OAKLAND ATHLETICS (51-63) VS. BALTIMORE ORIOLES (63-50)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight after losing eight of the previous nine games...have not won more than three in a row since a five-game winning streak from May 28-June 1...have not swept a four-game series since July 3-6, 2014 against Toronto...are 4-5 (.444) in August and 13-12 (.520) since the All-Star Break...are 51-63 (.447) overall, which is the fourth worst record in the American League...it matches the worst record by an A's team after 114 games over the last 19 years (1998, 2009, 2011, 2015)...are in fourth place in the AL West and trail first place Texas by 16½ games, which is ½ game short of the season high of 17 (twice, last: June 22)...have been in fourth or worse every day since June 3...have spent one day in sole possession of first place, five days tied for first, four days in second, four days tied for second, 15 days in third, eight days tied for third, 42 days in fourth, 16 days tied for fourth and 30 days in fifth.

STARTING PITCHING: Andrew Triggs will become the A's eighth different starting pitcher in the last eight games...it marks the first time in Oakland history the A's have used eight different starters over an eight-game span in one season...the last time it happened in franchise history was from June 7-12, 1961 when the A's were in Kansas City...the A's have used 12 different starting pitchers this year, which is tied with Los Angeles for the most in the American League and tied for fourth most in the majors...Oakland used 13 starters last year, which were their most since 2009 (14)...A's starting pitchers have picked up the win in three straight games for the first time since May 28-30 when they also did it in three straight games...the last time they won more than three straight was June 20-25, 2015 when they picked up the win in five straight games...starters are 3-2 with a 1.72 ERA (6 er in 31.1 ip) and .217 (25-for-115) opponents batting average over the last five games after going 0-4 with a 13.11 ERA and .430 opponents batting average over the previous six contests...have not walked a batter in five of the last six games (2 bb in 34.1 ip, 0.52 per nine innings)...are 31-48 with a 5.08 ERA (348 er in 616.2 ip) for the season...have the fewest innings pitched in the American League, are tied for the most losses, have the second highest ERA and the second fewest wins.

PITCHING: The A's tossed their fourth shutout of the season last night, which is tied for third fewest in the American League...have allowed 10 runs in the last five games (10 er in 45.0 ip, 2.00 ERA) after allowing 40 runs over the previous six contests (6.53 ERA)...have a 4.59 ERA for the season, which is second highest in the AL...also have the second most wild pitches (57), the third highest opponents batting average (.267) and slugging percentage (.430) and the fourth highest on-base percentage (.330)...have surrendered at least one home run in 14 of the last 16 games (26 home runs total).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored six runs over the last three games but have won all three games...the only other time in Oakland history the A's scored six runs or fewer in three straight games, all wins, was Sept. 24-27, 1972 (2-1, 1-0, 2-1)...are now batting .173 (31-for-179) with 13 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .232 on-base percentage) over the last six games...have scored nine runs over that stretch (1.5 per game)...have been shutout four times over the last 30 games and are batting .234 (235-for-1003) with 105 runs scored over that span (3.5 runs per game)...for the season, rank last in the American League in on-base percentage (.303), second in fewest walks (289) and fewest strikeouts (773) and fourth in lowest slugging percentage (.399), fewest runs scored (455) and fewest doubles (183).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have gone four consecutive games without an error...have made 17 errors in the last 41 games after committing 53 for the first 73 contests...have 70 errors for the season, which is tied for fourth most in the American League...A's outfielders have 16 assists, which is tied for second fewest in the AL.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-3 on this 10-game homestand against Chicago-NL (0-3), Baltimore (3-0) and Seattle (three games)...it is the A's second consecutive 10-game homestand as they went 7-3 on the last homestand against Toronto (2-1), Houston (2-1) and Tampa Bay (3-1)...are 27-32 (.458) at home for the season, which is the third worst home record in the American League...went 3-6 on the last road trip to Texas (2-1), Cleveland (0-3) and Los Angeles-AL (1-2) and are 24-31 (.436) on the road...started the year 7-0 on the road, went 5-20 from April 23 to June 11 and are 12-11 since then...are batting .260 (504-for-1939) on the road compared to .237 (458-for-1936) at home...have the fourth best road batting average in the AL and the third lowest home batting average...have

a 5.32 ERA (281 er in 475.1 ip) on the road compared to 3.94 (235 er in 537.0 ip) at home.

