OAKLAND ATHLETICS (50-63) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (63-49)

WEDNESDAY, AUGUST 10, 2016 — OAKLAND ALAMEDA COLISEUM — 7:05 P.M. PDT LHP ROSS DETWILER (0-0, 5.79) VS. RHP YOVANI GALLARDO (4-3, 5.47) CSNCA — A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) — EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight after losing eight of the previous nine games...are 3-5 (.375) in August and 12-12 (.500) since the All-Star Break...are 50-63 (.442) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...it matches the worst record by an A's team after 113 games over the last 19 years (1998, 2009, 2011)...a loss tonight would give the A's their worst record after 114 games since 1997 (43-71)...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by 16½ games, which is ½ game short of the season high of 17 (twice, last: June 22)...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 41 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: Ross Detwiler will become the 12th pitcher to start a game for the A's this year, which is tied with the Angels for the most in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors...Oakland used 13 starters last year, which were their most since 2009 (14)...A's starting pitchers have picked up the win in back-to-back games for the first time since May 28-30 when they did it in three straight games...are 2-2 with a 2.31 ERA (6 er in 23.1 ip) and .221 (19-for-86) opponents batting average over the last four games after going 0-4 with a 13.11 ERA and .430 opponents batting average over the previous six contests...have not walked a batter in four of the last five games (2 bb in 26.1 ip, 0.68 per nine innings)...are 30-48 with a 5.15 ERA (348 er in 608.2 ip) for the season... have the fewest innings pitched in the American League, are tied for the most losses, have the second highest ERA and the second fewest wins.

PITCHING: The A's have allowed 10 runs in the last four games (10 er in 36.0 ip, 2.50 ERA) after allowing 40 runs over the previous six contests (6.53 ERA)...have a 4.63 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the American League...also have the second most wild pitches (55), the third highest opponents batting average (.268) and slugging percentage (.432) and the fourth highest on-base percentage (.330)...have surrendered at least one home run in 14 of the last 15 games (26 home runs total)

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .179 (27-for-151) with 10 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .233 on-base percentage) over the last five games...have scored eight runs over that stretch (1.6 per game)...have been shutout four times over the last 29 games and are batting .237 (231-for-975) with 104 runs scored over that span (3.6 runs per game)...for the season, rank last in the American League in on-base percentage (.304), second in fewest walks (286) and fewest strikeouts (764), tied for third in fewest runs scored (454) and fourth in lowest slugging percentage (.400) and fewest doubles (181).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone three consecutive games without an error...have made 17 errors in the last 40 games after committing 53 for the first 73 contests...have 70 errors for the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...A's outfielders have 14 assists, which is the fewest in the AL and tied for second fewest in the majors (San Francisco, 13).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on this 10-game homestand against Chicago-NL (0-3), Baltimore (2-0) and Seattle (three games)...it is the A's second consecutive 10-game homestand as they went 7-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (3-1)... are 26-32 (.448) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and are 24-31 (.436) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 12-11 since then...are batting .260 (504-for-1939) on the road compared to .238 (454-for-1908) at home...have the fourth best road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home batting average...have a 5.32 ERA (281 er in 475.1 ip) on the road compared to 4.01 (235 er in 528.0 ip) at home.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's have won each of the last two games by one run and have now won nine of their last 13 one-run games...are 18-17 (.514) for the season and the 35 one-run games are fourth most in the American League...won just 19 one-run games all last year...each of the A's last 15 wins have been by three runs or fewer (nine one-run, four two-run, two three-run)...have not won a game by more than three runs since a 7-1 win over San Francisco on June 29...have won just 13 games by four or more runs, which is the fewest in the AL...three of the A's last six home wins and four of their last eight road losses have been walk-offs...are 6-7 in walk-off games...are tied for second in the AL in walk-off games (Houston, 14) and tied for third in walk-off wins...are 13-11 in games decided in the last at bat...have won each of their last three extra inning games and are 5-3 (.625) in extra innings.

THIS AND THAT: This series with the Orioles marks the fourth time in the last five series the A's have faced a division leader (Rangers, Indians, Cubs)...are 4-7 against those first place teams...A's pinch hitters rank second in the American League in hits (18), RBI (13) and plate appearances (84)...A's designated hitters are tied for last in the AL in RBI (43) and have the second lowest batting average (.222)...the A's have lost 12 of the last 16 games in which the opponent starts a left-handed pitcher.

