wild pitches (55), the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.333) and the third highest opponents batting average (.269) and slugging percentage (.434).

OFFENSE: The A's scored three runs in the three-game series against the Cubs over the weekend and hit .151 (14-for-93) with two walks and a hit by pitch (.177 on-base percentage)...have been shutout four times over the last 27 games and are batting .238 (218-for-917) with 99 runs scored over that span (3.7 runs per game)...for the season, rank last in the American League in on-base percentage (.303), second in fewest walks (278) and fewest strikeouts (753) and fourth in lowest slugging percentage (.401) and fewest runs scored (449).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors in the last six games after making one over the previous 10 contests...have 70 errors for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...A's outfielders have 14 assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 13).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-3 on this 10-game homestand against Chicago-NL (0-3), Baltimore (four games) and Seattle (three games)...it is the A's second consecutive 10-game homestand as they went 7-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (3-1)...are 24-32 (.429) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and are 24-31 (.436) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 12-11 since then...are batting .260 (504-for-1939) on the road compared to .238 (441-for-1850) at home...have the fourth best road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home batting average...have a 5.32 ERA (281 er in 475.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.09 (232 er in 510.0 ip) at home.

CLOSE CALLS: Three of the A's last four home wins and four of their last eight road losses have been walk-offs...are 6-7 in walk-off games...are tied for second in the American League in walk-off games (Houston, 14) and tied for third in walk-off wins...are 13-11 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for fourth in the AL in last at bat wins...have seven wins when trailing after seven innings, which is tied with Kansas City and Texas for the most in the majors...had just five such wins all last year...have won seven of their last 11 one-run games but are 16-17 (.485) for the season... rank fourth in the AL in one-run games (33)...have won each of their last three extra inning games and are 5-3 (.625) in extra innings.

THIS AND THAT: This series with the Orioles marks the fourth time in the last five series the A's have faced a division leader (Rangers, Indians, Cubs)...are 2-7 against those first place teams...have lost the first game in

each of the last five series...A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (18), RBI (13) and plate appearances (83)...A's designated hitters are last in the AL in RBI (42) and have the second lowest batting average (.222)...the A's have lost 12 of the last 15 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 12-17 (.414) in games against left-handed starters for the season, which is the second worst record in the AL (Seattle, 16-24)...the A's have scored 44 of their 83 runs since the All-Star Break with two outs (53.0%).

ROSTER NOTES: Since Opening Day (April 4), the A's have made a total of 150 transactions in 126 days (42 recalls, 11 selections, 42 options, two designated for assignments, 19 placed on the 15-day disabled list, 10 transferred to the 60-day DL, 10 reinstated from the DL, one placed on the family medical leave list, one reinstated from the FMLL, three lost on waivers, one claimed on waivers and three trades involving eight players on the 40-man roster)...yesterday, Chris Smith became the 44th player to appear in a game for the A's this year...the A's have used 24 pitchers after employing a franchise record 30 in 2015...10 of the 24 have been rookies, which is tied for the fourth most rookie pitchers in Oakland history...the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers is 12 (2009, 2012, 2015)...seven of those 10 have made their Major League debut this year...overall, the A's have used 13 rookies, 10 of which have made their ML debuts (Eibner with the Royals)...have used 11 starting pitchers, which is tied with Texas for the most in the American League.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Sonny Gray on the 15-day disabled list yesterday and have now used the DL an Oakland record tying 25 times (also 2008)...only the Dodgers (27) have used the DL more this year...the 25 players have combined to miss 1111 games (44.4 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record...the current mark is 1397 in 2010...have a season-high 14 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hahn, Lambo, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard), including 10 on the 60-day DL (all but Doolittle, Gray, Hahn and Lowrie)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's lost two of three in Baltimore in May to open the season series...have now lost seven of their last eight games to the Orioles...have lost the season series in two of the previous three seasons and are 8-15 against the Orioles over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 256-261 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 128-132 in Oakland and 128-129 in Baltimore...are 61-55 at Camden Yards...all-time, the A's are 992-941 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .448 with runners in scoring position...started the season 0-for-9 with RISP but is 26-for-49 (.531) since then...Khris Davis has matched his career highs in home runs (27) and RBI (69)...Ryan Dull has a 1.08 ERA (4 er in 33.1 ip) and .130 (15-for-115) opponents batting average over his last 33 games... opponents are 3-for-57 (.053) with runners in scoring position...Marcus Semien hit his 23rd home run of the season yesterday, which is an ongoing career high, second most among ML shortstops (Story, COL 27) and tied for fifth most in Athletics history by a shortstop...Jake Smolinski has not committed an error in 137 career games as an outfielder (including 85 with Oakland).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1986** Dave Kingman's eighth inning homer in the A's 5-2 win over Minnesota gives him homers in five consecutive games, an Oakland A's record at the time...in **2004** the A's defeat Minnesota 6-5 in 18 innings in their longest game since 1972...Oakland scores three times in the top of the 18th on RBI singles by Jermaine Dye, Erubiel Durazo and Damian Miller before the Twins score twice in the bottom of the 18th...in **2006** Nick Swisher hits his 24th home run of the season in the A's 7-6 win over Texas, setting an all-time Athletics record for homers by a switch hitter.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Kendall Graveman (7-7, 4.46 ERA)

