OAKLAND ATHLETICS (49-63) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (63-48)

TUESDAY, AUGUST 9, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP ZACH NEAL (1-1, 5.25) VS. LHP WADE MILEY (0-1, 7.20) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost eight of the last 10 games and are 49-63 (.438) overall...that is the third worst record in the American League and it matches the worst by an A's team after 112 games over the last 19 years (2011)...a loss today would give the A's their worst record after 113 games since 1997 (43-70)...the 14 games under .500 are one short of the season high (15 on August 8)...are 2-5 (.286) in August, which is tied for the second worst record in the AL...are 11-12 (.478) since the All-Star Break after going 38-51 (.427) before the break...are in fifth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by 16½ games, which is ½ game short of the season high of 17 (twice, last: June 22)...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 40 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: Kendall Graveman picked up the first win by an A's starting pitcher last night since July 26 (Gray)...starters are now 1-7 with a 7.93 ERA (42 er in 47.2 ip) and .348 (72-for-207) opponents batting average over the last 10 games...have tossed fewer than five innings in five of those games and 34 for the season...that is the most in the majors and second most by an A's team over the last 17 years (35 in 2009)...have 603.1 innings pitched, which is the fewest in the American League and third fewest in the majors...have a 5.176 ERA (347 er in 603.1 ip) which is second highest in the majors (Minnesota, 5.182)...lead the AL in most losses (48) and have the second fewest wins (29).

PITCHING: The A's have compiled a 5.31 ERA (46 er in 78.0 ip) and .290 (91-for-314) opponents batting average over the last nine games and have surrendered 17 home runs over that span...have a 4.66 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second most wild pitches (55), the second highest opponents on-base percentage (.332) and the third highest opponents batting average (.269) and slugging percentage (.433).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .169 (21-for-124) with five walks and a hit by pitch (.208 on-base percentage) over the last four games...have scored six runs over that stretch (1.5 per game)...have been shutout four times over the last 28 games and are batting .237 (225-for-948) with 102 runs scored over that span (3.6 runs per game)...for the season, rank last in the American League in on-base percentage (.303), second in fewest walks (281) and fewest strikeouts (760) and fourth in lowest slugging percentage (.401) and fewest runs scored (452).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed six errors in the last seven games after making one over the previous 10 contests...have 70 errors for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...A's outfielders have 14 assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 13).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-3 on this 10-game homestand against Chicago-NL (0-3), Baltimore (1-0) and Seattle (three games)...it is the A's second consecutive 10-game homestand as they went 7-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (3-1)... are 25-32 (.439) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and are 24-31 (.436) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 12-11 since then...are batting .260 (504-for-1939) on the road compared to .238 (448-for-1881) at home...have the fourth best road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home batting average...have a 5.32 ERA (281 er in 475.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.06 (234 er in 519.0 ip) at home.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's won 3-2 last night and have now won eight of their last 12 one-run games...are 17-17 (.500) for the season and the 34 one-run games are fourth most in the American League...three of the A's last five home wins and four of their last eight road losses have been walk-offs...are 6-7 in walk-off games...are tied for second in the AL in walk-off games (Houston, 14) and tied for third in walk-off wins...are 13-11 in games decided in the last at bat and are tied for fourth in the AL in last at bat wins...have won each of their last three extra inning games and are 5-3 (.625) in extra innings.

LEFT AND RIGHT: The A's have lost 12 of the last 15 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher...are 12-17 (.414) in games against left-handed starters compared 37-46 (.446) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is the second worst record in the American League (Seattle, 16-24)...are batting .257 against lefties, .247 against righties.

THIS AND THAT: This series with the Orioles marks the fourth time in the last five series the A's have faced a division leader (Rangers, Indians, Cubs)...are 3-7 against those first place teams...A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (18), RBI (13) and plate appearances (83)...A's designated hitters are tied for last in the AL in RBI (43) and have the second lowest batting average (.224)...the A's have scored 46 of their 86 runs since the All-Star Break with two outs (53.5%).