ONE-RUN GAMES AND MARGIN OF VICTORY: The A's have won each of the last three games by one run and have now won 10 of their last 14 one-run games...are 19-17 (.528) in one-run games for the season, which is the fourth best record in the American League...also have the fourth most one run games...went 19-35 (.352) in one-run games last year, which was the second worst record in the majors...each of the A's last 16 wins have been by three runs or fewer (10 one-run, four two-run, two three-run)...have not won a game by more than three runs since a 7-1 win over San Francisco on June 29...have won just 13 games by four or more runs, which is the fewest in the AL.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's have made a total of 152 player moves in 129 days dating back to Opening Day, April 4 (42 recalls, 12 selections, 42 options, three designated for assignments, 19 placed on the 15-day disabled list, 10 transferred to the 60-day DL, 10 reinstated from the DL, one placed on the family medical leave list, one reinstated from the FMLL, three lost on waivers, one claimed on waivers and three trades involving eight players on the 40-man roster)...last night, Detwiler became the 45th different player to appear in a game for Oakland, the 10th straight season the A's have employed at least 44 players...he is the 25th pitcher after the A's used a franchise record 30 in 2015...10 of the 25 have been rookies, which is tied for the fourth most rookie pitchers in Oakland history...the Oakland record for most rookie pitchers is 12 (2009, 2012, 2015)...seven of those 10 have made their Major League debut this year...overall, the A's have used 13 rookies, 10 of which have made their ML debuts (Eibner with the Royals).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have used the disabled list an Oakland record tying 25 times (also 2008)...only the Dodgers have used the DL more this year...the 25 players have combined to miss 1153 games (46.1 games per stint) and the games missed will set an Oakland record...the current mark is 1397 in 2010...have a season-high 14 players on the DL (Alvarez, Bassitt, Canha, Doolittle, Doubront, Fuld, Gray, Hahn, Lambo, Lowrie, Parker, Phegley, Rodriguez, Sogard), including 10 on the 60-day DL (all but Doolittle, Gray, Hahn and Lowrie)...prior to this year, had not had more than 11 players on the DL at once...have had at least 11 players on the DL every day since July 4, at least nine every day since May 6 and at least six all year...have had at least three players on the DL every day since July 30, 2011 and have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ORIOLES: The A's have won the season series for the second time in the last three years and 15th time in the last 18 years as they lead 4-2 entering the final game today...are 3-0 in Oakland and 1-2 in Baltimore...have not swept a four-game series from the Orioles since Aug. 26-29, 2005 at Baltimore...the last four-game sweep in Oakland was Aug. 23-26, 2004...are 11-15 (.423) against the Orioles over the last four years but are 93-54 (.633) over the last 18 years, which is the best mark against Baltimore by any American League team...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 260-260 against the Orioles...that breaks down to 131-132 in Oakland and 129-128 in Baltimore...are 62-54 at Camden Yards...all-time, the A's are 996-940 against the Orioles/Browns/Brewers...of the other seven original AL franchises, the Orioles are the only team the A's have a winning record against.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Billy Butler is batting .325 (39-for-120) over his last 44 games after hitting .200 over his first 29 contests...**Coco Crisp** is batting a Major League leading .448 with runners in scoring position...**Marcus Semien** has a consecutive games played streak of 116, which is the third longest active streak in the American League...**Jake Smolinski** has not committed an error in 139 career games as an outfielder (including 87 with Oakland).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1920** the A's score 10 times in the seventh inning to defeat Detroit 13-4...In **1978** Rick Langford tosses a three-hit shutout in the first game of a doubleheader at Minnesota in a 2-0 A's victory...in **2003** Tim Hudson tosses a complete game two-hit shutout and needs just 93 pitches to defeat Boston, 4-0.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Andrew Triggs (0-0, 5.35 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 20th appearance and second start of the season and his career...was recalled from Triple-A Nashville August 5 for his eighth stint with the A's this year...that is believed to be the most stints in one season in Oakland history...has pitched twice during his most recent stay and has a 4.50 ERA (2.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 3 so).

EIGHT STINTS: His stints with the A's this year are from April 26-26, April 29, May 7 (26th man for doubleheader), May 10-June 3, June 18, June 30-July 1, July 4-August 3 (includes stay on the DL from July 18-August 1) and August 5-present...five of his eight stints began less than eight days following his previous option...has three one-day stints and two two-day stints.

FIRST FOUR STINTS, LAST FOUR STINTS: Compiled an 8.00 ERA and .312 opponents batting average in 10 relief appearances over his first four stints through June 3...has a 2.30 ERA (4 er in 15.2 ip) and .279 (17-for-61) opponents batting average in nine games, including one start, over his last four stints.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has issued eight of his 12 walks to left-handed hitters...has yielded a .268 (30-for-112) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .423 (11-for-26) after that...opponents are 6-for-11 (.545) with a double and triple when putting the first pitch in play.