LAST 12, FIRST NINE: Is 6-1 with a 3.89 ERA (32 er in 74.0 ip) over his last 12 starts after going 1-6 with a 5.36 ERA over his first nine starts...has allowed six home runs (0.73 per nine innings) and issued 17 walks (2.07 per nine innings) over his last 12 starts after allowing 10 home runs (1.91 per nine innings) and walking 19 (3.64 per nine innings) over his first nine

21 STARTS: Is 7-7 with a 4.46 ERA, .283 opponents batting average and .783 OPS in 21 starts this year after going 6-9 with a 4.05 ERA, .276 opponents batting average and .761 OPS in 21 starts last year...has 16 home runs, 36 walks and 74 strikeouts in 121.0 innings this year after tallying 15 home runs, 38 walks and 77 strikeouts in 115.2 innings last year.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Has the sixth highest opponents batting average in the American League (.283) and the seventh highest on-base percentage (.337)...ranks fourth in fewest strikeouts per nine innings (5.50), fifth in fewest pitches per game (89.8), tied for fifth in opponents reaching on an error (7) and tied for eighth in grounded into double plays (15)

HOME AND AWAY: Is 3-3 with a 2.92 ERA (17 er in 52.1 ip) in eight starts at home compared to 4-4 with a 5.64 ERA (43 er in 68.2 ip) in 13 starts on the road...has surrendered just three home runs in 63.1 innings at home compared to 13 in 68.2 innings on the road.

SUPPORT: Has left with the lead in four of his starts only to have the bullpen blow the save (April 12 vs. Los Angeles-AL, June 17 vs. Los Angeles, June 28 vs. San Francisco, July 29 at Cleveland)...is averaging 5.59 (46 rs in 74.0 ip) runs of support over his last 12 starts after receiving an average of 2.30 runs of support over his first nine starts...is 0-5 with two runs of support or fewer, 7-1 with three runs of support or more...is now 1-14 in 20 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 12-2 in 22 starts with three runs of support or more.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has walked just five batters to lead off an inning, which is tied for fourth fewest in the American League among pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...has allowed a .147 (28-for-190) batting average with two strikes, which is 10th lowest in the AL...has issued 28 of his 36 walks this year and 52 of 74 in his career to left-handed

MONTH BY MONTH: Went 4-1 with a 2.68 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in five starts in July...the wins tied for third in the American League and were his most ever in a month...had just three wins over the first three months of the season...went 1-0 with a 4.33 ERA in five starts in June...was 1-4 with a 5.87 ERA in six starts in May...his May loss total tied for second in the AL...it was the first time he has lost four games in a month in his career...went 1-2 with a 4.03 ERA in four starts in April.