ROSTER NOTES: Since Opening Day (April 4), the A's have made a total of 150 player moves in 127 days (42 recalls, 11 selections, 42 options, two designated for assignments, 19 placed on the 15-day disabled list, 10 transferred to the 60-day DL, 10 reinstated from the DL, one placed on the family medical leave list, one reinstated from the FMLL, three lost on waivers, one claimed on waivers and three trades involving eight players on the 40-man roster)...44 different players have appeared in a game for Oakland...have used 24 pitchers after employing a franchise record 30 in 2015...10 of the 24 have been rookies, which is tied for the fourth most rookie pitchers in Oakland history...the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers is 12 (2009, 2012, 2015)...seven of those 10 have made their Major League debut this year...overall, the A's have used 13 rookies, 10 of which have made their ML debuts (Eibner with the Royals)...have used 11 starting pitchers, which is tied with Texas for the most in the AL.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland record tying 25 times (also 2008)...only the Dodgers (27) have used the DL more this year...the 25 players have combined to miss 1125 games (45.0 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record... the current mark is 1397 in 2010...have a season-high 14 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hahn, Lambo, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard), including 10 on the 60-day DL (all but Doolittle, Gray, Hahn and Lowrie)...prior to this year, had not not mad more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The season series is even at two games each...the A's won the first game in Oakland last night after losing two of three in Baltimore in May...have lost seven of their last nine games to the Orioles... have lost the season series in two of the previous three seasons and are 9-15 against the Orioles over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 258-260 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 129-132 in Oakland and 129-128 in Baltimore...are 62-54 at Camden Yards... all-time, the A's are 994-940 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Butler is batting .336 (39-for-116) over his last 43 games after hitting .200 over his first 29 contests...Coco Crisp is batting a Major League leading .448 with runners in scoring position...Marcus Semien has a consecutive games played streak of 114, which is the longest by an Athletic since Eric Chavez played in 123 consecutive games to start the 2005 season...Jake Smolinski has not committed an error in 137 career games as an outfielder (including 85 with Oakland).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1930** George Earnshaw tosses a seven-hit shutout and Jimmie Foxx hits a three-run home run in the bottom of the eighth inning as the A's defeat Chicago 3-0 in the second game of a doubleheader...in **1968** Campy Campaneris is a perfect 5 for 5 in the A's 4-2 win in the first game of a doubleheader at Washington...in **2002** the A's win a 16-inning game at New York 3-2 in a game that last six hours exactly...Mark Ellis has a RBI single in the 16th inning to drive in the winning run.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Zach Neal (1-1, 5.25 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 12th appearance and second start of the season...was recalled from Nashville July 21 for his fourth stint with the A's this year and has not allowed a run in three relief appearances since his return (8.1 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 5 so)...was first selected from Nashville May 11 and made his Major League debut that night at Boston...was optioned back to the Sounds May 13...returned May 25 and made his first ML start that day at Seattle, a loss...pitched once more in relief before he was optioned to Nashville May 31...joined the A's for a third time June 10 and compiled a 4.70 ERA in five relief appearances while recording his first win and save before he was option to Nashville June 30.

LAST SIX, FIRST FIVE: Is 1-0 with a 0.75 ERA (1 er in 12.0 ip), .256 (11-for-43) opponents batting average and no home runs over his last six games dating back to June 18...went 0-1 with a save, a 9.75 ERA, .340 opponents batting average and four home runs in 12.0 innings over his first five contests.

DON'T WALK: Has issued just one walk in 24.0 innings, an average of 0.38 walks per nine innings...issued his only walk with two outs in the sixth inning on July 30 at Cleveland to snap a career-opening nine-games, 18.2-innings, 80-batters faced streak without a walk...the career-opening streak of 18.2 innings without a walk was the longest such streak by an Athletics pitcher since at least 1913...the previous high was 15.1 by Paul Lindblad (Sept. 15, 1965-April 28, 1966).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has yielded all four of his home runs and issued his only walk to left-handed hitters...has a .972 OPS against left-handers compared to .625 against right-handers...opponents are 8-for-25 (.320) when leading off an inning...has a .250 (15-for-60) batting average with the bases empty, .389 (14-for-36) with runners on...opponents are 9-for-24 (.375) with runners in scoring position, including 5-for-10 (.500) with RISP and two outs.

IN RELIEF: First batters faced are 4-for-10 (.400)...has not inherited any runners...has tossed at least one inning in nine of his 10 relief appearances, including a season-high 3.0 innings on four separate occasions... tossed 4.0 innings in his lone start...made his Major League debut May 11 at Boston, tossing three innings of relief in the A's 13-3 loss...entered the game to start the sixth inning with the A's trailing 10-3...fanned Bradley, Jr. with one out in the sixth inning for his first Major League strikeout... struck out a career-high two batters in his debut...picked up his first Major League save June 13 against Texas when he tossed the final three innings of the A's 14-5 win...was credited with his first Major League win June 28 at San Francisco when he tossed a scoreless seventh inning in the A's 13-11 win...did not allow a run over his final four relief appearances from June 28 to Aug. 4 for a career-high 9.1-inning scoreless streak.