IN RELIEF: Tossed at least one inning in 17 of his 18 relief appearances, including two or more 10 times...allowed 4-of-8 (50.0%) inherited runners to score...first batters faced were 3-for-17 (.176) with a walk (.222 on-base percentage)...struck out 33 batters in 30.2 innings of relief (9.68 per nine innings)...pitched just once in a game the A's won (May 18 vs. Texas)...made his Major League debut April 25 at Detroit and retired the side in order in the eighth inning (1.0 ip, 1 so)...struck out the first batter he faced (Tyler Collins)...was sent back to Nashville two days later...did not pitch during his second stint and worked just once during his third...was recalled a fourth time May 10 and allowed at least one run in seven of his eight appearances for a 9.00 ERA and .338 opponents batting average...including June 3 at Houston when he had career highs in innings (4.0 ip), hits (7), runs (5), strikeouts (6) and pitches (76)...made just one appearance during his fifth stint and it was his only start on June 18 against Los Angeles-AL (see only Major League start below)...did not allow a run during stint number six from June 30 to July 1 (3.2 ip)...then allowed one run in each of the first three games of his seventh stint (2 er in 4.2 ip, 3.86 ERA) before going on the 15-day disabled list July 19 retroactive to July 18 with a right shin contusion...was reinstated Aug. 2, tossed 2.1 scoreless innings Aug. 3 at Los Angeles (AL), was optioned Aug. 4 and then recalled Aug. 5 when Jesse Hahn went on the DL.

ONLY MAJOR LEAGUE START: Had a no decision in his only start, a 7-1 A's loss to Los Angeles (AL) on June 18 in Oakland...shutout the Angels on two hits over the first three innings and had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a leadoff home run to Trout in the fourth...was relieved by Dull after tossing 3.0 innings and 50 pitches.

NASHVILLE: Was 2-1 with two saves and a 2.95 ERA in 16 appearances with Nashville, all in relief...struck out 21 and walked five in 18.1 innings...did not allow a home run...logged a 5.14 ERA in six games before his first promotion to Oakland on April 25...compiled a 1.59 ERA in 10 games after that...did not allow a run in seven games on the road (8.0 ip)

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .225 batting average, including .130 (3-for-23) against left-handed hitters compared to .271 (13-for-48) against right-handers...opponents hit .125 when leading off an inning...yielded a .273 batting average with runners in scoring position

THIS AND THAT: Tossed one or more innings in 15 of his 16 appearances, including a season-high 2.0 innings April 23 against New Orleans and July 28 against Colorado Springs...did not allow a run 12 times...including each of his first three games (3.0 ip) when he picked up his only two runs of the season (April 8 against Oklahoma City and April 13 against Colorado Springs...surrendered a season-high four runs on a season-high four hit in a season-low 0.1 innings for his only loss April 14 against Colorado Springs...his most pitches in a game came on April 20 at Colorado Springs (40)...recorded his first save of the season May 1 at Round Rock...matched his season-high with three strikeouts in the second game of a double header on June 9 at Oklahoma City (also April 11 against Colorado Springs)...was credited with his second save June 12 at Oklahoma City.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Has a 13-10 record, 52 saves and a 2.09 ERA (59 er in 254.1 ip) in 168 games over five professional seasons...has surrendered just seven home runs in 254.1 career innings (0.25 per nine innings) and has issued just 56 walks (1.98 per nine innings)...converted each of his 17 save opportunities at Double-A Bowie in 2015...led the Texas League with 19 saves at Northwest Arkansas in 2014...was a TL All-Star that year...made his only minor league start on May 18, 2014 at Tulsa and had a no decision in a 6-5 loss (4.0 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 2 so)...was drafted three times before signing with Kansas City...spent three seasons in the Royals farm system before he was traded to Baltimore prior to the 2015 season...was claimed off waivers by the A's March 13, 2016.

LHP Sean Manaea (3-7, 4.58 ERA):	Is 1-3 with a 3.12 ERA in eight games, including seven starts, since he was reinstated from the disabled list June 29...was 2-4 with a 6.02 ERA in nine starts when he was placed on the 15-day DL June 14 with a left pronator strain...is 0-2 despite a 2.58 ERA over his last six games...has just eight runs of support over that span (1.88 RSA)...has received two runs of support or fewer in 12 of his 16 starts and seven runs or more in three of his starts...ranks second among American League rookies in strikeouts (83), innings pitched (98.1) and games started (16)...is 3-3 with a 3.36 ERA in 11 games at home compared to 0-4 with a 6.88 in six starts on the road...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 3-1 A's loss to Chicago (NL) last Sunday here in Oakland (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...had a no decision in his only career appearance against Seattle, a 9-8 A's loss in Oakland on May 4 (5.0 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 1 bb, 6 so).

- Has tossed 395.2 innings, which is the most in the American League and tied for second most in the majors (Cincinnati, 405.0).
- Has allowed 44-of-191 (23.0%) inherited runners to score, which is the second best percentage in the AL (Houston, 22.4%).
- Is tied for third in the AL in opponents grounded into double plays (37), ranks fourth in strikeouts (373) and opponents on-base percentage (.306) and fifth in wins (20)...ranks second in most wild pitches (25) and tied for third in blown saves (15).