THIS AND THAT: Is scheduled to make his career high 22nd start of the season today...has a 1.71 ERA (4 er in 21.0 ip) in the first inning, 5.04 (56 er in 100.0 ip)...has walked one batter or fewer in 11 of his 21 starts...has tossed seven or more innings just four times this year and 10 times in 42 career starts...tossed 8.0 innings July 9, snapping a streak of 28 consecutive starts of seven innings or fewer dating back to June 18 of last year. that was the fifth longest such streak in Oakland history...went 1-2 with a 7.29 ERA over the first nine games (four starts) of his career through April 25, 2015, 5-2 with a 1.78 ERA over a nine-start stretch from May 23-July 4. 2015, 1-11 with a 5.57 ERA over a 17-start stretch from July 10, 2015-May 24, 2016 and is 6-2 with a 3.89 ERA (32 er in 74.0 ip) over his last 12 starts.

2016 HIGHLIGHTS: Allowed four hits or fewer in each of his first three starts, joining John Odom (1969) and Mike Norris (1980) as the only pitchers in Oakland history on an Opening Day roster to allow four hits or fewer while tossing five innings or more in each of their first three starts...picked up his first win of the season and struck out a career-high eight batters April 20 at New York (AL)...it snapped a career-high six-game losing streak dating back to July 10, 2015...compiled a 5.52 ERA and .276 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which spanned nine starts...struck out in the fifth inning in his first professional at bat that day...then lost each of his next five starts from April 25 to May 19...logged a 7.92 ERA and .361 opponents batting average during the losing streak, which fell one short of his career high of six...allowed a career-high 10 hits in back-to-back starts on April 25 at Detroit and May 2 against Seattle...is the first A's pitcher with at least 10 hits in back-to-back starts since Brandon McCarthy (April 16-21, 2012)...yielded a career-high four home runs in an 11-3 loss at Baltimore May 8...snapped his five-game losing streak in a 3-2 win over Minnesota May 30...issued a career-high tying four walks but allowed just one run in 6.2 innings of work in a 3-1 win at Minnesota July 4... tossed a career-high 112 pitches in 7.0 innings in a 7-4 win over Houston July 18...fired his second career complete game in the A's 4-3 win over Tampa Bay on July 23 in Oakland...it was his first complete game win...allowed nine hits, which were the most by an A's pitcher in a complete game since Mark Redman

allowed 12 on May 13, 2004 against Detroit...had his career high six-game winning streak come to an end in the A's 5-3 loss at Cleveland July 29...the streak doubled his previous best (3, June 24-July 4, 2015) and matched the longest by an A's pitcher this year (Hill)...compiled a 3.25 ERA and .264 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned 10 starts from May 30 to July 23.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 8-6 loss at Los Angeles last Wednesday...Oakland scored a run in the second but he allowed a run in the bottom of the second on a Perez RBI single...the A's scored again in the third but he allowed a RBI single to Trout in the bottom of the third... Oakland scored twice in the fourth but he allowed solo home runs to Marte and Pennington in the bottom of the fourth...allowed a RBI double to Pujols in the fifth and was relieved by Triggs, who allowed Pujols to score...the A's came back to tie the game with runs in the eighth and ninth innings to get him off the hook but Pujols hit a two-run home run in the bottom of the ninth for the win.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Zach Neal (1-1, 5.25 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 12th appearance and second start of the season...was recalled from Nashville July 21 for his fourth stint with the A's this year and has not allowed a run in three relief appearances since his return (8.1 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 1-0 with a 0.75 ERA, .256 opponents batting average and no home runs over his last six games dating back to June 18...went 0-1 with a save, a 9.75 ERA, .340 opponents batting average and four home runs over his first five contests...has issued just one walk in 24.0 innings with the A's, an average of 0.38 walks per nine innings...was the losing pitcher in his only Major League start, a 13-3 A's loss at Seattle earlier this year on May 25 (4.0 ip, 8 h, 7 r, 7 er, 1 so)...has never faced the Orioles in his career...went 7-2 with a 3.21 ERA in 11 starts with Triple-A Nashville...walked just eight batters in 61.2 innings, an average of 1.17 per nine innings

- Has tossed 389.0 innings, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 396.1).
- Has allowed 44-of-190 (23.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 22.8%).