LAST APPEARANCE: He tossed 2.1 scoreless innings of relief in the A's 8-6 win at Los Angeles (AL) last Thursday...entered the game to start the fifth inning in relief of Jesse Hahn with the scored tied 5-5...retired six of the seven batters he faced, allowing one-out singles to Simmons in the fifth and Bandy in the sixth...left with a 6-5 lead but Axford allowed an unearned run in the bottom of the seventh for the blown save.

ONLY MAJOR LEAGUE START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 13-3 loss at Seattle May 25...had career highs in innings pitched (4.0), hits (8), runs (7) and pitches (60)...retired the first five batters before Lind homered in the second inning...the scored was tied at 1-1 when he allowed six runs in the bottom of the third...Martin, Smith and Seager had RBI singles and Lind capped the scoring with a three-run home run...retired the side in order in the fourth and was relieved by Rzepczynski to start the fifth.

NASHVILLE: Went 7-2 with a 3.21 ERA in 11 starts with Triple-A Nashville...walked just eight batters in 61.2 innings, an average of 1.17 per nine innings...had five starts with no walks, four with one walk and two with two walks...took the loss in his first start but then went 6-0 with a 2.95 ERA over his next seven starts...went 1-1 with a 4.50 ERA over his final three starts...posted a 3-0 record and a 0.84 ERA in three starts in May...issued just one walk in 21.1 May innings...allowed 13 of his 27 runs in the third inning for an 8.18 ERA (10 er in 11.0 ip)...had a 1.64 ERA over the first two innings and a 2.51 ERA from the fourth inning on.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .259 opponents batting average, including .233 (24-for-103) against left-handed hitters compared to .279 (38-for-136) against right-handers...surrendered all five of his home runs to right-handed hitters...had a .551 OPS against lefties, .735 against right-handers...opponents were 12-for-63 (.190) with one walk (.203 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...opponents hit .318 with runners in scoring position.

MINOR LEAGUE START-BY-START: Took the loss in his first start April 10 against Oklahoma City, despite allowing just one run in 5.0 innings...picked up his first win in his second start at Oklahoma City April 15...allowed three unearned runs in 5.0 innings...was 1-1 with a 0.90 ERA and no walks in 10.0 innings over his first two starts...then went 1-0 with a 7.15 ERA over his next two starts...allowed a season-high six runs on a seasonhigh nine hits in 5.1 innings in his third start at Colorado Springs on April 21 but picked up the win in a 9-8 decision...had his only no decision April 26 against New Orleans when he had season-highs in walks (2) and strikeouts (5)...combined with Coulombe and Triggs on a five-hit 3-0 shutout at Round Rock May 1...tossed 7.1 innings and allowed all five of the hits... tossed a season-high 8.0 innings and allowed just one run in a 2-1 win over Memphis on May 7, his final start before his first promotion to Oakland... made his only start following his May 13 option on *May 16* against Fresno and allowed just one run on three hits in 6.0 innings for the win...made his only start following his May 31 option on June 2 against Round Rock...allowed three runs on a season-high tying nine hits in 5.0 innings but picked up the win...tossed 4.0 scoreless innings in his first start following his June 30 option on July 3 against Oklahoma City...had his six-game winning streak with Nashville snapped July 8 against New Orleans in a 5-1, rainshortened six inning game...matched his season-high with two walks in his final start July 16 at El Paso, a 19-5 win.

LHP Ross Detwiler (0-0, 5.79 ERA): Will be selected from Triple-A Nash-ville tomorrow and will be making his A's debut...was a non-roster invitee with Cleveland this spring and made the Indians Opening Day roster... logged a 5.79 ERA in seven relief appearances before he was designated for assignment April 29...was outrighted to Triple-A Columbus May 1 and traded to the A's organization in a minor league deal for cash considerations on July 17...went 2-4 with a 4.60 ERA in 12 starts with Columbus in the Indians farm system...was assigned to Nashville following his July 17 trade and went 4-0 with a 3.86 ERA in four games, including three starts, with the Sounds...combined for a 6-4 record and a 4.40 ERA in 16 games, 15 starts, overall at Triple-A...is 0-2 with a 5.09 ERA (23.0 ip, 28 h, 14 r, 13 er, 9 bb, 14 so, 2 hr) in seven career appearances, including four starts, against Baltimore.

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.32 ERA (22 er in 85.1 ip) and .191 (59for-309) opponents batting average since the All-Star Break...logged a 4.30 ERA and .258 opponents average before the break.
- Has tossed 391.0 innings, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 399.0).
- Has allowed 44-of-190 (23.2%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 22.8%).
- Ranks fourth in the AL in strikeouts (367) and opponents on-base percentage (.306) and tied for fourth in wins (20) and opponents grounded into double plays (36)...ranks second in most wild pitches (25) and tied for third in blown saves (15).