ROSTER NOTES: With today's moves, the A's have now made a total of 152 player moves in 128 days dating back to Opening Day, April 4 (42 recalls, 12 selections, 42 options, three designated for assignments, 19 placed on the 15-day disabled list, 10 transferred to the 60-day DL, 10 reinstated from the DL, one placed on the family medical leave list, one reinstated from the FMLL, three lost on waivers, one claimed on waivers and three trades involving eight players on the 40-man roster)...Craig Detwiler will become the 45th different player to appear in a game for Oakland, the 10th straight season the A's have employed at least 44 players...he will be the 25th pitcher after the A's used a franchise record 30 in 2015...10 of the 25 have been rookies, which is tied for the fourth most rookie pitchers in Oakland history...the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers is 12 (2009, 2012, 2015)...seven of those 10 have made their Major League debut this year...overall, the A's have used 13 rookies, 10 of which have made their ML debuts (Eibner with the Royals).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland record tying 25 times (also 2008)...only the Dodgers have used the DL more this year...the 25 players have combined to miss 1139 games (45.6 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record...the current mark is 1397 in 2010...have a season-high 14 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hahn, Lambo, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard), including 10 on the 60-day DL (all but Doolittle, Gray, Hahn and Lowrie)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's lead the season series, 3-2...have won the first two games in Oakland after losing two of three in Baltimore in May...have lost the season series in two of the previous three seasons and are 10-15 against the Orioles over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 259-260 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 130-132 in Oakland and 129-128 in Baltimore...are 62-54 at Camden Yards... all-time, the A's are 995-940 against the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Butler is batting .325 (39-for-120) over his last 44 games after hitting .200 over his first 29 contests...**Coco Crisp** is batting a Major League leading .448 with runners in scoring position...**Marcus Semien** has a consecutive games played streak of 115, which is the third longest active streak in the American League...**Jake Smolinski** has not committed an error in 138 career games as an outfielder (including 86 with Oakland).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1972**, in a game completed the next day, the A's defeat the Chicago White Sox 5-3 in 19 innings...the game was suspended after 17 innings and ended the next day when Joe Rudi hit a two-run homer in the bottom of the 19th...in **1976** Joe Rudi singles for his 1000th career hit in the A's 2-1 victory over Milwaukee...in **1985** Dave Kingman hits his 400th career home run in the A's 11-5 win at Seattle...in **2009** Mark Ellis is a perfect 5 for 5 and drives in four runs in the A's 9-1 win at Baltimore.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Ross Detwiler (0-0, 5.79 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Was selected from Triple-A Nashville today and will be making his A's debut...was a non-roster invitee with Cleveland this spring and made the Indians Opening Day roster...logged a 5.79 ERA in seven relief appearances before he was designated for assignment April 29... was outrighted to Triple-A Columbus May 1 and traded to the A's organization in a minor league deal for cash considerations on July 17.

WITH CLEVELAND: Opponents were 3-for-16 (.188) with Cleveland but he issued four walks in 4.2 innings for a .333 on-base percentage...all three of the hits were for extra bases (two doubles, one home run) for a .500 slugging percentage...allowed 1-of-4 (25.0%) inherited runners to score...first batters faced were 2-for-6 (.333) with a walk...tossed fewer than one inning in six of his seven appearances and his season high was 1.0 on April 17 against New York (NL).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Has made 180 career appearances with Washington (2007, 09-14), Texas (2015), Atlanta (2015) and Cleveland (2016)...that includes 76 games as a starter and 104 as a reliever...made 69 starts with Washington from 2009-13 but has just seven since then, all with Texas in 2015...went 0-5 as a starter with the Rangers and has not won a game as a starter since May 10, 2013 against Chicago (NL)...is 17-34 with a 4.27 ERA (194 er in 409.1 ip) in his 76 career starts and 4-3 with a 4.04 ERA (56 er in 124.2 ip) in 104 career relief appearances.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE APPEARANCE: He tossed 0.2 scoreless innings of relief in the Indians 4-3 loss at Minnesota on April 25...entered the game in the bottom of the sixth with Cleveland trailing 3-2 and got Arcia and Escobar to ground out.

LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START: He was the losing pitcher for Texas in a 6-3 decision against Kansas City on May 14, 2015 in Arlington...allowed a run in the first inning when Escobar scored on a Gordon fielders choice... yielded two more runs in the fourth inning on a Escobar two-run single... left after five innings with the Rangers trailing 3-2.

with a 5.73 ERA (7 er in 11.0 ip) in three games, two starts, at his home ballparks...is 0-2 with a 5.14 ERA (12 er in 21.0 ip) in his four starting assignments...last faced the Orioles in relief on July 28, 2015 at Baltimore while pitching for Atlanta (1.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 1 so)...entered the game to start the fifth with the Braves trailing 5-2 and allowed a RBI single to Joseph...his last start came on June 24, 2012 while pitching for Washington, a no decision in the Nationals 2-1 loss at Baltimore...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings and left with a 1-0 lead but Burnett allowed two runs in the eighth inning for the blown save and loss.

starts, with the Sounds...combined for a 6-4 record and a 4.40 ERA in 16 games, 15 starts, overall at Triple-A...issued 21 walks in 62.2 innings with the Clippers (3.02 per nine innings) but then walked just four batters in 23.1 innings with the Sounds (1.54 per nine innings...struck out 24 at Nashville for a strikeout-to-walk ratio of 6.0...went 0-4 with a 5.84 ERA over his first eight starts through June 11...finished the Triple-A portion of his campaign by going 6-0 with a 3.31 ERA over his final eight games, seven starts.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .256 opponents batting average, including .252 (58-for-230) against right-handed hitters compared to .265 (26-for-98) against left-handed hitters...surrendered nine of his 10 home runs to righties...nine were solo shots...opponents batted .229 with the bases empty compared to .301 with runners on base...allowed a .357 average with runners in scoring position with Columbus, .118 with Nashville...yielded a .313 batting average to batters leading off an inning.

THIS AND THAT: Tossed six or more innings in nine of his 16 appearances, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 11 times...had a 7.20 ERA (12 er in 15.0 ip) in the first inning, a 3.80 ERA (30 er in 71.0 ip) after that...Columbus was 4-8 in his starting assigments and Nashville was 3-0...his one relief appearance came in his first outing with the Sounds on July 20 at Albuquerque...Jesse Hahn started that game and tossed 1.0 innings prior to a July 24 call-up to Oakland.

MINOR LEAGUE HIGHLIGHTS: Tossed just 2.0 innings and 35 pitches in his first start May 7 at Toledo as he began to build up his pitch count following his relief role with the Indians...logged fewer than five innings in each of his first four starts...then tossed 7.0 scoreless innings against Durham May 27 but had a no decision in a 2-0 win...was 0-3 with a 3.42 ERA over his first six starts...then allowed 14 runs in 10.2 innings over his next two starts (11.81 ERA)...yielded six runs on a season-high 10 hits in 6.2 innings in a 7-1 loss to Indianapolis June 6 and a season-high eight runs in 4.0 innings in a no decision in a 15-12 loss to Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on June 11 ... walked four batters in that game, which was a season-high until he issued five free passed in 4.0 innings in his next start June 17 at Syracuse...picked up his first win of the season June 22 against Rochester when allowed one run in 7.0 innings in a 7-2 victory...tossed a season-high 7.1 innings in each of his final two starts with Columbus on June 27 at Lehigh Valley and July 8 at Louisville...allowed one run in 5.0 innings of relief in his first outing with Nashville on July 20 at Albuquerque ... struck out a season-high nine batters in 6.0 innings in his first start, a 12-5 victory over Omaha July 25...combined with Brasier and Healy on a six-hit 2-0 shutout at New Orleans July 30...tossed 6.1 innings and allowed four of the hits.

LAST MINOR LEAGUE START: He was the winning pitcher in Nashville's 12-7 victory at Colorado Springs last Friday...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the second inning on Garin Cecchini sacrifice fly and a Kyle Wren two-run single...the Sounds scored five times in the fourth to take a 7-3 lead and he allowed two runs in the bottom of the fourth on a Josmil Pinto solo home run and an error...left after six innings with an 11-6 lead

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Andrew Triggs (0-0, 5.35 ERA): Is scheduled to make his 20th appearance and second start of the season and his career...was recalled from Triple-A Nashville August 5 for his eighth stint with the A's this year... that is believed to be the most stints in one season in Oakland history...has pitched twice during his most recent stay and has a 4.50 ERA...compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3...has a 2.30 ERA and .279 opponents batting average in nine games, including one start, over his last four stints...last pitched on Sunday against the Cubs (0.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb)...made his only Major League start on June 18 against Los Angeles (AL) and had a no decision in the A's 7-1 loss (3.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 so)... has faced the Orioles one in his career (May 7, 1.0 ip, 3 so)...was 2-1 with two saves and a 2.95 ERA in 16 appearances with Nashville.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

20-15, 3.83 ERA (168 er in 394.2 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 32-for-47 (68.1%)

- The A's bullpen has compiled a 2.22 ERA (22 er in 89.0 ip) and .188 (60for-320) opponents batting average since the All-Star Break...logged a 4.30 ERA and .258 opponents average before the break.
- Has tossed 394.2 innings, which is the most in the American League and second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 402.0).


